Host Arizona In Tiger Stadium On ESPN2

LSU faces a Pac-10 opponent for the fourth consecutive year on Saturday as the eighth-ranked Tigers host Arizona at 5:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience on ESPN2 with Ron Franklin and Ed Cunningham handling the call. LSU brings a 1-0 mark into the game after opening the season with a 45-3 dismantling of Louisiana-Lafayette. Arizona, also 1-0, is coming off a 16-13 victory over BYU. The game will be the first between the two teams since LSU's national championship season in 2003 when the Tigers rolled to a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson. After going 18 years (1984 to 2002) without facing a squad from the Pac-10, the Tigers will face a team from that league for the fourth consecutive year - Arizona, 2003; Oregon State, 2004; Arizona State, 2005; Arizona 2006. LSU brings an 8-game winning streak against Pac-10 teams into the Arizona contest a streak that dates back to a 27-24 win over Oregon State in 1980. LSU's last loss to a Pac-10 team came in 1979 when then-No. 1 Southern Cal beat the Tigers, 17-12, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers go into Saturday's contest coming off another impressive passing performance by QB **JaMarcus Russell** and a stout defensive effort. In just over two quarters of action, Russell connected on 13-of-17 passes for 253 yards and three scores, while the Tiger defense limited the Cajuns to only 176 yards of offense and eight first downs.

Russell, Defense Dominant In 45-3 Dismantling Of Louisiana-Lafayette

JaMarcus Russell looked to be in mid-season form and the Tiger defense seemed to pick up where last season left off as eight-ranked LSU rolled to a 45-3 season-opening win over Louisiana-Lafayette. Russell, seeing his first action since the SEC title game a year ago, connected on 13-of-17 passes for 253 yards and threw a career-high 3 TD passes in the victory, including a 58-yarder to **Brandon LaFell** on LSU's first possession of the contest. Minutes later CB **Jonathan Zenon** returned an interception 20-yards for a touchdown, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead just five minutes into the game. ULL's only points came early in the second quarter on a field goal as the Tiger defense stretched its streak of not allowing a touchdown to 10 quarters. The Tigers closed out the first half with Russell throwing TD passes to **Early Doucet** and **Dwayne Bowe** as LSU led 28-3 at halftime. **Jacob Hester** and **Alley Broussard** added TD runs in the second half for the Tigers as LSU rolled up 469 yards of offense compared to just eight first downs and 176 yards for the Cajuns. For the contest, LSU's three quarterbacks combined to connect on 17-of-23 passes for 299 yards and 3 scores, while the Tigers racked up 170 yards on the ground, with Broussard leading the way with 46 yards on eight carries in his first action since a severe knee injury in August of 2005.

LSU VS. ARIZONA

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SECOND YEAR

It was nothing short of remarkable what LSU coach Les Miles accomplished during his inaugural season with the Tigers in 2005. Consider that Miles led the Tigers to only the third 11-win season in school history, to a top five national ranking and a berth in the Southeastern Conference Championship Game despite numerous distractions that covered most of the months of September and October.

Then, with starting quarterback JaMarcus Russell out with an injury, Miles, along with backup quarterback Matt Flynn, guided the Tigers to the most impressive bowl win in school history, a 40-3 thrashing of ninth-ranked Miami in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win over the Hurricanes in the Peach Bowl capped a season that saw the Tigers post an 11-2 overall mark and finish ranked No. 5 in the final USA Today/Coaches Poll and No. 6 in the Associated Press poll.

To appreciate just how adverse the conditions that Miles and the Tigers had to overcome in 2005, you have to go back to late August and Hurricane Katrina, the first of two storms to devastate the state of Louisiana during the fall.

Days before LSU's originally scheduled season opener against North Texas in Tiger Stadium, Hurricane Katrina blew ashore, packing tremendous winds, and turned the state, in particular New Orleans and southeastern Louisiana, upside down.

Massive flooding followed in the wake of the storm as more than 30 LSU players had their families and their homes affected by the hurricane and Miles' first game in Tiger Stadium against North Texas was postponed. With the LSU campus serving as the recovery center for those sick, homeless and displaced due to Hurricane Katrina, football seemed to be the farthest thing from most people's minds. However, Miles was able to successfully manage a delicate situation, one that saw his team and coaching staff volunteer time to those in need, while still attempting to focus on football for at least two hours a day.

