This will actually be the first regular season meeting since December 19, 1998 when LSU won a 63-61 overtime decision at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center ... Teams have met twice since then in the NCAA Tournament -- second round in 2000 in Salt Lake City with LSU winning 72-67; and, this past March when LSU won the Atlanta Regional final, 70-60, in overtime ... These two teams have met in Houston twice before with Texas scoring a 50-31 victory in 1947 and a wild game at the Summit on Dec. 2, 1990 when LSU won 124-113 in a game suiting its location at the former home of the Rockets ... LSU leads the series, 5-2, in games played at neutral sites.

John Brady

Head Coach • 10th Year

When John Brady first put a team on the floor of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, his Tiger squad was undermanned, undersized and underdogs.

Teams hated to play the Tigers then because John Brady coached his team hard and they responded with several strong performances against the leagues top teams, but not many wins.

Now entering his 10th year as the head coach at LSU, John Brady has coached the LSU team as only he knows how -- with heart and passion, and knowledge of the game that makes him one of the best at in-game decisions. The LSU Tigers, in 2006, won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record and won the Western Division for the second straight year. LSU has won 26 SEC games the last two years, the most in the league in that period and LSU concluded the 2005-06 season with 17 straight SEC home wins, the most in the 35-year history of the Maravich Assembly Center. In the process Brady was recognized for his coaching job for the second time as the SEC Coach of the Year.

LSU has advanced to postseason play each of the last five years and six times in the last seven seasons. LSU has had five consecutive winning seasons under John Brady and only three times in the program history has there been longer consecutive years of winning.

In the last seven seasons, LSU has won 141 games, an average of 20 a year.

Three times John Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year (Glen Davis-2006, Brandon Bass-2005, Stromile Swift-2000) and he has coached four SEC Freshman of the Year (Tyrus Thomas-2006, Glen Davis-2005, Brandon Bass-2004, Torris Bright-2000).

Brady's 167 wins in nine seasons is the third most wins by an LSU basketball coach and only two LSU basketball coaches have served longer tenures.

John Brady has built a program at LSU with a record of success that is hard to argue with. He has given the LSU program the direction to grow and the chance to shine again.

When Brady arrived on campus in March 1997 and was given the job of rebuilding the pro-

gram, make no mistake; he knew his program would be riddled with shortcomings because of NCAA-imposed sanctions. He knew he would have the chance to build a foundation based on responsibility and accountability.

Brady's knowledge of the game and his belief in discipline and responsibility for actions on and off the floor have made the LSU program strong again, one that LSU fans are proud of because they feel a part of the program.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hardwood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that that athletic and academic pursuits of the players should be challenged to the fullest. That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well. Hours are passed and posted toward graduation on a regular basis by scholarship players.

The team, despite missing nearly four weeks of school during the SEC and NCAA Final Four run, averaged a 3.01 GPA during the spring semester.

Brady came to LSU after six highly successful seasons at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala.

In his six-year tenure (1992-97), he turned the team into a consistent winner, posting a record of 89-77. In Brady's six years at Samford, the team had three first-team and five second-team all-league selections.

Now at LSU, the numbers are beginning to work for Brady both on and off the floor, with 15 players earning All-SEC honors, 32 earning All-SEC academic honors and 15 who have received their degrees from LSU.

The 52-year-old Brady is the father of two daughters (Brittany-16, Brooke-12) and is married to the former Misty Champagne.

The LSU program is now solid both athletically and academically. The top players in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers throughout the nation. The plan to bring LSU back to being a constant player at the top of the SEC and the nation has been accomplished and now the work is being done to keep LSU there for years to come.

The 12,053 paid crowd for the Texas A&M game Tuesday s the largest November-December attendance for a basketball game in the John Brady era at the Maravich Assembly Center ... The 9,274 actual scanner count was the second best ... Over 2,300 students attended the game, nearly filling the 2,500 seats that students have for their use in the building ... LSU's win over No. 6 A&M marked the first time to that point in the season that an SEC team won a game against a ranked team in 11 tries, eight of those against top 10 teams ... A rarity in college basketball came in the Wichita State game (11/25) as neither team went to the foul line in the first 20 minutes ... LSU is now 46-11 in the Brady era in the month of December.

