When John Brady first put a team on the floor of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, his Tiger squad was undermanned, undersized and underdogs.

Teams hated to play the Tigers then because John Brady coached his team hard and they responded with several strong performances against the leagues top teams, but not many wins.

Last year, in his eighth season at LSU, John Brady was coaching the LSU team as only he knows how -- with heart and passion, and knowledge of the game that makes him one of the best at in-game decisions. The LSU Tigers, in 2005, won the Southeastern Conference Western Division with a 12-4 record, won 20 games (including 14-of-the-last 19) and posted the first undefeated record at home in the SEC (8-0) since 1981.

LSU advanced to the NCAA Tournament, putting the Tigers in postseason play for the fourth straight year and the fifth time in six seasons. LSU has had four consecutive winning seasons under John Brady and only three times in the program history has there been longer consecutive years of winning.

In the last six seasons, LSU has won 119 games, one game shy of an even average of 20 wins per season.

For the second time in the last six seasons, John Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year and in those six years he has coached the SEC Freshman of the

Year three times, including each of the last two years.

Brady's 140 wins in eight seasons is the third most wins by an LSU basketball coach and only two LSU basketball coaches have served longer tenures.

In his first eight seasons, John Brady has built a program at LSU with a record of success that is hard to argue with. He has given the LSU program the direction to grow and the chance to shine again.

When Brady arrived on campus in March 1997 and was given the job of rebuilding the program, make no mistake; he knew his program would be riddled with shortcomings because of NCAA-imposed sanctions. He knew he would have the chance to mold the program from the ground up and build a foundation based on responsibility and accountability.

Brady knows after eight years his knowledge of the game and his belief in discipline and responsibility for actions on and off the floor have made the LSU program strong again, one that LSU fans are proud of because they feel a part of the program.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hardwood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that that athletic and academic pursuits of the players should be challenged to the fullest. That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well. Hours are passed and posted toward graduation on a regular

basis by scholarship players. The team GPA is now close to 3.0.

Brady came to LSU after six highly successful seasons at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala. He brought the program to a new level of excitement for the fans and to the team that is still talked about to this day.

In his six-year tenure (1992-97), he turned the team into a consistent winner, posted a record of 89-77. In Brady's six years at Samford, the team had three first-team and five second-team all-league selections. In his time at the school, he had 14 members named to the all-league academic team.

Now at LSU, the numbers are beginning to work for Brady both on and off the floor. He has had 27 players earn Academic Honor Roll status at LSU, plus 12 selections to the All-SEC team.

The 51-year-old Brady is the father of two daughters (Brittany-15, Brooke-11) and is married to the former Misty Champagne.

In eight seasons, John Brady has taken the Tigers a long way both on and off the court. The results is a program that is solid both athletically and academically. The top athletes in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers in the league. He has reestablished LSU back as a player in the SEC and the work is being done to keep LSU there for years to come.

The remaining question is which game is set for 1 p.m. and which will follow at 3 p.m. and all that will be depending on play by the two teams Saturday.

To try to sum it up as easily as possible -- if LSU wins and/or both teams win Saturday, the Tigers will play March 4 at 3 p.m. as the second game ... If LSU loses and Tennessee wins, the LSU game will lead off at 1 p.m. ... If both teams lose, LSU will play at 3 p.m. ... If LSU wins and Tennessee loses, LSU will play at 3 p.m.

LSU On The Road

With the win at Vanderbilt (2/22), LSU is now 6-4 on opponents courts this year with wins at West Virginia, Arkansas, Mississippi State, Ole Miss, Auburn and Vanderbilt ... LSU is 5-2 in the league on the road ... Last year, in winning the SEC Western Division with a 12-4 record, the Tigers were 4-4 in the league on the road, winning at Georgia and its last three SEC road games at Mississippi State, Auburn and Ole Miss ... The loss at Alabama (2/4) snapped a streak of six straight league road wins that tied for the fourth longest road winning streak in LSU history ... The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to the men and women's players of the year ... The top 30 list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, comprised of leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators from around the country. The board based its criteria on player performances this season. The list was narrowed down from the pre-season list of 50 candidates who were announced at the beginning of the season ... The final ballot will be issued in March when the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors announces four finalists for the award. The Naismith Trophy winner will be named at the NCAA Final Four in Indianapolis.

The only other player in the group of 30 from the SEC is Kentucky's Rajon Rondo.

Davis, Thomas Take SEC Honors For Feb. 21

Off a 2-0 week in which the LSU Tigers moved up one spot in the national polls, LSU forwards Glen Davis and Tyrus Thomas took top honors from the Southeastern Conference office announced on Monday ... Davis, off his fourth and fifth consecutive double doubles earned SEC Player of the Week honors for the first time this season and Thomas was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for the third time this year.

Davis totaled 19 points and 13 rebounds against Mississippi State and 24 points and 11 rebounds at Auburn in LSU's victories last week. The 24 points at Auburn marked his eighth 20-point game and in that game he became the 34th player in LSU history to pull down 500 rebounds in his two-year LSU career ... Davis leads the league with 9.7 rebounds per game and is second in scoring and third in field goal percentage at 50.6 percent.

Thomas total 16 points and 13 rebounds for his 13th double-double of the season against Mississippi State and followed that performance with 14 points, eight rebounds and four blocks at Auburn ... Thomas is the nation's leading freshman rebounder and shot blocker and leads the conference in blocks (3.1) and field goal percentage (60.9 percent) and is second in the SEC in rebounding at 9.2 boards per game.

The Louisiana Sports Writers Association also named Davis player of the week in the state.

Davis, Mitchell, Thomas on NABC All-District Team

LSU's Glen Davis and Darrel Mitchell were named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I All-District 8 first team announced Feb. 18 ... Freshman Tyrus Thomas was named on the District 8 second team ... Joining Davis and Mitchell on the first team were Southeastern Louisiana's Ricky Woods, Louisiana Tech's Paul Millsap and Brion Rush of Grambling.

Members of the team, which include 150 student-athletes selected and voted on by members of the NABC from 15 districts across the country, are eligible for NABC Division I All-American honors. The honors will be announced at the end of the 2005-06 NCAA men's basketball season.

Pierre A Vitale Choice As Top "Second Lieutenant"

ESPN and ABC analyst Dick Vitale Tuesday in USA Today named LSU Associate Head Basketball Coach Butch Pierre one of the "top second lieutenants" in college basketball ... Vitale listed six assistant coaches "waiting for an offer to coach a big-time program." ... Pierre is in his ninth year as a member of Head Coach John Brady's staff after a career highlighted by a long tenure at Louisiana-Lafayette. The Louisiana native was at the UNC Charlotte before coming to Baton Rouge.

Joining Pierre on Vitale's list was Johnny Dawkins of Duke, Barry Rohrsen of Pittsburgh, Fred Hill, Jr., of Rutgers, Bill Grief of Gonzaga, and, Anthony Grant of Florida.

LSU Fans Sell Out Retro Preview; Could Be Big Number Today

The Tigers gave fans a preview of SEC Throwback Week which begins Saturday by donning the 1970 throwback white jerseys of the Pete Maravich era against Georgia (1/25) and LSU fans took advantage of retro ticket prices and soft drink discounts and put the sold out sign in the ticket window for the first time since the building was reconfigured to its present seating capacity of 13,373 ... A total of 13,468 paid was the attendance, the fifth largest paid crowd in the John Brady era ... The actual attendance of 11,780 was the seventh best of the Brady era.

With today's game listed as a sellout, except for the student tickets which are picked up on game day by showing ID, it could be another top total in the Brady era.

LSU made its fourth appearance of the year and second consecutive week in the Associated Press Top 25 when the Feb. 20 poll was announced ... LSU moved up one spot in both the AP and ESPN/USA Today polls to No. 24 after wins versus Mississippi State and at Auburn ... LSU also picked up points in both polls from the previous week, from 42 to 99 in the coaches poll and 68 to 187 in the media AP voting ... The Tigers debut this season came in the No. 25 spot in both the AP and ESPN/USA Today polls on Nov. 26 after winning at No. 13 West Virginia ... A loss to Houston put the Tigers back out and they returned to the poll on Jan. 30 when the Tigers were No. 24 in the AP poll ... LSU was 1-1 that week, beating Auburn (84-69, 2/1) and then lost at Alabama (67-62, 2/4) ... Despite another 1-1 week, LSU returned back on Feb. 13 at 25th in both polls and this week marks the 174th appearance in the AP poll since first making the poll on Dec. 16, 1952 ... LSU's record as a ranked team is 231-82 and 4-2 this year ... LSU's four poll appearances is the most since the Tigers were ranked for nine AP polls during the 1999-2000 season ... LSU's record as a No. 24 ranked team is 3-4, 2-1 this year.

