SEC VIDEO REPLAY

The Southeastern Conference, following approval by the NCAA Football Rules Committee, has implemented the use of video replay on an experimental basis beginning with the 2005 football season.

THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

THE STANDARD

There must be indisputable video evidence for an officiating call to be changed by the Replay Official working from the press box. The play must have a direct competitive impact (ball possession, first down or score in question) on the game to warrant game stoppage for review. The Replay Official has the sole authority to review a play to stop game action and render a decision on any replay. Coaches and on-field officials have no authority to request a review.

THE SOURCE

All reviewable video will come direct from either the television network broadcasting the game (CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2, Jefferson-Pilot) or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards.

THE PLAYS

Reviewable

The following plays are subject to review under the SEC instant replay:

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
 - a. Scoring Plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line.
 - b. Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line.
 - c. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds.
 - d. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds.
2. Passing Plays:
 - a. Pass ruled complete/incomplete/intercepted in the field of play and end zones.
 - b. Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver.
 - c. Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player.
 - d. Quarterback (Passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, play is finalized).
 - e. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage.
 - f. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession.
 - g. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage.
3. Other Detectable Infractions:
 - a. Runner ruled not down.
 - b. Forward progress with respect to first down.
 - c. Touching of a kick.
 - d. Number of players on field.
 - e. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with overturned plays).
 - f. Fourth-down/try fumble plays.

Not Reviewable

The following are plays may not be reviewed with the use of video replay:

1. Holding.
2. Off-sides/Encroachment.
3. Pass interference.
4. Personal fouls (e.g., late hits).
5. Illegal blocks.
6. Illegal formations.
7. Face mask.
8. Taunting/excessive celebration.
9. False starts.
10. Roughing passer/kicker.
11. Fighting participants.

SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY (Continued)

THE PROCESS

Each SEC football stadium will have a secured replay booth equipped with DVSPORT Digital Replay system. Three individuals will be in the booth for the duration of the football game: 1) Replay Official; 2) Communicator, and 3) Technician. The Replay Official will be selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live video and audio feed (without any delay) will come directly into the replay booth. The Technician will watch the feed on an input monitor while capturing/digitizing it into the DVSPORT Digital Replay system. The Technician will also mark the beginning of each play as well as any replays as they occur in real time.

Each play and subsequent replay will appear on the touch screen in front of the Communicator. As the Technician marks the incoming video, each one will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Communicator can touch/click on a thumbnail and immediately playback the play or replay.

The Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation will be done via a remote device controlled by the Replay Official.

All replays/video will be viewed on an output monitor. The touch screen is only used to select the replay. In the event of a malfunction, one button will switch over to the backup system and allow the Replay Official to continue the review.

While most plays can be reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five on-field officials will wear pagers. If play is stopped, the Referee will announce on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee will then proceed to the sideline headset, which will provide direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth.

Once the replay has been reviewed, the Replay Official will notify the Referee, who in turn will announce the decision on the stadium PA system.

It is important to note that because of the digital, touch-screen technology, that every play can be reviewed without stopping play on the field. Just because play is not halted does NOT mean that the play was not reviewed.

THE EQUIPMENT

The SEC will use the Digital Replay System developed by DVSPORT of Pittsburgh, Pa., to implement its Instant Replay System. This digital system will be supplied to each member institution by the SEC and will be maintained by the home institution with the assistance of DVSPORT. DVSPORT will provide technical support throughout the 2005 football season. Additionally, a TIVO machine will be available as a backup system.

PROCESS SPECIFICS

Normal Booth Process (No Game Stoppage):

The Instant Replay Official will review every potentially-reviewable play to either confirm the call on the field was correct or to look for evidence that the play may need to be reviewed. When this type of review occurs there is no interruption to the game between plays. Note: As soon as the next play begins, it is too late to stop the game for a replay.

- a. Each play and subsequent replay will appear on the touch screen in front of the Communicator. As the Technician marks the incoming video, each one will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Communicator can touch on a thumbnail and immediately play back the play or replay.
- b. Replay Official will notify Communicator when to send play to his replay monitor. All replays/video will be viewed on an output monitor and the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation, including Play/Pause, Slow-Motion, Frame-by-Frame, and Fast Forward/Rewind, will be done via a remote device in the Replay Official's hand.
- c. Communicator will notify Replay Official when team breaks huddle or snap is imminent.

