#### Fourth-Ranked LSU Travels To Face 14th-Ranked Georgia In SEC Clash

LSU, now up to No. 4 in the nation in all three major polls - USA Today Coaches, Associated Press, and Harris Interactive - will look to keep its record perfect on Saturday when the Tigers face 14th-ranked Georgia in Athens. Kickoff for the Tigers and the Bulldogs is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. CT from Sanford Stadium. The game will be televised on CBS. The Tigers, who have won five straight dating back to last year, go into the game with a 4-0 overall mark and 2-0 record in league play following last week's 30-26 road win over Mississippi State. LSU is 4-0 for the third straight year, something that has never been done at the school. Georgia, winners of three straight, is 3-1 overall and 2-0 in conference action. The Bulldogs are coming off a 20-17 win over Arizona State last week. Saturday's game will be the first for the Tigers in Athens since 2004. LSU hasn't won between the hedges since a 26-23 victory in 1987. LSU starting free safety **Chad Jones** was named the Walter Camp Foundation National Player of the Week on Sunday for his play in the win over Mississippi State. Jones returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown and had two crucial plays - a PBU on 3rd down and a tackle on 4th down - during LSU's last-minute goalline stand that helped preserve the win. LSU has now recorded goalline stands in consecutive games against Louisiana-Lafayette and Mississippi State. LSU goes into the Georgia game averaging 28.8 points per game and 310.0 total yards (130.2 rushing, 179.8 passing). The Tigers are allowing 15.2 points and 333.5 total yards (134.8 rushing, 198.8 passing) per game. Quarterback **Jordan Jefferson** has completed 61.4 percent of his passes (62-of-101) for 708 yards, seven TDs and just one interception. His top targets are senior **Brandon LaFell**, who has 20 receptions for 230 yards and 5 TDs, and junior **Terrance Toliver** (17 rec., 266 yards, 2 TDs). **Keiland Williams** leads the Tigers in rushing with 184 yards and 2 TDs on 36 carries. Defensively, LB **Harry Coleman** leads the team with 29 tackles, while LB **Perry Riley** has 28 stops. CB **Patrick Peterson** and LB **Jacob Cutrera** have both returned interceptions for TDs this year.

#### Jones Punt Return and Goalline Stand Helps Tigers Past Mississippi State, 30-26

**Chad Jones** returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown to start the fourth quarter and a last-minute goalline stand by the LSU defense helped the Tigers hold off Mississippi State, 30-26, in Starkville. **Patrick Peterson** opened the scoring for the Tigers, returning an interception 37 yards on State's first offensive play to give LSU a 6-0 lead. Mississippi State responded on its next possession to take a 7-6 lead. The Tigers struck back, going 66-yards on seven plays, capped with a **Brandon LaFell** 4-yard TD reception from **Jordan Jefferson**, putting LSU up 13-6. After an errant snap on a punt gave Mississippi State the ball at the LSU 1-yard line, the Bulldogs needed just one play to regain the lead at 14-13 on a 1-yard run by **Anthony Dixon**. The Tigers took a 16-14 lead at halftime courtesy of a **Josh Jasper** 22-yard field goal midway through the second quarter. LSU extended its lead on the first play of the third quarter when Jefferson connected with LaFell on a 58-yard TD pass to extend the lead to 23-14. The Bulldogs responded, going 73 yards on six plays to pull to within 23-21 on a 50-yard TD pass at the 6:33 mark. Jones' 93-yard punt return to open the fourth quarter gave the Tigers a 30-21 cushion. After a State field goal at the 10:13 mark pulled the Bulldogs to within 30-24, LSU's offense couldn't sustain drives on its next two possessions, opening the door for a Bulldogs possession that had State driving all the way to the Tiger 2-yard line with just over a minute left in the game. LSU's defense turned back State on four straight downs, including three from the 1-yard line, preserving the victory.

# Les Miles

HEAD COACH • FIFTH YEAR

It has been said that LSU is in the midst of the Golden Era of football at the school and head coach Les Miles has been the driving force behind the Tigers' continued dominance at the national level since his arrival in 2005.

In four years at LSU, Miles has led the charge in what has been the best run in the history of football at the school. Since taking over the program in January of 2005, Miles has led LSU to a national title, a Southeastern Conference championship, two appearances in the SEC Championship Game, three straight top five finishes, and four bowl victories, two of which were BCS contests.

Throw in 46 victories and three seasons of at least 11 victories and that makes for the best four-year stretch of football in school history.

Miles' record with the Tigers is an astonishing 46-11 with those victories representing the most by any LSU football coach over a four-year period. In addition to his 46 wins, some other notable accomplishments during his first four years with the Tigers include: only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it twice; only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game; nine wins over coaches who have won national titles; only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings; and a perfect 4-0 record in bowl games, which includes wins in the BCS Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 10 wins for the past four years, the Tigers have had 66 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 85 earning their college diploma.