After a week of trying to minimize the distractions for a football team that had their apartments and dorm rooms filled with displaced family members and friends due to the storm, it appeared that the Tigers would finally get to play a home game, this time against 15th-ranked Arizona State.

However, just as the Tigers began to prepare for the Sun Devils and the season opener in Tiger Stadium, it was learned that the devastation to New Orleans was much greater than originally thought. With the Maravich Center on the LSU campus serving as what would become the largest field triage unit in United States history, it was mutually decided to move the LSU vs. Arizona State game to Tempe.

Still, with many in Louisiana under the distress of Hurricane Katrina, the Tigers were going to have to take to the desert to face a powerful offense in their first game of the season.

These were certainly trying times for everyone in the state of Louisiana, but even more so for a football coach who now had his team carrying the banner for a state in need of a diversion. LSU football had become a release for those consumed with the hurricane. LSU even re-stated its team goals, putting playing for the state of Louisiana at the top of the list.

The Tigers didn't disappoint as Miles and his LSU team used a 28-point fourth quarter rally to come back to beat Arizona State, 35-31, in Tempe.

Now with the Arizona State game behind them, it looked as if things for the LSU football team would gradually get back to normal as the Tigers now had a week off before facing Tennessee in Tiger Stadium on Sept. 24.

Then, the unthinkable happened. Another storm, this one named Rita, hit southwest Louisiana, causing severe damage to more homes, leaving thousands without electricity and displacing even more Louisianians. The combination of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita forced LSU to again shuffle its schedule. Instead of playing Tennessee on a Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers would now be forced to face the Volunteers on a Monday night. An emotionally drained LSU team saw a 21-0 halftime lead evaporate into a 30-27 overtime loss against the Vols.

There was no coaching handbook for Miles to refer to when it came to dealing with the hurricanes and preparing a team for competition during extreme adverse conditions. Miles was on his own, forced to navigate his LSU team through a treacherous stretch of games, while also being sympathetic to those still under the influence of the natural disasters.

With just five days between the Tennessee loss and the Mississippi State game, Miles and the Tigers were obviously dealt an unfair hand, however, he asked his team to respond and they did. The Mississippi State contest was the starting point for a stretch of games for the Tigers that saw LSU win nine straight. The 37-7 win over the Bulldogs was followed by a 34-6 road victory over Vanderbilt as the Tigers had re-established themselves as one of the nation's elite on the football field. During what would be 11-consecutive weeks of play, the Tigers posted a win over Florida along with overtime victories against Auburn and Alabama. In all, the Tigers beat four teams ranked among the top 15 in the nation, a school record for regular season victories over ranked opponents.

After 10 straight weeks of play during the regular season, the Tigers had fashioned a 7-1 conference mark and a berth in the SEC title game.

Miles became the only coach in his first year in the SEC to lead his squad to the league's title game. He also became the first coach in LSU history to beat Alabama, Auburn and Florida in the same season.

Following a loss to Georgia in the league's title game, Miles and the Tigers re-grouped, this time to beat No. 9 Miami, 40-3, in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. The win gave the Tigers 11 victories for the year, making Miles the winningest first-year coach in school history.

Tigers Return To Action Against Arizona

For the fourth straight year, LSU will step out of conference to play a team from the Pac-10 as Arizona comes to Tiger Stadium for a 5:30 p.m. contest. The game will be televised to a national audience by ESPN2 with Ron Franklin and Ed Cunningham calling the action. Both teams come into Saturday's game with a 1-0 mark - LSU beat Louisiana-Lafayette 45-3 to open the year, while Arizona edged BYU, 16-13 a week ago. LSU is 2-0 all-time against the Wildcats as the teams last meet in Tucson in 2003 with the Tigers posting a 59-13 victory.