- d. Replay Official will direct Communicator when to clear his monitor.
- e. Communicator then clears the Replay Official's screen to prepare for the next play.

Replay Review Process (Game Stoppage Review):

While most plays can be reviewed between the dead ball and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system:

- a. Replay Official communicates via vibrating pager to field officials (Referee, Umpire, Side Judge, Alternate Official and TV "Red Hat" [when applicable]) that a play is under review. In the event of a pager system failure, the Communicator shall immediately notify the Alternate Official by walkie-talkie. The Alternate Official shall then notify the nearest official, who will stop play.
- b. Referee announces via Stadium PA, "The previous play is under review."
- c. Communicator begins timing the replay. When play is stopped, a minimum of 45-seconds will be used. Replays should not exceed two-minutes.
- d. Referee proceeds to sideline, where Replay Sideline Assistant provides him with the headset for communications to the booth.
- e. Technician notifies TV production truck by ring-down what is being reviewed and requests additional views from the truck.
- f. Communicator notifies Replay Official additional views have been received.
- g. Replay Official completes review and informs Referee via headset of his decision.
 - a. Play stands as called on the field.
 - b. Indisputable video evidence to overturn/modify the play, along with description and the resulting modification of game situation.
- h. Referee PA announcement:
 - a. After review, the play stands as called on the field.
 - b. After review, there is indisputable video evidence that (description of video evidence e.g. "runner did not make the line to gain"), therefore (description of result of overturn/modification e.g. "the ball will be placed at the 39 yardline 3rd down").
- i. Communicator will log replay report information on SEC Replay Form (i.e. Teams, Qtr. Time, play reviewed, overturned or correct call, replay time).
- j. During game stoppage for a review, the stadium video system may NOT show any replays of the play in question. Once the referee announces the outcome, ONE replay of the play may be shown.

The Charlotte, N.C. company, holds the rights to televise 13 games annually throughout the nine-state SEC region on a syndicated basis. The games will be broadcast in the early afternoon at 12:30 p.m. ET.

FOX Sports Net South (FSNS), FOX Sports Net Southwest (FSNSW) and SUN Sports (SUN) together form **SEC-TV**, the league's regional cable package. SEC-TV Weekly airs Thursday nights and Saturday mornings during the season, highlighting all of the SEC's athletic teams and events.

THIS IS THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

- The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports - 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.
- The SEC's mission statement reflects the priorities of the league. "The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- During the last three years, the SEC has had more student-athletes honored as CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans than any other conference. The league has had 102 student-athletes named CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans, including 46 named to the first-team.
- During the last nine years, the SEC has had 16 winners of the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award, which is given annually to eight outstanding senior student-athletes. Since 1997, no other conference has had as many student-athletes honored with this prestigious award. In 2005, Auburn diver Caesar Garcia was named a recipient of this award.
- The Southeastern Conference had two student-athletes named by the National Football Foundation as National Scholar-Athletes - Georgia's David Greene and Tennessee's Michael Munoz. During the last three years, the SEC has had eight student-athletes honored, the most of any conference. Tennessee's Michael Munoz won the Vincent dePaul Draddy Award given by the National Football Foundation in 2004 as the nation's top football scholar-athlete. Munoz became the fifth SEC student-athlete to claim the "Academic Heisman" since the award was established in 1990.

FOR THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

- The 12 member institutions of the SEC provide nearly \$65 million in scholarships for the more than 5,300 student-athletes each year.
- The SEC distributed nearly \$600,000 during the 2004-2005 academic year from the NCAA Special Assistance Fund for Student-Athletes. This program was implemented to provide financial aid to student-athletes with specific needs such as clothing and shoes, medical or vision care, academic course supplies and family emergencies.
- During the 2005-06 academic year, the SEC will distribute more than \$1 million to directly benefit student-athletes from the Student-Athlete Opportunity Fund.
- The SEC, in conjunction with the ALLTEL Corporation, awards post-graduate scholarships totaling \$130,000 to 24 student-athletes each year. The top male and female nominee each receive the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award, named for the league's fourth commissioner, and a \$10,000 scholarship. Last year, 22 additional student-athletes (11 female and 11 male) received \$5,000 to continue their education. Tennessee diver Lauryn McCalley and Ole Miss football player Rob Robertson were named McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award winners in 2004-05.
- The SEC has established a Community Service Award to honor a male and female student-athlete with a \$5,000 scholarship for outstanding service in the community. LSU baseball player Jordan Faircloth and South Carolina diver Holly Hodges were named recipients of this award in 2005.