The Ohio State loss stopped LSU's three game straight regular season win streak over an AP ranked team, beating 14th-ranked Alabama (61-59) and No. 24 Florida (74-71) in Baton Rouge last February to go with November's West Virginia win ... The most astonishing thing about the West Virginia game is the fact that the win over West Virginia marked the first time in the history of the AP poll, that LSU had defeated a non-SEC ranked AP team on its home floor ... WVU was the highest-ranked foe the Tigers knocked off since beating No. 7 Florida, 65-61, in the 2003 SEC Tournament ... The victory was the first by LSU on the road over a ranked team since the Tigers beat Florida, when the Gators were ranked No. 22, 73-70, in Gainesville on Feb. 14, 2004 ... The WVU win was the third win for a John Brady Tiger team against a ranked team on the road ... Overall, LSU is now 54-209 against ranked teams in the AP poll after falling to No. 7 Florida (2/8).

LSU Three-Point Streak Ended in Fayetteville

Against Arkansas (1/11), the Tigers were 0-8 from the three-point arc ... It was the first time in 262 games that LSU failed to make a three-pointer ... The last previous game in which LSU failed to make a three-pointer came on Feb. 5, 1997, when LSU was 0-for-3 in a 79-73 loss in Baton Rouge to Ole Miss.

Three-Point Shooting, Down, Up, Now???

After shooting no worse than 38.9 percent (twice) at the arc in the seven games from January 18 through February 8, the Tigers were 7-of-35 in the games at Florida (2/11), Mississippi State (2/15) and at Auburn (2/18) ... But at Vandy, the thing went back a little bit the other way as LSU made 5-of-14 attempts (35.7 percent) ... For the year, the Tigers are now 110-of-325 or 33.8 percent ... LSU opponents have made 34.8 percent, but the opposition has attempted 146 more three-pointers and made 54 more treys than the Tigers.

It has been a season of runs as prior to the good seven games at the arc, LSU's five games prior to Jan. 18, LSU was just 24.3 percent from the arc.

LSU is now 10th in three-point percentage ... LSU shot 50 percent or better from the arc in five games a year ago, and the Auburn game (2/1) was the third this year ... LSU is coming off a 2004-05 season in which they made 205 three-pointers, the second most in school history ... This was following a 2003-04 season in which the Tigers made just 168 treys and 33.6 percent of their attempts ... In league play, LSU's average of 36.4 is fourth in the league.

The least three-pointers by LSU in the Brady era was his first year, 1997-98, when the Tigers made 140 treys.

A New LSU Three-Point King Crowned

Just before the clock ticked down to 10 minutes in the Mississippi State game (2/15), LSU senior Darrel Mitchell made his second three-point field goal of the game to become the school leader in three-point field goals with 238 ... The previous record was held by guard Torris Bright, who played from 2000-2003, with 237 career treys ... Mitchell made 42 treys coming exclusively off the bench as a freshman and then 67 in both his sophomore and junior seasons ... He enters the Kentucky game with 67 treys, obviously way ahead of the pace of his last two years when he made 67 each as a sophomore and a junior.

Davis Gets 500 Rebounds

LSU sophomore forward Glen Davis put his name in the LSU record book at Auburn (2/18) as the forward became the 34th member of the 500 rebound club at LSU ... He became just the 12th player in LSU history to grab 500 rebounds in the first two years of eligibility ... Davis has pulled down 517 rebounds in 56 career games, an average of 9.2 boards per game ... He presently leads the SEC in rebound average at 9.8 rebounds a contest.

Minor Out With Knee Surgery

LSU junior point guard Tack Minor underwent successful surgery on Dec. 29 to repair a torn meniscus in his left knee ... LSU will apply for a medical redshirt for Minor, who was injured in the second half of the game with Cincinnati (12/23) at the Las Vegas Holiday Classic ... The junior from Houston had played in three games since returning to the team after the conclusion of the first semester and was having his best game since his return with six points and three assists in 14 minutes of play. Last year, Minor started all 30 games at point guard for the Tigers.

The Brady Tenure -- Wins 150th At LSU Versus Tennessee (1/14)

Already in his ninth year as the head coach of LSU, John Brady is placing his stamp on the LSU coaching tenure ... Brady already has the third longest tenure of any LSU coach in the 98 seasons of the program and his 159 wins is the third most in program history ... His win against Tennessee (1/14) made him the 29th among SEC coaches to win 150 games at an SEC school ... He is presently 28th on the all-time league wins list ... In his first eight seasons, Brady has had 27 academic all-SEC honorees, two SEC Players of the Year (Stromile Swift -- 2000; Brandon Bass -- 2005), three SEC Freshman of the Year (Torris Bright -- 2000; Brandon Bass -- 2004; and, Glen Davis -- 2005) and 12 members of the All-SEC team.

Houston Snapped Early Home Winning Streak

The Tigers were 14-1 at home last year with the only loss early in the 2004 portion of the 2004-05 season against West Virginia ... The Tigers then ran off 13 straight wins at the Maravich Center, stopped finally in the 84-83 loss to Houston on Nov. 29 ... The 13-game winning streak equaled the seventh longest in the 35-year history of the Maravich Assembly Center.

Overtime Games

LSU is 1-0 in overtime games this year, the 71-68 win at No. 13 West Virginia ... LSU split four overtime games a year ago and has now won four of the last six times LSU has gone to overtime ... The Tigers are 28-42 overall in extra session games, 9-19 on the road.

100-Pointers

The Nicholls State game (11/21) marked the 104th time in LSU history that the Tigers have topped the 100-point mark with the 104-57 score ... It is the second straight year that LSU has topped 100 points and the fifth time in the John Brady era ... LSU is now 96-8 when scoring 100 points or more and LSU has won the last 10 straight when scoring 100 points

and 34 of the last 35 games when over the century mark.

The Pete Maravich Assembly Center -- Different and Better

The Pete Maravich Assembly Center has a new and much different look for 2005-06 after all new seats were put in the middle and upper levels and the lower level pullout sections were redone ... This was the first major renovations in the middle and upper levels of the building since the building first played host to basketball in January 1972.

This is the 35th season of play in the building and LSU is 398-135 overall (74.7 percent) ... Also there were changes in the arena set up as LSU returns to a single press row for the first time in many years featuring a length of the court ad board for LSU Sports Properties ... The courtside seats have moved behind the press row and in front of the primary group of students in the lower mid-court section.

The Official Capacity

For years, the capacity of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center was listed as 14,164 ... After new seats were installed in the building, including wider ones in the middle and upper levels, the capacity for basketball games is now listed at 13,373.

The Maravich Maniacs

The students voted at the start of the season to name the new student section and the main area of close to 300 seats which is located in the lower level at center court for LSU students and the choice was that the area would now be the home of the "Maravich Maniacs" ... The area allows students to be closer to the floor than they have in years, plus allow them to stand if they wish without blocking the view of fans who now are able to purchase tickets in the new center-court middle sections.

The Louisiana Streak Alive For Another Season

After LSU's win over Tulane (1/3), the Tigers stand at 58 straight regular season home wins against Louisiana schools ... The Tigers finish the non-conference schedule 6-0 against the state this year with wins over Southern (11/18), Nicholls State (11/21), McNeese State (12/10), UNO (12/13), Louisiana Lafayette (12/17) and Tulane (1/3).

The last time LSU lost a regular season Maravich Assembly Center game to an in-state school was Dec. 6, 1988 when LSU lost to Louisiana Tech in overtime, 111-109 ... The present streak started innocently enough two days later when the Tigers beat McNeese State, 91-89.

Chances That Got Away

Three very frustrating games ... Five losses by a combined 11 points ... The summary of the LSU non-conference set of games against some very formidable opponents.

It seems that each of the last three losses -- Cincinnati (12/23 in Las Vegas, at Ohio State (12/31) and Connecticut (1/7 in Hartford) all had their own maddening moments as LSU had a chance to get quality wins, including two wins over ranked teams.

Vs. Cincinnati (at Las Vegas), Dec. 23 -- LSU had a 72-67 lead with 2:57 left, but LSU would not score again, getting nothing on its final five possessions, missing front ends of one-and-ones twice, missing a jumper, a turnover and a three-pointer at the buzzer ... Cincinnati would hit two treys and free throws to win, 75-72.

At No. 21 Ohio State, Dec. 31 -- LSU had a 15-point advantage with six minutes remaining and led by 10, 76-66, at the 3:22 mark ... LSU would not scratch on its final seven possessions, including three turnovers ... Ohio State would hit four three-pointers, the last with five seconds to play, to give the Buckeyes the 78-76 win.

At No. 2 Connecticut, Jan. 7 -- LSU builds a 14-point advantage at the 5:07 mark of the first half, forcing UConn to call time and LSU leads, 37-30, at intermission ... UConn ties the game at 53-53 with 6:59 left and the game tied for the final time at 61-61 with 2:47 to play ... UConn takes a 67-64 lead with 20 seconds left before Darrel Mitchell was fouled on a three-point attempt ... He made the last two tosses, LSU fouled on the inbounds, UConn missed both and LSU down one, had the final shot, missing a three-pointer as UConn wins, 67-66.