The Wichita game was just the 15th time in 160 games in the Brady era that the Tigers have lost the game with the lead and five minutes to play ... LSU has now won 404 games in the 36 years of men's basketball play in the Assembly Center ... LSU Goes On The Neutral Court For First Time

The Tigers will be on the Neutral Court for the first time this season against the Longhorns at the 18,500-seat Toyota Center in Houston, the home of the Houston Rockets of the NBA... LSU was 6-3 on the neutral court last year, including 4-1 in the NCAA Tournament, 1-1 in the SEC Tournament and 1-1 in Valley High School and the Christmas Las Vegas Invitational ... LSU is 118-111 on the neutral court in its first 98 years of basketball and the Tigers are 25-18 on neutral courts in the John Brady era.

LSU-Texas Series Has Seen Its Neutral Courts

This will be the 30th game in the LSU-Texas series and the eighth time the game will be played on a neutral court ... This will be the third time the teams have met in Houston with two other games in San Antonio, one in the Louisiana Superdome in New Orleans (played before over 40,000), and the last two meetings in the NCAA Tournament -- 2000 at Salt Lake City and 2006 in Atlanta.

Last Time In Houston - LSU 124, Texas 113 - Jan. 2, 1990 - Stars On Both Team Shine

The 1990 meeting at the old Houston Summit featured stars on both teams -- Shaquille O'Neal, Stanley Roberts and Chris Jackson for LSU; Joey Wright, Travis Mays and Lance Blanks for Texas -- and the game allowed the stars to shine as the game could have been mistaken for an NBA game at the pace the teams played during the course of the game ... Tigers Ranked Fifth Preseason in AP, Highest Preseason Rating Since 1991-92

The LSU men's basketball team received its second highest preseason ranking ever in the Associated Press poll when the media voted LSU No. 5 in the 2006-07 Top 25 announced earlier this month. LSU was ranked for the 11th time in the preseason AP poll and the first time since being ranked sixth in the 1991-92 preseason AP voting. The only time LSU was ranked higher in the preseason was

the 1989-90 season when the Tigers were ranked No. 2.

Tigers Move To 9th At Start of Week

LSU moved up a spot in both the Associated Press (media) and ESPN/USA Today (coaches) poll this past Monday after two wins the week before ... LSU moved to nine in the AP poll and 11th in the ESPN/USA Today poll ... LSU already has a win over the No. 6 team in the poll, Texas A&M, but obviously tonight's game will have a factor in where LSU will rank in the sixth poll of the season ... LSU was in the final five AP polls of last year and the first five this year ... The string of 10 straight polls is the longest for the Tigers since the early 1990s.

Some Rankings Numbers

LSU's win over No. 6 Texas A&M on Tuesday made the Tigers 4-9 against teams ranked No. 6 in the Associated Press poll ... LSU has a 20-5 record while playing as a No. 9-ranked team ... LSU is 243-85 when ranked in the Associated Press poll.

Davis Earns First-Team Preseason A-A Honors

LSU junior forward Glen Davis was named preseason All-American by the Associated Press Tuesday on a team that featured three Southeastern Conference players. Davis, a first-team Wooden All-American last season and a second-team AP All-American a year ago, joins Joakim Noah of Florida and Ronald Steele of Alabama in making first-team A-A. Tyler Hansbrough of North Carolina and Brandon Rush of Kansas round out the first five. Davis (who led the SEC in scoring and rebounding a year ago to earn Player of the Year honors), Noah and Steele are all juniors, while Hansbrough and Rush are sophomores. Hansbrough was named on 65 of the 72 media ballots, one more than Noah. Steele received 55 votes, while Davis had 51 and Rush 26. UCLA junior guard Arron Affalo was the next-leading vote getter with 20.

Since the AP preseason team started in 1986-87, Davis is just the third player from LSU to make the first five, joining Chris Jackson in 1989-90 and Shaquille O'Neal prior to the 1991-92 season. Ronald Dupree is the only other LSU player to have been mentioned on a ballot, prior to the 2001-02 season.

Davis Adds Naismith, Wooden Preseason Honors

Glen Davis added his place on the Naismith Preseason Watch List to his earlier nod by the Wooden Award committee of the Los Angeles Athletic Club. The Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, comprised of leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators, compiled the Top 50 list for the Naismith Trophy presented by Cingular Wireless. The board based its preseason criteria on player performances from last season and expectations for the 2006-07 season ... Of the 50 players including Davis, 10 are from the Southeastern Conference.