A LEADER IN WOMEN'S SPORTS

- The SEC has developed a "Principles for Gender Equity," which, calls for each league school to provide equitable funding for women's sports, promotions and marketing and other support services. The SEC currently conducts championships in 11 women's sports and nine men's sports.
- The SEC had two sport winners of the Collegiate Woman of the Year Award sponsored by Honda. LSU's Seimone Augustus won for women's basketball and Auburn's Kirsty Coventry won for swimming and diving.
- The SEC has two of the 10 finalists for the 2005 NCAA Woman of the Year - Alabama gymnast Michelle Reeser and Tennessee diver Lauryn McCalley. This award recognizes senior student-athletes in intercollegiate athletics for their outstanding achievements in athletics, academics and community service. The national winner will be announced at an awards dinner on October 29 in Indianapolis. Since 1991, the SEC has had four winners of this award.

- Since 1987, SEC schools have won 59 NCAA women's national championships, an average of more than three per year in the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors. Eight of the 12 SEC institutions have won a national women's team championship since 1987.

COMPLIANCE AND EDUCATION

- The SEC Task Force Committee on Compliance and Enforcement recently issued a report of recommendations that represents an important initial step in a formal process of establishing a new standard of compliance excellence within the Southeastern Conference. Among the recommendations included in this report was how institutions will handle reports of allegations, strengthening the relationship between the league's institutions and the conference office, developing new orientation programs and establishing an annual review of compliance issues.
- The SEC also conducts a New Coaches Orientation Program four times a year, which supplements institutional orientation programs and enhance the professional development of coaches. Topics of discussion range from the role of the SEC and NCAA to the role of athletics in higher education.

SPORTSMANSHIP

- The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states:
 "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

IN THE COMMUNITY

- The SEC launched its education initiative in 2002, utilizing the platform of intercollegiate athletics to provide elementary school teachers with relevant resources they can use to educate and prepare children for life. The SEC became the nation's first conference to develop customized educational software, providing a CD-ROM containing SEC-branded content correlating to national educational standards. Since the CD-ROM was produced, the SEC has initiated an online program for K-8 students on education content and character development.
- SECKids.com is a website uniquely designed for school-age students. Now fans of all ages can access exciting, interactive and educational information on the SEC and its universities. SECKids.com features exclusive behind-the-scenes access at championship events, profiles of student-athletes and coaches, along with games and video highlights. Teachers can also register online to utilize the SEC Kids's college software in their classroom. The SEC is the only conference in the country to develop a site of this kind.

OVERALL ATHLETICS SUCCESS

- Since 1990, the SEC has won 104 team and 682 individual national championships. Since that time, the SEC has had at least one team ranked in the top five nationally in 76.7 percent of the total sports win which the league has competed (237 of 309). Nine of the SEC's 12 schools have won at least one national championship since 1990.
- In the 20 sponsored sports of the Southeastern Conference, the SEC had a higher national finish than any other conference in the nation in 2004-05. In a ranking system, using national polls and NCAA Championships finishes, the SEC had 973.5 points, edging second-place Pac-10 with 868 points. The Big 12 was third with 603.5 points followed by the Big Ten with 481 and the Atlantic Coast with 453 points. The SEC broke an eight-year string by the Pac-10 as the highest women's point total with 522.5 points. The SEC had also the highest men's total with 451 points.

VINCENT DEPAUL DRADDY AWARD

Presented by the National Football Foundation, it is often referred to as the "Academic Heisman." The Draddy Award is given to the nation's top scholar-athlete and awards a \$25,000 postgraduate scholarship. This year's winner is **LSU senior center Rudy Niswanger**. An SEC student-athlete has won this award five of the last 10 seasons.

NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION SCHOLAR-ATHLETES

LSU center Rudy Niswanger and Alabama linebacker DeMeco Ryans were named two of 16 national scholar-athletes, as selected by the National Football Foundation. Candidates must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

WUERFFEL TROPHY

Awarded by the All Sports Association of Fort Walton Beach, Fla., the Wuerffel Trophy is awarded to the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with outstanding academic and athletic achievement. This year's winner is **LSU senior center Rudy Niswanger**. This is the first year of the award.

LOTT TROPHY

Given by the Pacific Club in Newport Beach, Calif., it is named for NFL Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott, the accolade is given to the IMPACT Defensive Player of the Year. The award recognizes a player's success both on and off the field, IMPACT is an acronym for Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity. This year's winner is **Alabama linebacker DeMeco Ryans**.

SEC LEADS NATION IN NFL PLAYERS

The Southeastern Conference had 261 of its former student-athletes on 2005 National Football League Kickoff Weekend rosters, most of any conference in the nation.

Florida and Tennessee each had 37 players on rosters, which tied for second in the nation, behind Florida State's 42. Georgia tied with Ohio State for fourth with 35 players while Auburn was eighth with 31 and LSU tied Notre Dame for ninth with 30 players on NFL opening day rosters.

Alabama had 18 players on opening day rosters followed by Ole Miss and South Carolina with 17 each, Miss. State with 15, Arkansas 11, Vanderbilt 7 and Kentucky with six.

Using current conference alignments, the Atlantic Coast Conference was second behind the SEC with 231 players on NFL rosters. The Big Ten was third with 223, the Pac-10 fourth with 188 and the Big 12 was fifth with 176 former players on NFL rosters.

SEC BOWL REVENUE DISTRIBUTION

- (A) For bowl games providing receipts which result in a balance of less than \$1,500,000, the participating institution shall retain \$800,000 plus a travel allowance as determined by the SEC Executive Committee. The remainder shall be remitted to the Commissioner and will be divided into 13 equal shares with one share to the Conference and one share to each member institution.
- (B) For bowl games providing receipts which result in a balance between \$1,500,000 and \$3,999,999, the participating institution shall retain \$1,000,000 plus a travel allowance as determined by the SEC Executive Committee. The remainder shall be remitted to the Commissioner and will be divided into 13 equal shares, with one share to the Conference and one share to each member institution.
- (C) For bowl games providing receipts which result in a balance between \$4,000,000 and \$5,999,999, the participating institution shall retain \$1,200,000 plus a travel allowance as determined by the SEC Executive Committee. The remainder shall be remitted to the Commissioner and will be divided into 13 equal shares, with one share to the Conference and one share to each member institution.
- (D) For bowl games providing receipts which result in a balance between \$6,000,000 or more, the participating institution shall receive \$1,700,000 (\$1,800,000 if the SEC team is a participant in the Bowl Championship Series game which determines the National Championship) plus a travel allowance as determined by the SEC Executive Committee. The remainder shall be remitted to the Commissioner and will be divided into 13 equal shares, with one share to the Conference and one share to each member institution.
- (E) Bowl Revenue Protection Insurance and the cost of unused tickets up to 3,000 tickets, shall be deducted prior to the Conference distribution.

BOWL GAMES ARE COLLEGE FOOTBALL

• Bowl Games Provide Revenue...

This year 28 bowl games will distribute more than \$190 million to NCAA schools. More than \$900 million has been paid out in just the past six years and the bowls will conservatively payout more than \$2.2 billion over the next ten years.

Almost all Bowl games are non-profit organizations. The more revenue the bowl brings in through ticket sales, sponsors, etc. the more money can be paid to NCAA schools.

There have been articles on how teams don't profit from playing in a bowl and in fact some even lose money. This is rarely true. While some schools may elect to spend all of the allotted portion of their payout on bowl travel expenses most teams participating in bowls make money after all revenue sharing is distributed. In fact, conferences share most bowl revenue with all schools in their league, thus spreading the wealth with schools that don't even qualify for a bowl.