LSU's Celebrates 75th Anniversary Under The Lights In Tiger Stadium

The 2006 season will also mark the 75th anniversary of LSU's first night game in Tiger Stadium. LSU's first night game in Tiger Stadium was played in 1931 when the Tigers posted a 35-0 win over Spring Hill on Oct. 3. Since that first night game in Tiger Stadium, played under the lights in Death Valley has become one of the grandest traditions in all of college football. 2005: A Year of Firsts For LSU and Les Miles

A year ago, **Les Miles** set several milestones for first-year LSU coaches as he guided the Tigers to 11 wins, making him the winningest first-year Tiger coach in school history. In addition, Miles became the only coach in school history to beat Florida, Auburn and Alabama in the same season. LSU beat Florida 21-17 on Oct. 15, then followed that with a 20-17 overtime win over Auburn a week later. The 16-13 overtime win over Alabama clinched the feat for Miles. He was also the first coach in SEC history to lead his team to the SEC Championship Game in his first year in the league. Miles currently is 12-2 as LSU's head coach and he's 40-23 overall in 5-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach.

About Arizona

The Wildcats are coached by **Mike Stoops**, who is in his third season at Arizona ... Stoops has an overall head coaching record of 7-16, all at Arizona ... Stoops was the defensive coordinator for Oklahoma in 2003 when the Tigers beat the Sooners, 21-14, to claim the BCS National Title in the Sugar Bowl ... The Wildcats are led by sophomore QB **Willie Tuitama**, who took over as the starter in week 7 a year ago ... Tuitama threw for 186 yards and 1 score in the opener against BYU ... RB Chris Henry led the Wildcats with 63 yards rushing against BYU, which included a 54-yard run ... Defensively, Louis Holmes had 2 sacks and a forced fumble against BYU to key a Wildcat defense that held the Cougars to just 24 yards rushing.

Grand Canyon State Tigers

LSU has one player on its roster who calls Arizona home and that's junior college transfer **Chad Baniecki** from Seton, Ariz. ... Baniecki is in his first year with the Tigers after transferring to LSU during the summer from Mesa Community College ... Baniecki originally played for LSU coach **Les Miles** at Oklahoma State in 2004 before transferring to Mesa Community College.

The Pelini-Stoops Connection

LSU defensive coordinator **Bo Pelini** is well connected to the Arizona coaching staff. Pelini, a native of Youngstown, Ohio, grew up with **Mike Stoops** (Arizona head coach) and **Mark Stoops** (Arizona defensive coordinator). Pelini spent a year coaching with Mike and Mark at Iowa in 1991 and he played high school football with Mark at Cardinal Mooney in Youngstown, where they were coached by Stoops' dad, the late Ron Stoops. Pelini also coached with another Stoops, Bob, at Oklahoma in 2004 before taking over as LSU's defensive coordinator for the 2005 season.

In The Polls

The Tigers went into the 2006 season ranked No. 8 in the Associated Press poll and No. 9 in the USA Today Coaches poll. It marks the third straight year that the Tigers start a season ranked in the top 10. Last year, the Tigers were ranked No. 5 in the AP poll and No. 6 in the USA Today Coaches poll. LSU also had a top 10 national ranking to open the 2004 season as the Tigers were ranked No. 4 in the AP poll following their national championship season in 2003. LSU has now been ranked for 51 consecutive polls by USA Today and 50 straight polls by the AP. This week's poll will be released on Tuesday following the Miami-Florida State game on Monday night.

Tigers Have Been Tough To Beat In Tiger Stadium

LSU goes into the Arizona game having won five straight and 16 of its last 17 games in Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss at home came against Tennessee on Sept. 26 of last year, a Monday night. LSU hasn't lost a Saturday game in Tiger Stadium since a 19-7 setback to Florida on Oct. 11, 2003. To take it a step further, LSU hasn't dropped a Saturday night game at home since a 31-0 defeat to Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002, a streak that stretches 14 consecutive games.

LSU's Non-Conference Home Winning Streak At 15 Straight

LSU brings a streak of having won 15 straight non-conference home games in the Arizona contest. The Tigers haven't dropped a home non-conference game since falling to UAB, 13-10, on Sept. 23, 2000.

LSU's Home Record Among Best In Nation Since 2003

LSU's home record of 19-2 since the start of the 2003 season ranks as the ninth-best mark percentage wise in the nation. The following is a look at the best home records nationally dating back to the start of the 2003 season:

LSU's Won 5 Straight and 13 Of Last 14 Non-Conference Games

LSU has won five straight and 13 of its last 14 non-conference games heading into the Arizona contest. LSU was 5-0 in non-conference action a year ago. LSU's last non-conference loss came at the hands of Iowa by a 30-25 count in the Capital One Bowl on Jan. 1, 2005. Prior to that, LSU's last non-conference loss was to Texas by a 35-20 margin in the Cotton Bowl during the 2002 season.

