### After Bye Week, Refreshed LSU Set for November Run Which Starts With Tennessee

A refreshed LSU football team returns to action on Saturday as the 13th-ranked Tigers head to Knoxville to face eighth-ranked Tennessee. LSU goes into the Tennessee game coming off an open date, while the Vols posted a 31-24 road win over South Carolina last Saturday. The Tennessee contest is the first of four games in November for the Tigers, a stretch that has LSU also facing Alabama, Ole Miss and Arkansas. Kickoff for the Tennessee contest is set for 2:30 p.m. CDT from Neyland Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience by CBS marking LSU's third appearance on the network this year. Saturday's game will be the first for the Tigers in Knoxville since a 26-18 setback in 2001. LSU, winners of two straight, brings a 6-2 overall mark and a 2-2 league record into the Tennessee game. The Vols are 7-1 overall and 3-1 in league action. The Tigers are 6-0 at home this year and 0-2 on the road, which includes losses to then-No. 3 Auburn (lost 7-3) and then-No. 5 Florida (lost 23-10). It's the first time in school history that LSU will play three top 10 teams on the road in the same season. LSU goes into the Tennessee game ranked No. 1 in the SEC in scoring offense (35.9 points per game), scoring defense (8.2 points per game), total offense (414.8 yards per game) and total defense (211.6 yards per game). The Tiger defense, which goes into the Tennessee game having not allowed a touchdown in 9 quarters, ranks first in the nation in total defense and pass efficiency defense (85.36 rating), and they are No. 2 in scoring defense, No. 5 in pass defense (139.0 yards per game), No. 7 in rushing defense (72.63 yards per game) and No. 10 in sacks (3.3 per game). LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** leads the SEC and ranks No. 4 in the nation in pass efficiency with a 174.6 rating. Russell, who is 20-4 as LSU's starting quarterback, has connected on 135 of 194 passes for 1,910 yards, 15 TDs and just four interceptions. His top targets have been **Craig Davis** (41-595-2), **Dwayne Bowe** (37-620-7) and **Early Doucet** (29-403-4). Defensively, LB **Derry Beckwith** leads the Tigers with 51 tackles, while DE **Tyson Jackson** has 6.5 sacks to his credit to pace LSU.

### LSU Defense Shuts Down Fresno State in 38-6 Win in Wet Tiger Stadium

The LSU defense stretched its streak of not allowing a TD to 9 straight quarters as the Tigers had little trouble in a 38-6 non-conference win over Fresno State in a wet Tiger Stadium. Despite an afternoon filled with rain and lightning in the Baton Rouge area, the game was delayed just four minutes after the teams mutually agreed upon a 10-minute warm-period. It didn't seem to bother the Tigers as LSU needed only five plays to score its first TD, which came on a 38-yard run by **Trindon Holliday** at the 10:52 mark in the first quarter. LSU's **Craig Davis** followed that with a 77-yard punt return for a TD, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead just seven minutes into the contest. LSU led 17-3 at halftime. In the second half, **Alley Broussard** scored on a 21-yard stretch the margin to 24-6 late in the third quarter. LSU opened the fourth quarter with a 58-yard TD pass from **JaMarcus Russell** to **Dwayne Bowe**, which tied the school record for career receiving TDs at 21. Russell connected with Davis on a 30-yard score four minutes later to cap the scoring for the Tigers. For the game, LSU gained 394 yards of offense, while holding Fresno State to just 211 yards and only 11 first downs. Russell paced the Tigers by connecting on 15 of 19 passes for 210 yards and 2 TDs, while Broussard rushed for 67 yards and 1 score. Defensively, LB **Derry Beckwith** and S **Craig Steltz** each had 11 tackles for the Tigers, while LB **Ali Highsmith** added 8 tackles and a pair of sacks.

# Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SECOND YEAR

It was nothing short of remarkable what LSU coach Les Miles accomplished during his inaugural season with the Tigers in 2005. Consider that Miles led the Tigers to only the third 11-win season in school history, to a top five national ranking and a berth in the Southeastern Conference Championship Game despite numerous distractions that covered most of the months of September and October.

Then, with starting quarterback JaMarcus Russell out with an injury, Miles, along with backup quarterback Matt Flynn, guided the Tigers to the most impressive bowl win in school history, a 40-3 thrashing of ninth-ranked Miami in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win over the Hurricanes in the Peach Bowl capped a season that saw the Tigers post an 11-2 overall mark and finish ranked No. 5 in the final USA Today/Coaches Poll and No. 6 in the Associated Press poll.

To appreciate just how adverse the conditions that Miles and the Tigers had to overcome in 2005, you have to go back to late August and Hurricane Katrina, the first of two storms to devastate the state of Louisiana during the fall.

Days before LSU's originally scheduled season opener against North Texas in Tiger Stadium, Hurricane Katrina blew ashore, packing tremendous winds, and turned the state, in particular New Orleans and southeastern Louisiana, upside down.

Massive flooding followed in the wake of the storm as more than 30 LSU players had their families and their homes affected by the hurricane and Miles' first game in Tiger Stadium against North Texas was postponed. With the LSU campus serving as the recovery center for those sick, homeless and displaced due to Hurricane Katrina, football seemed to be the farthest thing from most people's minds. However, Miles was able to successfully manage a delicate situation, one that saw his team and coaching staff volunteer time to those in need, while still attempting to focus on football for at least two hours a day.