Temple On Bilas List Of Best Defenders

LSU sophomore Garrett Temple was one of several players on a season-opening list by ESPN analyst Jay Bilas noting the best defenders in the country at this time of the year ... Four other SEC players are on the list of 20 -- Corey Brewer, Florida; Joakim Noah, Florida; Ronald Steele, Alabama; and Mike Mercer, Georgia ... Temple earned his reputation as a defender with his effort limiting J. J. Redick of Duke in the Tigers' Sweet 16 upset.

It appears the reputation still holds after the A&M game as Temple held Aggie Acie Law to 1-of-11 shooting from the field and 0-of-5 from the three-point range.

Brady Third LSU Coach To Win Multiple SEC Titles

John Brady's second SEC championship in 2006 made him one of three LSU coaches to win SEC regular season honors and all three have multiple titles:

Harry Rabenhorst -- 1935, 1953, 1954

Dale Brown -- 1979, 1981, 1985, 1991

John Brady -- 2000, 2006

Brady In Elite Company

Brady's two SEC titles makes him one of just 15 coaches in SEC history to have won at least two SEC regular season titles joining Adolph Rupp (27), Joe Hall (8), Tubby Smith (5), Dale Brown and Babe McCarthy (4), Ray Mears, C. M. Newton and Harry Rabenhorst (3) and Brady, Billy Donovan, Eddie Fogler, Rick Pitino, Nolan Richardson, Ray Skinner and John Mayer (2).

As far as Western Division championships, only three coaches -- Tubby Smith (7), Rick Pitino and Nolan Richardson (4) have won more division titles than John Brady ... Billy Donovan is the other coach to have won three division titles.

Brady Now 24th On SEC All-Time Coaching List

John Brady enters the game with 172 career wins at LSU, 24th best in the history of the SEC in wins and the third highest win total of any of the active league coaches ... Brady with the A&M win moved past the namesake of Georgia's arena, former coach Harold Stegman (1920-31) ... Brady's win percentage of 60.6 puts him tied for 24th all-time among SEC coaches all-time in win percentage.

Big Man Has Web Site -- GlenBigBaby.com

The website www.glenbigbaby.com, designed to promote LSU basketball player Glen Davis of the men's team was launched this season by the LSU Athletics Department. The website, along with Bigsylv34.com for LSU women's player Sylvia Fowles, was created to promote the two for National Player of the Year honors as well as All-America honors. Davis, a 6-9 junior forward from Baton Rouge, was a first-team All-America selection and the Southeastern Conference Player of the Year last season and is a candidate for the John R. Wooden and Naismith Awards as well as being a preseason All-American by numerous publications. The site www.glenbigbaby.com features Davis' biography, honors, photos, videos, quotes about Davis and quotes from Davis, his career statistics and the 2006-07 Tigers' roster and schedule. The sites were designed by Peter Hoang and Jason Feirman of the LSU publication's office and will be maintained and updated throughout the season by the sports information department.

Glen Davis

Davis found his shooting touch again at the perfect time against A&M, hitting 9-of-14 from the field as he finished with 24 points and 10 rebounds ... Davis has scored no less than 15 points this season and three times has now pulled down double figure rebounds ... Davis has certainly seen the double teams which has made getting his shot more difficult, but he has been able to pass the ball around for buckets, averaging 2.5 assists per game ... For the season, Davis is hitting 53.3 percent from the field, 40-of-75.

The Baton Rouge junior has continued his string of consecutive double figure scoring games dating back to the final four games of his freshman season in 2005, each of the 36 games of the 2005-06 season and the first six games of 2006-07 to make the present string of 46 games ... He had his third double-double of the season against A&M (12/5) giving his 32 in his career ... The Davis double-doubles this year:

Vs. #24 Wichita State (11/25) -- 17 points, 13 rebounds

At Tulane (12/2) -- 20 points, 13 rebounds

Vs. #6 Texas A&M (12/5) -- 24 points, 10 rebounds

The A&M game marked the 20th time Davis has scored 20 or more points in his career.

Davis has started 71 consecutive games after coming off the bench in the first game of his freshman season ... In a year when three of the Associated Press first-team preseason All-Americans were from the SEC, Davis will be trying to post back-to-back player of the year honors in the league for the first time since Corliss Williamson of Arkansas was named player of the year in both 1994 and 1995 ... LSU's Pete Maravich was a three-time AP Player of the Year, while Chris Jackson was a consensus POY in 1989 and 1990 followed by Shaquille O'Neal in 1991 and 1992.