LSU Has Second-Best Record In SEC Over Last 5-Plus Seasons

Tiger Defense Hasn't Allowed A TD For 10 Straight Quarters; Ranks As Nation's Longest Streak

LSU's defense brings a streak into the Arizona game of holding its opponents without a touchdown for 10 straight quarters into the 2006 season, which ranks as the longest current streak in the nation. LSU closed out last year by holding Miami to only 3 points in the Peach Bowl. Prior to that, LSU's defense allowed only a pair of second half field goals in a loss to Georgia in the SEC Championship Game. The last offensive touchdown scored against LSU was on a 7-yard run by D.J. Shockley at the 8:23 mark of the second quarter in the SEC title game.

Redzone Streak Still Intact? You Make That Call

LSU's streak of 31 straight trips inside the redzone came to an end (or did it?) on Saturday, not because of the UL-Lafayette defense or a missed opportunity by the Tigers, but by the game clock. The game ended with the Tigers on the Cajuns 5-yard line. So until the Tigers are either stopped by the defense in the redzone or miss a scoring opportunity in the redzone, the LSU SID office will say the streak is still intact. Dating back to the Auburn game in 2005, the Tigers have been successful on every trip inside the redzone (24 touchdowns, 7 field goals).

Tiger Defense Scores Again

LSU's defense supplied points for the Tigers again on Saturday against Louisiana-Lafayette as CB Jonathan Zenon returned an interception 20-yards for a touchdown early in the first quarter. The Zenon interception return for a score marked the third time under defensive coordinator Bo Pelini that the Tiger defense has scored a touchdown. LSU is 41-2 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 team rushing yards and the Tigers are 26-1 when having a player rush for 100 yards.

LSU O-Line Goes From Grey to Green

A year ago, LSU had one of the most experienced offensive lines in school history, as the starting five up front combined for 146 career starts (Andrew Whitworth - 52, Nate Livings - 34, Rudy Niswanger - 31, **Brian Johnson** - 16, and **Will Arnold** - 14). This year, the Tigers go into the season with an offensive line that has combined for 32 career starts. Johnson and Arnold combined for 30 of the 32 starts, while center **Brett Helms** made up the other two. **Peter Dyakowski** and **Ciron Black** both made their first career starts last week against Louisiana-Lafayette. Russell Runs Record As LSU's Starting QB To 15-2

LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** ran his record as the Tigers starter to 15-2 with the 45-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette. Russell guided the Tigers to a 10-2 mark as a starter last year after going 4-0 as a redshirt freshman in 2004. LSU's **Matt Flynn** is 1-0 as a starter after leading the Tigers to a 40-3 win over Miami in last year's Peach Bowl.

Russell Sets Career Mark for TD Passes Against Louisiana-Lafayette

When LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** connected with **Brandon LaFell** on a 58-yard TD pass on the third play of the game against Louisiana-Lafayette, it marked the longest completion of Russell's career. It also marked the first of what would be a career-best three TD passes for Russell against the Cajuns. For the game, Russell finished 13-of-17 for 253 yards and 3 scores. The 253 passing yards ranks as the second-highest total of Russell's career.

Landry Runs Starting Streak to 36 Straight

LSU All-America free safety **LaRon Landry** ran his streak of consecutive starts to 36 straight against Louisiana-Lafayette. Landry, from Ama, La., has been in the LSU lineup since the Mississippi State contest (week 5) in 2003. The 36 straight starts ranks as the fifth-longest streak in the Division IA.

Russell-To-Bowe TD Combination Now Tied For Fourth Best Combo In School History

The pitch and catch combination of **JaMarcus Russell-to-Dwayne Bowe** ran their TD streak to 13 with a second quarter score against Louisiana-Lafayette. The 13 touchdowns between the pair (Russell throwing and Bowe catching) ranks as the fourth most prolific scoring combo in school history. Russell and Bowe have hooked up for 8 TDs in 2005 after combining for 4 scores in 2004. The Tommy Hodson-to-Wendell Davis ranks as the most prolific TD combination in school history as the duo accounted for 21 touchdowns during their careers. Davis missed the Mississippi State and Florida contests with injuries a year ago. In 11 games in 2005, Davis caught 35 passes for 559 yards and 2 TDs.