After a week of trying to minimize the distractions for a football team that had their apartments and dorm rooms filled with displaced family members and friends due to the storm, it appeared that the Tigers would finally get to play a home game, this time against 15th-ranked Arizona State.

However, just as the Tigers began to prepare for the Sun Devils and the season opener in Tiger Stadium, it was learned that the devastation to New Orleans was much greater than originally thought. With the Maravich Center on the LSU campus serving as what would become the largest field triage unit in United States history, it was mutually decided to move the LSU vs. Arizona State game to Tempe.

Still, with many in Louisiana under the distress of Hurricane Katrina, the Tigers were going to have to take to the desert to face a powerful offense in their first game of the season.

These were certainly trying times for everyone in the state of Louisiana, but even more so for a football coach who now had his team carrying the banner for a state in need of a diversion. LSU football had become a release for those consumed with the hurricane. LSU even re-stated its team goals, putting playing for the state of Louisiana at the top of the list.

The Tigers didn't disappoint as Miles and his LSU team used a 28-point fourth quarter rally to come back to beat Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe.

Now with the Arizona State game behind them, it looked as if things for the LSU football team would gradually get back to normal as the Tigers now had a week off before facing Tennessee in Tiger Stadium on Sept. 24.

Then, the unthinkable happened. Another storm, this one named Rita, hit southwest Louisiana, causing severe damage to more homes, leaving thousands without electricity and displacing even more Louisianians. The combination of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita forced LSU to again shuffle its schedule. Instead of playing Tennessee on a Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers would now be forced to face the Volunteers on a Monday night. An emotionally drained LSU team saw a 21-0 halftime lead evaporate into a 30-27 overtime loss against the Vols.

There was no coaching handbook for Miles to refer to when it came to dealing with the hurricanes and preparing a team for competition during extreme adverse conditions. Miles was on his own, forced to navigate his LSU team through a treacherous stretch of games, while also being sympathetic to those still under the influence of the natural disasters.

With just five days between the Tennessee loss and the Mississippi State game, Miles and the Tigers were obviously dealt an unfair hand, however, he asked his team to respond and they did. The Mississippi State contest was the starting point for a stretch of games for the Tigers that saw LSU win nine straight. The 37-7 win over the Bulldogs was followed by a 34-6 road victory over Vanderbilt as the Tigers had re-established themselves as one of the nation's elite on the football field. During what would be 11-consecutive weeks of play, the Tigers posted a win over Florida along with overtime victories against Auburn and Alabama. In all, the Tigers beat four teams ranked among the top 15 in the nation, a school record for regular season victories over ranked opponents.

After 10 straight weeks of play during the regular season, the Tigers had fashioned a 7-1 conference mark and a berth in the SEC title game.

Miles became the only coach in his first year in the SEC to lead his squad to the league's title game. He also became the first coach in LSU history to beat Alabama, Auburn and Florida in the same season.

Following a loss to Georgia in the league's title game, Miles and the Tigers re-grouped, this time to beat No. 9 Miami, 40-3, in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win gave the Tigers 11 victories for the year, making Miles the winningest first-year coach in school history.

Tennessee is 7-1 overall and 3-1 in conference play. LSU has won two straight and four of its last five, while the Vols bring a 5-game winning streak into the contest.

## November Reign

LSU brings an 11-game winning streak in games played in November into the Tennessee contest. LSU hasn't lost in the month of November since a 21-20 last-second defeat to Arkansas in 2002. LSU was 4-0 in November in 2003 and then followed that with a 3-0 mark in November, 2004 and a 4-0 mark in November games last year. Dating back to the 2000 season, LSU is 18-3 in games played in November, which includes an 8-2 mark in road games. LSU coach Les Miles has won six straight November games dating back to his final season (2004) with Oklahoma State.

## Another Top 10 Ranked Road Opponent

LSU's game against No. 8 Tennessee will mark the third against a top 10 team on the road for the Tigers this year. It's the ONLY time in school history that LSU has faced three top 10 teams on the road in the same season. LSU has already played then-No. 3 Auburn (lost 7-3) and then-No. 5 Florida (lost 23-10). LSU closes out the season on the road against currently No. 12 ranked Arkansas. If Arkansas remains in the Top 25, it will mark the ONLY time in school history that every road game for LSU will come against a Top 25 team.

## Tigers Go After First Road Win In 2006

LSU heads to Knoxville on Saturday looking for its first road win in 2006. LSU is 0-2 on the road this year, dropping a 7-3 decision to then-No. 3 Auburn on Sept. 16 and then falling to then-No. 5 Florida, 23-10, on Oct. 7.

## Home and Road Has Been Like Night and Day For LSU

LSU is 6-0 at home this year and the Tigers have outscored their opponents 274 to 36 in those six contests. LSU is averaging 45.7 points in its six home games. On the road, it's been a different story as the Tigers are 0-2 and have only managed to score 13 points, while allowing 36 points.