This season Davis is averaging 19.7 points per game and is second in the league in scoring, one of two SEC players averaging at least 19 points per game ... Davis' 9.8 rebounds a game average is second behind Jermareo Davidson (Alabama) and his league best average of 10.7 boards a game ... His field goal percentage of 53.3 is eighth in the conference ... One noticeable thing is the forward's free throw shooting where he is 37-of-52 for the season, 71.2 percent ... Only one game, against Wichita State when Davis was 3-of-6, has Davis' free-throw percentage been less than 66.7 percent ... In Davis' first two seasons, he was 69.8 percent at the line as a freshman and 67.6 as a sophomore.

Davis is also making moves on both the school career scoring, rebounding and blocks charts ... He presently stands 19th in rebounds, 26th in scoring and 8th in blocks in a career and those charts can be found on a later list box in the notes.

Brady Era Stats

Since the John Brady coaching era has reached the 10th season, the crack research team has gone back and compiled career numbers for the players in the Brady era. Here are some of the numbers:

When Glen Davis topped the 1,100 mark at the start of this season, he became the sixth Brady era player to score more than 1,100 points in his LSU career joining Ronald Dupree (1999-03), Darrel Mitchell (2002-06), Torris Bright (1999-03), Antonio Hudson (2001-05) and Collis Temple III (1999-03)

... Davis presently has the best career scoring average of any player in the Brady era at 16.6 a game ahead of Maurice Carter's 15.8 for the 54 games of his last two years in 1998 and 1999 ... In the A&M game, in just 72 games, Davis has moved to within two free throws made of Dupree's total of 329 made in 129 games ... Garrett Temple's 42-game minutes played average of 33.9 is second only to Brandon Bass' 34.2 average for his two years at LSU ... Tasmin Mitchell is third, averaging 33.8 minutes per game.

Dameon Mason

One of the toughest things for a transfer to do is to be ready and sharp when they step on the court for the first time after a year on the sidelines because of the NCAA transfer rules. But Dameon Mason, a lifetime for him removed from his last game in March 2005, has made a good impression on the fans as he has started all six games since transferring from Marquette.

Mason averaged a co-team high 15.5 points in the two exhibition games, hitting 12-of-17 field goal attempts while grabbing 12 rebounds with eight assists ... So far in the first six games, Mason has two games in double figures -- 10 against Louisiana-Monroe (11/19) and 12 at Tulane (12/2) ... He is averaging 8.3 points per game, 4.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game ... He is averaging 28.7 minutes per game ... Mason is 19-of-43 from the field, 5-of-11 from the arc and he has his treys in each of the last three games.

Tasmin Mitchell

Mitchell is proving to be a big factor for the Tigers, not only from the wing, but now down low as well as John Brady is allowing him to work from the post at times to allow Glen Davis the opportunity to move outside to the small forward ... That proved important in the second half of the Tulane game (12/2) and the Texas A&M game (12/5) with Darnell Lazare on the bench unable to play.

LSU fans are hopeful that Tasmin Mitchell has a breakout sophomore season and if his intensity and aggressiveness at practice is any indication, then this will be his year ... But then again, who is to say that his freshman year wasn't a breakout year ... The Denham Spring product averaged 11.4 points per game and 5.6 rebounds, making the SEC All-Freshman team while being selected to the freshman All-American team selected by Collegeinsider.com ... Of Mitchell's top 11 scoring games as a freshman, eight were against SEC schools, including all four of his career high of 20 points (Florida-SECT, Vanderbilt-SECT, at South Carolina and at Ole Miss ... Mitchell, after all those 20 points games, finally upped his career high to 21 against Louisiana-Monroe (11/19), hitting five treys as part of his 7-of-8 night from the floor ... Mitchell has started every game in his 42-game LSU career and he has 27 games scoring in double figures, 5-of-6 this year.

Mitchell played all 40 minutes against A&M, with 15 points and a season high of nine rebounds ... For the season, he is averaging 13.8 points per game, 7.2 rebounds and 2.3 assists ... His rebound average is good enough for 10th in the league and his three-point percentage of 57.1 (12-of-21) is third in the league.