Sixteen of the 18 seniors on the 2008 football team graduated, while 18 members of the 25-man senior class from the 2007 national championship team have earned their degree.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 25 NFL Draft picks over the past four years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards - the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies - as well as being named the SEC Defensive Player of the Year and a consensus All-American. A year later, Tyson Jackson became the highest drafted defensive player in LSU history, going No. 3 overall to the Kansas City Chiefs.

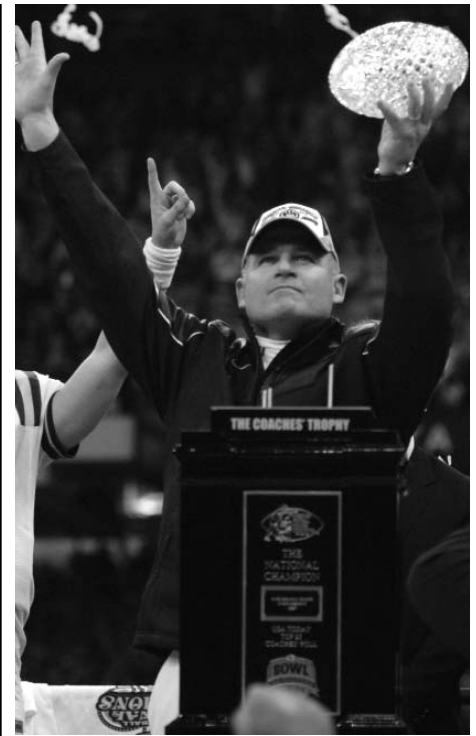
Now, with the Tigers becoming the first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for the LSU football program continues to be solid. After 46 wins, including 17 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with four-straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 class in 2009, Miles and the Tigers have solidified their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

## LSU Goes To Athens Looking For First Victory Between the Hedges Since 1986

Fourth-ranked LSU plays its second straight road game on Saturday when the Tigers travel to face 14th-ranked Georgia at Sanford Stadium in Athens. LSU is 4-0 overall and 2-0 in SEC action following last week's 30-26 win over Mississippi State. Georgia is 3-1 overall and 2-0 in conference play. The Bulldogs are coming off a 20-17 win over Arizona State last week.

## LSU Storylines This Week ...

- LSU goes to Georgia looking for its first win in Athens since a 26-23 victory in 1987.
- Tigers go into the month of October ranked in the top 10 for the fifth straight year.
- LSU will face a ranked opponent for the first time this year. LSU was 2-3 vs. ranked opponents last year, which included a 52-38 loss to No. 9 Georgia in Tiger Stadium.
- In four games this year, LSU's defense has returned two interceptions for touchdowns something that the Tigers didn't do one time a year ago.
- Since the 2002 season, LSU has posted a 47-10 mark in games in which they entered ranked in the AP Top 10.
- LSU is +7 in the turnover margin category, which leads the SEC and ranks No. 5 nationally.

## LSU's Chad Jones Is Walter Camp Foundation National Defensive Player of the Week

LSU junior free safety Chad Jones was named the national defensive player of the week by the Walter Camp Foundation on Sunday for his play in the Tigers' 30-24 win over Mississippi State. Jones had seven tackles, including four solo, as well as a 93-yard punt return for a touchdown in LSU's 30-26 win over Mississippi State in Starkville on Saturday. The punt return ranks as the second-longest in LSU history. Jones had two key plays on LSU's goalline stand against Mississippi State late in the fourth quarter - breaking up a pass on third down at the one-yard line and then tackling quarterback Tyson Lee just short of the endzone on the fourth down attempt by the Bulldogs. The national defensive player of the week honor is the first of Jones' career.

## LSU Out To Snap CBS Streak

LSU has always enjoyed the national exposure that appearing on CBS generates for the program. However, a year ago, games on CBS weren't kind for the Tigers as LSU went 0-5 in contests televised by CBS. Last year, all five of LSU's losses came in games televised by CBS. The list includes losses to Florida, Georgia, Alabama, Ole Miss and Arkansas. LSU's last win on CBS came against Tennessee in the 2007 SEC Championship Game in Atlanta.

## Georgia Only Team Still Standing For Miles

LSU coach Les Miles goes into this week's game against Georgia having won games against 10 of the 11 other SEC teams. The only team that Miles has yet to beat is Georgia. Miles is 24-10 in SEC regular season games and 26-10 in all league games (including SEC Championship Game). Miles is 0-2 vs. Georgia, which includes a loss in the 2005 SEC Championship Game and a loss last year against the Dawgs in Tiger Stadium.

## Miles Is 9-6 vs. The SEC East

LSU coach Les Miles goes into the Georgia game with a 9-6 record against opponents from the SEC Eastern Division. The 9-6 mark includes two appearances in the SEC Championship Game. Miles was 2-2 vs. the SEC East in 2005, 2-1 in 2006, 3-1 in 2007, and 1-2 last year. This year, Miles is 1-0 against the SEC East following the Tigers win over Vanderbilt in week 2.

