John Brady

Head Coach • 10th Year

When John Brady first put a team on the floor of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, his Tiger squad was undermanned, undersized and underdogs.

Teams hated to play the Tigers then because John Brady coached his team hard and they responded with several strong performances against the leagues top teams, but not many wins.

Now entering his 10th year as the head coach at LSU, John Brady has coached the LSU team as only he knows how -- with heart and passion, and knowledge of the game that makes him one of the best at in-game decisions. The LSU Tigers, in 2006, won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record and won the Western Division for the second straight year. LSU has won 26 SEC games the last two years, the most in the league in that period and LSU concluded the 2005-06 season with 17 straight SEC home wins, the most in the 35-year history of the Maravich Assembly Center. In the process Brady was recognized for his coaching job for the second time as the SEC Coach of the Year.

LSU has advanced to postseason play each of the last five years and six times in the last seven seasons. LSU has had five consecutive winning seasons under John Brady and only three times in the program history has there been longer consecutive years of winning.

In the last seven seasons, LSU has won 141 games, an average of 20 a year.

Three times John Brady has coached the SEC Player of the Year (Glen Davis-2006, Brandon Bass-2005, Stromile Swift-2000) and he has coached four SEC Freshman of the Year (Tyrus Thomas-2006, Glen Davis-2005, Brandon Bass-2004, Torris Bright-2000).

Brady's 167 wins in nine seasons is the third most wins by an LSU basketball coach and only two LSU basketball coaches have served longer tenures.

John Brady has built a program at LSU with a record of success that is hard to argue with. He has given the LSU program the direction to grow and the chance to shine again.

When Brady arrived on campus in March 1997 and was given the job of rebuilding the pro-

gram, make no mistake; he knew his program would be riddled with shortcomings because of NCAA-imposed sanctions. He knew he would have the chance to build a foundation based on responsibility and accountability.

Brady's knowledge of the game and his belief in discipline and responsibility for actions on and off the floor have made the LSU program strong again, one that LSU fans are proud of because they feel a part of the program.

Brady's plan isn't just taking place on a hardwood floor in the Maravich Center. He has worked hard to show the public that that athletic and academic pursuits of the players should be challenged to the fullest. That's part of the reason that LSU basketball is not only a success on the court, but in the classroom as well. Hours are passed and posted toward graduation on a regular basis by scholarship players.

The team, despite missing nearly four weeks of school during the SEC and NCAA Final Four run, averaged a 3.01 GPA during the spring semester.

Brady came to LSU after six highly successful seasons at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala.

In his six-year tenure (1992-97), he turned the team into a consistent winner, posting a record of 89-77. In Brady's six years at Samford, the team had three first-team and five second-team all-league selections.

Now at LSU, the numbers are beginning to work for Brady both on and off the floor, with 15 players earning All-SEC honors, 32 earning All-SEC academic honors and 15 who have received their degrees from LSU.

The 52-year-old Brady is the father of two daughters (Brittany-16, Brooke-12) and is married to the former Misty Champagne.

The LSU program is now solid both athletically and academically. The top players in the country are seriously putting LSU at the top of their lists and Brady is earning the respect of his peers throughout the nation. The plan to bring LSU back to being a constant player at the top of the SEC and the nation has been accomplished and now the work is being done to keep LSU there for years to come.

Strong Starts ...

LSU has turned that around the last four games, hitting 60-plus percent at home against Alabama (1/28) and at Mississippi State (2/3) before coming out with good 40 percent first halves against Tennessee (2/6) and Arkansas (2/10).

End Game Hurt Tigers Three Times

In the three of LSU's SEC losses, the Tigers had chances to win with the lead, but couldn't do enough to finish the deal ... At Georgia (1/24), LSU led the game, 54-52, on a Darnell Lazare layup with 4:59 to play ... LSU would lose the game, 57-54, on a three-pointer with 0.6 to play ... In between the LSU layup and the Georgia three pointers the Tigers had two missed shots sandwiched around three turnovers.

Against Alabama (1/28), the Tigers led 68-63 with 4:34 to play ... LSU would lose the game 73-70 ... LSU finished the game 1-of-6 from the field with three turnovers ... Alabama would convert on five of six possessions during the same period to get the lead with 6-of-6 shooting at the free throw line as part of the situation.

At State (2/3), the Tigers were unable to keep pace with the barrage of threes by Mississippi State. Up 62-61 with 9:20 to play, Mississippi State took the lead for good, 63-62, at the 7:54 mark as LSU was outscored, 24-16, the rest of the way, including an early run of 18-7 that gave State a double digit lead entering the final 52 seconds.