Even in LSU's other two non-conference losses, there were scenarios that could have gone LSU's way ... In the 54-50 loss to Northern Iowa (12/19), the game turned with LSU up 36-33 with 13:44 to play ... LSU would be outscored 12-2 and go down 45-38 (5:23 to play) in the process missing three jump shots, two three-pointers, two turnovers, a layup and two missed free throws (in the game LSU was 3-of-10 at the free throw line).

In LSU's 84-83 loss to Houston (11/29), the game seemed to turn coming out of the dressing room as LSU was outscored 18-3 in the first 4:30 of the second half to see LSU go from 43-31 up to 49-46 down ... In that time, LSU hit just one three-pointer with one missed three point shot and eight turnover possessions without getting a shot.

In the Last Five Minutes

In the seven games that LSU lost, especially the Cincinnati and Ohio State games, the three-pointer late was a huge factor against the Tigers ... In the seven losses, the opponents have made 9-of-14 three-point attempts or 64.3 percent, compared to just 4-of-16 by LSU ... LSU is 22-of-50 from the field against the opponents 24-of-39 (61.5 percent) in the seven games and LSU was just 6-of-16 (37.5 percent) from the free throw line, compared to 17-of-25 for the visitors for the charity tosses (68.0 percent).

Overall, in the SEC games, LSU has been strong in the final five minutes, hitting 49-of-84 field goal attempts (58.3 percent), 6-of-12 from the arc and a very impressive 48-of-63 (76.2 percent) from the line ... Against Ole Miss (1/28), in the last five minutes with the game on the line, LSU was 3-of-3 from the field, two of those treys, and 9-of-9 from the free throw line.

More Scoring Numbers

The 58 second-half points against Tennessee (1/14) marked the third most LSU has scored in a half in the John Brady era and the most against an SEC team during his nine years ... LSU's 50-19, 31-point advantage at the half marked the fourth biggest halftime lead for LSU in the John Brady era and the biggest since LSU had a 30-point lead on Arkansas (2/22/03).

The Tigers have had great success under John Brady when scoring 80 points or more in his career at LSU and that's another thing that made the Houston (11/29) loss so unusual ... The 84-83 loss to the Cougars marked only the second time in 63 games that LSU has lost a game in the Brady era when scoring 80 or more points ... The Tigers remain undefeated (24-0) when scoring 90 or more points in the John Brady era ... LSU scored just 65 points in winning at Auburn (2/18), making the Tigers 3-3 this year when scoring between 60-69 points and 38-40 in the Brady era.

LSU is 18-4 this year when leading at the half, 131-21 in the Brady era.

Possessions And Possession Points That Stand Out

At Vandy (2/22), LSU scored 20 points in the first 12 possessions of the second half to take a one-point lead to a 12-point advantage in a game LSU would win by 11.

In the Mississippi State win (2/15), LSU started out with just two points in its first 10 possessions, while State had 12 points in its first nine, before the situation turned and State had just 27 points in its 44 first half possessions, while the Tigers had 34 over the course of its next 36 possessions.

The possession story of the Arkansas game (2/8) was seen at the end after LSU got a dunk from Tyrus Thomas to take a 75-63 with 4:35 to play ... Over the next four minutes, LSU had the ball eight times and failed to score a point, while Arkansas was scoring 14 points in 11 possessions to take the lead ... LSU's final possession, however, resulted in the game winning three by Darrel Mitchell and Arkansas's last two possessions, around the three-pointer were two missed free throws and a missed shot right before the buzzer.

In the Georgia win (1/25), as LSU jumped out to an 18-2 lead in the first 5:15 of the contest, LSU scored the 18 points on its first 11 possessions and 50 points in 43 possessions in the first half ... During the same time period, Georgia scored just two points on 14 possessions and 19 points in its 44 first-half possessions.

After scoring just 19 points on its first 33 possessions against Tennessee (1/14), the Tigers ramped it up in the second half, scoring 41 points on their first 35 possessions of the second half.

In the UConn game (1/7), the interesting possession swing came when LSU in the first half built the lead from 17-11 up with 13:39 to go to a 10-point 25-15 lead with 7:22 to go as the Huskies scored just four points in 15 possessions during that time, while LSU was scoring 25 points in its first 25 possessions of the game.

LSU drew a blank in the final five possessions of the Cincinnati game (12/23) when the Tigers lost a five-point advantage and on the final five possessions against Ohio State (12/31).

In overtime against West Virginia (11/26), the Tigers used their seven possessions to score nine points, while WVU only scored six points in their nine possessions of the five-minute period ... LSU's and points per possessions average this season through 24 games:

LSU -- 1,971 points in 2,212 possessions (0.89 points per possession)
Opponents -- 1,671 points in 2,119 possessions (0.79 points per possession)

Field Goal Percentage

After posting its worst field goal percentage of the year against Mississippi State (2/15) at 38.3 percent, the Tigers came back and posted another 50 percent night at Auburn (2/18), 25-of-50 ... The Tigers have shot below 40 percent three times this year and ironically, the Tigers are 3-0.

The Tigers posted their best percentage of the season against Tennessee (1/14), when they made 31-of-48 attempts for 64.6 percent in the 88-74 victory ... Ironically, it was just under two years ago (2/4/04), also against Tennessee, that the Tigers last hit 60 percent from the floor (60.4 percent, 29-of-48) ... Against Auburn in the first meeting (2/1) LSU hit over 70 percent in the second half from the field for the second time this season ... LSU was 15-of-21 from the floor in the half (71.4 percent) with 12 assists that led to 63 percent for the game (29-of-46) ... The second Auburn game (2/18) marked the 10th time this year, fifth in the league in which the Tigers shot 50 percent or better from the floor.

LSU has out shot 20 opponents this year (with a 17-3 record) ... The Tigers have won 134-of-161 games in the Brady era in which it has out shot the opponent from the field.

LSU is 78-13 in the Brady era when making better than half of their shots ... LSU through 26 games is shooting 48.0 percent ... The Tigers best percentage in the Brady era was in 2000 when LSU shot 48.7 percent from the floor ... Just for the record, the 1978-79 team holds the school record for season field goal percentage of 52.0 percent.

LSU is second to Florida in field goal percentage and leads the league in field goal percentage defense, holding opponents to 39.7 percent ... In SEC games, LSU is third in offensive field goal percentage, shooting 47.4 percent and is first in field goal percentage defense in league games, holding the 13 league opponents to 40.9 percent.

Rebounding

In the last three games, LSU has out rebounded Mississippi State (2/15) by 16, Auburn (2/18) by 11 and Vandy (2/22) by 17, a total rebound difference of 44 in the three contests ... LSU has been out rebounded just three times this season -- the last in the Ole Miss game (1/28) as Ole Miss had 32 rebounds to LSU's 25 ... The other games in which LSU was out rebounded were the McNeese game (12/10) and the first Mississippi State game (1/18).

LSU earlier in the season had an amazing four players in double figure rebounds in the Nicholls State game (11/21) -- Glen Davis (13), Tyrus Thomas (12), Tasmin Mitchell (11) and Magnum Rolle (10) ... A check of the LSU records show that the last time an LSU team had four players in double figures in rebounds was on Dec. 30, 1991, ironically against Nicholls State

LSU remains the league leader in rebounding averaging at 41.9 rebounds ... LSU also leads the league in rebounding defense at 31.3 boards a game and rebound margin at plus 10.7. Kentucky is now second at plus 4.0, tied with Mississippi State.

Under the just for curiosity department, LSU's best ever rebound average was during the 1969-70 season (Pete Maravich's senior year) when LSU averaged 52.8 rebounds a game ... The top five on the list all occurred in the 1960s and

there hasn't been an LSU team average more than 45 rebounds since the 1989-90 team averaged 45.5 boards game (tied for 10th best in school history) ... Last year's LSU team averaged 36.6 boards a game, while the best Brady era average was in 1999-2000 when the league champions that year averaged 40.4 boards a contest.

Free Throws

The Tigers free throw fortunes continue to ebb and flow and no more so than in the two Arkansas wins ... LSU made just 9-of-16 at Arkansas (1/11) and in Baton Rouge (2/8) was just 5-of-11 against the Razorbacks ... The main difference in those percentages is that LSU won both games after such nights as Houston (11/29) when LSU was 14-of-27 at the line (51.9 percent) and Northern Iowa (12/19), 3-of-10, 30.0 percent and lost.

After the Northern Iowa game (12/17), the Tigers season free throw percentage was 104-of-168 (61.9 percent) ... Now LSU has gone from the back of the league to sixth in the league making 375-of-550 or 68.2 percent ... In the SEC games, the Tigers are fourth at 185-of-262 or 70.6 percent.