## Miles Tied With Dietzel For Fourth-Highest Win Total In LSU History; Saban Next

With the win over Mississippi State, LSU coach Les Miles won his 46th game (57 tries), which ties him with Paul Dietzel as the fourth-winningest coach in school history. Miles got to 46 victories faster than any other coach in school history, a list that includes the top four winningest coaches at the school - Nick Saban (46 in 61 games), Charles McClendon (46 in 67 games), Bernie Moore (46 in 68 games) and Dietzel (46 in 73 games). Miles needs two wins to tie Saban for third place on the LSU all-time wins list. Saban posted a 48-16 mark in five years (2000-04) with the Tigers.

## LSU's Georgia Ties

Georgia offensive line coach Stacy Searels held the same position at LSU for four years from 2003-06 ... Georgia assistant director of football operations John Brooks was an student equipment manager at LSU ... Brooks graduated from LSU in 2002.

## Peach State Tigers

LSU has seven players on its roster who call Georgia home: linebacker Kelvin Sheppard (Stone Mountain), linebacker Perry Riley (Ellenwood), running back Drayton Calhoun (Clarkston), defensive back Derrick Bryant (Lawrenceville), linebacker Kevin Minter (Suwanee), center T-Bob Hebert (Norcross), and offensive lineman Cordian Hagans (Snellville). Three of the seven players are starters for the Tigers - Sheppard, Riley and Hebert.

## LSU Ranked No. 4 In All Three Major Polls; Tigers Were No. 4 To Start October Last Year

LSU continued its climb up the national rankings on Sunday, jumping three spots to No. 4 in both the USA Today Coaches Poll and the Associated Press Poll. LSU also opened at No. 4 in the Harris Interactive Rankings, which made its 2009 debut this week. The No. 4 ranking in the AP Poll is the same spot the Tigers held a year ago. LSU was No. 3 this week one year ago in the Coaches Poll and No. 2 in the Harris Interactive Rankings.

## Tigers Head Into October Ranked In Top 10 For Fifth Straight Year

LSU goes into the month of October ranked in the top 10 for the fifth straight year dating back to the 2005 season. LSU was ranked No. 4 during the first AP Poll in October in 2005; No. 9 in the first AP Poll in October 2006; No. 1 in 2007 and No. 4 last year.

## LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 47 of the 57 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis earlier this decade, LSU has recorded a 47-10 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU is 2-0 this year as an AP Top 10 with wins over UL-Lafayette and Mississippi State.

## LaFell Off To Quick Start With 5 TDs in First 4 Games

With five TD receptions in the first four games of the season, senior **Brandon LaFell** is having one of the most productive starts ever for an LSU receiver. LaFell's five TD receptions is the most by a Tiger since 1977 when Carlos Carson had six TD receptions during that span. Carson caught a school-record five TD passes against Rice in week 2 and then followed that with a sixth TD catch a week later against Florida. The school record for TD receptions in a season is 12 set by Dwayne Bowe in 2006.

## LaFell First Tiger Since 1989 To Have Back-to-Back Multi-TD Reception Games

With a pair of receiving touchdowns against Mississippi State, senior wide receiver **Brandon LaFell** became the first LSU player since Eddie Fuller in 1989 to have back-to-back multi-TD games. LaFell caught a pair of TD passes against Louisiana-Lafayette on Sept. 19 and then followed that last week with two more TD receptions in the win over Mississippi State. The last time an LSU player turned in that feat came in 1989 when Eddie Fuller caught two TD passes in consecutive games against Ole Miss and Alabama.

## Tiger Defense Has Goalline Stands in Back-to-Back Games

LSU goes into the Georgia game having recorded a goalline stand in back-to-back games. Last week against Mississippi State, the Tiger defense turned back the Bulldogs at the goalline with just over a minute left in the game to preserve the victory. The Bulldogs had four shots at the Tigers, three coming at the 1-yard line, but LSU turned them away each time. The big plays came on third down when LSU safety **Chad Jones** tipped away a pass and then on fourth down when Jones stopped Mississippi State quarterback Tyson Lee just an inch shy of the endzone. A week earlier, UL-Lafayette was turned back after three tries from the 1-yard line. UL-Lafayette's last attempt from the 1-yard line resulted in a fumble, which was recovered by Perry Riley.

## Chad Jones 93-yard Punt Return Ranks Second In School History

**Chad Jones'** 93-yard punt return for a touchdown early in the fourth quarter against Mississippi State ranks as the second-longest punt return in school history. Eddie Kennison holds the school record with a 100-yard return against Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium in 1994. By returning a punt for a TD, LSU now has two punt returners on its roster - Jones and **Trindon Holliday** - who have returned at least one punt for a touchdown during their career.

## LSU Leads SEC In Turnover Margin; Rank No. 5 In the Nation

LSU goes into this week's game against Georgia leading the SEC in turnover margin at +7 through the first four weeks of the season. In SEC games only, LSU has forced five turnovers (4 interceptions, 1 fumble), while turning the ball over just one time (fumble vs. Vanderbilt). LSU has scored 31 points off of their turnovers during the first four games this year. By comparison, LSU's national championship team in 2007 was +9 in the turnover category with those turnovers resulting in 55 points through the first four games.