Bowl games generate increased donations, valuable visibility and even increases in school enrollment applications. In addition, it can also increase long term revenues in licensing, endorsement money, TV contracts and season ticket sales.

While it is true that some teams in conferences that don't send multiple teams to bowls don't receive as much revenue, that is a key reason additional bowls have been added recently -- to provide more opportunities for those conference members and increase their revenue. Indeed some bowls have been setup with the help of conferences to provide all the other benefits of a bowl.

• Bowl Games Are Tradition...

Bowl games have been a part of college football for 90 years. They have provided some of the greatest moments in college football history and add to the pageantry, color and excitement of the game. Bowl games are as much a part of the tradition of college football as any other aspect of the game.

While there has been an increase in the number of bowl games, half of the bowls have been around for at least 15 years and 12 of these have been in existence for 25 or more years.

The addition of bowl games has provided opportunities for more schools to participate in the bowl experience. That means more student athletes, coaches, cheerleaders, band members, halftime performers, administrators, alumni, college football fans and communities can be a part of this unforgettable experience. College football bowl games offer these people memories that can last a lifetime. This season about 5,600 student-athletes, 11,000 band members, 1,100 cheerleaders, 50,000 - 100,000 performers and millions of fans and community members were a part of this experience.

Bowl games bring a measure of importance to the regular season not seen in other sports.

No other intercollegiate sport plays as few regular season games as football and every game means something, conference championships mean something. (This is different from basketball where you can lose a dozen games as long as you win in your conference tournament).

86 (out of 117) different Division IA schools have participated in at least one bowl game in the past six seasons. A total of 56 schools will be a part of the bowl experience this season and 28 teams will finish their season as a bowl champion.

• Bowl Games Are Popular...

Total attendance increased this past year as more than 1.49 million fans attended 28 bowl games. The average capacity-filled of the bowl stadiums was 90%. Eighteen bowls were at least 90% filled. Twelve bowls were soldout.

Average attendance was up 2.3% this past year. Of the 20 current bowls that have been played at least six years attendance has increased 6.5% and stadium capacity was at 98.5% in 2004-05.

The combined TV audience for the 28 bowls was an average of 109 million households.

• Bowls Benefit Communities...

Bowl games generate an estimated \$1.1 billion dollars worth of economic impact for their host communities each year. This does not include the value of exposure.

Bowls benefit not only NCAA institutions but local causes and charities. Many bowls contribute in excess of \$100,000 annually to charitable causes and host camps for disadvantaged youth. A small sample of charities benefiting include the Boys & Girls Clubs, numerous hospitals, YMCA, local education programs through elementary and high schools, college scholarship programs, the United Way, Make a Wish Foundation, Boy Scouts of America, and the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.

• Bowls Provide New & Unique Experiences...

Players take part in many diverse experiences and see many sights during their bowl trips. In Tampa they visit Busch Gardens and the beaches. Players at the Holiday Bowl have lunch and tour an aircraft carrier. Players visit the Alamo in San Antonio, tour historic Alcatraz in San Francisco, Disney theme parks in Orlando, go snowmobiling in Boise, experience a luau and visit Pearl Harbor in Hawaii, and much more. These things never would happen in a playoff setting.

Looking at the Numbers ...

1) The bowls experienced record total attendance once again with 1,492,001 fans in 2004-05, an increase of 2.3% over 2003-04. A total of 19 bowls saw increased attendance or were sold out.

2) Bowls filled their stadiums to an average 89.8% of capacity in 2004-05, up from 88.2 percent the previous year. BCS bowls were overflowing with 102.4% capacity. 11 bowls were sellouts and 18 bowls were filled to at least 90% of capacity.

3) Ten of the 28 bowls in existence in 2003-04 saw their TV ratings increase in 2003-04.

4) The SEC had six teams in bowl games in 2004-05. The six games had 413,441 fans, an average of 68,907 fans per game and had an average capacity of 99.9 percent. All six bowl games each had a capacity of more than 95 percent.

5) Bowl games that featured an SEC team in 2004-05 were four of the 10 highest rated televised bowl games. The Nokia Sugar Bowl, which pitted Auburn against Virginia Tech, was the third-most watched bowl (9.5 rating).