LSU is averaging 21.1 trips to the line ... LSU has made 104 more free throws than the opponents and had 167 more attempts ... LSU after going 6-of-12 at Vandy (2/22), made the first 13 attempts of the second half in going 18-of-23 to finish at 24-of-35 (68.6 percent).

Block Party

The blocks came from every angle during the Tennessee game (1/14) as LSU blocked 13 shots, the first time LSU blocked more than 10 shots in a game since Jan. 3, 1995 when LSU blocked 11 shots against Florida ... Twice before this year (against New Orleans and Tulane) LSU had 10 blocked shots in a game ... The school record is 16 blocked shots versus Texas on Jan. 2, 1990.

LSU and UConn combined for 21 blocks (1/7), with LSU getting 10 blocks for the second time this season (19 in the last two games combined) ... UConn's 11 marked the most against an LSU team since Alabama blocked 11 LSU shots on Feb. 17, 1996.

The Tigers have blocked 173 shots, best in the league at 6.65 per game, already the fifth best single season in school history (see page 14 of the notes) ... The only seasons better are the 1999-00 (with Jabari Smith and Stromile Swift) and the three Shaquille O'Neal seasons (1989-90, 1990-91 and 1991-92) ... LSU is on pace to be in the neighborhood of 215 by the end of the year ... The school record total is 225 set by the 1989-90 team.

Tyrus Thomas is in the lead in the league in blocked shots at 3.04 and his 79 blocks is the fifth best single season block total in school history ... The only people ahead of him are Stromile Swift (1999-2000) with 95 and the three 100-plus years of Shaquille O'Neal ... Thomas is on pace to become the fourth LSU player in history to block 100 shots in a season.

Double Up The Pleasure

Usually one player on a team dominates the others when it comes to double doubles whether it be scoring-rebounding or scoring-assists, but no more is it more even than between front-court running mates Glen Davis and Tyrus Thomas of LSU.

Davis moved into sole possession of the double double lead in the league with doubles in each of the last six games, including at Vandy (2/22) with 16 points and 11 boards ... That gives him his league topping 15th double double overall and eighth in SEC play ... Teammate Tyrus Thomas is second overall with 13 double doubles ... Thomas' 13th double also came against Vandy (2/22) with 15 points and a season-high equaling 14 boards ... The LSU frontcourt has an amazing 28 double doubles in 26 games.

A quick check of the books showed Shaquille O'Neal in his freshman season had 21 double doubles and two triple doubles ... Thomas just missed a triple double against Tennessee (1/14), with 17 points, nine boards and nine blocked shots ... Davis has a two-year career total of 25 double doubles ... For the record, O'Neal had 73 career double doubles.

Top Duos

Three pair of players in the Southeastern Conference are averaging over 30 points this season and the pairing of senior guard Darrel Mitchell and sophomore forward Glen Davis of LSU highlights that:

Davis has had double doubles in each of the last six games -- 18 points and 11 rebounds at Alabama (2/4), 19 points and a season-high equaling 16 rebounds vs. Arkansas (2/8), 16 points-15 rebounds at Florida (2/11), 19 points, 13 rebounds versus Mississippi State (2/15), 24 points, 11 rebounds at Auburn (2/18) and 16 points, 11 rebounds at Vandy (2/22) ... He has now 15 double doubles this season and 25 for his two-years at LSU ... Davis' 24 points against Auburn (2/18) gave him eight 20-plus point games this year, 12 games of 20 or more in his career, with his best game this year of 25 points at Ohio State (12/31) ... For the second straight year, Davis is shooting well from the field, having made 50.6 percent of his shots (183-of-362) and that is third best in the conference ... Davis has been fairly consistent throughout his 56-game career as shown by his two season field goal percentage lines:

2005-06 -- 26 games -- 183-of-362 -- 50.6 percent

Totals -- 56 games -- 321-of-631 -- 50.9 percent

One more rebounding note -- Davis leads the SEC in offensive rebounds per game average at 4.04 ... No where was his offensive board skills more pronounced than in the Florida game (2/11) as he grabbed nine offensive rebounds, the first LSU player to grab nine offensive rebounds since Shaquille O'Neal in 1992 ... Davis has started every game of his college career except for the first game of his freshman season, 55-of-56 games.

The Baton Rouge University High product changed his number this season to "0" and changed his look as well. Davis worked out extensively in the off-season to drop his weight to approximately 310 pounds and had the chance to experience his first international competition this past summer, as a member of the United States Under 21 team that traveled to Argentina for the world championships where the U.S. finished fifth.

Davis averaged 13.5 points and 8.8 rebounds a game last year and was second in the league in rebounds ... Davis has had 47 games in double figures, including 30 straight dating back to last year, the longest streak of double figure scoring games since Ronald Dupree ran off 29 straight scoring in double figures in the 2002-03 season.

The number "0" thing? Here's what Davis was quoted as saying regarding his number switch at media day on the LSU campus in October: "The number change is something I had wanted to do. When you ask, number 34 who is that? Baby Shaq. No offense to Shaq, but I want my own identity, my own number with my own thing. No one has zero so hopefully I can just let this one ride. Also it is a symbol of where I started from just to keep me level headed. Zero, I started with nothing. It always makes me think about back when I was little and what I had to do to get to this moment."

Now the all-time leader in three-point career field goals with 243, Mitchell is having a career year to wrap up his consistent LSU career.

For the second time this year, the senior from St. Martinville, La., has answered the late game call with his top of the key three-pointer with 11 seconds that game LSU the lead and ultimately the win against Arkansas (2/8).

Earlier this season at No. 13 West Virginia, it was Mitchell who made a seemingly impossible three-pointer to force overtime and then another three late in the contest to ice the win on the road for the Tigers.

Darryl Mitchell earned his second SEC Player of the Week honor after his stellar play against Georgia (1/25) and at Ole Miss (1/28) ... Against Georgia, in 29 minutes, Mitchell had 24 points, six rebounds, eight assists, a block and three steals, while hitting 9-of-13 shots, including 5-of-7 three-pointers ... He followed that up with a 40-minute effort at Ole Miss, scoring the third highest point total of his career with 28 points, hitting 8-of-12 shots (again 5-of-7 three-pointers) and 7-7 from the free throw line.

The week before he was named the Louisiana Sports Writers Association Player of the Week for his play at Mississippi State (1/18) and Alabama (1/21) ... Since going 0-for-4 from the arc in the first two SEC games, Mitchell came back in the next seven SEC games to hit 27-of-49 from the arc, with six games of 50 percent or better from the arc in that span ... Mitchell's 27 versus Arkansas (2/8) capped off a night in which he made a career high 10 field goals and was 5-of-7 from the arc for the third time in the last five games ... His 21 at Vandy (2/22) was his ninth 20-plus point game of the year and gave him his fifth 20-plus point game in the last nine:

Vs. Georgia (1/25) -- 9-13 FG, 5-7 3FG, 1-2 FT -- 24 points

At Ole Miss (1/28) -- 8-12 FG, 5-7 3 FG, 7-7 FT -- 28 points

Auburn (2/1) -- 8-11 FG, 2-4 3FG, 9-9 FT -- 27 points

Arkansas (2/8) -- 10-14 FG, 5-7 3FG, 2-3 FT -- 27 points

Vandy (2/22) -- 6-14 FG, 3-7 3FG, 6-8 FT -- 21 points

Mitchell's three consecutive 20-point games in SEC play is the first time a Tiger has done that since Maurice Carter in January 1997 when he had 28 vs. Auburn, 28 at Alabama and 24 vs. Mississippi State.

Mitchell has 25 double figures scoring games this season and 76 in his LSU career ... Against West Virginia (11/26), Mitchell became the 35th player in LSU history to score 1,000 career points and he is now 15th with 1,438 career points, 25 out of 14th place ... His present average of 18.2 points per game ranks him second in the conference, behind league leader, Ronnie Brewer of Arkansas (18.5).

Mitchell hit 67 treys each of the last two seasons and has 67 this year with a minimum of five games still to play ... For his career, Mitchell has made 243-of-597 three-pointers or 40.7 percent, fifth best all-time at LSU.

Mitchell earned his first SEC Player of the Week honors in November, based primarily on his West Virginia effort, but he also had 13 points and nine assists against Nicholls State (11/21).

Mitchell has inherited another role in his career with LSU in his final season, playing primarily at the point guard position ... For the first year plus at LSU, Mitchell came off the bench for the Tigers and was thought of as one of the best sixth

man candidates in the Southeastern Conference. He moved into the starting lineup in mid-season of his sophomore season, a position he has secured since then, but mainly played primarily the off-guard in a three-guard offense.

Mitchell has 122 assists and is fifth in the league in assist average at 4.69 ... His career total of 201 steals is sixth on the all-time LSU steals list and his 2005-06 steal average of 2.00 is tied for fourth best in the SEC ... Also, Mitchell, now has 329 career assists and that is seventh all-time on LSU's list.