## LSU Returns Another Interception For a Touchdown

LSU CB **Patrick Peterson** became the second Tiger to return an interception for a touchdown this year when he picked off a pass and returned it 37 yards for a first quarter score against Mississippi State. Peterson's interception came on Mississippi State's first offensive play from scrimmage. Linebacker **Jacob Cutrera** returned the other interception for a TD, taking a Jake Locker pass back 29-yards for a score in the first quarter against Washington in the season-opener.

## Brothers Jones and Alem Sparking Tiger Defense

You don't have to look any further than brothers **Chad Jones** and **Rahim Alem** (formerly Al Jones) to see who's been the key to LSU's success on defense this year. Alem is the unquestioned leader of the Tiger defensive front, while Jones is the quarterback in the secondary for the Tigers. Alem, a defensive end, leads the Tigers in both tackles for losses (4.5-19 yards) and sacks (2-12 yards), while Jones, the free safety, is first on the squad in interceptions (2) and he's fifth in total tackles (20).

## Miles Goes Into Georgia Game With a 12-5 Record in SEC Road Games

LSU coach **Les Miles** goes into the Georgia game with a Mississippi State game with a 12-5 record in SEC road games. Miles and the Tigers were 2-2 in SEC road games last year. In his first year with the Tigers, Miles won all four of his SEC road games in 2005 followed by a 2-2 record in 2006 and a 3-1 mark in 2007. Of Miles' 12 SEC road wins, five have come against teams ranked in the top 20. Miles is 7-1 in SEC road games against unranked teams.

## LSU's Best After Dark

Night games in Tiger Stadium seem to bring out the best in LSU. However, lately LSU has been at its best no matter the location just as long as it dark outside. After the win over UL-Lafayette, LSU has now won 26 of its last 27 night games. (Note: NCAA determines that a kickoff at 5 p.m. or later is a night game). Florida snapped LSU's streak of consecutive night wins at 19 on Oct. 11. Prior to the Florida game on Oct. 11, LSU hadn't lost a night game since a 34-14 loss to Georgia in the SEC Championship Game in 2005. Overall, LSU coach **Les Miles** has guided the Tigers to a 32-3 mark in night games.

## R.J. Jackson Has Career Night Against Vanderbilt

Senior WR **R.J. Jackson** produced a career performance against Vanderbilt with 6 catches for 55 yards, including a long of 30 yards that setup a field goal for the Tigers just before halftime. Prior to the Vanderbilt game, Jackson had just one reception for minus-1 yard in his career. Jackson is currently LSU's third-leading receiver thru four games.

## Jefferson Off To Fast Start

LSU sophomore QB **Jordan Jefferson** has performed well in the first four games of the season as he's connected on 62-of-101 passes for 708 yards, 7 TDs and just one interception. Jefferson has also added 83 rushing yards. Jefferson completed 31 passes in LSU's first two games, which were the most by an LSU quarterback since Rohan Davey completed 32 passes in the first two games of the 2002 season. Jefferson opened the year by throwing 3 TD passes in the win over Washington and by doing so, he joined JaMarcus Russell (2006 vs. UL-Lafayette), Matt Mauck (2003 vs. UL-Monroe) and Davey (2000 vs. Western Carolina) as the only quarterbacks who have tossed 3 TDs in a season opener for the Tigers in the modern (SEC) era. Jefferson had his streak of passes thrown without an interception snapped at 100 last week against UL-Lafayette. Jefferson, who has a 5-1 record as LSU's starting quarterback, has only thrown one interception in his six career starts. Jefferson threw for a career-high 233 yards and a pair of scores in the win over Mississippi State.

## Jefferson Youngest Starting QB In SEC; Youngest LSU QB To Start Season-Opener Since 1945

LSU's **Jordan Jefferson** is the youngest starting quarterback in the SEC. Jefferson, who has five career starts to his credit, was 19 years and 11 days old when he took the first snap against Washington. Jefferson was the youngest quarterback to start a season-opener for the Tigers since Y.A. Tittle in 1945. That year, Tittle was 18 years, 11 months and 6 days when LSU opened the season against Rice. ## LaFell Moving Up The LSU Career Record Books

Senior WR **Brandon LaFell** continues to make an impact in the LSU career record books. LaFell, who opted to return for his senior season, leads the Tigers in receptions (20), and touchdowns (5) and he's second in receiving yards (230). Against Mississippi State, LaFell hauled in six passes for 101 yards and a pair of TDs. It was the fourth 2-TD game of his career, and the second straight. LaFell now stands in a fourth-place tie with Devery Henderson (2000-03) and Wendell Davis (1984-87) in LSU career receiving touchdowns with 19. LaFell has also moved into the LSU career top 10 for receptions and receiving yards. LaFell is eighth in school history with 138 receptions and his 2,045 yards rank No. 9.

