LSU To Face Tennessee In SEC Championship Game; Tigers Go After 10th League Title

LSU will go after its 10th Southeastern Conference title on Saturday when the seventh-ranked Tigers meet 14th-ranked Tennessee in the league's championship game at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. Kickoff for the contest is scheduled for 3 p.m. CT and will be televised by CBS. LSU brings a 10-2 overall mark into the game after last week's 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas. Both of LSU's losses this year have come in triple-overtime. The Tigers also dropped a 43-37 decision to Kentucky in three extra periods on Oct. 13. LSU has also won at least 10 games for an unprecedented three straight seasons, all of which have come under head coach **Les Miles**. Tennessee brings a 9-3 overall mark into the contest. The Volunteers are coming off a 52-50 win over Kentucky last Saturday in a game that took four overtimes to decide. The game will mark the first between the Tigers and Vols this year. Last year, LSU posted a 28-24 win over Tennessee in Knoxville. It will also mark the second time that LSU and Tennessee will meet in the league's title game. LSU beat the Vols, 31-20, in 2001 to claim the school's first outright SEC title since 1986. Saturday's appearance in the SEC Championship Game will mark LSU's fourth appearance in the contest, all coming this decade. LSU has appeared in the SEC Championship Game in 2001, '03, and '05. LSU won the 2003 game, beating Georgia, 34-13, on its way to claiming the BCS National Championship that year. The Tigers dropped a 34-14 decision to Georgia in 2005. LSU goes into the Tennessee game with the league's top rated defense, allowing 278.9 yards per game. Offensively, the Tigers have scored a school-record 482 points this year, which includes going over the 40-point mark a school-record seven times. LSU is averaging 40.2 points per game. RB **Jacob Hester** leads the squad with 897 yards rushing and 11 TDs, while QB **Matt Flynn** has thrown for 2,233 yards and 17 scores. Defensively, S **Craig Steltz** is tops on the squad with 89 tackles and he's first in the SEC with 6 interceptions.

LSU Falls To Arkansas In Triple OT, 50-48

Matt Flynn's potential game-tying two-point conversion in triple-overtime was intercepted as top-ranked LSU dropped a 50-48 decision to Arkansas in the regular-season finale in Tiger Stadium. The loss snapped LSU's 19-game home winning streak and it also marked the Tigers' first loss in a game played in November since 2002. In a game that featured five ties, Arkansas came out on top as the Tigers' couldn't contain the Razorback rushing attack as Arkansas rushed for 385 yards and five scores. Arkansas led 7-6 at halftime and then built a 14-6 lead early in the third quarter before the Tigers tied the score on a 12-yard run by **Jacob Hester**. Arkansas regained at 21-14 on a 65-yard TD run, but the Tigers came back to tie the game on a 7-yard TD pass from **Flynn** to **Demetrius Byrd**. Trailing 28-21 late in the contest, LSU tied the game at 28-28 with less than a minute left when **Flynn** on fourth-and-goal, connected with **Byrd** on a 2-yard TD pass to send the game into overtime. The teams traded touchdowns in the first two overtimes before the game-clincher in the third extended period. Arkansas took the lead for good in the third overtime when the converted on the two-point conversion, running its lead to 50-42. LSU responded on its possession during the third overtime, this time **Flynn** connected with **Brandon LaFell** on a 9-yard TD pass bringing the Tigers to with 50-48. LSU's attempt on the two-point conversion was denied as Arkansas beat the Tigers for the first time since 2002. For the game, **Hester** led the Tigers with 126 yards and 2 TDs, while **Flynn** threw for 209 yards and 3 scores. **Ali Highsmith** had 19 tackles to pace the Tigers on defense.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Les Miles' first two years with the Tigers have been unmatched in the history of the program. The results are impressive and staggering: 22 wins; 13 SEC victories; eight wins over top 25 teams; five wins over top 10 teams; back-to-back top five final rankings; two bowl victories, including one BCS bowl win; 12 NFL Draft picks and four first-team All-Americans.

After leading LSU to an 11-2 mark and a top five national ranking in his first year as LSU's head coach in 2005, many wondered just what Miles would do for an encore. His second year with the Tigers proved to be another year full of milestones and firsts as he guided the Tigers to another 11-2 overall record, culminating with a 41-14 dismantling of 11th-ranked Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

The Tigers finished their second year under the direction of Miles ranked No. 3 in the nation, marking the first time since the 1958-59 seasons that LSU was ranked in the top five in the country in back-to-back years.

LSU's at-large berth in a BCS bowl was a first in school history and it also represented the third time this decade that the Tigers ended their season in the Sugar Bowl.

In 2006, Miles became the first coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to back-to-back 10-wins seasons and with 22 victories in his first 26 games as the school's head coach, his win total matched Bernie Moore for the most in school history over that span. He also became the first LSU coach since Jerry Stovall in 1982 to beat two top 10-ranked teams on the road in the same season as the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee in Knoxville followed by a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in Little Rock.

The Tigers were able to accomplish all of this during the 2006 season despite having to face four top eight opponents on the road, also a first in school history. LSU posted a 2-2 mark in those road games, which included November wins over Tennessee and Arkansas that propelled the Tigers to a berth in a BCS bowl.

LSU opened the 2006 season in grand style, posting identical 45-3 wins over Louisiana-Lafayette and Arizona. After a gut-wrenching 7-3 loss at No. 3 Auburn, the Tigers reeled off decisive wins over both Tulane (49-7) and Mississippi State (48-17). Following a 23-10 setback to eventual national champion Florida, the Tigers responded with seven-straight wins to end the season, starting with a 49-0 victory over a Kentucky team who went on to win eight games and beat Clemson in a bowl game.

The Tigers capped the 2006 season with its 41-14 win over an overmatched Notre Dame team in the Sugar Bowl, giving the Tigers their third win in a BCS game since the 2001 season. The three wins for the Tigers in BCS bowl games since the 2000 season is the most of any SEC team during that span.

With a 6-2 SEC mark in 2006, Miles ran his record in conference games to 13-3, which trails only Bernie Moore as the best start for an LSU head coach in league games in school history. Moore won 15 of his first 16 conference games from 1934-36.

With a makeshift offensive line that featured three first-time starters and a pair of true freshmen running backs having to plug holes in a depleted backfield, the Tigers still managed to lead the SEC in total offense (411 yards per game) and scoring offense (33.7 points per game), while ranking No. 2 in the league in rushing offense (165 yards per game). Defensively, (the Tigers, despite losing three defensive linemen to the NFL Draft from the year before), ranked among the top four in the nation in scoring defense, total defense and pass defense.

In all, the Tigers fashioned its 11-2 record against seven teams who went on to play in bowl games as LSU's schedule was ranked as the 12th toughest in the nation according to the NCAA.

Even though the Tigers had to go on the road to face four top 10-ranked teams in 2006, year two under Miles seemed somewhat ordinary compared to what the Tigers had to endure during his first year in Baton Rouge.

In Miles' inaugural season at LSU he led the Tigers to only the third 11-win season in school history, to a top five national ranking and a berth in the SEC Championship Game despite numerous distractions that covered most of the months of September and October.

The Tigers, playing without starting quarterback and future No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick JaMarcus Russell, put an exclamation point on the year with a 40-3 win over No. 9 Miami in the Peach Bowl to finish with an 11-2 overall mark and a No. 5 national ranking.

To appreciate just how adverse the conditions that Miles and the Tigers had to overcome in 2005, you have to go back to late August and Hurricane Katrina, the first of two storms to devastate the state of Louisiana during the fall.

Days before LSU's originally scheduled season opener against North Texas in Tiger Stadium, Hurricane Katrina blew ashore, packing tremendous winds, and turned the state, in particular New Orleans and southeastern Louisiana, upside down.

Massive flooding followed in the wake of the storm as more than 30 LSU players had their families and their homes affected by the hurricane and Miles' first game in Tiger Stadium against North Texas was postponed. With the LSU campus serving as the recovery center for those sick, homeless and displaced due to Hurricane Katrina, football seemed to be the farthest thing from most people's minds. However, Miles was able to successfully manage a delicate situation, one that saw his team and coaching staff volunteer time to those in need, while still attempting to focus on football for at least two hours a day.

After a week of trying to minimize the distractions for a football team that had their apartments and dorm rooms filled with displaced family members and friends due to the storm, it appeared that the Tigers would finally get to play a home game, this time against 15th-ranked Arizona State.

Still, with many in Louisiana under the distress of Hurricane Katrina, the Tigers were going to have to take to the desert to face a powerful offense in their first game of the season.

These were certainly trying times for everyone in the state of Louisiana, but even more so for a football coach who now had his team carrying the banner for a state in need of a diversion. LSU football had become a release for those consumed with the hurricane. LSU even re-stated its team goals, putting playing for the state of Louisiana at the top of the list.