Tigers Finished The Deal Versus Hogs

Against Arkansas (2/10), LSU built a 10-point second half lead, 52-42, against the Hogs with 9:34 to go and led 59-54 with 4:55 to play ... Arkansas would use three three-point field goals to take an eventual 63-61 lead with 2:30 to play, but a Tasmin Mitchell layup with 2:06 tied the game and on LSU's next possession, Glen Davis collected three offensive boards before scoring and getting fouled underneath to put LSU up 66-63 (42 seconds) ... On Arkansas' next possession, Garrett Temple stole the ball at mid court and drove in for a dunk to give LSU a lead it would not lose, 68-63, with 29 seconds to play en route to the 71-67 decision.

The Points Good of Late Offensively

The Tigers finally got the points on its side of the ledger back on the right track, scoring 70 against Alabama (1/28), 78 at Mississippi State (2/3) and 67 at Tennessee (2/6) and Arkansas (2/10) after scoring under 60 in the three previous SEC contests ... The last time LSU scored under 60 in three consecutive SEC games was when the Tigers scored under 60 in the final four games of the 2001-02 season ... LSU is 0-4 this year scoring under 60 and 10-53 in the Brady era when scoring under 60.

But Defensively...

But the defensive points have been some problem for LSU ... After keeping games close by keeping opponents from scoring over 60, the Tigers have given up 70 points or more seven times this year (LSU 0-7) and LSU is 26-70 when giving up more than 70 in the John Brady era.

The Season's Not Over

In a year when the West is so crazy from top to bottom, LSU's 3-7 record doesn't mean the season is over even at this point. All one has to do is look at recent history to see what still remains a possibility for the Tigers.

During the 2002-03 season, LSU had a five-game losing streak (the last time it happened to LSU before the present streak) that put LSU at 1-6 in the league after seven games ... LSU was 2-6 at the halfway point and 3-8 after a Feb. 15 loss at Kentucky ... LSU won its final five games of the season to finish at 8-8, 21-11 overall and go to the NCAA Tournament ... Here's what the West teams face in the final three weeks:

LSU Quick Notes From The Games This Season

LSU has out rebounded the last three teams by a combined 28 boards -- 10 at Mississippi State (2/3), nine at Tennessee (2/6), nine vs. Arkansas (2/10) ... The Arkansas game (2/10) marked the second time Glen Davis had at least nine offensive boards in a game (Florida last season was the other)

and he is the first player since Shaquille O'Neal in 1992 to record it for the Tigers ... LSU had 17 assists at Tennessee for its 22 made buckets.

The 85 points Mississippi State scored was the most in a conference game allowed by LSU since giving up 89 in an 89-58 loss in Lexington to Kentucky on Jan. 22, 2005 ... The game marked the first time in 13 games this year LSU has lost when out shooting the opponent (53.4% to 50.9%) and just the 28th time in 178 games in the Brady era when LSU has lost when having a better percentage than the opposition.

LSU's 9-of-9 at the free throw line against Alabama (1/31) marked the first time LSU had been 100 percent from the stripe since making 17-of-17 against Kentucky on Feb. 29, 2004 ... LSU had the lead at the half against Alabama (1/31), marking the third time this year that LSU has lost with a halftime lead ... LSU is 145-24 under John Brady with a halftime advantage ... LSU in the last two games (Alabama-Mississippi State) has had a lead with 10 minutes to play, just the third and fourth time that LSU has lost a game with a lead with 10 minutes to play this year (13-4) and it is now just 22 times in 175 games that LSU has lost in the Brady era with a lead entering the final 10 minutes ... The lineup change against Alabama was the fifth different lineup fielded by the Tigers this year.

LSU never had the lead in the Vanderbilt game (1/24) ... Against Ole Miss (1/17), Garrett Temple equaled his career high in assists for the third time with seven ... Against Auburn (1/13), he became the second player this season to record four blocks in a game ... The win over Connecticut (1/6) marked the third time that Coach Brady has defeated a Hall of Fame coach, this time Jim Calhoun ... Brady's teams also have wins over Duke under Coach Mike Krzyzewski (last year in the NCAA Tournament) and two wins over Lute Olson at Arizona (2000, 2002) ... The 49 points by UConn was the fewest points scored in a game since a 46-40 win against Villanova in 2002 and the fewest points scored against a non-conference opponent since a 49-48 loss to Hartford on Dec. 29, 1986. Playing three straight nights for the first time since November 2001 in the HCF Classic (12/27-29), the Tigers were amazingly consistent in their field goal shooting: Vs. Wright State -- 28-of-50 -- 56.0%; Vs. Miss. Valley -- 35-of-62 -- 56.5%; Vs. Samford -- 24-of-43 -- 55.8% ... With LSU scoring 92 against Mississippi Valley State (12/28), the Tigers are 28-0 in the Brady era when scoring 90 or more points and 67-2 when scoring 80 or more.