## Dickson In Position To Break Every Tight End Receiving Record at LSU

Senior TE **Richard Dickson** came into the 2009 season with a shot at breaking every school record for receiving at his position. For his career, Dickson has caught 77 passes for 849 yards and 10 touchdowns. His 10 TD receptions tie with Brad Boyd for the school's career mark for a tight end, while his 77 catches leave him 10 short of tying the school mark of 87 held by Mitch Andrews. Dickson's 849 yards is No. 4 in school history. The following is a look at Dickson's career receiving numbers and who he's chasing to become the most productive tight end in school history

## Alem Racks Up The Sacks - Career Total Now at 12

With a pair of sacks in LSU's first four games, DE **Rahim Alem** has run his career sack total to 12. Alem goes into the Georgia contest having recorded a sack in four of LSU's last seven games dating back to 2008. A year ago, Alem led the Tigers with 8.0 sacks, which ranked as the ninth-highest total in school history. Alem earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his performance against Vanderbilt.

## Shepard Makes The Most Of His Touches

LSU QB **Russell Shepard** makes the most of his touches as he's averaging 6.75 yards every time he gets his hand on the football. Shepard, who has lined up at quarterback, running back and receiver for the Tigers, had rushed for 74 yards on 11 carries (6.7 avg.) and he's caught one pass for a 6-yard gain. Against Mississippi State, Shepard actually led the Tigers in rushing with 26 yards on four carries, all coming in the first half.

## LSU Has Used 9 First-Time Starters In 2009

Four games into the 2009 season and LSU has already had nine players make their first career start. Four Tigers started the first game of their career against Washington and then two more followed against Vanderbilt. TE **Deangelo Peterson** was the newest member to the starting club when LSU started in a two tight-end set at Mississippi State. The following is a look at LSU's first-time starters this year:

## He Must Be A Former Lineman

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach Les Miles is a former offensive lineman. In 57 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 42-5 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 29-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 28-0. ## A Unique Situation At Left Tackle - 2 Players Have Accounted For Last 96 Starts

Starting left tackle Ciron Black goes into the Georgia game having started 44 straight games, all coming at left tackle. Since the start of the 2002 season, a stretch that spans 96 games, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Black and Andrew Whitworth. Whitworth, now a starting tackle for the Cincinnati Bengals, set an LSU record by starting 52 straight games for the Tigers from 2002-05. Black then picked up where Whitworth left off, starting the next 42 games at that position for the Tigers. Black's 43 straight starts ranks as the second-longest active streak in college football.

## Taking Note On The Tigers Under Miles (Since 2005)

Here are some notable trends for LSU in the 56 games its played under head coach Les Miles ... LSU is 28-0 under Les Miles when rushing for 100 or more yards and holding the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards ... The Tigers are 42-5 when rushing for 100 yards or more ... On the contrary, the Tigers are just 4-6 under Les Miles when failing to reach the 100-yard mark in net rushing yards ... The Tigers are 33-3 when leading after the first quarter with the only losses during that span coming against Tennessee in 2005, Arkansas in 2007, and Alabama in 2008 - all three of which were overtime losses ... LSU is 44-7 when scoring 20 or more points and 37-5 when scoring 25 or more points ... The Tigers are 29-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing, while the record goes to 16-8 under Miles when allowing opponents to go over the 100-yard mark.

## Charles Scott Goes Over 1,000-yard Mark

LSU's Charles Scott topped the 1,000-yard rushing mark in 2008, going for 1,174 yards and 18 touchdowns in what was one of the most productive seasons in school history for a running back. Scott's 1,174 rushing yards is the fifth-highest total in school history, while his 18 rushing TDs ranks No. 2 all-time. Scott goes into 2009 looking to become the first LSU running back since Kevin Faulk to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons. Faulk did it three straight years from 1996 to 1998. Only three players in LSU history have had back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons - Charles Alexander (1977-78), Dalton Hilliard (1984-85) and Faulk (1996-97-98).

## Two Brothers Start For Tigers On Defense -- Alem and Jones

LSU had two brothers starting on defense against Washington in the season-opener as DE Rahim Alem (formerly Al Jones) and FS Chad Jones both started. It is the first time brothers started in the same game for the Tigers since 2005 when FB Kevin Steltz and S Craig Steltz both started in a win over Appalachian State.

## LSU Returns Top Rusher, Receiver And Passer For First Time Since 1997

For the first time since the 1997 season, LSU returns its top three hands on offense in terms of rushing, passing and receiving. This year, Charles Scott returns as the Tigers leading rusher from a year ago, while Brandon LaFell returns as the top receiver from 2008 and quarterback Jarrett Lee comes back after leading the Tigers in passing yards. In 1997, running back Kevin Faulk, quarterback Herb Tyler and wide receiver Larry Foster all returned on offense after leading the Tigers in rushing, receiving and passing from the year before.

## Cap and Gown Tigers

Three current members of the LSU football team - DE Rahim Alem, WR R.J. Jackson and DT Charles Alexander - have already earned their Bachelor's degree from the university.