The Tigers didn't disappoint as Miles and his LSU team used a 28-point fourth quarter rally to come back to beat Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe. Now with the Arizona State game behind them, it looked as if things for the LSU football team would gradually get back to normal as the Tigers now had a week off before facing Tennessee in Tiger Stadium on Sept. 24.

Then, the unthinkable happened. Another storm, this one named Rita, hit southwest Louisiana, causing severe damage to more homes, leaving thousands without electricity and displacing even more Louisiana natives. The combination of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita forced LSU to again shuffle its schedule. Instead of playing Tennessee on a Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers would now be forced to face the Volunteers on a Monday night. An emotionally drained LSU team saw a 21-0 halftime lead evaporate into a 30-27 overtime loss against the Vols.

Miles became the only coach in his first year in the SEC to lead his squad to the league's title game. He also became the first coach in LSU history to beat Alabama, Auburn and Florida in the same season.

Following a loss to Georgia in the league's title game, Miles and the Tigers re-grouped, this time to beat No. 9 Miami, 40-3, in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win gave the Tigers 11 victories for the year, making Miles the winningest first-year coach in school history.

Miles, the 2002 Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year and former assistant with Michigan, Colorado and the Dallas Cowboys who built Oklahoma State into a force in the Big 12, became LSU's 32nd head football coach on Jan. 3, 2005.

During his two years with the Tigers, Miles has put together a 22-4 overall mark, while leading LSU to a 13-3 conference record. LSU has also had 12 players selected in the NFL Draft over the past two years, including a school-record four in the first round in 2007, which included the No. 1 overall pick in Russell. In addition, LSU has had four players earn first-team All-America status under Miles.

LSU Heads To Atlanta In Search Of 10th League Title

Seventh-ranked LSU heads to the SEC Championship Game on Saturday in search of the school's 10th league title. The Tigers and 14th-ranked Tennessee will square off a 3 p.m. CT from the Georgia Dome. The game will be televised to a national audience by CBS. Since the establishment of the SEC in 1933, LSU has won a total of nine conference titles with the most recent one coming in 2003. LSU's other SEC title came in 1935, '36, '58, '61, '62, '70, '86, '88, and 2001.

With a 10-2 overall mark, the 2007 season will go down as another year of firsts for the Tigers. The following is a look at some of the firsts associated with this year's team:

- First time LSU has won at least 10 games in three straight seasons
- First outright SEC Western Division title
- First time LSU has scored 40 or more points in at least 7 games
- First time LSU has won 5 games against Top 25 teams during regular season
- First time LSU was No. 1 in the BCS Standings during the regular season

LSU In SEC Championship Game For Fourth Time; Tigers Are 2-1 In SEC Title Games

LSU will be making its fourth appearance in the SEC Championship Game, all of which have come this decade. LSU is 2-1 in SEC title games, beating Tennessee, 31-20, to claim the championship in 2001 followed by a 34-13 win over Georgia in 2003. Georgia beat the Tigers, 34-14, in the 2005 championship game. LSU coach Les Miles is 0-1 in the SEC Championship Game, falling to Georgia in 2005.

Two Tigers Have Earned MVP Honors In SEC Title Game

LSU's had two players earn MVP honors at the SEC Championship Game. Backup quarterback Matt Mauck came off the bench and led the Tigers to their stunning 31-20 upset over Tennessee in 2001 to earn MVP honors. Then in 2003, true freshman running back Justin Vincent shredded Georgia's defense for 201 yards and one score in earning MVP honors.

Feels Like Home In The Georgia Dome

LSU's game against Tennessee in the SEC Championship Game will mark the Tigers' seventh appearance in the Georgia Dome. LSU is 5-1 all-time in games played in the Georgia Dome. LSU is 3-0 in Peach Bowls in the Georgia Dome and 2-1 in SEC Championship Games played there. The following is a look at LSU's results in games played in the Georgia Dome:

CBS, The Unofficial Sponsor Of LSU Football

The Tennessee contest will mark LSU's seventh appearance on CBS this year, the most ever for the Tigers on any particular network in a single-season. It will also mark the third straight game that the Tigers have appeared on the network. One thing is for certain, CBS is getting their money's worth with the Tigers as four of the seven games that have been aired on the network have been decided in the closing moments, including two games that have gone to triple-overtime. Most recently, LSU's game against Arkansas went to triple-overtime with the Razorbacks coming out on top 50-48. LSU is 4-2 on CBS this year.

LSU's Class of 2007: Winningest Senior Class in School History

This year's LSU senior class will leave its mark as the school as the winningest group of seniors in the history of the program. Most of this year's 25 seniors joined the Tigers in the spring of 2003 and were a part of the school's first national title in over 50 years when LSU posted a 13-1 overall mark and claimed the BCS National Championship. This year's senior class has been ranked in the top 25 for their entire career. The following is a look at the accomplishments of this year's senior class:

LSU Claims First Outright SEC Western Division Title In 2007

LSU claimed the school's first outright SEC Western Division title this year. LSU finished its SEC slate with a 6-2 mark, one game ahead of Auburn. Since the SEC went to divisions in 1992, the Tigers have shared the SEC Western Division title six times (1996, '97, '01, '02, '03, '05) and claimed the division title outright one time (2007).

In the Polls - Tigers Drop To No. 7 In BCS

LSU slipped from the top spot in the polls this week, tumbling six places to No. 7 in the BCS Standings following its 50-48 triple overtime loss to Arkansas last week. LSU had spent the previous two weeks as the consensus No. 1 ranked team in college football. LSU is No. 5 this week in the AP and Harris Polls and No. 7 in the USA Today Coaches Poll. This year, LSU has spent four weeks as the No. 1 ranked team in the AP Poll and three weeks as the No. 1 team in the Harris and USA Today Coaches Polls. LSU has now been ranked for 81 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches Poll and for 80 straight weeks in the AP poll. The last time LSU failed to make the top 25 in either poll came following the Tigers loss to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl to conclude the 2002 season.

Steltz Named One Of 3 Finalists For Thorpe Award

LSU senior DB Craig Steltz is one of three finalists for the Thorpe Award, the screening committee for the award announced. The Thorpe Award, now in its 21st year, is given annually to the top defensive back in college football. Thorpe Award winners are selected for performance on the field, athletic ability and character. Steltz, a senior from New Orleans, leads LSU in tackles with 89, five of which have gone for losses. Steltz also leads the SEC in interceptions with 6 to go with 7 pass breakups. He's also recorded one sack, forced two fumbles and recovered a fumble. He's fifth in the league in passes defended with a total of 13. Other finalists for the Thorpe Award include: James Silva of Boston College and Antoine Cason of Arizona. All three players will be invited to the Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards Show on December 6 in Orlando, Fla., where the award will be presented.

LSU's Dorsey A Finalist For Four National Awards - Lombardi, Outland, Bednarik, and Nagurski

LSU All-American DT Glenn Dorsey has put together one of the finest years for a defensive lineman in school history and as a result he's been named a finalists for four national awards. The leader of the LSU defense, Dorsey has recorded 61 tackles this year despite being constantly double and sometimes triple-teamed on just about every snap. He's also managed to recorded 11.5 tackles for losses, six sacks. He's also batted down four passes and posted four quarterback hurries to lead an LSU defense that ranks among the top 10 in the nation in three categories, including a No. 3 rating in total defense. Tigers Post Third Straight 10-Win Season

LSU's win over Ole Miss gave the Tigers their third straight season with at least 10 wins, a first in the history of the program. LSU coach Les Miles is the only coach in school history to lead the Tigers to at least 10 victories in consecutive seasons and now he's done it for a third time this year. In addition, LSU joins Alabama, Georgia, Tennessee and Florida as the only teams in SEC history to win at least 10 games in three straight seasons.

LSU Sets School Record For Points In A Season With 482

By scoring 48 points against Arkansas, LSU set the school record for points in a season with 482. The 482 breaks the previous record of 475 set by the 2003 team during its 14-game schedule. In addition, LSU is averaging 40.2 points per game, which puts the Tigers on pace to break the school's scoring average of 34.9 points set by the 1969 team.

Tigers Have Scored At Least 28 Points In Every Game This Year; An LSU First So Far

LSU goes into the Tennessee game having scored at least 28 points in every game this year. No other LSU team in school history has gone the length of a season with 28 points as the fewest points scored in a single-game. The only other LSU team in to score at least 20 points in every game during the season came in 1969. That year, the Tigers posted a 9-1 overall mark under Charles McClendon. The fewest points the Tigers scored in a single-game in 1969 was 20 points, doing it twice in a 20-0 victory over Miami (Fla.) and a 20-15 win over Alabama.