Washington's 8-of-13 three-pointers made the Huskies (12/20) the first team to shoot 60 percent from the three-point line (61.5 percent) since the University of New Orleans pulled the same numbers (8-of-13) in a 2004 game ... While Oregon State (12/17) made 11-of-21 threes against the Tigers, the Beavers were just 8-of-37 from inside the arc ... Davis' fourth consecutive 20-point game against OSU (12/17) made for the longest string of consecutive 20-point games since Jaime Lloreda did it in four games in the final game of the 2004 season and the first three games of the 2005 season ... Glen Davis played all 45 minutes against the Longhorns (12/10) and that is a high in minutes for his LSU career ... Previously he played 42 in overtime win at West Virginia in 2005.

The Tigers have made 73 more field goals than the opponents ... LSU opponents have made six more three-point field goals than opponents (141-147) ... The 2002-03 season was the last year LSU made more three-pointers in a season than the opponents ... The Tigers have made more free throws than the opponents in every year of the John Brady era.

The Pete Maravich Assembly Center

This is the 36th season of play in the building and LSU is now 412-138 (74.9 percent) overall in the building and 199-108 in SEC contests (64.8 percent) ... LSU is 12-3 at home this year ... This will mark the 18th time in the 36-year history of the building that the team has won at least 12 home games, including six straight years and eight-of-the-last-nine.

Tigers Fall Out Of National Polls After 17 Straight In Late January

The men's basketball season started the season with its second highest preseason ranking ever in the Associated Press media poll when the Tigers were picked No. 5 ... On Jan. 29, LSU fell out of the national polls after being ranked for 12 straight polls this year and 17 total dating back to the final five polls of the 2005-06 season ... This streak was the longest consecutive week string since the Tigers were in 38 straight polls from the preseason poll in the 1989-90 season through the first two polls of the 1991-92 season ... LSU is 252-91 when ranked in the Associated Press poll ... The Tigers are 2-4 this year against Top 25 teams in the AP poll (2-3 at home, losing to No. 24 Wichita State, beating No. 6 A&M and No. 18 Connecticut and losing to No. 19 Alabama; 0-2 on the road, losing at No. 17 Washington and No. 14 Alabama).

Tigers Trying to Keep Attendance Averages Moving Forward

LSU's 66-49 victory over the 18th-ranked Connecticut Huskies (1/6) drew a paid total of 13,121 putting the game seventh best in the John Brady era and the second largest paid attendance since the building was configured to its present capacity of 13,215 for men's basketball prior to the 2005-06 season. Last season, LSU drew 13,468 paid for the LSU-Georgia game ... The top four paid attendances of the Brady era came in the 2000 season and many of the Top 20 for the 36-year history of the building occurred when the capacity of the building was over 14,000.

The actual scanner attendance of 12,023 was also the sixth best regular season actual attendance for an LSU home game in the Brady era and the second best in the Brady era for a non-conference regular season game behind the 13,488 who saw the LSU-Arizona game in 2000 in a bigger configured arena.

In December, the 12,053 paid crowd for the Texas A&M game (12/5) was the largest November-December attendance for a basketball game in the John Brady era at the Maravich Assembly Center.

LSU has a paid average of 9,889 with three home Southeastern Conference games remaining, an increase of 480 from the final number of a year ago ... The Tigers are trying to improve their paid attendance average for the sixth consecutive year. LSU's paid attendance average was 8,106 in 2001 and last year's final total was 9,409.

Davis Honors

LSU junior forward Glen Davis was named preseason All-American by the Associated Press on a

team that featured three Southeastern Conference players. Davis, a first-team Wooden All-American last season and a second-team AP All-American a year ago, joins Joakim Noah of Florida and Ronald Steele of Alabama in making first-team A-A. Tyler Hansbrough of North Carolina and Brandon Rush of Kansas round out the first five. Davis (who led the SEC in scoring and rebounding a year ago to earn Player of the Year honors), Noah and Steele are all juniors, while Hansbrough and Rush are sophomores. Hansbrough was named on 65 of the 72 media ballots, one more than Noah. Steele received 55 votes, while Davis had 51 and Rush 26. UCLA junior guard Arron Affalo was the next-leading vote getter with 20.

Since the AP preseason team started in 1986-87, Davis is just the third player from LSU to make the first five, joining Chris Jackson in 1989-90 and Shaquille O'Neal prior to the 1991-92 season. Ronald Dupree is the only other LSU player to have been mentioned on a ballot, prior to the 2001-02 season. Davis also made the first cut for the Wooden Award and All-American team as presented by the Los Angeles Athletic Club ... Davis is the only one on the final 30 who was named a Wooden All-American squad member a season ago.

Temple On Bilas List Of Best Defenders

LSU sophomore Garrett Temple was one of several players on a season-opening list by ESPN analyst Jay Bilas noting the best defenders in the country at this time of the year ... Four other SEC players were on the list of 20 -- Corey Brewer, Florida; Joakim Noah, Florida; Ronald Steele, Alabama; and Mike Mercer, Georgia ... Temple earned his reputation as a defender with his effort limiting J. J. Redick of Duke in the Tigers' Sweet 16 upset.