## LSU vs. the SEC Eastern Division

The Tigers are 1-1 vs. the SEC Eastern Division this year, beating Kentucky and losing to Florida. LSU coach Les Miles has a 3-3 mark vs. SEC Eastern Division teams, which includes a loss to Georgia in the SEC Championship Game. Since going to the divisional format in 1992, LSU is 21-26-1 against teams from the SEC Eastern Division. However, since the 1996 season, the Tigers are 20-16 against foes from the east.

## LSU Is 5-2 In Road Games Under Miles

LSU brings a 5-2 mark in road games under Les Miles into the Tennessee contest. LSU won all five of its road games a year ago. The Tigers are 0-2 on the road this season.

## In The Polls

The Tigers remained No. 13 in all three major polls for a second straight week. LSU dropped a spot in the BCS Standings, falling to No. 17 this week. LSU has now been ranked for 59 consecutive polls by USA Today and 58 straight polls by the AP.

## LSU's Defense Has Gone 9 Quarters Without Allowing A TD

LSU's defense bring a streak of 9 consecutive quarters without allowing a touchdown into the Tennessee contest. LSU hasn't allowed a touchdown since the third quarter against Florida when Tim Tebow threw a 35-yard TD pass. The Tigers held the Gators scoreless in the fourth quarter and then followed that by holding Kentucky and Fresno State out of the endzone in consecutive games. Earlier this year, LSU had a streak of 16 straight quarters without allowing a TD before Auburn snapped it with a Brandon Cox run in the third quarter of the 7-3 loss.

## LSU's Defense Has Allowed Only 6 TDs All Season; Fewest Since 1970

LSU's defense goes into the Tennessee game having allowed just 6 touchdowns (3 rushing, 3 passing) all year. The 6 TDs allowed by the Tigers is the fewest through 8 games by an LSU team since 1970. That year, the Tigers also allowed 6 TDs in the first 8 games before finishing the season by allowing 10 scores.

## Tigers On CBS For Third Time; All Road Games In 2006 On CBS

LSU returns to CBS for the third time this year when they face Tennessee. LSU is 0-2 this year on CBS after losing to Auburn and Florida on the network. LSU is 19-18-1 all-time on CBS, which includes a 3-3 mark under Les Miles. LSU closes out the regular season against Arkansas on the Friday after Thanksgiving in a game that will also be televised by CBS.

## LSU Brings Nation's Top Rated Defense Into Tennessee Game

For the fourth straight week, LSU stands atop the national rankings in total defense, allowing only 211 yards per game. The Tigers also remain No. 1 in the nation in pass efficiency defense with an 85.6 rating and they are No. 2 in points allowed with an 8.25 average. In eight games this year, LSU's defense has allowed only 6 touchdowns (3 rushing and 3 passing). The following is a look at how LSU ranks nationally in all defensive categories:

Bowe's 21 career TD receptions is currently tied for 16th in SEC history. Bowe also ranks No. 8 in LSU history in career receptions (126) and he's No. 6 in career receiving yards (2,033).

## LSU Goes Without A Turnover For Second Straight Game

For the second time this year, LSU has now gone back-to-back games without committing a turnover. The Tigers didn't commit turnovers in wins over Kentucky and Fresno State. LSU goes into the Tennessee game having not committed a turnover since the fourth quarter of the Florida game. LSU has had 58 minutes and 57 seconds of possession time without a turnover. Earlier this year, LSU went without a turnover in consecutive games against Auburn and Tulane.

## LSU Sack Streak At 14 Straight, Interception Streak Snapped Against Fresno State at 8

LSU ran its streak of games with a sack to 14 straight against Fresno State. However, LSU's streak of games with an interception was snapped against Fresno State as the Tigers didn't record an interception for the first time since the Miami game a year ago. The last time LSU failed to record a sack came last year against North Texas.

## LSU Is Nation's Fourth Best Team Away From Tiger Stadium Since 2003 Season

## Tigers Have Scored At Least 40 Points Five Times This Year

By racking up 49 points against Kentucky, LSU has now gone over the 40-point mark a school-record tying five times this year. The 2003 team scored 40 points five times in 14 games that year. This year's team became the first squad in school history to score 40 or more points during the first seven weeks of a season.

## Tigers Have Scored 287 Points In 8 Games

LSU's 287 points through the first 8 games is the most ever in modern history for a Tiger team at this point in a season. The only LSU team to score more points during the first 8 games of a year came in 1930 when that Tiger team scored 289 points in the first 8 contests.

## LSU Defense Has Allowed Only 66 Points In 8 Games, Fewest Since 1970

By allowing only 66 points in the first 8 games of the season, the LSU defense has surrendered the fewest points by a Tiger team since the 1970 squad. In 1970, the Tigers allowed only 65 points over the first 8 games of the season.

## LSU Defense Tabbed "Baddest In the Land" By the Sporting News

LSU's defense has been named the "Baddest in the Land" by the Sporting News in the Oct. 16 issue. The Sporting News said of the LSU defense, "it starts with the best defensive player in the country, tackle Glenn Dorsey, the leader of a wicked-good front seven. The emergence of shutdown corner Chevis Jackson completes the unit. Other teams on the list include Michigan at No. 2, Texas at No. 3, Florida at No. 4 and Ohio State at No. 5.