## LSU Leads Nation With 21 Straight Non-Conference Wins

With its win over UL-Lafayette, LSU has now won 21 straight non-conference games, a streak that dates back to the start of the 2005 season. LSU coach **Les Miles** is a perfect 21-0 in non-conference games at LSU. The 21-game non-conference win streak ranks first nationally. LSU's last non-conference loss came during the 2004 season when Iowa scored on the final play of the game to beat LSU, 30-25, in the Capital One Bowl. LSU hasn't lost a regular season non-conference contest since dropping a 26-8 decision to Virginia Tech in the 2002 season opener.

## This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 211-59-4 (.778) at night under the lights compared to a 21-25-3 (.459) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 56-10 overall at home, which includes a 45-4 (.918) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 11-6 (.647) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. ## An Offseason of National Championships for Chad Jones and Trindon Holliday

Free safety **Chad Jones** and running back/return specialist **Trindon Holliday** became national champions during the football off-season. Jones was an outfielder and key relief pitcher for LSU's 2009 College World Series champion baseball team. Jones maintained a 2.70 ERA in 6.2 innings pitched while walking three and striking out seven. He tossed three innings and did not allow a run or a hit in three appearances at the College World Series, which earned him the nickname "Dreadlocks of Doom". Jones came on in relief of starter Anthony Ranaudo in the deciding Game 3 of the CWS Championship Series against Texas and was brilliant. He did not allow a run in 1.2 innings of work while walking none and striking out two. Prior to spring football practice, Jones played in the outfield and batted .343 (12-for-35) with a homer, six RBI and eight runs scored. Along with former WR Jared Mitchell, Jones and he became just the second and third athletes in school history to win national titles in multiple team sports. Both were members of the 2007 BCS national championship team. Holliday, meanwhile, became the 100-meter dash national champion at the 2009 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships. Holliday clocked 10.00 in the national final of the 100-meter to claim the title. The time was the fastest of any player in the history of college football.

## LSU Has Become D-Line U.

You can now refer to LSU as D-line U as the Tigers have made it a habit of producing All-Americans and NFL Draft picks from its defensive line. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had five defensive linemen earn a total of six First-Team All-America honors and nine members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. In 2007, DT Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defensive player in school history - winning four national awards - on his way to becoming the fifth overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft. In the spring of 2009, Defensive end Tyson Jackson became the highest LSU defender ever picked in the NFL Draft, going No. 3 overall to Kansas City. ### Game 1 Notes vs. Washington

- LSU ran just 48 offensive plays in the season-opener against Washington. The 48 offensive plays were the fewest by an LSU team since the 1965 season when the Tigers mustered just 45 snaps in a 23-0 loss to Ole Miss on Oct. 30. LSU, 5-1 and ranked No. 5 in the nation at the time, managed just 52 yards of offense that day against the Rebels.
- LSU LB **Jacob Cutrera** intercepted a pass on his first play (Washington's first play of second drive) and returned it 29 yards for a TD. Cutrera became the first LSU player to return an interception for a TD since CB Jonathan Zenon did it against Tennessee in the 2007 SEC Championship Game. He's the first linebacker to do it since Kenny Hollis scored on a 3-yard interception return against Tennessee in 2005.

### Game 2 Notes vs. Vanderbilt

- LSU senior **Rahim Alem** was named defensive player of the week in the SEC for his play in the Tigers' 23-9 win over Vanderbilt. Alem recorded a career-best seven tackles, a sack and a pass breakup in the victory.

### Game 3 Notes vs. UL-Lafayette

- LSU stretched its non-conference winning streak to a nation's best 21 straight
- FS **Chad Jones** became the first Tiger to intercept two passes in a game since **Chris Hawkins** did it against Auburn in 2008
- LSU ran its streak of not allowing a TD to six consecutive quarters.

### Game 4 Notes vs. Mississippi State

- **Chad Jones** returned a fourth quarter punt 93 yards for a TD. The 93-yard punt return ranks as the second-longest in school history.
- For the second straight week, LSU's defense had a goalline stand - this time coming with just over a minute left in the contest, which preserved the Tiger victory.
- LSU CB **Patrick Peterson** returned an interception 37 yards for a touchdown on Mississippi State's first offensive play.