Brady Coached 300th LSU Game Against State

Coach John Brady coached his 300th game as the LSU head basketball coach in Starkville against Mississippi State (2/3) ... Brady has the third longest tenure of any LSU coach (10 years) and only Harry Rabenhorst (29 years, 604 games) and Dale Brown (25 years, 749 games) had longer tenures in Baton Rouge ... All three won multiple SEC titles at LSU and took at least one team to the NCAA Final Four:

Harry Rabenhorst -- SEC Titles: 1935, 1953, 1954; NCAA Final Four: 1953
Dale Brown -- SEC Titles: 1979, 1981, 1985, 1991; NCAA Final Four: 1981, 1986

Brady In Elite Company

Brady's two SEC titles makes him one of just 15 coaches in SEC history to have won at least two SEC regular season titles joining Adolph Rupp (27), Joe Hall (8), Tubby Smith (5), Dale Brown and Babe McCarthy (4), Ray Mears, C. M. Newton and Harry Rabenhorst (3) and Brady, Billy Donovan, Eddie Fogler, Rick Pitino, Nolan Richardson, Ray Skinner and John Mayer (2).

As far as Western Division championships, only three coaches -- Tubby Smith (7), Rick Pitino and Nolan Richardson (4) have won more division titles than John Brady ... Billy Donovan is the other coach to have won three division titles.

Brady Now 23rd on SEC All-Time Coaching List

John Brady enters the game with 181 career wins at LSU, 23rd best in the history of the SEC in wins and the third highest win total of any of the active league coaches ... Brady with the Louisiana Tech win (12/23) moved past longtime Auburn Coach Sonny Smith into solo 23rd spot ... Brady needs five more wins to match another more recent Auburn coach, Cliff Ellis, at 22nd at 186 wins ... Only Tubby Smith (UGA, UK) and Billy Donovan (UF) are the active SEC coaches with more victories.

Glen Davis

Davis came up big in the second half against Arkansas with his 13th double double of the year as he had 19 points and 18 rebounds ... The 18 rebounds equaled his career high for boards, ironically set against Arkansas when he was a freshman in 2005.

The game came after Tennessee (2/6) held him to one of his lowest scoring total at LSU, five points and the Tennessee game was sandwiched between the Arkansas game and the Mississippi State (2/3) in which he was one off his career high with 27 points, hitting 10-of-16 field goals and three treys ... The Tennessee game marked just the second time since the start of his sophomore season that he has failed to score in double figures, a span of 59 games.

Davis is hitting 153-of-318 field goals or 48.1 percent, seventh best in the SEC ... Davis has been successful passing the ball out from double teams to set up baskets, averaging 2.4 assists per game.

One of his best games since the first of the year came under extenuating circumstances when he doubled up at Alabama (1/9) with 24 points and 17 rebounds ... The game came just two days after a two-car automobile accident in which someone hit Davis' car trying to make a left turn in front of the LSU

junior, leaving him in the hospital for a few hours undergoing X-rays and a CAT scan ... X-rays proved negative, but he had extremely sore ribs that forced him to wince with each substantial contact ... Davis played 39 minutes his stat line also showed three blocks and a 9-of-16 night from the field with a 5-of-5 effort at the free throw line.

Davis had been tied with Joakim Noah for the best single game rebound total in the league this year with his 17 versus Alabama (1/9), but now he is alone at the top of the league rebound superlatives with his 18 versus Arkansas (2/10).

The double double vs. Arkansas (2/10) gives him an SEC leading 13 double doubles this season (Davis and Dwayne Curtis of Ole Miss are tied with five each in league play):

Davis is trying to become the first player to win back-to-back league rebound totals since Erwin Dudley of Alabama won the league rebounding title three times in 2001-02-03 ... Jaime Lloreda in 2004 was the last LSU player to average double figures in both points and rebounds and before that you have to go back to 1993 and Geert Hammink to have done it for the Tigers.

Davis has had 42 double doubles in his career and the State game (2/3) marked the 27th time Davis has scored 20 or more points in his career and the eighth time this season.

In the league, Davis is averaging 15.8 points per game (seventh best) and a league games only 11.0 rebounds (best in the SEC) ... Davis is also working on a long consecutive game starting streak which started the second game of his career ... Coach John Brady brought him off the bench in his career opener, but he has been called from the bench by the PA announcer for the last 89 games.

Davis is one of just five players in LSU history to block 100 career shots joining Shaquille O'Neal, Stromile Swift, Brandon Bass and Jose Vargas ... He is presently third all-time behind only O'Neal (412) and Swift (130) with 107 career blocks.

Davis, tied for 12th in the league in free throw percentage at 71.0 percent (110-of-155, minimum 2.5 made per game), is fifth in free throw makes in LSU history with 400 ... Davis is averaging 35.46 minutes per game, third best in the SEC ... Davis also is the league leader in offensive rebounds at 4.00 per game, after his 10 on Saturday against Arkansas, including three in one possession that led to a three-point play in the final minute.