Garrett Temple

Temple showed the hours of work this summer on his shooting may have paid off, as the week before this he upped his career high in both games ... After hitting for 16 in the opener, making 4-of-8 three-pointers, he followed it up with a 17-point performance (11/29) against McNeese and an 18-point effort against Tulane ... For the two games, Temple hit 13-of-25 field goal attempts, including 4-of-10 three-point attempts ... Temple had 10 assists, including a six assist, no turnover effort at the New Orleans Arena against the Wave.

So far in six games, Temple is close to halfway to the number of treys he made last year ... So far he is 12-of-33 (36.4 percent), while last year Temple hit 27 treys in 109 attempts in 36 games ... Temple is averaging 11.8 points per game with four double figure scoring games ... Also on the stat line is 3.3 rebounds and 3.8 assists per game with a ratio of 23 assists and just six turnovers, none in the last two games, both 40 minute efforts ... His average of 36.17 minutes per game ranks third in the SEC.

His father played, his older brother played and there was no doubt that Garrett has added to the Temple legacy with his first-year starting on the 2006 NCAA Final Four Tigers ... Temple scored an average of 5.1 points last year with 2.8 assists, startling 35 of the team's 36 games last year.

Darnell Lazare

The Tigers won against A&M Tuesday with Lazare on the sidelines, but he did work out for about half-an-hour prior to the pregame warm-ups of the teams and is expected to be able to dress in the Sunday game ... The senior has certainly done a good job for the Tigers as the primary occupant of the spot Tyrus Thomas left when the SEC Freshman of the Year moved on to the Chicago Bulls of the NBA.

Lazare has made 23-of-33 field goal attempts for LSU and 15-of-18 free throw attempts to average 12.2 points per game and 5.6 rebounds ... His shooting totals from the field have been fairly consistent

-- 4-of-6, 8-of-10, 4-of-7, 5-of-8 and before he collided with a Tulane player and had to leave the game Saturday, 2-of-2.

Lazare started the season opener for the third time in four years against Nicholls State (11/17) and recorded his first college double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds ... His 10 rebounds were all defensive boards ... Lazare his 4-of-6 field goal attempts and was part of LSU's impressive free-throw shooting, hitting 8-of-9 attempts ... He came right back against ULM and his 8-of-10 field goal attempts in scoring another 16 points in 25 minutes of play ... Against McNeese his 11 points made it his longest string of consecutive double figure scoring games at LSU ... He is averaging 13.5 points per game and 6.5 rebounds per game.

This will mark the second straight year that LSU has just one senior (Darrel Mitchell last year, Darnell Lazare this season).

Ben Voogd

Voogd took advantage of the opportunity that was presented him on against McNeese (11/29) and responded, coming off the bench to hit all four field goal attempts, including both trey shots and add two free throws for a career-high 12 points in 21 minutes of play against the Cowboys ... More importantly on the stat line were the six assists and no turnovers with two steals ... The Oregon sophomore's previous career high was five points in December 2005 against UNO ... Voogd is averaging 3.0 points per game, 2.5 assists and 1.3 rebounds, while averaging 12.3 minutes a contest ... He has only played nine minutes combined in the last two games as Tack Minor has made himself more of a factor on the floor for LSU.

Tack Minor

The road back for Tack Minor has been well documented from being unable to play the first semester last season to playing three games before an injury turned his year into a medical redshirt season ... Now he has been looking to find his niche in the LSU offense and adapt his style to that of the other point guards on LSU's team ... The theory of never knowing when the bell would ring certainly applied against Tulane (12/2) as Minor came in early in the second half as LSU went with a smaller lineup and he directed the Tiger comeback from 11 down in the first half ... He only scored two points, but it was an important jumper in the final minute that sealed the victory ... He played 22 minutes, most this season.

Against A&M Tuesday, Minor played 19 minutes off the bench, had a season high six points, hitting 2-of-4 field goals helping LSU in the strong second half with no turnovers in the 10 minutes he played in the final stanza ... For six games, he is averaging 3.0 points per game, 1.3 rebounds a game and 2.5 assists per game.

The Point Guards

One of the best set of numbers is when the number of assists for the point guards is higher than the combined number of turnovers and that so far is working well for the point guard trio of Temple, Voogd and Minor ... Temple (23-6), Voogd (15-5) and Minor (15-11) have combined for 53 assists and 21 turnovers ... Temple is second in the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio at 3.83 assists to turnover per game.