Mitchell is 160-of-338 from the field (47.3 pct., sixth in the league) and 72.9 percent from the charity stripe (86-of-118), eighth in the league ... The St. Martinville, La., native is 67-of-154 from the arc or 43.5 percent, fourth best in the league in three-point percentage ... Mitchell, in a new stat being kept this year, is second in the league in minutes played per game, averaging 36.62 minutes per game, having played 40 minutes in eight of the last 11 games ... He did come to the bench late in the first half against Arkansas (2/8), but was out less than 20 seconds, thus statistically still being credited with playing the full game ... At Auburn and Vandy, he played 39 minutes.

Mitchell has an assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.60 (122 assists, 77 turnovers), again continuing a trend that dates back to the arrival of point guard Torris Bright in 2000 of LSU's primary point guard having more assists than turnovers.

SEC Freshman of the Week (11/21)

With back spasms limiting his ability, Mitchell didn't score for 39 minutes and 30 seconds at Auburn (2/18), but he was able to get open for a layup that gave LSU the lead for good in the final 30 seconds of the 65-61 win.

The freshman from Denham Springs has been a good go-to guy in SEC play and showed his ability at Ole Miss (1/28), hitting the go-ahead for good three-pointer in the final two minutes to wrap up a season-high of 20 points (7-of-15 from the field, 2 treys) ... Mitchell has been in double figures in seven of the 13 league games, all before the back spasms that have limited him to 17 points over the last three games combined.

Mitchell's game came alive in the second half of the Arkansas game (1/11), scoring 16 second half points as he equaled his season high of 19 points in leading Tiger scorers in the opening night road league win ... He followed that up in the Tennessee game (1/14) with a 13-point performance (with four assists), the first time this season with three consecutive double figure scoring games ... Against Alabama (1/21), he hit 5-of-10 shots and had his season high with three treys as he finished with 14 points and four assists against the Crimson Tide.

The freshman has 14 double figure games this season ... Mitchell has had two double-doubles, the last against ULL (12/17), scoring 16 points on 7-of-12 shooting with 11 rebounds, including six offensive boards.

In the opening game of his college career, Mitchell hit 8-of-15 field goals, including two treys to finish with a game-high 19 points. In addition he had 12 rebounds for a college double-double in his first game ... Mitchell's 12 rebounds included four offensive rebounds and added four steals ... For his game, he was named the first SEC Freshman of the Week by the league office.

Against Nicholls State, he was in double figures again with 11 rebounds in 20 minutes ... Mitchell had his second straight double figure scoring game against McNeese (12/10) with 13 points, hitting 6-of-13 field goals to go with five assists ... Mitchell is averaging 11.2 points per game and 5.4 rebounds, 19th best in the SEC ... In the league played minutes list, Mitchell stands seventh at 33.77.

Mitchell was a Mr. Basketball selection by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association following his outstanding career at Denham Springs High School.

LSU freshman Tyrus Thomas earned a rare honor (1/16) by being named Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week in back-to-back weeks ... Thomas, who earned the honor Jan. 9 for his play against Tulane and Connecticut, put together another good week as the Tigers opened 2-0 in league play at Arkansas on Jan. 11 and at home versus Tennessee on Jan. 14 ... Thomas scored 13 points and had 14 rebounds, his ninth double double of the season against the Razorbacks. Thomas played 35 minutes in the game, hitting 6-of-11 shots and one-of-two free throws as LSU won, 63-58 ... Against Tennessee, Thomas just missed a triple double with 17 points, nine rebounds and a season best nine blocked shots ... Thomas was 7-of-7 from the field and 3-of-3 from the free throw line. LSU played 32 minutes in the game as LSU won, 88-74.

Thomas added two more double doubles with a 14 point, 10 rebound effort at Mississippi State (1/18) and then, despite not scoring for the first 30 minutes, had his 11th double double with 10 points and 12 boards in the Alabama win (1/21) ... While not doubling up, Thomas posted his 10th consecutive double figure scoring game against Georgia (1/25) ... He was held below double figures against Ole Miss scoring eight points (1/28), but came back against Auburn (2/1) with 17 points and for the second time in SEC play, was 7-of-7 from the field.

Thomas got his 12th double double of the year in the home game against Mississippi State (2/15) with 16 points and 13 rebounds and clinched his third freshman of the week honors at Auburn (2/18) with 14 points, eight boards and four blocks ... Double double No. 13 was at Vandy where he equaled his high of 14 rebounds to go with 15 points.

Thomas is the second LSU freshman to be honored by the SEC this season ... In his first SEC Freshman of the Week award, he also had some great stats ... Against Tulane (Jan. 3, a 75-58 LSU win), Thomas had 20 points and nine rebounds while shooting 6-of-8 from the field and a perfect 8-of-8 from the charity stripe. Thomas added two assists, four blocks and two steals in 27 minutes of playing time ... Thomas also came up big in the one-point, 67-66, loss at No. 2 Connecticut (1/7), posting a double-double of 15 points and 13 rebounds to go along with his second blocks.

Thomas is presently averaging 12.9 points per game (16th in SEC) and 9.4 rebounds per game (second in the SEC) ... He is also the league leader in blocked shot average at 3.04 blocks per game ... The Baton Rouge redshirt freshman moved into the starting lineup prior to the Cincinnati game (12/23) after coming off the bench the first nine games ... Thomas is 129-of-215 from the field (60.9 percent) and is one field goal shy of being eligible for the league lead in field goal percentage, based on the five made per game requirement ... Thomas' field goal percentage is presently the ninth

best for an LSU single season, minimum 100 attempts.

Fans got a brief look at this McKinley freshman in November, 2004 when he made a short appearance in one exhibition game ... What they saw was a lanky, athletic player who could seemingly sky with and for the basketball ... But a pre-season neck injury was aggravated and he was granted a medical redshirt and fans would have to wait a year to see him officially in action.

Garrett Temple

The redshirt freshman is continuing to try to find his consistent niche offensively for the Tigers and will be looking to rebound after hitting just 2-of-13 shots from the field in the last three games ... He hopes to find the touch in which he scored eight points each in three SEC games -- vs. Auburn (2/1), at Alabama (2/4) and vs. Arkansas (2/8) ... Temple scored 10 points at Mississippi State (1/18), equaling his season high ... Temple started the first nine games at the off-guard position for LSU, before coming off the bench in the Cincinnati game (12/23) to play 15 minutes ... He returned to the starting lineup since that point.

What Garrett Temple is rapidly becoming is a very tough defender to get by and get easy chance to score ... He is earning his minutes and reputation by playing against some of the best scorers other teams have to offer ... So far he is averaging almost 32 minutes a game, averaging 5.0 points per game, 2.7 rebounds a game and 2.9 assists a contest ... Temple played 39 minutes against No. 2 UConn, followed that up with a full 40-minute stint against Arkansas (1/11) and 38 minutes against both Tennessee (1/14) and Mississippi State (1/18).

Temple started his first game after a hard-working redshirt season and the freshman played 28 minutes, scoring six points, including a three-pointer. He followed that up with the Nicholls State game where he scored in double figures with 10 points, five assists and just one turnover ... Against Tennessee (1/14), Temple had his season rebound high of eight.

In the Southern game (11/18), Temple became the third member of his family to start a basketball game for LSU. His father, Collis Temple, Jr., played for Coach Dale Brown in the 1970s, and, his older brother, Collis Temple III was a fixture for John Brady's team earlier in the decade. His father also made note for not only his play on the court, but the fact he was the first African-American to play basketball for LSU.

Ben Voogd

The freshman from the Oregon coast got a chance to start for the first time in front of several members of his family and friends against Cincinnati (12/23) ... In the two Las Vegas games (12/22-23), Voogd had 10 combined assists and played 38 minutes, 17 in the start against Cincinnati ... Voogd is averaging 1.2 points per game and 2.1 assists a contest ... Against Georgia (1/25), Voogd played 19 minutes and while not scoring, had a season best seven assists with no turnovers with a block and a steal ... He has a 1.3 assist-to-turnover ratio with 54 assists and 41 turnovers ... He had a season scoring high of five against UNO (12/13), hitting his first three-pointer of his LSU career ... Voogd filled in when Darrel Mitchell got in foul trouble against Tennessee (1/14) and had four points and three assists in 20 minutes.

Darnell Lazare

When the chronicles of the LSU basketball season are written, certainly someone is going to have to take a look at what Darnell Lazare has meant for this team. Whether in practice or in the games, Lazare comes and does what he needs to do to help this team be successful ... In the SEC games, that has meant coming off the bench and contributing like he did against Auburn (2/1) when he played 14 minutes, scoring seven points on 3-of-4 shooting, including his first career three-point attempt and make, with one assist ... Or it means coming off the bench at Florida (2/11) to post his seventh double figure scoring game of the year (10 points), while hitting 5-of-8 field goals.