Davis At 1,500 Career Points; 30 More For 900 Career Rebounds

Glen Davis is halfway to getting to 1,500 career points and 900 rebounds at LSU ... His 19 points against Arkansas (2/10) put him over the 1,500 point mark with 1,505, 14th best all-time at LSU ... He is three points shy of 13th best Leonard Mitchell (1980-84) and eight points shy of 12th best Vernel Singleton (1988-92) ... He is on pace to finish the season with over 1,600 points which would put him at least ninth on the school scoring list.

His 18 rebounds put him at 870, tied for seventh all-time with Ned Clark (1952-55) and 30 boards shy of 900 career rebounds ... He is on pace to finish the season with over 940 rebounds, fifth best at LSU ... There have been just five players in LSU history to reach the 1,500 points-900 rebounds plateau:

Durand Macklin -- 1977-81 -- 2,080 points -- 1,276 rebounds
Shaquille O'Neal -- 1990-92 -- 1,941 points -- 1,217 rebounds
Bob Pettit -- 1952-94 -- 1,916 points -- 1,039 rebounds
Ronald Dupree -- 2000-03 -- 1,726 points -- 907 rebounds
Leonard Mitchell -- 1981-84 -- 1,508 points -- 922 rebounds

Once Davis hits 1,500-900, he will join Shaquille O'Neal as the only two LSU players to have 1,500 points, 900 rebounds and 100 blocks in their LSU careers.

Chris Johnson

LSU Coach John Brady said he would play against Alabama (1/31), but Johnson got more than playing time, he got his first collegiate start ... He responded by playing 18 minutes, hitting four-of-eight field goal attempts, all four free throws and had three blocks in a 13 point performance ... It was the first double figure game of his career, topping his previous high of nine in eight minutes in the season opener at Nicholls State.

Johnson also started the next game, playing a career high 24 minutes at Mississippi State (2/3) where he scored four points with a career best seven boards and two more blocks.

Johnson came off the bench to play seven minutes at Tennessee (2/6) and after getting nine points in the Arkansas win (2/10), the sophomore is now averaging 3.8 points and 1.8 rebounds for the season ... In the last four games, however, the sophomore has played 66 minutes, scoring 29 points on 11-of-23 shooting, including two three pointers with 13 boards and seven blocked shots ... Last year, Johnson played 43 minutes, scoring 13 points.

Terry Martin

Martin has posted three consecutive double figure scoring games, getting 13 against Arkansas (2/10), hitting three treys for the second straight game and staying on the court for the longest time in his LSU career, 37 minutes ... This game followed the game at Tennessee (2/6) where he came off the bench and scored 15 points on 4-of-8 field goal shooting, including 3-of-6 from the arc.

The transfer from Texas Tech moved into the starting lineup for the first time against Auburn (1/13) ... In that first start for LSU against Auburn, Martin in 34 minutes made 8-of-16 field goals and five three-pointers for the second time in a 23-point effort ... Martin had another solid effort against Ole Miss (1/17), hitting 4-of-7 from the arc as part of a 15-point night ... In his first three LSU starts, he made 16-of-39 field goals, including 12-of-25 three-pointers.

Against Mississippi State (2/3), Martin hit 6-of-11 field goals, including two treys to finish with 14 points and five rebounds ... Martin has 11 double figure scoring games in the 16 games he has played since becoming eligible prior to the Dec. 20 Washington game.

Martin averages 11.1 points per game, 2.4 rebounds and 1.1 assists per game ... Martin is hitting 40-of-88 three-pointers, 45.5 percent for the season ... Martin is hitting 43.1 percent of his threes in conference games (25-of-58), fifth in the league.

Martin, a 6-6 guard who will have two and a half years of eligibility remaining for the Tigers, played 14 games as a freshman at Texas Tech in the fall of 2005, starting eight before moving back to his home state ... Martin averaged 7.4 points per game, 3.6 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game, playing an average of 24.7 minutes for the Red Raiders ... Martin made 38 percent of his three-point attempts (16-of-42) and had six double figure scoring games.

Dameon Mason

Mason made a one-game return to the starting lineup at Tennessee (2/6), playing 14 minutes, scoring three points ... Mason came off the bench against Vanderbilt (1/24) and played his most minutes (25) since the HCF Classic (12/27-29) and did some good things to help the Tigers in the second half get back in the contest ... Mason had six points with five rebounds, two assists, a block and three steals.

Mason's best games probably came on the three nights of the HCF Classic (12/27-29) and he certainly looked to be over the effects of the migraine headaches he suffered just prior to and during the Tigers' trip to the Pacific Northwest.