Never Know Who Might Lead In Assists

Five games in, there have been five different players lead the LSU team in assists ... Then in the sixth game against A&M, five different players tied for the lead in assists with two apiece:

Magnum Rolle

Rolle, despite battling a disc problem, got his first career start against the Aggies ... Rolle played 28 minutes, had one point and four rebounds ... The raw talent from the Bahamas is averaging 3.5 points and 5.3 rebounds with 1.2 blocks while averaging 16 minutes a game ... He has made 10-of-24 shots ... Last year, Rolle was effective late, sometimes in tandem with Lazare when Glen Davis and Tyrus Thomas were out of the game for rest or more importantly, when the pair got into four trouble ... In 17 minutes against Tulane (12/2), he had nine rebounds and hit 2-of-4 field goal attempts.

The Louisiana Streak At The PMAC

LSU now has won 63 straight regular season home games at the Maravich Center against Louisiana schools after the wins against Nicholls State, Louisiana-Monroe and McNeese ... The last loss at the Maravich Center to an in-state school was Dec. 6, 1988 when LSU lost to Louisiana Tech in overtime, 111-109 ... LSU has wins over the following schools in the streak (note--exhibition game wins over LSU-Shreveport and this year over Louisiana College do not count):

Interesting to note that the last state school to beat LSU in the Maravich Center, Louisiana Tech, will make its first appearance since that win on Dec. 23, the first meeting between the two schools since that 1988 game.

Tigers Still Trying to Find Consistency At Three-Point Line

It's been talked about ad nauseam in the preseason magazines whether LSU would be able to come up with consistent results from the three-point line ... How would LSU replace sharp shooting senior Darrel Mitchell as the three-point shooter. Would the Tigers be scared of the line? Would it suddenly trip them as they ran down the floor?

In six games, things have been up and down as in the first game against Nicholls (11/17) the Tigers hit 11 treys in 19 attempts, more than any single game made last year, the followed it up with 7-of-18 versus ULM (11/19) and LSU was just 2-of-9 against Wichita State (11/25) ... Last week was more of the same, as LSU was in double figures for the second time this season with 10 against McNeese, but hit only 3-of-11 on the tight rims of the New Orleans Arena against Tulane ... But while it looks inconsistent, when you total it all up, LSU is 37-of-89 for 41.6 percent, a strong overall percentage that is third in the SEC.

Rebounding

Rebounding was a strong suit for the 2005-06 LSU team, outrebounding 26 of 36 opponents a year ago with a 21-5 record ... Ironically in the eight games in which LSU was outrebounded, the Tigers were 6-2.

LSU has out rebounded all six teams this season, four times with a difference in double figures (+22 versus Nicholls State 11/17, +14 versus ULM 11/19, +14 at Tulane 12/2, +11 vs. A&M 12/5) ... Against Tulane, LSU had 16 offensive rebounds to just three for the Green Wave. Last year, LSU averaged 40.2 rebounds a game, compared to 32.4 a game by the opponents ... Five times last year the Tigers had 51 rebounds or more and only twice (both vs. Ole Miss, did the Tigers grab less than 30 boards ... Twice in the Brady era have the Tigers averaged 40 rebounds as a team - 2000 (40.4) and 2006 (40.2) ... So far, LSU is averaging 41.2 rebounds a game while opponents stand at 29.2 ... LSU's rebound margin of 12.0 is the best in the SEC.

Television Appearances

Last season, LSU was on television a school record 26 times and from the success last season has come one of the offshoots of that success ... LSU will be on television a minimum of 23 times this season ... Besides the five telecasts on regional sports channel CST, the Tigers will be featured five times on ESPN, five times on Fox Sports Net, twice on CBS and six times on the league's syndicated package through Lincoln Financial Sports ... The March 3 South Carolina game could be selected as a wild-card telecast on Lincoln Financial and all post-season games will be televised ... Last year, LSU was a strong 18-8 on television, and John Brady's television record is 73-66.

ESPN will debut its 2007 Saturday night prime time game of the week on Jan. 6 when Connecticut comes to the Maravich Assembly Center and with that will be the season debut of Saturday college bas-

The junior class which not only features Glen Davis, but now transfer Dameon Mason, is at 39.5 percent of LSU's point total.

It's Early, But Attendance Numbers Up

Topped by the best November-December paid attendance for a single game in the John Brady era this past Tuesday, the Tigers attendance through five home games is up over the same five games a year ago.