## Turnovers Too Costly As Tigers Fall To No. 9 Georgia, 52-38

Georgia returned two LSU interceptions for touchdowns, including one on the first play of the game, as the ninth-ranked Bulldogs outlasted the Tigers, 52-38, in Tiger Stadium. Georgia never trailed in the contest as the Bulldogs picked off a Jarrett Lee pass on the game's first play and returned it 40 yards for a TD and a 7-0 lead. Lee marched the Tigers down the field on their next possession, tying the game at 7-7 with a 10-yard pass to Brandon LaFell. Georgia extended its lead to 21-7 early in the second quarter before a 51-yard Colt David field goal and a 2-yard run by Charles Scott got LSU to within 21-17 at the 7:23 mark in the second quarter. The Tigers had a chance to take the lead late in the first half, but a Lee pass was intercepted at the UGA 35-yard line. The Bulldogs tacked on a field goal to take a 24-17 advantage at the break. Georgia opened the second half with scoring plays of 49 and 68 yards to increase the lead to 38-17. LSU didn't cave though, getting to within 38-24 on a 1-yard run by Scott with 2:47 left in the third quarter. LSU was still in the game at 45-31 following a 6-yard TD reception by Keiland Williams with 8:47 to go. After a Georgia punt, LSU drove to the UGA 13-yard line before turning the ball over on downs. Another stop by the LSU defense kept the Tigers alive, however Georgia intercepted a Lee pass and returned it 53 yards for a TD on LSU's next offensive play, putting the game out of reach. Scott led the Tigers with 144 yards and 2 TDs, while Lee threw for 287 yards and 3 scores.