## LSU's Highsmith Named A Semifinalist For Butkus Award

LSU linebacker Ali Highsmith is one of 10 players from across the country who has been named as semifinalists for the Butkus Award. The Butkus Award is presented annually to the top linebacker in college football. In 8 games this year, Highsmith has recorded 34 tackles, 4.5 tackles for losses and 3 sacks for the nation's top-rated defense. He also has a forced fumble, two pass breakups and a quarterback hurry to his credit this season.

## LSU's Jackson On Mid-Season Watch List For Hendricks Award

LSU DE Tyson Jackson is one of 28 players named to the mid-season watch list for the Hendricks Award, the Ted Hendricks Foundation announced. The award goes to the top defensive end in college football. Jackson, a sophomore from Edgard, La., has 23 tackles, six sacks, 6.5 tackles for losses and 4 QB hurries.

## LSU's Landry Named Quarterfinalist For Lott Trophy

LSU S LaRon Landry is one of 17 players who have been named as quarterfinalists for the Lott Trophy, the Pacific Club IMPACT Foundation announced on Thursday. Named after Hall of Famer Ronnie Lott, The Lott Trophy is awarded to college football's Defensive IMPACT Player of the Year. Now in its third year, The Lott Trophy is the first and only college football award to equally recognize athletic performance and the personal character attributes of the player. In his fourth season as a starter for the Tigers, Landry currently is second on the LSU squad in tackles with 40. He also has two tackles for losses, one interception and a blocked punt for the nation's No. 1 rated defense.

## Miles' 17 Wins After 21 Games Second-Highest Total In LSU History

LSU coach Les Miles has won 17 of his first 21 games, which ranks second for the most victories during that span in LSU history. Bernie Moore holds the mark by posting an 18-2-1 mark during his first 21 games as the Tigers head coach. ## LSU's Landry And Dorsey On CBS Sportsline.com Halfway to All-America Team

CBS Sportsline.com has named Tiger DT Glenn Dorsey and FS LaRon Landry to their Halfway to All-America Team. Dorsey and Landry lead an LSU defensive unit that ranks first in the nation in total defense and the Tigers are second nationally in scoring defense. Dorsey, a junior from Gonzales, La., has 35 tackles, seven tackles for losses and a pair of sacks for the 13th-ranked Tigers. Dorsey earned Southeastern Conference Defensive Lineman of the Week twice this year for his performances against Arizona and Auburn. Against Arizona, Dorsey recorded four tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss in the 45-3 LSU victory. A week later against Auburn, Dorsey registered a career-high eight tackles, including three for losses and 1.5 sacks in the 7-3 setback. Landry, who has started 43 straight games for the Tigers dating back to his true freshman season in 2003, is second in the team with 40 tackles. He also has two tackles for losses, one interception, three QB hurries and a blocked punt.

## LSU's Dorsey Named Mid-Season All-America By SI.com

In addition to the midseason honor by CBS Sportsline.com, LSU DT Glenn Dorsey has also been cited as a midseason First-Team All-America by Sports Illustrated and SI.com.

## LSU Starting Defense Has Allowed Only 40 Points This Year

While LSU may be allowing 8.2 points per game, the Tiger starting defense is responsible for allowing only 40 of the 66 points scored by the opponents this year. LSU's starting defense yielded field goals against Louisiana-Lafayette and Mississippi State, a touchdown against Auburn, three touchdowns against Florida, one of which came after an LSU turnover at its own 19-yard line, and a pair of field goals against Fresno State.

## Quick Starting Tigers

LSU's been good at getting off to quick starts this year as the Tigers have scored on their first possession in seven of eight games this year. The only game in which LSU didn't score on their opening possession came against Auburn. The following is a look at the quick starts LSU's offense has gotten off to this year:

The Tigers are 60-5 when scoring 20 or more points and 51-2 when scoring at least 25 points in a game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 5-15 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 19-6 in games decided by 7 points or less and 9-3 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 45-4 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 team rushing yards and the Tigers are 27-1 when having a player rush for 100 yards.

## First Half 3-And-Outs For The Opposition

One of the keys to LSU's defensive success has been keeping the Tigers fresh early in the game. First half drives of over three plays are anything but common for the Tiger opposition this year. Through 7 games, LSU has allowed only 20 first half points and of the 43 first half possessions for Tiger opponents, 22 ended after 3 plays or less. The longest first half drive allowed by the Tigers this year is 72 yards (vs. Florida - resulted in TD) and the longest the LSU defense has been on the field in the first half is 8:31 (vs. Auburn). In SEC games against Auburn and Mississippi State, LSU held both of those teams to a combined 25 first quarter yards (minus 1-yard for Auburn and 25 yards for Miss. State). ## Miles Is 9-3 In SEC Games

LSU coach Les Miles is now 9-3 in SEC games, which is the best start for a Tiger coach since 1987-88 when Mike Archer won 9 of his first 11 games as the Tiger head coach.

## Russell No. 3 In School History In Passing TDs; He's No.5 In Passing Yards

LSU QB JaMarcus Russell has now climbed into the top 5 in LSU history in both TD passes and passing yards. Russell ranks third in school history in TD passes with 39 and he's fifth in passing yards with 5,406. For his career, Russell has connected on 396 of 648 passes for 5,406 yards, 39 TDs and just 17 interceptions. Russell's 396 completions ranks No. 5 in LSU history, while his 648 attempts is also No. 5.