Tuesday night, LSU had a paid crowd of 12,053 against A&M, the largest single paid total for a men's game in the last 10 years in November or December, topping the mark of 11,260 paid when LSU knocked off No. 1-ranked Arizona on Dec. 21, 2002. The actual crowd Tuesday night of 9,274 ranks second over that time period to the actual crowd of 9,735 that watched LSU top the Wildcats in 2002. Tuesday's crowd included just over 2,300-students almost filling the student section of some 2,500 seats to capacity.

Through five games, LSU's average paid attendance is 9,579, compared with 7,771 for the first five home games of the 2005-06 season. LSU's actual numbers are up an average this season of close to 1,700 a game.

Tiger Have Exams Monday; Northwest On Their Minds In The Future

The Tigers will be flying back to Baton Rouge immediately after the end of tonight's game because

the Tiger players will have final exams starting on Monday morning ... LSU's sometime maligned three-point shooting showed plenty of spark as six players combined to hit 11 three-pointers as LSU won the home opener under John Brady for the 10th consecutive year ... The Tigers shot 58.5 percent from the field (31-of-53) and 11-of-19 from the three-point arc ... LSU, as in the exhibition games, continued its strong shooting at the free throw line, hitting 23-of-26 attempts ... LSU outrebounded the Colonels, 49-27 ... Glen Davis, Darnell Lazare and Garrett Temple all had 16 points for the Tigers, while Tasmin Mitchell had 14 ... Lazare had his first career double-double with 10 rebounds, while Temple's 16 points was a career high.

Game 2 -- LSU 88, Louisiana-Monroe 57 (November 19, 2006 -- Maravich Center)

LSU again had another strong night from the field, hitting 17-of-24 field goal attempts in the first half (70.8 percent) to build a 44-22 advantage en route to the second win of the season ... LSU would end up shooting 60 percent for the game (36-of-60), making seven three pointers ... Glen Davis scored 17 second half points in a 26-point night, while Tasmin Mitchell hit five treys in a career-high 21-point game ... Darnell Lazare had his second straight 16-point night to open the season, while Dameon Mason added 10 to get his first double-figure scoring game at LSU ... LSU had 26 assists for its 36 field goals and out rebounded the Warhawks, 42-28.

Game 3 -- #24 Wichita State 57, #6 LSU 53 (Nov. 25, 2006 -- Maravich Center)

LSU's 11-game home winning streak went by the boards as the Tigers couldn't find the offense to sustain the defense effort against the Shockers ... LSU shot just 8-of-24 from the field in the second half, 1-of-5 from the arc and just 7-of-13 from the free throw line as LSU lost a six-point halftime lead and the advantage they had the whole game ... Wichita State took the lead in the final two minutes and LSU never could get back even ... Glen Davis had his 30th career double double, first of the year with 17 points and 13 rebounds, while Darnell Lazare was the only other player in double figures with 11 ... Five player, including two reserves, for Wichita scored 54 of their 57 points.

Game 4 -- LSU 91, McNeese State 57 (November 30, 2006 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

The Tigers got their offense back in gear and was able to go with several different combinations in downing the Cowboys for LSU's 63rd straight win against Louisiana opposition in games played at the Maravich Center ... Five players were in double figures led by Garrett Temple with his second career high of the season, this time 17 points ... Tasmin Mitchell, hitting 7-of-11 field goals, had 16 points, Glen Davis 15, Ben Voogd a career high 12 and Darnell Lazare 11 ... Voogd, whose previous high last year was five, hit all four of his field goal attempts, including two treys and had six assists and no turnovers in 21 minutes ... LSU shot 52.5 percent from the floor (32-of-61) and for the second time this year posted a double figure makes number for the three-point arc (10-of-19).

Game 5 -- LSU 74, Tulane 67 (December 2, 2006 -- New Orleans, La.)

The Tigers were sluggish offensively and allowed an inspired Tulane team to get out to an 11-point advantage with three minutes to go in the first half before coming back to defeat the Wave at the New Orleans Arena ... LSU went on a 15-0 run in the second half taking a six point deficit into a nine-point lead that the Tigers never surrendered ... LSU outrebounded the Wave, 43-29, with a 16-3 advantage on the offensive boards ... Glen Davis had his second double-double of the year with 20 points and 13 rebounds, while Garrett Temple had a career high for the second game in a row, this time with 18 points ... Dameon Mason added 12 and Tasmin Mitchell 11 ... LSU shot just 40.3 percent from the floor (25-of-62), but made 21-of-28 free throws.