Tigers Rank Among Nation's Best At Taking Care Of Football

When it comes to taking care of the football, LSU has been one of the nation's best this year as the Tigers are No. 2 in the nation in turnover margin with a +1.50 average per game. In 12 games, the Tigers have turned the ball over only 13 times - 11 interceptions and 2 fumbles. With only 2 fumbles this year, the Tigers are ranked No. 1 in the nation in that category. LSU is tied for third nationally in turnovers lost with 13.

LSU's Defense Has Been Good With Takeaways

While the LSU offense has been good at protecting the football, the Tiger defense has been just as productive in terms of turnovers gained as the squad has produced 31 takeaways this year. LSU has 19 interceptions and 12 fumble recoveries. The 31 takeaways ranks as the fifth-best total in college football this year, trailing only South Florida (40), Cincinnati (39), Western Michigan (34) and Kansas (32).

LSU's Wins At Least 6 SEC Games For Fifth Straight Year

The win over Ole Miss also sent the Tigers to their sixth SEC win this year. It marks the fifth consecutive year that the Tigers have won at least six SEC games, which is also a first in school history. LSU's currently enjoying its most successful SEC run ever, winning 32 league games since the start of the 2003 season. Counting regular season games only, LSU won 7 SEC games in 2003, followed by 6 in 2004, 7 in 2005, 6 in 2006 and 6 this year.

LSU Is 2-1 Against SEC Eastern Division In 2007; Miles Is 6-4 Against SEC East

LSU brings a 2-1 record against SEC Eastern Division opponents into the Tennessee contest. LSU beat South Carolina and Florida this year, while losing to Kentucky. LSU coach Les Miles has a 6-4 record against members of the SEC East since taking over at LSU in 2005. LSU is 24-27-1 all-time against the SEC Eastern Division, which includes an 18-9 mark since 2000.

LSU Sets School Record With 7th 40-plus Point Game

By scoring 48 points against Arkansas, LSU has now set the school record for games with at least 40 points with seven this year. Last year's squad scored 40 points six times, which was the previous mark.

LSU Is 5-0 Under Miles Following A Loss

LSU ran its record to 5-0 under Les Miles in games following a loss with the win over Auburn. The win over Auburn came following LSU's 43-37 triple-overtime defeat to Kentucky. The Tigers have bounced back in impressive fashion following losses under Miles. In 2005, LSU beat Mississippi State, 37-7, the week after a 30-27 overtime loss to Tennessee. Also that year, after its 34-14 defeat to Georgia in the SEC Championship Game, the Tigers regrouped to post a 40-3 win over Miami in the Peach Bowl. Last year, LSU lost to Auburn 7-3 and then followed that with a 49-7 win over Tulane, then after a 23-10 loss to Florida, the Tigers followed with a 49-0 victory over Kentucky. Most recently, the Tigers beat Auburn, 30-24, following the loss to Kentucky.

Tigers Haven't Lost Back-To-Back Games Since 2002

LSU goes into the Tennessee contest having not lost back-to-back games since the 2002 season. The last time LSU dropped back-to-back came in 2002 when the Tigers fell to Arkansas, 21-20, to end the regular season and then dropped a 35-20 decision to Texas in the Cotton Bowl.

Bowl Eligible Again; Tigers Have Won At Least 8 Games In A Season For 8 Straight Years

With the win over Florida in week 6, LSU became bowl-eligible for a school-record eighth straight season. Since the 2000 season, LSU has played in the Peach Bowl (2000 and 2005), Sugar Bowl (2001, 2003, 2006) Cotton Bowl (2002) and Capital One Bowl (2004) in consecutive years. In addition, the Tigers have now recorded at least 8 wins for the eighth straight season, also a first for LSU.

LSU's Tiger Stadium Streak Snapped At 19 Straight

LSU's school-record streak of 19 consecutive wins in Tiger Stadium was snapped against Arkansas. The 19-game streak was also the nation's longest. LSU's 19-game streak broke the previous record of 17 consecutive wins, which was set from 1935-37. Prior to the Arkansas game, LSU's last loss in Tiger Stadium came against Tennessee by a 30-27 count in overtime on Sept. 26, 2005, which was a Monday night. LSU has still won 29 of its last 31 games in Tiger Stadium. In addition, LSU hasn't lost a Saturday game in Tiger Stadium since a 19-7 setback to Florida on Oct. 11, 2003. To take it a step further, LSU hasn't dropped a Saturday night game at home since a 31-0 defeat to Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002, a streak that stretches 26 consecutive Saturday night games.

Colt David Kicks Way Into LSU Record Books

LSU junior PK Colt David has kicked his way into the LSU record books as he now holds the school's single-season record for field goals (23) and points (132). With a pair of field goals against Ole Miss, David moved past David Browndyke (19 field goals in 1988) for first place in LSU history for field goals in a season. In addition, David's 11 points against the Rebels allowed him to surpass RB LaBrandon Toefield for points in a season. Toefield held the school mark with 114 points scored during the 2001 season. David's 132 points this year ranks as the second-highest total in SEC history, while his 23 field goals ranks seventh in SEC history. Holliday Returns Another Kickoff For TD; Sets LSU Mark

LSU's Trindon Holliday became the first player on record in school history to return two kickoffs for touchdowns in his career when he scored on a 98-yard return against Ole Miss. Holliday's first kickoff return for a score came last year when he went 92 yards for a TD against Arkansas. For his career, Holliday has returned 22 kickoffs for 606 yards and two touchdowns. He's averaging 27.5 yards per return for his career, which includes an average of 26.1 yards on 17 returns this year. Holliday currently ranks fourth in the SEC in kickoff return average.

Holliday Makes Most Of His Touches

LSU's Trindon Holliday makes the most of his touches as he's averaging 11.6 yards every time he touches the football. In 11 games, Holliday has accounted for 740 total yards on 67 attempts. He's rushed for 293 yards on 44 carries; returned 17 kickoffs for 444 yards; caught 2 passes for 3 yards and returned a punt for zero yards.

The Cardiac Tigers

Five times this year, LSU has had the outcome of games decided either late in the fourth quarter or in overtime. Most recently, LSU and Arkansas had to go to three overtimes before the contest was decided with the Razorbacks coming out on top by a 50-48 margin. LSU went four straight games - Florida, Kentucky, Auburn and Alabama - with the outcome of those contests determined either late in the fourth quarter or in overtime. Against Alabama on Nov. 3, LSU scored with less than two minutes left and basically on its final possession to post a 41-34 win over Alabama. The win over the Crimson Tide capped a comeback that saw LSU score 14 points in the final 2:49 of the contest to register the come-from-behind victory. The Alabama comeback fell in line with other games in recent weeks for the Tigers. LSU scored on its final possession with just over a minute left to beat Florida, 28-24, on Oct. 13. The last game-winning drive featured a pair of fourth-down conversions that kept LSU's hopes alive. The following week, the Tigers went to triple-overtime before dropping a 43-37 decision to Kentucky. Then, on Oct. 20, LSU scored with just one second left when QB Matt Flynn connected with WR Demetrius Byrd on a 22-yard pass to beat Auburn, 30-24.

LSU Now 14-3 In Games Played As No. 1 Ranked Team

The loss to Arkansas dropped LSU's all-time record in games played as the No. 1 ranked team to 14-3, which includes a 2-2 mark this year. The Florida contest on Oct. 6 marked the first time since the 1959 season that LSU played a football game as the nation's No. 1 ranked team.

LSU's Streak Of 33 Straight Wins Against Unranked Opponents Snapped By Arkansas

The Tigers streak of 33 straight wins against unranked opponents was snapped against Arkansas on Nov. 23. Prior to the Arkansas game, LSU hadn't lost a game against an to an unranked team since the 2003 season when the No. 6 Tigers fell to unranked Florida, 19-7, in Tiger Stadium.

LSU's 54 Wins Since 2003 Ranks No. 3 Nationally

Since the start of the 2003 season, LSU has won 54 games, which ranks as the third-highest total nationally during that span. Southern Cal is first with 57 wins, followed by Boise State with 56. LSU is third with 54. The following is a look at the school's with the most wins since the start of the 2003 season:

Miles Now 32-6 At LSU; Best Start For A Coach In LSU History

With a 10-2 mark this year, LSU coach Les Miles is now 32-6 overall with the Tigers. The 32 wins in his first 38 games is the most of any coach in school history during that span. Bernie Moore ranks second with 31 wins during his first 38 games.