Against Wright State (12/27), Mason hit 5-of-7 field goal attempts, including both three-point attempts in 24 minutes with a career high 14 points ... The next night against Mississippi Valley (12/28), Mason came back to his 4-of-6 field goals for 13 points and concluded the tournament, hitting 5-of-6 against Samford (12/29) to finish with 11 points ... For the three games, Mason was 14-of-19 from the

Mason failed to score in the game with Arkansas (1/20), the first time this year he did not tally ... Mason started 14 games and is averaging 5.9 points per game, 3.0 rebounds per game and 1.0 assists per game ... The junior came to LSU after transferring from Marquette ... Martin has had five double-figure games this season.

Tasmin Mitchell

Mitchell came up big at Tennessee (2/6), playing 39 minutes and equaling his career high of 23, hitting 7-of-13 field goals with two treys and 7-of-9 free throws ... Mitchell has been in double figures 19 times in the 24-game season and in the last four games (all in double figures), Mitchell has made 25-of-44 field goals ... He had 16 on 7-of-11 shooting with a career high three blocks against Arkansas (2/10).

Mitchell is proving to be a big factor for the Tigers as he is making his sophomore season the breakout season that LSU fans were hopeful of ... The Denham Spring product averaged 11.4 points per game and 5.6 rebounds, making the SEC All-Freshman team while being selected to the freshman All-American team selected by Collegeinsider.com.

Mitchell had his third double double of the year against Ole Miss (1/17), scoring 19 points with 10 boards in 36 minutes of play ... He has had five career double doubles.

Mitchell had four games as a freshman of 20 points and upped his career high to 21 in the second game of the year against Louisiana-Monroe (11/19), hitting five treys as part of his 7-of-8 night from the floor ... His other career high game of 23 came in the Texas game (12/10), hitting 9-of-18 field goals, including 3-of-7 three-pointers as well as grabbing 10 rebounds ... Against Washington (12/20), Mitchell posted 20 markers, hitting 8-of-17 field goal attempts ... More importantly, he had three assists and no turnovers on his 34-minute stat line ... When he scored the 23 against Texas, he had just one turnover with six assists in 44 minutes.

He got the SEC season off to a good start scoring 19 points against the Crimson Tide (1/9) ... Mitchell has started every game in his 60-game LSU career and he has 42 games scoring in double figures ... For the season, he is averaging 14.1 points per game, 6.0 rebounds and 1.9 assists ... His three-point percentage is 37.2 percent (29-of-78) ... His scoring average is ranked tied for 16th in the league, while he is tied for 11th in rebound average ... His overall field goal percentage of 46.4 percent (127-of-274) is ninth in the SEC and his minutes played average of 33.38 is ranked eighth most in the SEC.

Garrett Temple

Temple had his best game since mid-December at Mississippi State (2/3) with 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting with five assists and two steals in 34 minutes ... It was his best shooting game of the season and first over 50 percent since the fourth game of the season.

The sophomore who has drawn praise for his defensive play, early in the season was earning props for his scoring ability, but as his scoring has lessened in the last few weeks, he is earning notice for his assist work in several games this season.

Temple's game was his third double figure scoring game since Dec. 17 (ninth of the year), but in that same time period has posted five games of seven assists (including against Tennessee (2/6), six assist game against Alabama (1/31) and the five assists against State ... For the season, Temple is averaging 4.2 assists per game, ninth best in the league ... He is eighth in the league in SEC games at 4.50.

He had career highs in three of the first four games of the season, hitting 16 in the opener, making 4-of-8 three-pointers, and followed it up with a 17-point performance (11/29) against McNeese and an 18-point effort against Tulane (12/2).

Temple hopes to recapture the shooting touch that had him hit 19 treys in the first eight games, but only 12 since then, but his 12th was a big one that gave LSU the opportunity to stay with the Razorbacks late in the game and eventually get the win ... Temple is 7-of-36 in the 10 SEC games from the arc ... For the year, Temple is now averaging 8.9 points per game and 3.2 rebounds a game ... Temple has 100 assists and 56 turnovers this season, an assist to turnover ratio of 1.8 ... He is the seventh Tiger in the last eight seasons to record 100 assists.

Although, the Tiger coaching staff has been able to get him to the bench a little more, Temple is still again this year one of the workhorses for LSU in minutes played, averaging 33.79, fifth in the league ... Only Glen Davis (35.43) has averaged more minutes this year for LSU ... Earlier this year against Tulane, Texas A&M, Texas and Oregon State Temple played a combined 165-of-165 available minutes.

His father played (as the first African-American basketball player at LSU), his older brother played and there was no doubt that Garrett has added to the Temple legacy with his first-year starting on the 2006 NCAA Final Four Tigers ... Last season as a freshman, Temple averaged 5.1 points with 2.8 assists, starting 35 of the team's 36 games.