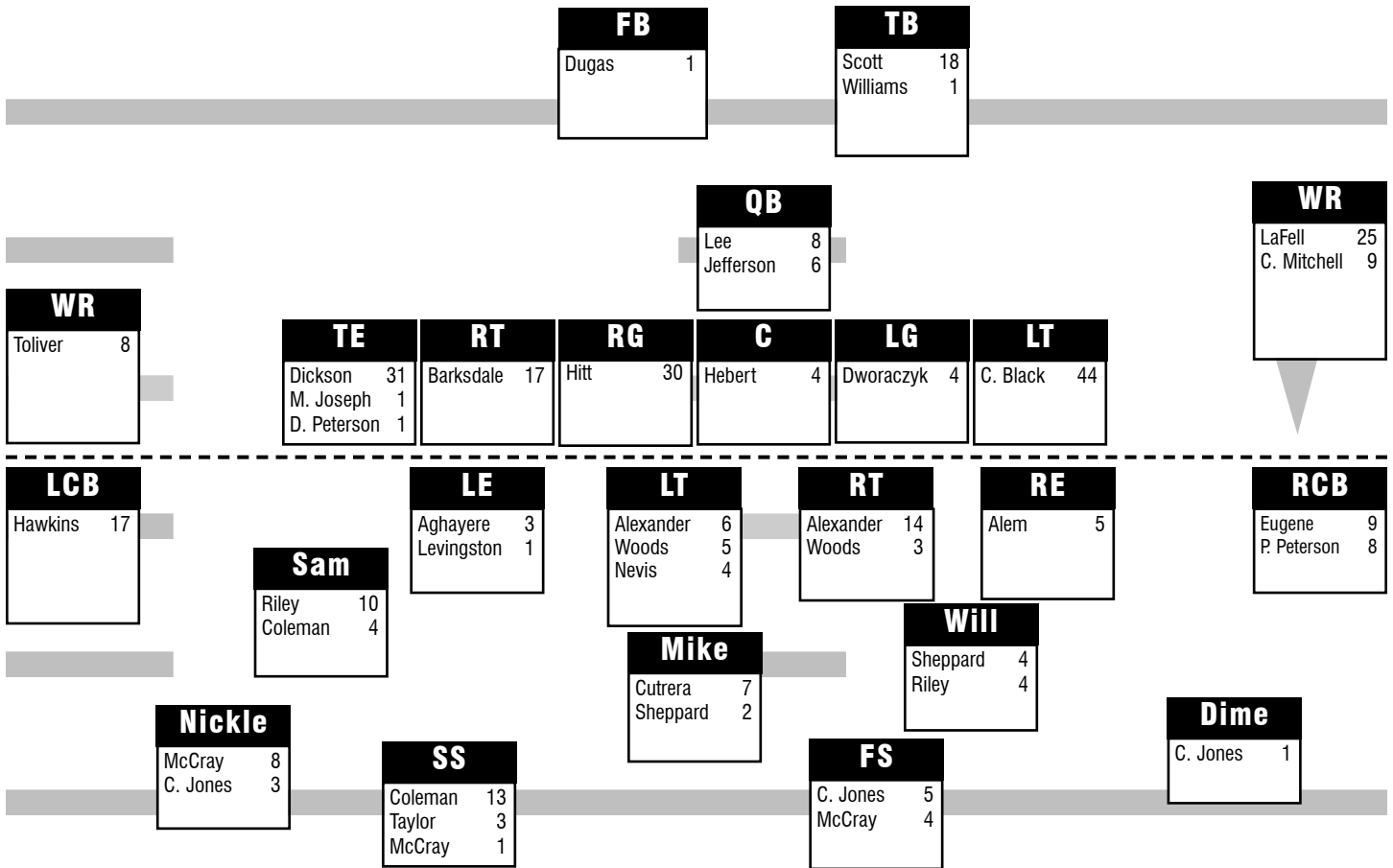

**Tigers Open Season With 31-23 Win Over Washington**

Jordan Jefferson threw for 172 yards and 3 touchdowns as he helped lead the No. 9/11 Tigers to a hard-fought 31-23 non-conference win over Washington in Seattle to open the 2009 campaign. LSU spotted the Huskies an early first quarter TD when UW went 85 yards on 10 plays to take a 7-0 advantage over the Tigers. LSU responded with a 24-yard field goal at the 6:03 mark. The Tigers took their first lead 14 seconds later when **Jacob Cutrera** returned an interception 29 yards for a score giving LSU a 10-7 advantage. The Huskies tied the game at 10-10 early in the second quarter before the Tigers took the lead for good on a 45-yard pass from Jefferson to **Terrance Toliver** at the 1:15 mark. UW added a field goal as time expired in the first half. Jefferson and Toliver hooked up for another score in the third quarter, this time a 39-yarder, as LSU stretched the lead to 24-13. The Tigers increased their margin to 31-16 on a 6-yard TD pass from Jefferson to **Brandon LaFell**. The Huskies added a touchdown as time expired for the final margin. Washington out-gained LSU on offense, 478-321, as the Huskies ran 83 plays compared to just 48 for the Tigers. LSU rushed for 149 yards and added 172 through the air. Toliver had his best game in an LSU uniform with four receptions for 117 yards and two scores. **Charles Scott** rushed for 51 yards, while **Keiland Williams** added 51 and Jefferson 42 to pace the Tigers offense.

**Strong Defensive Effort and Efficient Offense Leads LSU Past Vanderbilt, 23-9**

Keiland Williams rushed for 71 yards and a pair of TDs and the LSU defense limited Vanderbilt to just 210 total yards as the Tigers opened conference play with a 23-9 win over the Commodores on a rainy night in Tiger Stadium. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 7-0 lead on a 6-yard TD run by Williams late in the first quarter. LSU stretched the lead to 10-0 on a 32-yard field goal by **Josh Jasper** at the 10:22 mark in the second quarter. Vanderbilt responded with a 12-play, 80-yard drive to pull to within 10-7 on a 6-yard run by Larry Smith at the 7:20 mark in the second quarter. LSU need just over a minute to go 64 yards just before halftime as another Jasper field goal extended the lead to 13-7 at intermission. A third Jasper field goal stretched the margin to 16-7 midway through the third quarter. With the Tiger defense holding Vanderbilt in check, the LSU offense couldn't put the Commodores away though. An errant snap on a punt deep in LSU territory resulted in a safety for Vanderbilt, pulling the Commodores to within 16-9 with 1:35 to go in the third quarter. LSU's defense stepped up again the fourth quarter, halting a Vanderbilt drive at the LSU 23-yard line on an interception by **Brandon Taylor**. LSU put the game away with a 7-play, 46-yard drive capped on a 14-yard TD run by Williams with 6:05 to play. **Jordan Jefferson** completed 20-of-29 passes for 138 yards, while **Charles Scott** added 49 yards on the ground for LSU. LaFell led all LSU receivers with 7 catches for 38 yards. **Harry Coleman** paced the defense with 10 tackles, while **Rahim Alem** added 7 tackles and a sack.

### Defense Leads Tigers Past UL-Lafayette, 31-3

Another solid defensive effort combined with a pair of touchdown receptions by **Brandon LaFell** helped lead LSU to a 31-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in Tiger Stadium. The win was the 21st straight non-conference win by the Tigers. LSU got on the board first, going 62 yards on six plays capped with a 16-yard TD pass from **Jordan Jefferson** to LaFell to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead at the 3:09 mark in the first quarter. **Jones Punt Return and Last-Minute Goalline Stand Helps Tigers Past Mississippi State, 30-26**

Chad Jones returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown to start the fourth quarter and a last-minute goalline stand by the LSU defense helped the Tigers hold off Mississippi State, 30-26, in Starkville. Patrick Peterson opened the scoring for the Tigers, returning an interception 37 yards on State's first offensive play to give LSU a 6-0 lead. Mississippi State responded on its next possession to take a 7-6 lead. The Tigers struck back, going 66-yards on seven plays, capped with a Brandon LaFell 4-yard TD reception from Jordan Jefferson, putting LSU up 13-6. After an errant snap on a punt gave Mississippi State the ball at the LSU 1-yard line, the Bulldogs needed just one play to regain the lead at 14-13 on a 1-yard run by Anthony Dixon. The Tigers took a 16-14 lead at halftime courtesy of a Josh Jasper 22-yard field goal midway through the second quarter. LSU extended its lead on the first play of the third quarter when Jefferson connected with LaFell on a 58-yard TD pass to extend the lead to 23-14. The Bulldogs responded, going 73 yards on six plays to pull to within 23-21 on a 50-yard TD pass at the 6:33 mark. Jones' 93-yard punt return to open the fourth quarter gave the Tigers a 30-21 cushion. After a State field goal at the 10:13 mark pulled the Bulldogs to within 30-24, LSU's offense couldn't sustain drives on its next two possessions, opening the door for a Bulldogs possession that had State driving all the way to the Tiger 2-yard line with just over a minute left in the game. LSU's defense turned back State on four straight downs, including three from the 1-yard line, preserving the victory.