The work ethic and ability of Darnell Lazare shown throughout the preseason practice schedule of LSU and paid off with his return to the starting lineup for the first nine games this season for his first starts since he started eight games in place of Jaime Lloreda during his freshman season ... Even though he has now been coming off the bench, usually first, his presence on the court has been some of the best of his career, getting key buckets at some very important times for LSU.

Lazare posted two career highs in scoring during the season ... Against McNeese (12/10), he made 7-of-11 field goals in a 19-point effort in 23 minutes and against UNO (12/13) despite not scoring the first 14 minutes and only four first-half points, he finished with 20 points on 8-of-14 shooting in 27 minutes ... Add in a 12 point night against ULL (12/17) and for those three games, Lazare was 20-of-37 from the field and 11-of-16 at the charity stripe.

His initial previous career mark came against Nicholls State (11/21) when he had 16 points, hitting 7-of-12 field goals in 20 minutes ... Against Tennessee (1/14), Lazare came off the bench to play 24 minutes and get his ninth double figure scoring game of his career with 10 points (2-of-3 FGs, 6-of-7 FTs) ... So far this season, Lazare is averaging 7.0 points per game and 3.4 rebounds per game ... For the season, he is averaging 18 minutes per game ... Against Arkansas (2/8), Lazare only scored two points, but Lazare contributed in other ways with a career high three assists in 12 minutes.

Already Lazare's numbers are way above his numbers of his sophomore season, in some cases more than doubled:

2006 -- 26 gms, 451 minutes, 66-of-132 FG, 1-1 3FG, 46-of-66 FT, 88 rebs (3.4 rpg) 179 pts (6.9 ppg)

Magnum Rolle

Rolle, who was part of the prep school national championship team last year at Laurinburg (NC), has played in 23 games off the bench this season, averaging 2.0 points per game and 2.3 rebounds a contest after playing nine minutes at Vandy (2/22) and equaling his career high in scoring with eight points on 3-of-4 field goal shooting and two free throws ... He played 16 minutes off the bench at Florida (2/11) scoring six points on 2-of-4 shooting with two free throws ... Against Auburn on the road (2/18), Rolle had four points and four boards ... In the last four games, Rolle has scored 18 points with 10 boards, hitting 7-of-11 field goals ... He had four points and six rebounds with two blocks in 16 minutes off the bench in the Georgia (1/25) win ... Rolle had double figure rebounds (10) against Nicholls State (11/21) and also hit 4-of-8 field goals in that game for his season high of eight points ... Rolle has 13 blocks, including two against Mississippi State (2/15)

Martin, under the transfer rules, will sit out until the end of the fall 2006 semester and will have 2 1/2 years of eligibility remaining to play for LSU ... He joined the team at practice on Jan. 19.

Martin, Jr., played for his father, Terry Martin, Sr., at Richwood High School in Monroe where they won the Class 3A state championship ... The Louisiana Sports Writers Association named Martin, Jr., the Class 3A Outstanding Player in the state after averaging 24 points, 10 rebounds and nine assists a game ... The 6-6 Martin started eight of the 14 games he played for the Red Raiders, averaging 7.4 points and 3.6 rebounds a game.

Exhibition Game 1 -- LSU 74, EA Sports 54

The Tigers overcome early jitters in the first exhibition game and a 31-27 halftime deficit to win going away with a strong second half in which the Tigers made 18-of-26 field goals (69.2 percent) ... Glen Davis led LSU with 20 points, while Darrel Mitchell had 17 points, five assists and five steals. Tasmin Mitchell made 6-of-his last eight shots to finish with 13 points and seven assists, while Tyrus Thomas came off the bench to add 13 of his own ... LSU had just nine turnovers and shot 52.6 percent (30-of-57) for the game, while holding EA Sports to 37 percent (17-of-46).

Exhibition Game 2 -- LSU 122, LSU-Shreveport 58

The Tigers defeated the NAIA Pilots, shooting 60.3 percent for the game, after shooting over 60 percent in the second half for the second straight exhibition game ... LSU also had a good night from the arc, making 8-of-17 treys ... Six LSU players were in double figures with Darnell Lazare having what would be career highs with 19 points and 11 rebounds ... Darrel Mitchell had 18 points, Glen Davis and Tasmin Mitchell had 16 each, Tyrus Thomas had 15 points and 11 rebounds and Magnum Rolle 13 ... For the second straight exhibition game, LSU had just nine turnovers, compared to 27 assists ... LSU outrebounded LSU-S, 62-27.

Game No. 1 -- LSU 84, Southern 56 (November 18, Baton Rouge)

The Tigers jumped out to a 7-0 lead in the first 85 seconds of the contest and really was never in much trouble as LSU won its opening night game under John Brady for the ninth time and won for the 53rd consecutive time against Louisiana schools ... Tigers did not play their best game with 17 turnovers and just 30.8 percent (4-13) from three-point range, but it was dominating enough, including a 55-23 margin on the boards ... Tasmin Mitchell had 19 points and 12 rebounds, while Glen Davis (10 boards) and Tyrus Thomas each had 18 points and Darrel Mitchell 13 ... LSU shot 48.4 percent from the field (31-of-64).

Game No. 2 -- LSU 104, Nicholls 57 (November 21, Baton Rouge)

The Tigers won for the 54th consecutive time at home against Louisiana schools without too much trouble as LSU posted four players with double figure rebounds for the first time since Dec. 30, 1991 (ironically, also against Nicholls State) ... LSU shot 57.1 percent from the floor and had 59 rebounds in the win ... Redshirt freshman Tyrus Thomas hit 10-of-11 shots to finish with 22 points with 12 boards, while Glen Davis had 19 points and 13 rebounds ... Darnell Lazare had a career high 16 points, with Darrel Mitchell getting 13 (nine assists) and Garrett Temple 10 points ... Tasmin Mitchell had 11 rebounds and Magnum Rolle 10 ... LSU had 26 assists, the most assist since 2002 in a game and 10 turnovers.

Game No. 3 -- LSU 71, West Virginia 68 (OT) (Nov. 26, Morgantown, W. Va.)

The Tigers took their act on the road for the first time and came back winners against the 13th-ranked Mountaineers on a day when the school drew its biggest ever November crowd in the WVU Coliseum ... LSU held off a barrage of three-pointers by West Virginia (15-of-45) and rallied after losing a 15-point first-half lead ... Senior Darrel Mitchell hit a three-pointer with 23 seconds left in regulation to force the overtime and then hit a three-pointer with six seconds left in overtime to get the win ... Mitchell had the second best scoring game of his career with 26 points, playing 45 minutes ... Glen Davis had his fifth straight double-double dating back to last year with 23 points and 14 rebounds ... LSU shot 47.5 percent for the game, holding West Virginia to just 34.8 percent and the Tigers out rebounded West Virginia, 51-29.

Game No. 4 -- Houston 84, LSU 83 (Nov. 29, Baton Rouge)

Turnovers, free throws and an amazing second half shooting performance by Houston all played into the Cougars rallying win over the Tigers, stopping LSU's 13-game home winning streak that dated back almost one full year ... LSU held a 43-31 lead, but the Cougars hit 19-of-29 field goals, including 8-of-10 three-pointers in the second half to score 53 points ... The effort was aided by Houston scoring 27 points off 22 LSU turnovers and the Tigers going just 6-of-15 at the free throw line in the final 20 minutes ... Darrel Mitchell had 25 points and seven assists to lead LSU, while freshman Tyrus Thomas added 21 points and 12 rebounds ... Tasmin Mitchell had 18 points and Glen Davis 15 ... For the game LSU shot 58.2 percent (32-55) from the field and for the fourth straight game had a big rebound margin, 42-20, with LSU getting as many offensive boards as Houston did total rebounds.

Game No. 5 -- LSU 90, McNeese State 70 (Dec. 12, Baton Rouge)

Tigers come out of a 10-day break and lead from start to finish against McNeese State, although the game had highlights and still showed the things the Tigers needed to work on ... LSU shot 54 percent from the field, but was out rebounded for the first time all year (44-41) and again struggling with 27 turnovers ... Five LSU players were in double figures, led by Glen Davis with 21 points and 10 rebounds while Darnell Lazare posted a career high of 19 points ... Darrel Mitchell, who moved into second at LSU in all-time three-pointers made with 190, had a solid 18 points, while Tasmin Mitchell scored 13 and Tyrus Thomas doubled up for the second straight game with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Game No. 6 -- LSU 81, Louisiana-Lafayette 62 (Dec. 17, Baton Rouge)

The Tigers cost themselves chances with turnovers and Louisiana-Lafayette kept firing back at LSU runs, before the Tigers held the Cajuns scoreless in the final 6:08 of the game to get the final margin ... The Tigers dominated the game on the boards, out rebounding ULL, 57-28, with the Tigers getting 25 offensive boards to just seven for Louisiana-Lafayette ... Tigers had 20 assists to 18 turnovers, while Louisiana Lafayette had 15 assists and 20 turnovers ... Glen Davis had 20 points and 12 rebounds, while Darrel Mitchell had 17 points (eight assists) and Tasmin Mitchell doubled with 16 points and 11 rebounds ... Darnell Lazare rounded out the double figure scorers with 12.