LSU's Miles Up For Both Bear Bryant and George Munger Awards

LSU's Les Miles is one of just a handful of coaches from across the country up for the Bear Bryant Award and the George Munger Award. Both awards are given to the coach of the year in college football. Miles, in his third season with the Tigers, has guided LSU to a No. 1 national ranking and to a 10-1 overall mark this year. The Tigers have also clinched a berth in the league's title game for the second time in three years. Of LSU's 10 wins, five have come against teams ranked in the top 25, including top 10 victories over No. 7 Florida and No. 9 Virginia Tech. LSU's five wins over ranked opponents is the most of any team in the country this year. The Bear Bryant Watch list will be narrowed down to five candidates on Dec. 12 at a press conference in Houston. The finalists will attend an awards dinner on Jan. 17, 2008 in Houston where the winner will be announced. The winner of the George Munger Award will be announced in December.

Another Fourth Quarter Comeback Under Les Miles

LSU's rally to beat Alabama on Nov. 3 marked the eighth time under Les Miles, including the third time this year that the Tigers have come from behind in the final quarter to win a game. LSU Is 11-3 In Road Games Under Miles

LSU's win over Ole Miss ran the Tigers' overall road record to 11-3 under Les Miles. LSU was 2-2 on the road last year after going 5-0 away from Tiger Stadium in 2005. The Tigers are 4-1 away from Tiger Stadium this year, beating Mississippi State in the season-opener followed by a 34-9 win over Tulane in week 5. LSU's road loss this year came to Kentucky in triple-overtime by a 43-37 count. Of LSU's 11 road wins under Miles, four have come against teams ranked in the top 15 with three of those coming against top 10 ranked teams. LSU's top 10 road wins under Miles include a 16-13 victory over No. 3 Alabama in 2005; a 28-24 win over No. 8 Tennessee and a 31-26 victory over No. 5 Arkansas in 2006.

Flynn Now 10-2 As LSU's Starting Quarterback

Matt Flynn's record fell to 10-2 as LSU's starting quarterback with the Tigers' loss to Arkansas. Flynn is 9-2 this year as LSU's starter after going 1-0 in 2005. Flynn's first start for the Tigers came in the 2005 Peach Bowl as he directed LSU to a 40-3 victory over Miami.

Miles Does It Again - Beats Auburn, Florida And Alabama In Same Year

With LSU's win over Alabama, LSU coach Les Miles swept those three conference foes for the second time during his LSU career. Miles is the only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in the same season, and now he's done it twice.

LSU Has Nation's Third-Best Winning Percentage Away From Tiger Stadium Since 2003

With the win over Ole Miss, LSU has now won 23 of its last 30 games away from Tiger Stadium since the 2003. LSU's .767 away-from-home winning percentage since 2003 ranks as the nation's third-best mark, trailing only Southern Cal (.853) and Boise State (.774). LSU Now 6-4 In Overtime Games

With LSU's triple-overtime defeat to Arkansas, the Tigers dropped their all-time overtime record to 6-4. LSU is 2-1 in overtime road games and 4-1 in overtime games against Top 25 teams. LSU coach Les Miles is 3-3 in overtime games. Only two of LSU's 10 overtime games have gone more than one period (3OT loss to Kentucky, 43-37, in 2007; 3OT loss to Arkansas, 50-48, in 2007)

Dorsey Being Heaped A Great Deal Of Praise

LSU DT Glenn Dorsey has been dealt a great deal of praise in recent weeks. In addition to being named a Mid-Season All-America by CBSsports.com, Collegefootballnews.com and Sports Illustrated, Dorsey was recently named the third-toughest player in college football to prepare for by ESPN. Dorsey, who ranks behind Florida QB Tim Tebow and Indiana WR James Hardy on the list, was also listed by ESPN.com as the top performer in college football at the midway point of the season last week. ESPN's Mel Kiper also has Dorsey listed as the No. 1 player on his NFL Draft Big Board.

LSU Has Five Wins Over Top 25 Teams This Year

LSU has a 5-2 mark against top 25 teams this year. The six top 25 opponents is the most LSU has faced during the regular season since 1999 when the Tigers played six ranked teams during their 3-8 season under Gerry DiNardo. LSU was 1-5 against top 25 teams that year. The most top 25 teams that LSU has ever faced in a season (both regular and post season) is seven, which has happened twice - 2005 and 1988. LSU was 3-4 against ranked teams in 1988 and 5-2 against ranked teams in 2005. This year, LSU has wins over then-No. 9 Virginia Tech, 48-7, in week 2; a 28-16 win over then-No. 12 South Carolina in week 4; a 28-24 win over then-No. 7 Florida in week 6, a 30-24 win over then-No. 18 Auburn in week 8, and a 41-34 win over then-No. 17 Alabama in week 9. LSU's only loss against a top 25 team came against then-No. 17 Kentucky, 43-37 in triple overtime in week 7. Since taking over at LSU, Les Miles has a 12-5 mark in games against Top 25 teams.

LSU A Second Half Team

Thru 12 games this year, LSU has made its mark as a second half team, outscoring its opponents, 262 to 98 in the third and fourth quarters this season. LSU has outscored its opposition 134 to 45 in the third quarter and 128-53 in the fourth quarter.

Running Back Hester Adds To Receiving Total

When it comes to catching the ball out of the backfield, RB/FB Jacob Hester has become one of the best in school history at it. During his LSU career, Hester has 60 receptions from the running back position, a figure that ranks just outside of the top six in LSU history. A year ago, Hester caught 35 passes, which ranked as the third-highest single-season total in school history. Gary James (1982-85) holds both the LSU career mark (122) and single-season record (50 in 1985) for receptions by a running back. This year, Hester has 12 catches for 101 yards and one touchdown.

LSU Overall Winning Streak Snapped At 13 Straight; Ranks Third In School History

LSU had its overall winning streak snapped at 13 straight against Kentucky on Oct. 13. The 13-game streak, which started a year ago with a 49-0 win over Kentucky in Tiger Stadium, ranks as the third-longest winning streak in school history. LSU "D" Has Held Opponents Scoreless In 25 Of Last 56 Quarters

Dating back to last year's Notre Dame contest, LSU has held its opponent scoreless in 25 of the last 56 quarters in which they have played. That streak included holding opponents scoreless in 22 of 48 quarters this year.

Three Tigers Named To Midseason All-America List

With college football now past the midseason point, three members of LSU's football team earned spots on All-America teams based on play during the first half of the season. Defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey, linebacker Ali Highsmith and safety Craig Steltz each have been named to midseason All-America teams as selected by Sports Illustrated and CBSsports.com. The CBSsports.com All-America squad, as voted on by college football experts at the website, features three players from LSU and three from Boston College to lead all teams in terms of midseason All-America selections. LSU's Dorsey headlines the list of defenders on the CBSsports.com team. All three Tigers were named to the SI.com Midseason All-America list as well.

LSU's Only Allowed One 100-Yard Rusher This Year

LSU goes into the Tennessee game having allowed only one 100-yard rusher this year as Arkansas' Darren McFadden with 206 yards is the only player to reach the mark against the Tigers in 2007. LSU held Tulane's Matt Forte, who has rushed for over 2,000 yards this season, to 73 yards on 16 attempts back on Sept. 29. Prior to McFadden's 206 yards, the last time a player went over the 100-yard mark against LSU came in the Sugar Bowl a year ago when Notre Dame's Darius Walker accounted for 128 yards.

Except For Arkansas, LSU Defense Stingy Against The Run Under Pelini

LSU's defense under Bo Pelini has become stingy when it comes to rushing yards. In 38 games as LSU's defensive coordinator, the Tigers have held 25 of their 38 opponents to less than 100 net rushing yards. LSU is 22-3 in those games with the losses coming to Tennessee in 2005 and Auburn and Florida in 2006. Only 4 teams have gone over the 100-yard mark against LSU this year - Arkansas with 385 yards, Ole Miss with 201 yards, Florida with 156 yards and Kentucky with 125 yards.

First Quarter Dominance Continues Into 2007

One big reason for LSU's success last year was its ability to take control of the contest early. Last year, the Tigers outscored their opponents 136 to 27 in the first quarter and 240 to 87 in the first half. LSU didn't allow a single point in the first quarter of a game last year until the sixth contest of the year when Florida scored with 11 seconds remaining in the opening frame. In all, LSU held nine of its 12 opponents without a point in the first quarter a year ago. This year, LSU has outscored its opponents 88-34 in the first quarter and 190-105 in the first half.

David Scores TD, Then Kicks PAT - A First For LSU Since 1965

The last time an LSU player scored a touchdown and then kicked the ensuing PAT came back on Nov. 20, 1965 when Doug Moreau (who now handles the color analyst duties for the Tiger broadcast team) did it against Tulane. In the 62-0 win over the Green Wave, Moreau scored on a 9-yard TD pass from Pat Screen with 30 seconds left in the first quarter and then followed with one of his six extra points that day. Now, 42 years later, LSU PK Colt David did it again for the Tigers, scoring on a 15-yard run on the Tigers' fake field goal just before halftime in the win over South Carolina. It was the first touchdown of David's career.