## Bowe Sets Career-High With 3 TD Catches Against Kentucky

Senior WR Dwayne Bowe set a career-high with 3 touchdown receptions against Kentucky. Bowe caught 2 first half TD passes and then added another in the third quarter. For the game, Bowe finished with 6 receptions for 111 yards and 3 scores, including a 48-yarder in the second quarter.

## Tigers Have 3 Receivers With Over 1,000 Career Yards

LSU's trio of receivers - Buster Davis, Dwayne Bowe and Early Doucet - all have over 1,000 yards receiving in their career. Doucet went over the 1,000-yard mark against Kentucky with 4 catches for 54 yards. Bowe is tops on the list with 2,033 yards on 126 catches, while Davis has 1,867 yards on 127 receptions. Doucet has 1,049 yards on 73 receptions. This year, the trio has combined for 107 catches for 1,618 yards and 13 touchdowns.

## Russell Has Career Day Against Mississippi State

LSU QB JaMarcus Russell had a career-day against Mississippi State. Russell threw for a career-best 330 yards and tied a career-high with 3 TD passes (all in the first half) against the Bulldogs. In addition, he tied a school-record with 14 consecutive completions in the contest and he tied another school record for completion percentage by connecting on 18 of 20 passes (.900 percent) in the contest. Russell did all of this despite not playing in the fourth quarter of the contest.

### Craig Davis Reception Streak At 31 Straight

Senior WR **Craig Davis** has caught at least one pass in 31 straight games. The streak dates back to LSU's season-opener in 2003 against Oregon State. Davis caught at least one pass in all 12 games a year ago. Davis missed the Mississippi State and Florida contests with injuries a year ago. In 11 games in 2005, Davis caught 35 passes for 559 yards and 2 TDs. This year, Davis ranks first on the team with 41 catches for 595 yards and 2 TDs.

### Russell-To-Bowe TD Combination Now Second Best Combo In School History

The pitch and catch combination of **JaMarcus Russell-to-Dwayne Bowe** ran their TD streak to 18 with a score against Fresno State. The 18 touchdowns between the pair (Russell throwing and Bowe catching) ranks as the second most prolific scoring combo in school history. Russell and Bowe hooked up for 8 TDs in 2005 after combining for 4 scores in 2004. This year, the duo has combined for 6 touchdowns. Tommy Hodson-to-Wendell Davis ranks as the most prolific TD combination in school history as the duo accounted for 21 touchdowns during their careers. ### Colt David PAT Streak At 67 Straight

LSU PK **Colt David** ran his streak of successful PATs to 67 straight by connecting on all five of his attempts against Fresno State. The 67 straight successful PATs ranks as the third-longest streak in school history, trailing only David Browndyke (109 straight) and Andre' Lafleur (69).

### Tyson Jackson Ranks No. 3 in SEC In Sacks

LSU DE **Tyson Jackson** ranks No. 3 in the SEC in sacks with an average of .75 per game. In 8 games, Jackson has recorded 6 sacks, which have accounted for 30 yards in losses.

### 2005: A Year of Firsts For LSU and Les Miles

A year ago, **Les Miles** set several milestones for first-year LSU coaches as he guided the Tigers to 11 wins, making him the winningest first-year Tiger coach in school history. In addition, Miles became the only coach in school history to beat Florida, Auburn and Alabama in the same season. LSU beat Florida 21-17 on Oct. 15, then followed that with a 20-17 overtime win over Auburn a week later. The 16-13 overtime win over Alabama clinched the feat for Miles. He was also the first coach in SEC history to lead his team to the SEC Championship Game in his first year in the league. Miles currently is 17-4 as LSU's head coach and he's 45-25 overall in 5-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach.

### LSU's Allowed Only 6 TDs In Last 40 Quarters

The LSU defense goes into the Tennessee game having allowed only 6 touchdowns over the last 40 quarters of play. The streak dates back to the second half of the SEC Championship Game against Georgia. LSU ran its streak of quarters without allowing a TD to 16 straight before Auburn scored on a 1-yard TD run in the third quarter in week 3. Through 8 games in 2006, LSU has allowed only 23 first half points. Florida became the first team this year to score a touchdown in the first half against LSU.

### Tigers Have Outscored Opponents 327-69 Over Last 28 Quarters

Dating back to the Miami (Fla.) game in last year's Peach Bowl, the Tigers have outscored their opposition 327-69. That stretch has had the Tigers scoring over 40 points six times, while holding their opponents to a combined 7 touchdowns (3 by Florida, 2 by Miss. State and 1 by Auburn and Tulane), 6 field goals (2 by Fresno state, 1 by Miami, UL-Lafayette, Arizona and Miss. State) and a safety (by Florida).

### Tigers First In SEC In Sacks By; Third in Sacks Against

LSU goes into the Tennessee game ranked first in the SEC in sacks, having recorded 26 through its first 8 games of the year. In addition, the Tigers are third in the league in sacks allowed as the LSU offensive line has yielded only 10 sacks this season.