Alley's Back

LSU RB **Alley Broussard** returned to action for the first time in nearly two years on Saturday against Louisiana-Lafayette. Broussard, who injured his knee in fall camp a year ago, hadn't played since the Capital One Bowl in January of 2005. Broussard entered the ULL game in the second half and responded with 46 yards and 1 touchdown on 8 carries, which included a 19-yard run on his first carry of the game.

Colt David PAT Streak At 41 Straight

LSU PK **Colt David** ran his streak of successful PATs to 41 straight by connecting on all six of his attempts against Louisiana-Lafayette. The 41 straight successful PATs ranks as the seventh longest streak in school history. David Browndyke holds the school record by making 109 in a row from 1986 to 1989.

LSU Used 5 First-Time Starters Against Louisiana-Lafayette

The Tigers had four first-time starters in the contest against Louisiana-Lafayette last Saturday. First time starters for the Tigers included: **Tyson Jackson** at defensive end; **Daniel Francis** at nickel back; **Luke Sanders** at linebacker; **Ciron Black** at left offensive tackle; and **Peter Dyakowski** at right offensive tackle.

11 True Freshmen See Action In Opener

A total of 11 true freshman saw action in the opener against Louisiana-Lafayette. LaRon Landry Back To Lead Secondary

LaRon Landry, a First-Team All-SEC pick in 2004, returns as the "quarterback" of the Tiger secondary in 2006. Landry is listed on just about every preseason All-America team as well as being named the top safety in the country by several publications. Landry opened his senior season with 6 tackles and 1 tackle for a 3-yard loss against UL-Lafayette. For his career, Landry has recorded 247 career tackles, 13.5 tackles for losses, 7 sacks and 9 interceptions.

A Familiar Face Under Center

For just the second time since 1998, the Tigers opened a season with the same quarterback who served as the starter from the year before. Junior **JaMarcus Russell** joined **Matt Mauck** (2002-03) as the only quarterbacks since the days of Herb Tyler to start consecutive season openers for the Tigers when he takes the first snap against Louisiana-Lafayette. • LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 82nd year in the venerable stadium. LSU is also celebrating the 75th anniversary of playing under the light of Tiger Stadium. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.

• LSU has won 24 OF ITS LAST 27 games at home.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 41 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 30 times, including a school-record 92,664 for the Oct. 22, 2005 game that pitted No. 7 LSU against No. 15 Auburn. LSU won the game 20-17.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 46 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 44 of the 46 years and in the top 10 on 38 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP SIX IN THE NATION, including the last five.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 196-59-3 (.765) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 18-22-3 (.453) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 92,400 fans.

LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks Matt Mauck and Marcus Randall combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and Joseph Addai rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. Michael Clayton led all receivers with six catches for 109 yards and a 48-yard TD reception. Addai opened the scoring for LSU with a 1-yard run midway through the first quarter. Ryan Gaudet nailed a 47-yard field goal three minutes later and then Addai added an 8-yard TD run less than a minute after Gaudet's field goal to give the Tigers a 17-0 lead. LSU stretched the advantage to 38-0 at halftime, as the Tigers were never threatened in the contest. In all the Tigers, had five rushing TDs, two passing TDs and Skyler Green returned a punt 65 yards for a TD. Arizona scored its first points with 10 minutes left in the contest on a 1-yard fumble return. Defensively, LSU limited the Wildcats to only 182 yards of offense.