Miles Is 19-5 In SEC Games

LSU coach Les Miles is 19-5 in SEC games as LSU's head coach. Miles was 7-1 in 2005 in conference games followed by a 6-2 record a year ago. The Tigers finished league play with a 6-2 record this year. Miles is 8-3 in SEC road games and 11-2 in league games played in Tiger Stadium.

Miles Is 6-3 Against Top 10 Teams As LSU's Coach; He's 12-5 In Top 25 Games

Les Miles has a 6-3 record against top 10 teams as LSU's head coach and he's now 12-5 against top 25 teams. Miles and the Tigers are 4-1 against top 25 teams this year, which includes a 2-0 mark against top 10 teams.

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Miles (Since 2005)

Here are some notable trends for LSU in the 37 games its played under head coach Les Miles ... The Tigers are 29-2 when rushing for 100 yards or more ... The Tigers are 24-2 when leading after the first quarter with the only losses during that span coming against Tennessee in 2005 and Arkansas last week ... LSU is 29-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 26-3 when scoring 25 or more points ... The Tigers are 22-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing.

The Bo Pelini "D"

Since taking over as defensive coordinator for the Tigers in 2005, defensive coordinator Bo Pelini has put a unit on the field that rarely allows opponents to reach the 20-point mark. In 38 games with Pelini as its defensive coordinator, LSU has held 27 opponents to fewer than 20 points. In addition, 18 of LSU's 36 opponents failed to score more than 10 points. Last year, LSU limited seven of its 13 opponents to 10 points or less, including holding Kentucky scoreless, Arizona to 3 points, Fresno State to 6 points, and Auburn to 7 points. Pelini's defenses have also recorded four shutouts over the past 2-plus seasons, including two this year.

Hester Does It All For Tigers

LSU senior RB Jacob Hester does it all for the Tigers. In 11 games this year, Hester has played a variety of positions for the Tigers. He's started both games at tailback, but he's also seen action at fullback as well as on LSU's punt, punt return, and PAT/field goal teams. The following is a look at Hester's play breakdown for the Tigers through two games:

Hester Goes Over 1,000-Yard Mark For Career

LSU RB Jacob Hester ran his career rushing total to 1,574 yards with his 126-yard effort against Arkansas. For his career, Hester has accounted for 2,028 total yards (1,574 rushing, 454 receiving) and a total of 25 TDs (19 rushing, 6 receiving).

Flynn Cracks LSU Top 10 List For Passing Yards and TDs In A Season

LSU QB Matt Flynn has cracked the school's top 10 list for passing yard and passing TDs in a season. With 2,233 passing yards this year, Flynn is currently ranked eighth in school history in that category. In addition, Flynn's 17 TD passes is tied with Josh Booty and Herb Tyler as the seventh highest single-season total in school history. Flynn also ranks seventh in completions with 183, and he's seventh in attempts with 332.

Doucet Up To No. 4 In School History With 158 Catches

With 7 receptions against Arkansas, LSU WR Early Doucet moved past Dwayne Bowe into fourth place in school history with 158 catches for his career. Despite missing four games this year with an injury, Doucet has still managed to catch 45 passes for 445 yards and four scores.

Flynn Adds Named To Short List of LSU QBs With 3 TD Passes In 3 Straight Games

By throwing for 3 touchdowns in LSU's win over Louisiana Tech, Matt Flynn became just the second quarterback in school history to toss at least 3 TD passes in three straight games. In consecutive games, Flynn has tossed 3 TD passes against Auburn, Alabama and Louisiana Tech. The only other Tiger to accomplish the feat is JaMarcus Russell, who tossed three TD passes in consecutive games against Tennessee, Alabama and Ole Miss in 2006.

LSU Running Backs Take Care Of The Football

LSU's running back-by-committee approach has been good at more than just rushing yards and TDs. The group has also done a tremendous job of taking care of the football. Of LSU's four running backs - Jacob Hester, Keiland Williams, Charles Scott and Richard Murphy - only Hester has lost a fumble on a rushing attempt. Hester's lost fumble on a rush came against Georgia in what was the first game of his career in 2004. Hester fumbled for the first time since the 2004 season against Arkansas, however, LSU was able to recover keeping his streak of carries without a lost fumble intact. Hester has now gone 307 carries without losing a fumble. The following is a look at the number of carries LSU's running backs have totaled the football without a fumble:

Flynn Joins Elite Group Of LSU QBs With Second 300-Yard Passing Game

When Matt Flynn threw for a career-best 353 yards against Alabama on Nov. 3, he became only the seventh quarterback in LSU history to throw for 300 or more yards in two games in the same season. Flynn has done it twice this year - also throwing for 319 yards and 3 scores against Auburn on Oct. 20. Flynn is also just one of four LSU quarterbacks who have thrown for 300 yards in back-to-back games joining Rohan Davey (3 straight times in 2001), Jeff Wickersham (twice in 1983), and Tommy Hodson (twice in 1989).

Just Who Is Backup QB Andrew Hatch?

LSU backup QB Andrew Hatch joined the Tigers over the summer after spending a year on a church mission in Chile. Hatch originally committed to BYU and current LSU OC Gary Crowton when Crowton was still the head coach in Provo. Hatch eventually signed with Harvard and spent the 2005 season with Crimson, playing on the junior varsity squad. After a year at Harvard, Hatch took a planned leave of absence from the program, going to Chile as part of a Mormon Mission. Originally, Hatch was going on a two-year mission, however, his trip was cut short by a knee injury suffered while playing soccer with some of the locals. Hatch remained in Chile, undiagnosed for two months, before returning to the United States for surgery. Hatch finished the year rehabbing in his hometown of Henderson, Nev., where he re-connected with Crowton, who had stayed in touch with the Hatch family over the years. Eventually Hatch was offered a chance to walk-on at LSU in the summer of 2007 with a chance of earning not only a spot on the roster, but also a scholarship. Hatch has seen action in one game this year, playing against Middle Tennessee. He's completed 1-of-2 passes for 9 yards and he's rushed four times for 27 yards.

Three Members of LSU Coaching Staff Have Wins As Division I Head Coaches

LSU is one of the few schools in the country that can lay claim to having three coaches on its staff who have picked up wins as a head coach at the Division I level. Head coach Les Miles has combined to win 58 games at LSU and Oklahoma State, offensive coordinator Gary Crowton has a combined 47 victories after stints at Louisiana Tech and BYU and defensive coordinator Bo Pelini won his only game as the interim head coach at Nebraska during the 2003 season.

Offense Comes Up Big In Second Half Against Auburn

After being held to just seven points in the first half against Auburn, LSU erupted for 23 second half points, including 17 in the fourth quarter, in its win over Auburn. LSU scored on five of its six second half possessions against Auburn, including the game-winning touchdown with just one second left. In all, LSU racked up 351 yards of total offense in the second half against Auburn, which included 222 passing yards.

Seven True Freshmen Have Seen Action For the Tigers

Through 11 games, seven true freshmen have seen action for the Tigers. DT Drake Nevis added his name to the list against Tulane, filling in for an injured Marlon Favorite on the defensive line. The following is a look at the true freshmen who have played seen the field this year: PK Josh Jasper, PK Andrew Crutchfield, LT Jarvis Jones, RT Joseph Barksdale, WR Terrance Toliver, DB Chad Jones, DT Drake Nevis.

Double-Trouble At Corner

LSU cornerbacks Chevis Jackson and Jonathan Zenon are back as returning starters at cornerback for the Tigers in 2006. The duo has started opposite each other at the cornerback position for 24 straight games. Last year, Jackson and Zenon combined for 6 interceptions for an LSU defense that ranked No. 1 in the SEC and No. 3 in the nation in pass defense.

Dickson's 26 Catches Most By An LSU Tight End Since 1996 Season

Richard Dickson ran his season total for receptions to 26 against Arkansas with five catches against the Razorbacks. For the year, Dickson has caught 26 passes for 316 yards and 3 touchdowns for the Tigers. His 26 receptions rank fourth on the squad and he's one of nine players to have caught a TD pass for LSU. The 26 receptions for Dickson is the most by an LSU tight end since All-American David LaFleur caught 30 passes for 439 yards and 3 TDs in 1996. Earlier this year, Dickson led the Tigers in receiving against South Carolina with 4 catches for 39 yards and 1 TD. By doing so, he became the first tight end to lead the Tigers in receiving since Robert Royal did it against Houston in 2000. Royal had 4 receptions for 44 yards and 1 TD against the Cougars.

Tiger Defense Picks Off 6 Passes In Opener; Most By LSU Team Since 1975

LSU's six interceptions in the season-opener against Mississippi State was the most by an LSU team since having the same total against Tulane in 1975. Senior S Craig Steltz tied a school-record with 3 interceptions against the Bulldogs. Steltz became just the seventh player in school history, and the first since Corey Webster vs. Florida in 2002, to intercept 3 passes in a game. In all, the Tigers forced 7 turnovers in the 45-0 win over Mississippi State. The school record for interceptions in a game is 8, which was set against Villanova in 1951.