Game No. 7 -- LSU 94, UNO 53 (Dec. 13, Baton Rouge)

Tigers were sluggish at the start, but picked up the intensity, especially coming out of the dressing room at intermission to extend their Louisiana school home-court winning streak to 56 games ... Darnell Lazare didn't score until the final five minutes of the first half and then posted 16 second half points to score a career high for the second straight game with 20 points ... Also at 20 points was sophomore Glen Davis, who doubled up with 20 points, 16 rebounds and a career tying four assists ... Darrel Mitchell, despite not hitting a three-pointer, had 19 points and six assists and Tyrus Thomas posted 11 points, 10 rebounds (his third straight double-double) and four blocks ... The Tigers shot 53.5 percent with 24 assists and just 12 turnovers (four in a 51-point second half), while out rebounding the Privateers, 49-30.

Game No. 8 -- Northern Iowa 54, LSU 50 (Dec. 19, Baton Rouge)

The Tigers couldn't find an answer for the more experience Panthers as they missed shots, hitting 41 percent from the field, 3-of-11 from the arc and for the first time since March 3, 2004, less than 50 percent at the foul line ... LSU was 3-of-10 at the stripe or 30 percent ... Darrel Mitchell had the fourth highest scoring game of his career at 22 points, but it wasn't enough as Glen Davis was the only other player in double figures with 13 points and just four rebounds ... LSU out rebounded Northern Iowa, 31-30.

Game No. 9 -- LSU 75, Arkansas-Monticello 48 (Dec. 22, Las Vegas)

The Tigers used a 12-0 run in the middle of the first half to gain a 33-21 halftime advantage and then went on to the win over the Division II Boll Weevils ... LSU shot 43.5 percent from the floor, holding Arkansas-Monticello to just 28 percent from the floor, while out rebounding UAM, 46-33 ... Darrel Mitchell had 18 points to lead LSU with Glen Davis adding 17 and Tyrus Thomas in 26 minutes, getting 16 points and 10 rebounds.

Game No. 10 -- Cincinnati 75, LSU 72 (Dec. 23, Las Vegas)

The Tigers and Bearcats battled back and forth at Valley High School in Las Vegas before Cincinnati won the game on two late three-pointers while LSU was missing front end of two one-and-ones in addition to a late turnover ... Ben Voogd and Tyrus Thomas moved into the starting lineup for LSU ... The Tigers lost despite shooting 52.8 percent from the field and out rebounding Cincinnati, 38-25 ... However, LSU was just 2-of-8 from the three-point arc and had 23 turnovers, 14 in the first half ... Glen Davis led LSU with 21 points, while Darrel Mitchell had 17 points ... Thomas in his first start, doubled up with 12 points and 13 rebounds, with Tasmin Mitchell scoring 10.

Game No. 11 -- Ohio State 78, LSU 76 (Dec. 31, Columbus, Ohio)

LSU had a chance to post its second win over a ranked team on the road, but four-late three-pointers by the Buckeyes were the difference as Ohio State rallied from 10 down in the final 3:22 as the Tigers failed to score on their final seven possessions ... LSU led by as much as 15 points with six minutes to go, 73-58 ... Glen Davis had a strong 25 points, including LSU's first 10 points of the second half ... Darrel Mitchell added 16, Tyrus Thomas his third straight double-double of 14 points and 11 rebounds to go with four assists, five blocks and four steals, with Tasmin Mitchell adding 12 points and a team-high five assists ... LSU shot 46.7 percent for the game and out rebounded the Buckeyes, 35-29.

Game No. 12 -- LSU 75, Tulane 58 (Jan. 3, Baton Rouge, La.)

LSU did not have one of its better games, especially in the first half, appearing to have a hangover from the Ohio State loss, while looking ahead to playing No. 2 Connecticut, but it was enough to get a 17-point win over the Wave, the 58th consecutive victory for LSU at home over Louisiana schools ... Tyrus Thomas had 20 points to lead the Tigers to go with four blocks, while Darrel Mitchell scored 13, Darnell Lazare 12 and Glen Davis had his 17 double double of his career with 10 points and 10 rebounds ... Thomas just missed his fourth consecutive double up with nine boards ... LSU shot 39 percent for the game (19-of-59), while Tulane hit just 32.2 percent ... LSU did have great success at the free throw line, making 26-of-31 (83.9%), including at one point 17 straight free throws ... LSU again had the rebounding edge, 42-39, with 16 assists, 12 turnovers and 14 steals.

Game No. 13 -- Connecticut 67, LSU 66 (Jan. 7, Hartford, Conn.)

The Tigers for the second straight Saturday had a nationally-ranked team on the ropes before falling in the final seconds, this time No. 2 Connecticut ... The young, athletic Tiger squad came out again with no fear, building as much as a 14-point first-half lead before 16,294 fans at the Hartford Civic Center before going to the dressing room with a 37-30 lead ... UConn took the lead for good at 2:25 and had a four-point advantage, 65-61, with 1:47 to go ... With the Huskies up, 67-64, on a Marcus Williams bucket with 20 second left, the Tigers came down and Darrel Williams was fouled on a three-point attempt ... He made two free throws with 9 seconds left to cut it to 67-66 ... LSU fouled on the inbound and UConn missed two free throws ... The Tigers rebounded and Darrel Mitchell drove down the floor, off a screen and missed a three-pointer right before the buzzer ... Darrel Mitchell led LSU with 21 points, while Tyrus Thomas had 15 points, 13 rebounds and a career best seven blocks, while Glen Davis and Tasmin Mitchell each had 12 points ... LSU shot 46.3 percent from the floor (25-of-54) and out rebounded UConn, 41-39 ... The Huskies shot just 32.8 percent from the floor.

Game No. 14 -- LSU 63, Arkansas 58 (Jan. 11, Fayetteville, Ark.)

LSU was able to close the deal on the road to win its SEC opener at Bud Walton Arena ... LSU weathered the early emotional storm of the Razorbacks, falling behind 24-12 in the first 10 minutes before outscoring the Razorbacks, 16-4, to tie the game at 28-28 with 2:42 to go in the first half ... LSU would go to the intermission up, 32-31 ... LSU built its own 12 points lead, 44-32, with 14:44 to play before the Razorbacks cut the game back ... Tasmin Mitchell's layup with 1:37 to go gave LSU a 59-53 lead ... Arkansas would cut it to one, 59-58, with one minute to play before T. Mitchell hit a 14-footer after an LSU timeout to make it 61-58 with 29 seconds to play ... LSU's T. Mitchell added two free throws for the final margin ... Besides scoring LSU's last six points, the freshman scored 16 second half points to finish with a game-best 19 ... Tyrus Thomas doubled up with 13 points and 11 boards as did Glen Davis as he had 12 points, 10 rebounds and for the second straight game four assists ... LSU failed to make a three-pointer ending a 262 game streak dating back to 1997 in which LSU had made at least one three ... The Tigers shot 39.7 percent (27-of-68) from the field and 56.3 percent from the line (9-of-16) to go with the 0-for-8 from the arc ... LSU did our rebound the Razorbacks, 44-34, with 16 offensive boards ... LSU had just eight turnovers, compared with 13 for Arkansas.

Game No. 15 -- LSU 88, Tennessee 74 (Jan. 14, Baton Rouge, La.)

The Tigers won for the 10th consecutive time in SEC play at home, overcoming turnover problems early to win going away ... LSU turned the ball over 17 times in the first half, but still went to the dressing room with a 30-27 lead after making 12-of-23 field goal attempts while holding Tennessee to just 10-of-37 shooting ... In the second half, LSU scored the first nine points to open up a 12-point lead ... Tennessee would cut it eventually back to two, but LSU get answering Tennessee's running play to get the win ... LSU would shoot 76 percent in the second half (19-of-25) and make 20-of-26 (76.9 percent) at the line in the final 20 minutes ... For the game, LSU was at 64.6 percent from the field (31-of-48) ... Ironically, it was just under two years ago when LSU shot over 60 percent, Feb. 4, 2004 also against the Volunteers when LSU made 29-of-48 attempts (60.4) ... Glen Davis led LSU with 24 points and 10 rebounds, with Tyrus Thomas with 17 points, nine boards and nine blocked shots ... LSU also got 13 from Tasmin Mitchell, 11 from Darrel Mitchell and 10 from Darnell Lazare.