Temple's Dad To Be SEC Legend

Garrett Temple's dad, Collis Temple, Jr., will be LSU's representative as the Legend for the 2007 SEC Tournament in Atlanta, this March ... Temple, whose sons Collis III and Garrett, have both followed him as LSU basketball players, was the first African-American basketball player at LSU ... He was signed by Press Maravich and played for both Maravich and Dale Brown in the 1970s, earning All-SEC honors in 1974 and presently stands 23rd all-time on the school's rebound list with 607 rebounds in three years, including a 10.5 rebound average in 1974 ... Temple III Takes Televised "Horse" Game On Inside LSU Basketball

Two Sundays ago on "Inside LSU Basketball," the weekly men's basketball coaches' show, executive producer Kevin Wagner sat down for a three-way conversation with the Temples: Collis, Jr., Collis III and present player Garrett. Somewhere in the conversation, it came up that the elder Temple said his sons would never beat him in golf or in a game of "Horse."

Well, a basketball was bounced out there and on last Sunday night's show, the game was on between the three Temples ... The elder Temple was first out and Collis III ended up eliminating Garrett in this made-for-television event.

Darnell Lazare

Darnell Lazare has never been a big scorer for LSU, but when he does shoot, he is usually very accurate ... Against both Georgia (1/28) and Alabama (1/31), he hit 3-of-4 attempts for six points in each game and for the season he is 57-of-101 from the field (56.4 percent) ... He is averaging 6.2 points per game and 4.0 rebounds.

Lazare returned to the starting lineup for the first time since the Georgia game (1/28) and played 25 minutes with seven points, his best point total since scoring eight against Ole Miss (1/17).

Lazare started the season opener for the third time in four years against Nicholls State (11/17) and recorded his first college double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds ... His 10 rebounds were all defensive boards ... Lazare hit 4-of-6 field goal attempts and was part of LSU's impressive free-throw shooting, hitting 8-of-9 attempts ... He came right back against ULM and his 8-of-10 field goal attempts in scoring another 16 points in 25 minutes of play ... Against McNeese, his 11 points made it his longest string of consecutive double figure scoring games at LSU.

This marks the second straight year that LSU has just one senior (Darrel Mitchell last year, Darnell Lazare this season).

Ben Voogd

After playing just three minutes in the first four SEC games, Ben Voogd has played double figure minutes in five of the last six games and playing with a new-found confidence ... Against Vanderbilt (1/24), Voogd played 27 minutes, best of the year, with three points, four rebounds, three assists, no turnovers and a steal ... Voogd played 11 minutes against Alabama (1/31), 14 at Mississippi State (2/3), 13 at Tennessee (2/6) and 15 versus Arkansas (2/10) ... In the last four games he has scored 11 points, hitting 5-of-10 field goals with 13 assists.

The sophomore returned to his home state for the opening of the two-game Pacific Northwest road swing against Oregon State (12/20) and with nearly 100 friends and family members looking on, Voogd hit a three-pointer and had two rebounds, an assist and two steals in 11 minutes ... He failed to score against Washington, but didn't turn the ball over in 10 minutes ... His increased playing time continued against Louisiana Tech (12/23) as he played 17 minutes with two assists.

Voogd took advantage of the opportunity that was presented him on against McNeese (11/29) and responded, coming off the bench to hit all four field goal attempts, including both trey shots and add two free throws for a career-high 12 points in 21 minutes of play against the Cowboys ... More importantly on the stat line were the six assists and no turnovers with two steals ... The Oregon sophomore's previous career high was five points in December 2005 against UNO ... Voogd is averaging 1.8 points per game, 2.0 assists and 1.2 rebounds, while averaging 12 minutes a contest.

Magnum Rolle

Rolle had his career high of nine points, hitting all three field goal attempts and all three free throws against Alabama (1/31), playing 18 minutes off the bench ... He returned to the starting lineup against Tennessee (2/6), hitting 3-of-5 field goals for seven points.

Rolle started four December games while Darnell Lazare was recovering from his ankle problems, his first career starts for LSU ... In a two-game span against Texas (12/10) and Oregon State (12/17), Rolle grabbed a combined 17 rebounds, including eight offensive ... But the Tigers hoped for more offensive production as he was a combined 1-of-10 from the field in those two games.

Against UConn (1/6), Rolle had to come in and play 21 minutes as Glen Davis was in foul trouble ... He hit 2-of-3 field goal attempts and grabbed six rebounds, along the way becoming the first LSU player to block four shots this season ... Against Alabama (1/9), for the third time this year he grabbed at least four offensive rebounds ... Rolle also grabbed four offensive boards against Auburn (1/13).

The raw talent from the Bahamas is averaging 3.6 points and 4.4 rebounds with 1.0 blocks ... Last year, Rolle was effective late, sometimes in tandem with Lazare when Glen Davis and Tyrus Thomas were out of the game for rest or more importantly, when in foul trouble.

Alex Farrer

Farrer saw action in his first career SEC game against Arkansas, playing four minutes and missing his only field goal attempt ... The freshman has played in eight games this year, averaging 1.5 points per game ... He has played double digit minutes in three contests this year.