### Tiger Defense Has Scored In Two Games This Year

LSU's defense has supplied points for the Tigers in two games this year as CB **Jonathan Zenon** has returned a pair of interceptions for touchdowns for the Tigers. Zenon opened the year by returning an interception 20 yards for a first quarter score against Louisiana-Lafayette. A week later he followed with an interception return of 41-yards for a touchdown against Arizona. The Zenon interception return for a score against Arizona marked the fourth time under defensive coordinator **Bo Pelini** that the Tiger defense has scored a touchdown. ## Steltz Picked Off A Pass In Four Straight Games, A First In LSU History

LSU S Craig Steltz intercepted a pass for the fourth straight game with a fourth quarter pick against Mississippi State. Steltz is the first player in LSU history to intercept a pass in four straight games. His streak of games with an interception came to an end against Florida. Steltz has returned his four interceptions a total of 111 yards, which includes a 76-yard return against Tulane in week 4. He's averaging 27.8 yards per return.

## Doucet Scores By Land And Air Against Tulane

Early Doucet scored a career-best 3 touchdowns against Tulane, all coming in the first half. Doucet scored on a 17-yard run as well as catching TD passes of 12 and 4 yards. Doucet became the first LSU wide receiver to score both a rushing TD and a receiving TD in the same game since Michael Clayton did it against Ole Miss in 2001.

## Charles Scott Gives Tigers First 100-Yard Back In 2006

LSU true freshman Charles Scott rushed for a career-best 101 yards and 2 touchdowns against Tulane becoming the first Tiger to reach the 100-yard mark this year. In reaching the 100-yard mark in his third career game, Scott becomes the quickest LSU true freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since 1995 when Kevin Faulk went for 171 yards against Mississippi State in the second game of his career. Scott is also the first LSU true freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since 2003 when both Justin Vincent and Alley Broussard did it.

## Zenon Joins Elite Club

With his 41-yard interception return for a touchdown against Arizona, LSU CB Jonathan Zenon is the first Tiger since at least the 1960s to return interceptions for scores in back-to-back games. Zenon is also the first LSU player since Jack Hunt in 2003 to have two interceptions returned for touchdowns in the same season.

## Keeping Them Under 20 Points

LSU goes into the Tennessee game having held 17 of its last 19 opponents, 10 of which are SEC foes, to 20 points or less, a streak that dates back to early last year. Prior to the Georgia game in the SEC Championship, LSU held 9 straight opponents to 20 points. It was the longest streak since 2003 when the Tigers did it for the first 11 weeks of the season on their way to claiming both the SEC and National titles.

## LSU O-Line Goes From Grey to Green

A year ago, LSU had one of the most experienced offensive lines in school history, as the starting five up front combined for 146 career starts (Andrew Whitworth - 52, Nate Livings - 34, Rudy Niswanger - 31, Brian Johnson - 16, and Will Arnold - 14). This year, the Tigers went into the season with an offensive line that had combined for 32 career starts. Johnson and Arnold combined for 30 of the 32 starts, while center Brett Helms made up the other two. Peter Dyakowski and Ciron Black both made their first career starts against Louisiana-Lafayette. LSU QB JaMarcus Russell is now 19-4 as a starter for the Tigers after last week's loss to Florida. Russell won 17 of his first 20 starts for the Tigers, ranking him second behind Matt Mauck as the quickest LSU quarterback to 17 victories. Mauck won 17 of his first 19 games and 18 of his first 20 starts. Mauck finished his career with an 18-2 mark as the Tiger starter. Russell posted a 10-2 mark in 2005 after going 4-0 as a redshirt freshman in 2004. He's 5-2 this year.

## Landry Runs Starting Streak to 43 Straight

LSU All-America free safety LaRon Landry ran his streak of consecutive starts to 43 straight against Fresno State. Landry, from Ama, La., has been in the LSU lineup since the Mississippi State contest (week 5) in 2003. The 43 straight starts ranks as the fifth-longest streak in the Division IA.

## LSU Streak Of Holding Opponents To Under 200 Yards Of Offense Snapped By Tulane

LSU's streak of holding opponents to fewer than 200 yards of offense came to an end at four game in the fourth quarter against Tulane in week 4. With the Tiger starters on the bench, LSU's reserves couldn't keep the Green Wave under 200 yards as Tulane finished the contest with 231 yards of offense, 90 of which came in the fourth quarter. It's marked the first time a team has gone over the 200-yard mark against the Tigers since the SEC Championship game last year against Georgia. The streak was the first time in school history that LSU held four consecutive opponents to fewer than 200 yards in a game.

## This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

Myth has it that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The facts show that since 1960, LSU is 200-59-3 (.768) at night under the lights compared to a 19-22-3 (.466) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 41-6 overall at home, which includes a 33-4 (.889) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 8-2 (.800) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 11 games at home during the day in 34 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted an 11-20-3 (.368) record at home during the day. ## 75 YEARS UNDER THE LIGHTS SATURDAY NIGHT IN DEATH VALLEY



• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 82nd year in the venerable stadium. LSU is also celebrating the 75th anniversary of playing under the light of Tiger Stadium. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.