Cap and Gown Tigers

Two members of the LSU football team - FB Shawn Jordan and DL Anthony Zehyoue - have already earned their bachelor's degree. Jordan graduated last spring with a degree in kinesiology, while Zehyoue earned his diploma last spring in history.

Oh Brother

LSU has two sets of brothers on this year's team - defensive end Rahim Alem (formerly Al Jones) and defensive back Chad Jones are brothers as are center Brett Helms and offensive lineman Trey Helms. Alem is a backup defensive end for the Tigers, while Jones serve as either a nickel back or dime back in LSU's subpackages on defense. Brett Helms is LSU's starter at center, while Trey is a walk-on true freshman.

SEC Defensive Player of the Week vs. Ole Miss - S Craig Steltz

LSU S Craig Steltz was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Tigers' 41-24 win over Ole Miss. Steltz recorded five tackles and intercepted a pair of passes in the win over the Rebels. His first interception came in the endzone just before halftime that ended an Ole Miss drive inside the redzone. He followed that with another interception that halted an Ole Miss drive inside LSU territory. Steltz returned the second interception 42 yards to the Ole Miss 35-yard line leading to an LSU score four plays later that put the game out of reach.

SEC Defensive Lineman of The Week vs. South Carolina - DT Glenn Dorsey

LSU DT Glenn Dorsey picked up his first weekly award of the year as he was named the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his efforts in the 28-16 victory over South Carolina. Dorsey was credited with 8 tackles, 7 of which were solo, to go with a sack for a 7-yard loss and a PBU. Dorsey led a Tiger defense that held South Carolina to 17 yards rushing in the contest.

SEC Defensive Player of the Week vs. Alabama - DT Glenn Dorsey

LSU DT **Glenn Dorsey** came up big in his return to the field and as a result, he was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the win over Alabama. For the game, Dorsey recorded a team-best 7 tackles to lead a Tiger defense that limited Alabama to 254 total yards and just 20 rushing yards in 41-34 victory over the Crimson Tide. He had one sack for a 6-yard loss and added another tackle for a loss in the win. In all, he led a Tiger defense that sacked Alabama QB John Parker Wilson seven times. Dorsey also added a pair of quarterback hurries and batted down a pass at the line of scrimmage on Alabama's final possession of the game. For the game, LSU defense forced Alabama to punt on five of its seven second half possessions as the Tigers held the Crimson Tide to just three first downs on its final five possessions of the contest with one of those coming courtesy of a penalty. All of this came just two weeks after Dorsey was the victim of an illegal "post and chop" block in the third quarter against Auburn two weeks ago that sent the All-American to the sidelines for the remainder of the game. Luckily for Dorsey, he didn't suffer any permanent damage.

SEC Offensive Player of the Week vs. Auburn - QB Matt Flynn

LSU quarterback **Matt Flynn** was rewarded for playing the best game of his career in the Tigers' 30-24 win over Auburn on Oct. 20 as he was named the Southeastern Conference's Offensive Player of the Week. Flynn, a senior from Tyler, Texas, set career highs for completions (22), attempts (34) and passing yards (314) and tied another career-best with three touchdown passes, including the game-winner with one second left, in the LSU victory. Flynn also rushed for 34 yards, including runs of 10 and seven yards, on LSU's game-winning drive. Trailing 24-23 with just over three minutes left, Flynn directed the Tigers on a 9-play, 58-yard drive, which was capped with a 22-yard TD pass to Demetrius Byrd with one second left in the contest. Trailing 17-7 at halftime, Flynn took over in the second half, guiding LSU to scores on five of its six possessions in the third and fourth quarters. LSU outscored Auburn, 23-7, in the second half to record its second fourth quarter comeback in the last three weeks. In all, Flynn directed an LSU offense to a total of 488 yards, including 356 yards in the second half. Auburn's defense came into the contest ranked second in the SEC in total defense and scoring defense.

SEC Offensive Player of the Week and National Player of the Week vs. Florida - RB Jacob Hester

LSU RB **Jacob Hester** earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week and National Player of the Week honors from the Sporting News for his performance in the Tigers' 28-24 win over Florida. In the win over the Gators, Hester rushed for a career-high 106 yards and scored the game-winning TD with just over a minute left. The 106 yards came on a career-best 23 attempts and he averaged 4.6 yards per carry against a Florida defense that entered the game allowing just 63 yards per contest. Down 24-21 late in the fourth quarter, LSU was forced to go for it on fourth down twice and they put the ball in Hester's hands both times, converting both times. In all, Hester carried the ball eight times on LSU's final possession, a drive that consumed 60 yards on 15 plays and took just over eight minutes. In the fourth quarter alone, the Tigers held the ball for 12 minutes, outscored Florida 14-0 and outgained the Gators, 130-37. Of Hester's 106 rushing yards, 77 came in the second half with 39 of those yards coming in the fourth quarter. Hester also became the first LSU back to go over 100 yards in an SEC game since Joseph Addai had 105 yards against Auburn in 2005.

D-Line U

You can now refer to LSU as D-line U as the Tigers have made it a habit of producing All-Americans and NFL Drafts from its defensive line. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had five defensive linemen earn First-Team All-America status and seven members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. Senior defensive tackle **Glenn Dorsey** earned First-Team All-America recognition in 2006 and then opted to return to LSU for his senior season despite being projected as a first round pick in last spring's NFL Draft.

WR **Chris Mitchell** made his first start in the home opener against Virginia Tech and QB **Ryan Perrilloux** and WR **Jared Mitchell** each started for the first time against Middle Tennessee. WR **Demetrius Byrd** made his first start as an LSU Tiger against South Carolina. DT **Al Woods** got his first start at Tulane and **Danny McCray** started at nickel back against Florida. Hitt and Stewart are both converted defensive linemen who were playing on the offensive side of the football for the first time in their career. Double-Duty Tigers

Three members of the LSU football team also participate in other sports on campus. Wide receiver **Jared Mitchell** and defensive back **Chad Jones** are on the baseball team, while wide out/return specialist **Trindon Holliday** is on the track team. Here's a look at how these players fared while competing in their "other" sport:

Trindon Holliday - sprinter - track and field

Established himself as one of the nation's premier sprinters on the track with his outstanding performance in the spring. He earned a pair of All-America honors at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in June. He finished as the NCAA runner-up in the 100-meter dash after ripping up the track with a time of 10.06 seconds in the final while also anchoring the Tigers' fearsome 4x100-meter relay team to a second-place finish with a seasonal best time of 38.85. In addition, Holliday etched his name in the record books with his performance as he shattered the school record in the 100-meter dash with a seasonal best time of 10.02, eclipsing the mark of 10.09 set by LSU great and former two-sport standout Xavier Carter in 2006.

Jared Mitchell - centerfield - baseball

Last year as a true freshman, Mitchell started 55 games at centerfield for the Tiger baseball team, batting .258 (54-of-209) with eight doubles, a triple, three homers and 21 RBI. He also became the first freshman since 1998 to lead the team in steals with 18. The stolen bases put him fourth in the SEC in that department and represented the most by an LSU player since 2004. Mitchell, the 10th-round selection of the Minnesota Twins in the 2006 MLB Draft, was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Feb. 26.

Chad Jones - outfielder - baseball

Jones, a left-handed outfielder from Southern Lab High School, was picked in the 13th round by the Houston Astros in the 2007 Major League Draft. He will make his debut for the Tiger baseball team this spring.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 83rd year in the venerable stadium. LSU is also celebrating the 76th anniversary of playing under the light of Tiger Stadium. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.