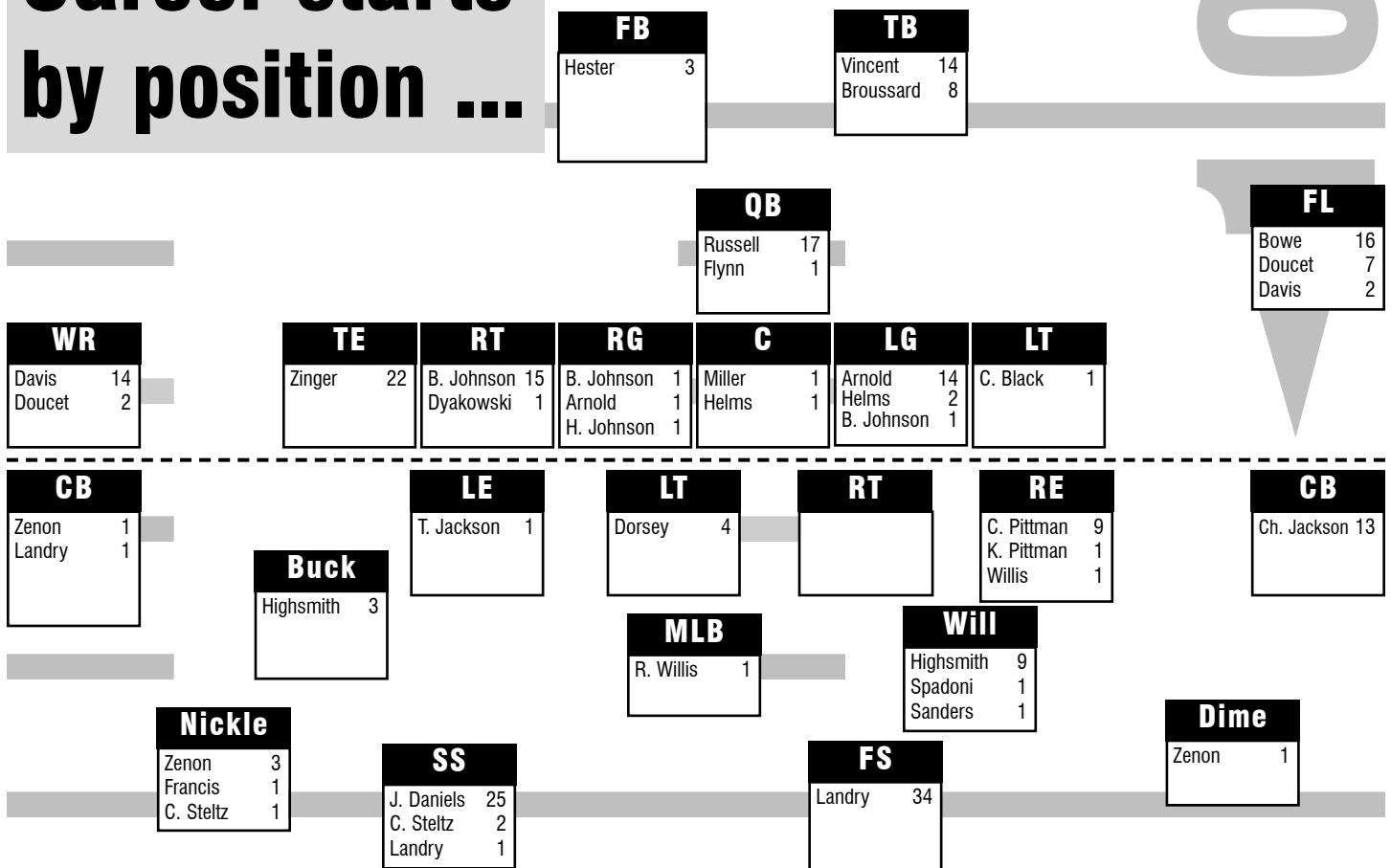

Russell, Defense Dominant In 45-3 Dismantling Of Louisiana-Lafayette

JaMarcus Russell looked to be in mid-season form and the Tiger defense seemed to pick up where last season left off as eight-ranked LSU rolled to a 45-3 season-opening win over Louisiana-Lafayette. Russell, seeing his first action since the SEC title game a year ago, connected on 13-of-17 passes for 253 yards and threw a career-high 3 TD passes in the victory, including a 58-yarder to Brandon LaFell on LSU's first possession of the contest. Minutes later CB Jonathan Zenon returned an interception 20-yards for a touchdown, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead just five minutes into the game. ULL's only points came early in the second quarter on a field goal as the Tiger defense stretched its streak of not allowing a touchdown to 10 quarters. The Tigers closed out the first half with Russell throwing TD passes to Early Doucet and Dwayne Bowe as LSU led 28-3 at halftime. Jacob Hester and Alley Broussard added TD runs in the second half for the Tigers as LSU rolled up 469 yards of offense compared to just eight first downs and 176 yards for the Cajuns. For the contest, LSU's three quarterbacks combined to connect on 17-of-23 passes for 299 yards and 3 scores, while the Tigers racked up 170 yards on the ground, with Broussard leading the way with 46 yards on eight carries in his first action since a severe knee injury in August of 2005.