• LSU has won 29 OF ITS LAST 32 games at home.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 45 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 35 times, including a school-record 92,664 for the Oct. 22, 2005 game that pitted No. 7 LSU against No. 15 Auburn. LSU won the game 20-17.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 46 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 44 of the 46 years and in the top 10 on 38 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP SIX IN THE NATION, including the last five.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 200-59-3 (.769) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 19-22-3 (.466) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

"I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised. ## Tigers Fall to Tennessee in Overtime, 30-27

Tennessee rallied from a 21-0 halftime deficit to post a 30-27 overtime win over LSU in a rare Monday night game in Tiger Stadium. The Tennessee contest served as the home-opener for the Tigers as scheduled home games against North Texas (postponed until Oct. 29) and Arizona State (moved to Tempe) were changed due to Hurricane Katrina. LSU wasted little in jumping on the Vols as Joseph Addai raced 19-yards for a score on the Tigers' first play from scrimmage early in the first quarter. Addai's TD was setup following a UT fumble at the LSU 19-yard line. From there, the Tigers stretched their lead to as much as 21-0 when Kenneth Hollis returned an Erik pass three yards for a TD late in the second quarter. The momentum shifted to Tennessee in the second half, as the Vols scored 17 fourth quarter points, including a 28-yard field goal with just over two minutes left in the contest to force overtime. In overtime, LSU's Colt David connected on a 31-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 27-24 following their possession. However, UT clinched the victory on its possession when Gerald Riggs scored on a 1-yard run for the Vols. Addai led the Tigers with 84 yards rushing and 1 TD, while QB JaMarcus Russell completed 14 of 28 passes for 158 yards.

## Russell, Defense Dominant In 45-3 Dismantling Of Louisiana-Lafayette

JaMarcus Russell looked to be in mid-season form and the Tiger defense seemed to pick up where last season left off as eight-ranked LSU rolled to a 45-3 season-opening win over Louisiana-Lafayette. Russell, seeing his first action since the SEC title game a year ago, connected on 13-of-17 passes for 253 yards and threw a career-high 3 TD passes in the victory, including a 58-yarder to Brandon LaFell on LSU's first possession of the contest. Minutes later CB Jonathan Zenon returned an interception 20-yards for a touchdown, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead just five minutes into the game. ULL's only points came early in the second quarter on a field goal as the Tiger defense stretched its streak of not allowing a touchdown to 10 quarters. The Tigers closed out the first half with Russell throwing TD passes to Early Doucet and Dwayne Bowe as LSU led 28-3 at halftime. Jacob Hester and Alley Broussard added TD runs in the second half for the Tigers as LSU rolled up 469 yards of offense compared to just eight first downs and 176 yards for the Cajuns. For the contest, LSU's three quarterbacks combined to connect on 17-of-23 passes for 299 yards and 3 scores, while the Tigers racked up 170 yards on the ground, with Broussard leading the way with 46 yards on eight carries in his first action since a severe knee injury in August of 2005.

**LSU Overwhelms Arizona, 45-3**

LSU struck early and often and never looked back as the Tigers scored on their first possession for the second straight week on their way to a 45-3 win over Arizona. LSU's defense also added first quarter points for the second straight week when **Jonathan Zenon** returned an interception 41 yards for a score, giving LSU a 14-0 lead. The Tigers extended their lead to 24-0 early in the second quarter on a 17-yard run by **Alley Broussard**. LSU extended the lead to 38-0 in the third quarter with a pair of touchdowns in a two minute span, the first coming on a 28-yard run by **Jacob Hester** and the second coming on a 29-yard TD pass from **JaMarcus Russell** to **Dwayne Bowe**. **Charles Scott** capped the LSU scoring midway through the fourth quarter with a 38-yard run. For the game, the Tigers racked up 461 yards of offense compared to just 152 yards for Arizona. Russell threw for 196 yards and 2 scores, while Hester rushed for 43 yards and a score and caught 6 passes for 53 yards and a touchdown. Defensively, the Tigers intercepted 3 passes and forced a fumble in limiting the Wildcats to just three fourth quarter points. LB **Darry Beckwith** led the Tigers with 9 tackles and 1.5 sacks, while SS **Jessie Daniels** had 5 tackles, a tackle for a loss and forced a fumble.

**LSU Loses Defensive Battle to No. 3 Auburn, 7-3**

LSU held Auburn to only 7 points and just 182 yards of total offense, but it wasn't enough as No. 3 Auburn held off LSU, 7-3, in Jordan-Hare Stadium. Trailing 3-0 late in the third quarter, Auburn used a 12-play, 75-yard drive capped with a 1-yard run by QB Brandon Cox to take a 7-3 lead against LSU. That score would hold up as LSU had a last-minute drive stopped at the Auburn 4-yard line as time expired. In a game that featured two of the nation's top defenses, LSU took a 3-0 halftime lead when PK **Colt David** drilled a 42-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter. The David field goal capped a 13-play, 55-yard drive for the Tigers. QB **JaMarcus Russell** highlighted the Tiger offense by completing 20 of 35 passes for 269 yards. LSU, which had 311 yards of total offense in the contest, managed just 42 yards on the ground with RB **Alley Broussard** and **Justin Vincent** each totaling 16 yards rushing. The Tiger defense, led by LB **Darry Beckwith** and DT **Glenn Dorsey**, held Auburn to only 72 yards rushing in the contest. Of its 9 possessions, Auburn went 3-and-out five times, including all four of its first quarter possessions.