Game No. 16 -- LSU 71, Mississippi State 57 (Jan. 18, Starkville, Miss.)

LSU won its fifth consecutive SEC road game dating back to last year (two this season) and its ninth consecutive SEC game overall with the win at Starkville ... LSU shot a consistent 45.8 percent for the game (25-of-59) and regained some of its shooting touch beyond the arc, making 6-of-15 ... LSU was out rebounded by State (for the second time this season), 40-33, but LSU turned the ball over just 11 times, compared to 18 for the Bulldogs ... Tyrus Thomas had his league leading 10th double double with 14 points and 10 rebounds to go with six blocks, while Glen Davis led LSU in scoring with 17, Darrel Mitchell 15 and Garrett Temple tied his season high with 10 points.

Game No. 17 -- LSU 68, Alabama 57 (Jan. 21, Baton Rouge, La.)

LSU won its 11th consecutive SEC home game and its 10th consecutive SEC game overall with the win in the Maravich Center that pushed the Tigers SEC record to 4-0 ... Darrel Mitchell led the charge for LSU, scoring 19 points and equaling his career high of seven rebounds ... Glen Davis was in double figures for the 21st straight game with 17 points, while Tasmin Mitchell pumped in 14 ... Tyrus Thomas made it a league leading 11th consecutive double double with 10 points and 12 rebounds, despite not scoring for the first 30 minutes of the game ... LSU shot 42.6 percent for the night (26-of-61), 7-of-18 from the arc (38.9 percent) and out rebounded the Crimson Tide, 39-31.

Game No. 18 -- LSU 81, Georgia 57 (Jan. 25, Baton Rouge, La.)

LSU won its 12th consecutive SEC home game and its 11th consecutive SEC game overall with the win in the Maravich Center before the first sellout paid attendance in the new configuration of seating (13,468) ... LSU, with the game tied at 2-2, went on a 16-0 run to go up 18-2 at the 14:42 mark and cruised from there to a 50-19 halftime advantage ... In the first 20 minutes, LSU was 20-of-36 from the floor (55.6 percent) and 7-of-10 three-pointers ... For the game, LSU shot 50.8 percent (33-of-65) and 7-of-11 from the arc ... LSU out rebounded Georgia 44-39 ... Darrel Mitchell, hitting 5-of-7 treys, had 24 points and eight assists, while Glen Davis and Tyrus Thomas had 13 apiece and Tasmin Mitchell 11. Ben Voogd did not score but did have seven assists and no turnovers in 19 minutes.

Game No. 19 -- LSU 79, Ole Miss 73 (Jan. 28, Oxford, Miss.)

LSU continued its success outlasting the Rebels to win its sixth consecutive road game in the SEC and its 12 overall consecutive SEC game ... LSU had to battle back several times against an Ole Miss team playing at the top of its game, but so were the Tigers on this occasion ... Ole Miss built a 10-point first half lead before LSU went on a 15-0 run and built a nine-point lead of its own ... Up 37-33 at the half, LSU and Ole Miss battled back and forth with Ole Miss taking the lead back at the 5:32 mark ... But behind the play of Darrel Mitchell and Tasmin Mitchell and outstanding free throw shooting, LSU was able to finish the game ... Darrel Mitchell scored 28 points, making five treys for the second straight game, while Tasmin Mitchell scored a career high 20 points ... Glen Davis added 19 as LSU shot 47.3 percent from the floor and 50 percent (7-14) from the arc, while making 87 percent from the free throw line (20-of-23).

Game No. 20 -- LSU 84, Auburn 69 (Feb. 1, Baton Rouge, La.)

LSU had to work hard to put away the scrappy Tigers, but won its 13th consecutive SEC game at home and its 13th consecutive SEC game overall at the Maravich Center ... LSU had to spurt away at the end of the first half to get a 40-33 halftime advantage, but Auburn came back to tale a 54-52 advantage with 12:54 to play ... The game was tied at 54 and 56-all before LSU would go on a 24-8 run to put the game away ... Darrel Mitchell had his third straight 20-plus point game in SEC play with 27 points (8 assists), while Glen Davis and Tyrus Thomas each scored 17 points ... LSU shot 71.4 percent in the second half, making 15-of-21 field goals with 12 assists in that 20 minutes ... LSU shot 63 percent for the game (29-46) and 5-of-10 from the arc ... LSU also continued its strong free throw shooting in league play, making 75 percent (21-28).

Game No. 21 -- Alabama 67, LSU 62 (Feb. 4, Tuscaloosa, Ala.)

The Tigers lost for the first time in SEC play as Alabama made key free throws down the stretch to keep LSU at bay at Coleman Coliseum to get a split in the season series ... LSU was down at the half, 37-35 ... Both teams made 25 field goals and seven treys, with each team getting 34 rebounds, 12 turnovers and six steals ... LSU was 5-of-6 at the line, while Alabama was 10-of-13 ... Glen Davis had his 10th double double of the season and 20th of his career with 11 rebounds to go with 18 points ... Tasmin Mitchell and Darrel Mitchell each had 14 points ... Tyrus Thomas was held to his lowest point total since the Dec. 19 Northern Iowa game with four points and four blocks.

Game No. 22 -- LSU 78, Arkansas 77 (Feb. 8, Baton Rouge, La.)

The Tigers appeared to have the game won, watched the lead disappear and then Darrel Mitchell rescued LSU with a top-of-the-key three-pointer with 11 seconds to play to give LSU the victory and push it to 8-1 in the league ... LSU led the game, 39-33, at the half, and had a 14-points advantage five times in the second half ... LSU led, 75-63, on a Tyrus Thomas dunk with 4:35 to play,

before LSU began to unravel, turning the ball over on six possessions as Arkansas tied the game at 75-75 with 2:02 to play and took the lead, 77-75, on two Ronnie Brewer free throws with 51 seconds left ... LSU missed a three-pointer and had to foul ... Arkansas missed both shots, setting up the Mitchell bucket and the Razorbacks missed a shot at the buzzer ... Darrel Mitchell led LSU with 27 points, hitting five treys for the fourth time this year ... Glen Davis had his 11th double double with 19 points and a season-equaling high of 16 rebounds ... LSU shot 53.2 percent from the field (33-62) and 7-15 from the arc, but just 5-of-11 from the line ... LSU out rebounded Arkansas, 39-32.

Game No. 23 -- Florida 71, LSU 62 (Feb. 11, Gainesville, Fla.)

Although not playing as well as they had in recent weeks on the road, the Tigers took a couple of good shots from the Gators and continued to stay even, before a late scoring rush pushed the margin out too far to overcome in the final minutes ... The game was tied at 37-37 at the half, but the seventh-ranked Gators held LSU to just 25 second-half points ... Glen Davis had his third consecutive double double with 16 points and 15 rebounds, while Tasmin Mitchell added 14 points, Darrel Mitchell 11 and Darnell Lazare off the bench in a strong performance, scored 10 ... LSU shot 40.0 percent from the floor (24-of-60), but just 2-of-11 from the arc and 12-of-19 from the free throw line ... The rebounds in the game were even at 38 ... Davis had nine offensive rebounds, the first LSU player to grab nine offensive boards in a game since Shaquille O'Neal in 1992.

Game No. 24 -- LSU 72, Mississippi State 59 (Feb. 15, Baton Rouge, La.)

The Tigers made it 15 straight home SEC wins in the Maravich Center, keeping a scrappy Bulldog team at bay, despite shooting a season low 38.3 percent from the floor ... LSU did dominate a team that out rebounded LSU in the first meeting, 51-35 ... Darrel Mitchell's second trey just before the 10 minute mark of the second half set the school record for career threes at 238 and he finished with 16 points ... Glen Davis had his fourth consecutive double double with 19 points and 13 rebounds, while Tyrus Thomas continued to play well at home with 16 points and 13 rebounds ... Mississippi State shot just 34.4 percent from the floor ... The Tigers got its free throw shooting back in gear a bit, hitting 23-of-32 shots for 71.9 percent.

Game No. 25 -- LSU 65, Auburn 61 (Feb. 18, Auburn, Ala.)

LSU needed a Tasmin Mitchell layup and two free throws by Darrel Mitchell in the final 30 seconds to get out of Auburn with its fourth SEC road win of the year ... Tasmin's layup was his only bucket of the night after battling back spasms throughout the game ... Darrel's two free throws came after Auburn missed two shots to try to tie the game ... Glen Davis had high eighth 20-plus point game of the season and his fifth consecutive double double with 24 points and 11 rebounds, while Darrel Mitchell had 16 points and Tyrus Thomas 14 points and four blocks ... LSU turned the ball over 14 times in the first 20 minutes while trailing at the half, 31-30, but turned the ball over just four times in shooting 50 percent for the game, 25-of-50 ... LSU was just 2-of-14 from the arc and 13-of-22 at the free throw line, while out rebounding Auburn, 37-26