• LSU has won 26 OF ITS LAST 28 games at home.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 54 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 44 times, including a school-record 92,910 for the Oct. 6, 2007 game that pitted No. 1 LSU against No. 9 Florida. LSU won the game 28-24.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 47 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 45 of the 47 years and in the top 10 on 39 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. 15 times, LSU has ranked in the TOP SIX IN THE NATION, including the last six.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 207-59-3 (.779) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 20-23-3 (.475) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

Russell's Last Minute Heroics Leads Tigers Past Tennessee, 28-24

LSU QB JaMarcus Russell connected with **Early Doucet** on a 4-yard TD pass with 9 seconds left to lift the 13th-ranked Tigers to a 28-24 come-from-behind win over No. 8 Tennessee. The win was only the second ever for LSU in Knoxville and the first since a 34-9 victory in 1988. Trailing 24-21 with just over 7 minutes left in the contest, Russell engineered a 15-play, 80-yard scoring drive, which included converting on a fourth-and-8 situation, to lead the Tigers to the victory. The victory came despite a fourth quarter that saw the Tigers lose a pair turnovers as well as a 21-17 lead. Tennessee took a 24-21 lead at the 7:29 mark following a Dwayne Bowe fumble at the UT 46-yard line. On UT's first play following the turnover, Jonathan Crompton completed a 54-yard TD pass to Robert Meachem. The Tigers controlled the contest early, taking a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter on a 23-yards pass from Russell to Craig Davis. Tennessee added 10 second quarter points to take a 10-7 lead at halftime. Tennessee scored its 17th unanswered point just two minutes into the third quarter when Demetric Morley returned an interception 31-yard for a TD, giving the Vols a 17-7 lead. LSU didn't fold, however, as the Tigers responded with a 10-play, 77-yard drive to pull to within 17-14 on a 5-yard pass from Russell to Dwayne Bowe. The Tigers then took the lead on their next possession as **Keiland Williams** raced 7-yards for a scoring, putting LSU up 21-17 with just under three minutes left in the quarter to setup the fourth quarter fireworks between the teams. For the game, the Tigers racked up 478 yards compared to just 248 for the Vols as LSU had 41 minutes of possession time to UT's 19 minutes. Russell led the Tigers with 247 yards passing and 3 TDs. He also added 71 yards rushing on 7 carries. Doucet led all LSU receivers with 8 catches for 73 yards and the game-winning TD.

LSU's Defense Overwhelms Miss. State In 45-0 Win Over Bulldogs

LSU forced seven turnovers, including six interceptions, as the second-ranked Tigers overwhelmed Mississippi State, 45-0, in the season-opener for both teams last week. Matt Flynn, making his first regular season start at quarterback, directed a Tiger offense that didn't commit a turnover and racked up 45 points, the most by an LSU team in an SEC road game since scoring 63 points against Kentucky in Lexington in 1997. LSU took an early 3-0 lead on a 27-yard field goal by Colt David. The Tigers stretched the lead to 10-0 late in the second quarter on a 1-yard run by Keiland Williams. LSU increased the lead to 17-0 when Williams scored on a 1-yard run as time expired in the first half. LSU took the opening kickoff to start the second half and put together its best drive of the game, going 73-yards on six plays, capped with a Flynn-to-Early Doucet 11-yard TD pass to run the score to 24-0. Backup QB Ryan Perrilloux engineered a pair of fourth quarter TD drives for the final margin of 45-0. For the game, the Tiger defense limited Mississippi State to just 10 yards rushing and 136 yards passing. The Bulldogs managed just nine first downs, four of which came in the first half. Thirty-eight of LSU's 45 points came following an MSU turnover, including all 17 first half points.

Tigers Click On All Cylinders In 48-7 Win Over No. 9 Virginia Tech

LSU scored on four of its first five possessions and the Tiger defense didn't allow Virginia Tech to cross midfield until the third quarter in a 48-7 victory over the ninth-ranked Hokies in Tiger Stadium. In a game that saw LSU dominate in all phases, the Tigers raced out to a 24-0 halftime lead and never looked back in a contest that was billed as a defensive battle. LSU set the tone early, taking the opening kickoff and going 87 yards on 10 plays, capped with a 3-yard run by **Jacob Hester** to take a 7-0 lead. After a three-and-out by the Hokies, LSU went 85 yards on eight plays on its next possession, capped with a 7-yard TD run by **Matt Flynn** to stretch the margin to 14-0. LSU blew the game open early in the third quarter when **Keiland Williams** used a spectacular 67-yard run to give the Tigers a 24-0 lead. The Hokies scored their only points in the contest late in the third quarter to cut the deficit to 27-7. However, it took the Tigers only three minutes to add another score, this time **Ryan Perrilloux** connected with **Early Doucet** on a 34-yard TD pass. LSU added a pair of fourth quarter TDs for the final margin. For the game, LSU racked up 598 yards of offense (297 rush, 301 pass), while limiting the Hokies to just 149 yards (71 rush, 78 pass). Williams led the Tigers with 126 yards and 2 TDs on 7 carries, while Hester added 81 yards and 1 score on 12 rushes. Flynn and Perrilloux combined to complete 22 of 32 passes for 301 yards and a pair of scores. **Brandon LaFell** led all receivers with 7 catches for 125 yards and a score.

Defense Dominates, Perrilloux Steps In To Lead Tigers Past MTSU, 44-0

LSU's defense put together another dominating performance and backup **Ryan Perrilloux** stepped in for an injured **Matt Flynn** at quarterback to lead the Tigers to a 44-0 win over Middle Tennessee. In his first collegiate start, Perrilloux connected on 20-of-25 passes for 298 yards and 3 TDs to pace an LSU offense that accounted for 505 yards against the Blue Raiders. The Tiger defense did its apart as well, limiting Middle Tennessee to only 9 first downs, 9 rushing yards and just 90 yards of offense in pitching its second shutout this year. The game was never in doubt as the Tigers opened with 10 first quarter points and then stretched the lead to 17-0 early in the second quarter when Perrilloux connected with **Demetrius Byrd** on a 67-yard TD. The Tigers led 24-0 at halftime following a pair of **Colt David** field goals during the final three minutes of the first half. LSU scored three times in the third quarter - the first on an 18-yard TD pass from Perrilloux to **Brandon LaFell**. Perrilloux hit **Terrance Toliver** with a 15-yard TD pass less than two minutes later and then **Richard Murphy** capped the scoring for Tigers with an 8-yard run with 1:28 to play. **Jacob Hester** led the Tigers in rushing with 57 yards on 10 carries, while Perrilloux added 37 yards on eight attempts. **Jared Mitchell**, in his first collegiate start, led the Tigers in receiving with six catches for 82 yards. Defensively, LB **Ali Highsmith** had 7 tackles, while DB **Danny McCray** had 4 tackles, 2 sacks and a fumble recovery in the win.

Defense, Special Teams Trickery Leads Tigers Past Gamecocks, 28-16

Another stout defensive performance to go along with some first half special teams trickery was too much for 12th-ranked South Carolina to overcome as No. 2 LSU posted a 28-16 win over the Gamecocks. South Carolina actually led early in this contest, scoring the first first half points against LSU this year with a 1-yard TD run by Mike Davis at the 2:46 mark in the first quarter. The Tigers, who hadn't trailed this year until falling behind the Gamecocks in this contest, responded on their next possession, using the speed of **Trindon Holliday** to go 69 yards on four plays, capped with a 33-yard TD run by Holliday, to tie the score at 7-7. LSU took the lead for good early in the second quarter when **Matt Flynn** hit **Richard Dickson** on a 1-yard TD pass to cap a 9-play, 69-yard drive. Following an interception by **Danny McCray**, LSU drove to the South Carolina 15-yard line where the drive stalled and forced what appeared to be a field goal attempt by the Tigers with just over a minute left in the first half. However, with South Carolina bringing a heavy rush, holder Flynn flipped the ball over his shoulder on the fake field goal attempt, right into the hands of placekicker **Colt David**, who raced 15 yards for his first career TD and a 21-7 LSU lead at halftime. The Tigers stretched the margin to 28-7 midway through the third quarter on a 9-yard run by **Jacob Hester**. The Gamecocks added a field goal and a late touchdown to make the margin appear much closer than it actually was. Tigers Overcome Slow Start To Beat Tulane, 34-9

LSU erupted for 24 second half points as the second-ranked Tigers overcame a slow start to post a 34-9 non-conference win over Tulane in the Louisiana Superdome. **Matt Flynn** threw for a career-best 258 yards in the win, while **Charles Scott** added 53 yards and a pair of second half scores to aid the Tiger victory. LSU didn't show any signs of being sluggish early in the game as it took only two plays on their second possession to take a 7-0 lead on a **Jacob Hester** 3-yard run. However, a series of penalties and poor offensive execution plagued the Tigers for the rest of the first half. LSU finished the game with 15 penalties that accounted for 91 yards. Tulane actually took a lead, albeit brief, on a 5-yard run by Andre Anderson at the 1:40 mark in the second quarter. It marked the only time all year that LSU has trailed in the second quarter of a game. The Tigers responded, however, going 37 yards on nine plays, capped with a 37-yard field goal by **Colt David** just before halftime. LSU led 10-9 at the break. In the second half, it was all LSU as the Tigers limited the Green Wave to only 101 total yards over the final two quarters. LSU's offense finally got untracked in the second half, scoring 24 unanswered points, including runs of 35 and 3 yards by Scott. After managing just 127 yards in the first half, the Tigers doubled that output in the second half with 264 yards. Defensively, **Craig Steltz** and **Kirston Pittman** both had 7 tackles to lead the Tigers. Pittman added 2 TFLs, while Steltz had a fumble recovery in the win.