**Tigers Dominant In All Phases in 49-7 Win Over Tulane**

LSU bounced back from its disappointing loss to Auburn a week earlier with a 49-7 victory over Tulane in Tiger Stadium. LSU scored early and often in the contest, building a 14-0 first quarter lead and then stretching it to 28-0 at halftime. Early Doucet scored three first half touchdowns, two on passes from JaMarcus Russell and the other coming on a 17-yard run. Freshman Charles Scott added an 8-yard run to cap the first half scoring for the Tigers. Scott added another scoring run in the third quarter as the Tigers built a 35-0 lead. Scott finished the game with a career-best 101 yards rushing as the Tigers had 201 yards on the ground in the contest. LSU rounded out the scoring with TD runs of 7-yards by Matt Flynn and 6-yards by Jacob Hester. For the game, LSU limited the Green Wave to just 231 total yards and one fourth quarter touchdown, which came against LSU's defensive backups. Tulane did become the first team in 2006 to surpass the 200-yard mark on the Tigers as the Green Wave eclipsed the mark late in the fourth quarter against LSU defensive reserves. Russell connected on 17 of 23 passes for 198 yards and 2 TDs. As a team, the Tigers rushed for 5 scores in the game.

**Russell Passes LSU Past Mississippi State, 48-17**

LSU scored touchdowns on its first five possessions, building a 35-0 lead just 20 minutes into the contest as the ninth-ranked Tigers rolled to a 48-17 win over Mississippi State. The game was delayed 52 minutes just after halftime due to lightning. LSU led 35-3 when the game was halted with just over 10 minutes left in the third quarter. **JaMarcus Russell** completed 15 of his first 16 passes on his way to the best passing day of his career. Russell finished 18 of 20 for a career-best 330 yards and 3 TDs. Russell threw first half TD passes of 9, 37, and 6 yards. For the game, the Tigers piled up 446 yards of total offense, including 338 passing and 108 rushing. **Charles Scott**, making his first career start, rushed for 27 yards and 2 TDs for the Tigers. **Jacob Hester** led the Tigers in rushing with 49 yards and 1 TD. **Craig Davis** led LSU in receiving with 6 receptions for 101 yards and a TD, while **Dwayne Bowe** added 5 catches for 95 yards and a score. Defensively, LSU limited State to just 14 yards rushing and 226 yards of offense. LSU sacked MSU quarterbacks five times as the Tigers held the Bulldogs to 3-and-out on five of their seven first half possessions.

**Special Teams Blunders Doom Tigers in 23-10 Loss to Florida**

Fumbles on a punt return and a kickoff return along with a blocked punt were too much for LSU to overcome as the Tigers dropped a 23-10 decision to Florida in Gainesville. In all, LSU turned the ball over five times, including once at the Florida 1-yard line, leading to 16 of the Gators' 23 points, including all 14 of their first half points. LSU took the early lead in the contest, scoring on a 2-yard pass from **JaMarcus Russell** to **Jacob Hester** midway through the first quarter. The Tigers appeared to be in control of the game after forcing the Gators to punt on their next possession. However, **Chevis Jackson** muffed the punt and Florida recovered at the LSU 19-yard line. The Gators tied the game six plays later. LSU again looked to have regained control of the contest, going 75 yards on 17 plays before a fumble on the center-quarterback exchange at the Florida 1-yard line. The Gators took the lead for good just before halftime on a 1-yard scoring pass play. LSU then fumbled the second half kickoff resulting in a safety for the Gators. Florida took the ensuing kickoff and went 67 yards on five plays to take a 23-10 lead early in the third quarter. LSU had its chances down the stretch, but interceptions deep in Florida territory, erased those scoring opportunities for the Tigers. Russell finished the game with 228 yards passing and 1 TD as he connected on 24 of 41 attempts. **Craig Davis** led the Tigers with 8 catches for 85 yards, while Hester rushed for 43 yards on 9 carries. **LaRon Landry** tallied 12 tackles and blocked a fourth quarter punt to pace a Tiger defense that limited Florida to 288 yards of offense.

A balanced offense and a stingy defense proved just too much for Kentucky as the Tigers rolled to a 49-0 win over Kentucky in Tiger Stadium. **LSU Defense Shuts Down Fresno State in 38-6 Win in Wet Tiger Stadium**

The LSU defense stretched its streak of not allowing a TD to 9 straight quarters as the Tigers had little trouble in a 38-6 non-conference win over Fresno State in a wet Tiger Stadium. Despite an afternoon filled with rain and lightning in the Baton Rouge area, the game was delayed just four minutes after the teams mutually agreed upon a 10-minute warm-period. It didn't seem to bother the Tigers as LSU needed only 5 plays to score its first TD, which came on a 38-yard run by **Trindon Holliday** at the 10:52 mark in the first quarter. LSU's **Craig Davis** followed that with a 77-yard punt return for a TD, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead just seven minutes into the contest. LSU led 17-3 at halftime. In the second half, **Alley Broussard** scored on a 21-yard to stretch the margin to 24-6 late in the third quarter. LSU opened the fourth quarter with a 58-yard TD pass from **JaMarcus Russell** to **Dwayne Bowe**, which tied the school record for career receiving TDs at 21. Russell connected with Davis on a 30-yard scored four minutes later to cap the scoring for the Tigers. For the game, LSU gained 394 yards of offense, while holding Fresno State to just 211 yards and only 11 first downs.