Hester, Tigers Will Themselves To Win Over Florida, 28-24

In what is being called an epic battle of two college football heavyweights, LSU willed itself, behind the play of **Jacob Hester** and the gutsy play calling of **Les Miles**, to a 28-24 win over seventh-ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium. Trailing 24-14 entering fourth quarter, the Tiger offense dominated the final 15 minutes of the game, possessing the ball for 12 minutes and scoring 14 points during that final frame. LSU took its first and only lead of the contest on its last possession of the game, going 60 yards on 15 plays, capped with a 2-yard Hester TD run that put the Tigers up 28-24 with just over a minute left. LSU's defense turned away Florida on its final possession to seal the victory in front of a school-record 92,910 fans. Florida wasted little time in jumping on the Tigers, taking a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. The Tigers pulled to within 10-7 on a 1-yard run by **Ryan Perrilloux**, but the Gators answered right back to a take a 17-7 lead at half-time. The second half was all LSU as the Tigers held the powerful Gators to only seven points and just 142 yards of offense. LSU used a **Kirston Pittman** interception early in the fourth quarter to pull within 24-21 following a 4-yard pass from **Matt Flynn** to **Demetrius Byrd**. The Tigers held the Gators to a 3-and-out on their next possession setting up the game-winning drive. Hester led the Tigers with 106 yards rushing, while Flynn threw for 144 yards and a TD in the victory.

LSU Drops Triple-Overtime Battle With No. 17 Kentucky, 43-37

LSU RB Charles Scott was stopped short on 4th-and-2 in the third overtime as the Tigers had their 13-game winning streak snapped in a 43-37 loss to 17th-ranked Kentucky. Trailing 43-37 after Kentucky scored on their offensive possession, the Tigers couldn't convert on their possession in the third overtime sending the Wildcats to their first win over a No. 1 ranked team since 1964. With the game tied at 27-27 at the end of regulation, the teams traded TDs during the first overtime and then exchanged field goals in the second overtime before UK QB Andre Woodson connected with Steve Johnson for a 7-yard TD in the third overtime for what proved to be the winning points. Last Second Heroics Lift LSU Past Auburn, 30-24

Matt Flynn connected with Demetrius Byrd on a 22-yard TD pass with one second left to lift LSU to a 30-24 win over Auburn. The TD capped a comeback that saw the Tigers rally from deficits of 17-7 at halftime and 24-23 with just over three minutes left in the contest. It also marked the third straight game in which the outcome of a contest was decided on LSU's final possession of the game. Trailing 24-23 with 3:13 left in the game, Flynn guided LSU on a 9-play, 58-yard drive capped with his TD pass to Byrd. Flynn rushed for 19 yards, including runs of 10 and 7 yards, on the final drive and threw for another 23 on LSU's final possession. LSU started slow against Auburn, falling behind 17-7 at halftime. LSU closed the gap to 17-13 in the third quarter following field goals of 29 and 26 yards by **Colt David**. Cardiac Tigers Rally For Another 4th Quarter Comeback Victory Over Tide, 41-34

For the third time in four games, LSU rallied from a 4th quarter deficit to win, this time scoring with just over a minute left to beat 17th-ranked Alabama, 41-34. **Jacob Hester's** 1-yard TD plunge with 1:26 left in the contest capped a comeback that saw LSU score 14 points, which also included a 32-yard catch-and-run TD by **Early Doucet** on a fourth-down opportunity at the 2:49 mark, in the closing minutes to record the victory. Hester's game-winner came just seconds after LSU's **Chad Jones** sacked Alabama's John Parker Wilson, forcing a fumble that was recovered on the 3-yard line by **Curtis Taylor**. Early on, it didn't appear that LSU would any fourth quarter drama to win the game against its former coach in Nick Saban as the Tigers scored on their first three possessions to build a 17-3 on a 1-yard run by Hester just four seconds into the second quarter. However, a series of penalties, breakdowns and three interceptions, put Alabama back in the game as the Crimson Tide scored 17 unanswered points to take a 20-17 lead at halftime. Alabama stretched its lead to 27-17 late in the third quarter before the Tigers struck back less than a minute later when **Matt Flynn** hit **Demetrius Byrd** with a 61-yard TD pass to pull LSU to within 27-24. A **Colt David** 49-yard field goal tied the score at 27-27 with 11:23 to play. Alabama then regained the lead at 34-27 on a 61-yard punt return with just over seven minutes left in the contest to setup LSU's late fourth quarter drama. For the game, LSU outgained the Tide, 475-254, including a 388-234 margin through the air. Flynn had a big game for LSU, throwing for a career-best 353 yards and three scores.

Tigers Ride Arm Of Flynn, Feet Of Hester To 58-10 Win over Louisiana Tech

Matt Flynn threw for 237 yards and three scores and Jacob Hester rushed for a career-best 115 yards, including an 87-yard TD run, as LSU rolled to a 58-10 win over Louisiana Tech in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers racked up 595 yards, including 343 on the ground in extended their school-record Tiger Stadium winning streak to 19 straight games. The Tigers limited the Bulldogs to 256 total yards, which included just 67 rushing yards. LSU also forced five Tech turnovers which resulted in 20 LSU points. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 10-0 lead in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Flynn followed by a 31-yard Colt David field goal. Tech pulled to within 10-7 early in the second quarter before the Tigers responded with 17 unanswered points, which had Flynn throwing TD passes of 71 yards to Terrance Toliver and 37-yards to Brandon LaFell, extending the margin to 27-7 at halftime. LSU stretched its lead to 37-7 on Hester's 87-yard TD run early in the third quarter. Richard Dickson added a 14-yard TD reception in the third quarter followed by a 15-yard run by Trindon Holliday and a 2-yard TD reception by Mit Cole in the fourth quarter to close out the scoring for the Tigers. Four different Tigers caught TD passes with another three scoring on the ground for LSU.

Holliday's 98-Yard Kickoff Return Sparks Tigers Past Ole Miss, 41-24

Trindon Holliday's 98-yard kickoff return late in the first quarter gave LSU all the cushion it would need as the top-ranked Tigers held off a pesky Ole Miss team, 41-24, in Oxford. With the game tied at 7-7 after an Ole Miss punt return for a TD, Holliday answered on the ensuing kickoff, going straight up the middle, breaking a couple of tackles along the way, and easily outracing the Ole Miss defenders for the second kickoff return for a score in his career. Leading 14-7 at halftime, the Tigers increased the margin to 21-7 early in the second half on a 10-yard run by Keiland Williams. Ole Miss pulled to within 10 points on two occasions in the fourth quarter - 27-17 and 34-24 - but the Tigers responded each time with touchdowns to keep the score out of reach. Jacob Hester scored on a 2-yard run with 3:44 left in the game to extend the margin to 34-17 and then Charles Scott added the final points for LSU on a 29-yard TD run with just over two minutes left after the Rebels had pulled to within 34-24. For the game, the Tigers rushed for 228 yards with Scott leading the way with 66 yards and Hester adding 65. Matt Flynn connected on 17 of 25 passes for 168 yards and Colt David became LSU's all-time single-season leader in field goals, running his total to 21 this year, with two field goals against Ole Miss. Craig Steltz picked off two passes and had five tackles to lead the Tiger defense.

LSU Falls To Arkansas In Triple OT, 50-48

Matt Flynn's potential game-tying two-point conversion in triple-overtime was intercepted as top-ranked LSU dropped a 50-48 decision to Arkansas in the regular-season finale in Tiger Stadium. The loss snapped LSU's 19-game home winning streak and it also marked the Tigers' first loss in a game played in November since 2002. In a game that featured five ties, Arkansas came out on top as the Tigers' couldn't contain the Razorback rushing attack as Arkansas rushed for 385 yards and five scores. Arkansas led 7-6 at halftime and then built a 14-6 lead early in the third quarter before the Tigers tied the score on a 12-yard run by **Jacob Hester**. Arkansas regained at 21-14 on a 65-yard TD run, but the Tigers came back to tie the game on a 7-yard TD pass from Flynn to **Demetrius Byrd**. Trailing 28-21 late in the contest, LSU tied the game at 28-28 with less than a minute left when Flynn on fourth-and-goal, connected with Byrd on a 2-yard TD pass to send the game into overtime. The teams traded touchdowns in the first two overtimes before the game-clincher in the third extended period. Arkansas took the lead for good in the third overtime when the converted on the two-point conversion, running its lead to 50-42. LSU responded on its possession during the third overtime, this time Flynn connected with **Brandon LaFell** on a 9-yard TD pass bringing the Tigers to with 50-48. LSU's attempt on the two-point conversion was denied as Arkansas beat the Tigers for the first time since 2002. For the game, Hester led the Tigers with 126 yards and 2 TDs, while Flynn threw for 209 yards and 3 scores. **Ali Highsmith** had 19 tackles to pace the Tigers on defense.