SI.Com Thinks LSU Is No. 1 Athletically In SEC

SI.com writer Nick Zaccardi has placed the LSU athletic program first in his SEC Power Rankings. Zaccardi ranked each school by averaging their positions in the five sports that are currently in action: football, men's and women's basketball, volleyball and swimming.

About LSU, Zaccardi writes: "With everything that has happened on and off the field in Baton Rouge, the last two years, it's astonishing that the Tigers continue to lead the SEC in athletic achievement. The writer then essays Nick Saban bolting for the NFL and in comes Les Miles and the Tigers are going BCS bowling. The men's basketball team lost Tyrus Thomas to the NBA. "But with Glen 'Big Baby' Davis picking up the slack," Zaccardi writes, "the Tigers are proving that last season's Final Four was no slack."

He then talks about the departure of Seimone Augustus, who left last season to become the No. 1 pick in the WNBA draft. Enter a group led by Sylvia Fowles, he writes and the team is strong as ever and he cites the 24-point win over nationally ranked Ohio State. In his spotlight, Zaccardi salutes the LSU volleyball team that wrapped up a 26-6 season with an NCAA Tournament bid. The number of wins tied for the most in a season by the Tigers since 1992.

After LSU, the list in the power rankings is Florida, Tennessee, Alabama, Georgia and Kentucky rounding out the top six. Arkansas, Auburn, Mississippi, South Carolina, Vanderbilt and Mississippi State follow them.

Rebounding

Rebounding was a strong suit for the 2005-06 LSU team, out rebounding 26 of 36 opponents a year ago with a 21-5 record ... Ironically in the eight games last season in which LSU was outrebounded, the Tigers were 6-2.

LSU has out rebounded 17 of the 24 teams this year and has a 13-4 mark in those games ... By out rebounding Mississippi State (2/3), the Tigers stopped a four game streak in which LSU was out rebounded by six boards in each game ... Now LSU has out rebounded the last three teams by at least nine boards each game.

LSU has posted a double figure rebound margin against eight of the teams -- Nicholls State +22, Louisiana-Monroe +14, Tulane +14, Texas A&M +11, Louisiana Tech +20, Wright State +10, Mississippi Valley +13, Auburn +11 and Mississippi State +10.

LSU is averaging 38.2 rebounds a game, fourth in the league and they are third in rebound margin (+5.7).

Sophomores Carrying Scoring Load As They Did As Freshmen?

Last year, the freshmen on the LSU team scored 42 percent of LSU's point average of 73.1 ... Now, without Tyrus Thomas, sophomores Garrett Temple, Tasmin Mitchell, Ben Voogd, Magnum Rolle and Chris Johnson are carrying that scoring load, now joined by Terry Martin ... Presently, the sophomore class is carrying over half the scoring load now at 53.6 percent ... The junior class which features Glen Davis, is at 37.5 percent of LSU's point total.

Game 1 -- LSU 96, Nicholls State 42 (November 17, 2006 -- Maravich Center)

LSU's sometime maligned three-point shooting showed plenty of spark as six players combined to hit 11 three-pointers as LSU won the home opener under John Brady for the 10th consecutive year ... The Tigers shot 58.5 percent from the field (31-of-53) and 11-of-19 from the three-point arc ... LSU, as in the exhibition games, continued its strong shooting at the free throw line, hitting 23-of-26 attempts ... LSU out-rebounded the Colonels, 49-27 ... Glen Davis, Darnell Lazare and Garrett Temple all had 16 points for the Tigers, while Tasmin Mitchell had 14 ... Lazare had his first career double-double with 10 rebounds, while Temple's 16 points was a career high.

Game 2 -- LSU 88, Louisiana-Monroe 57 (November 19, 2006 -- Maravich Center)

LSU again had another strong night from the field, hitting 17-of-24 field goal attempts in the first half (70.8 percent) to build a 44-22 advantage en route to the second win of the season ... LSU would end up shooting 60 percent for the game (36-of-60), making seven three pointers ... Glen Davis scored 17 second half points in a 26-point night, while Tasmin Mitchell hit five treys in a career-high 21-point game ... Darnell Lazare had his second straight 16-point night to open the season, while Dameon Mason added 10 to get his first double-figure scoring game at LSU ... LSU had 26 assists for its 36 field goals and out rebounded the Warhawks, 42-28.

Game 3 -- #24 Wichita State 57, LSU 53 (Nov. 25, 2006 -- Maravich Center)

LSU's 11-game home winning streak went by the boards as the Tigers couldn't find the offense to sustain the defense effort against the Shockers ... LSU shot just 8-of-24 from the field in the second half, 1-of-5 from the arc and just 7-of-13 from the free throw line as LSU lost a six-point halftime lead and the advantage they had the whole game ... Wichita State took the lead in the final two minutes and LSU never could get back even ... Glen Davis had his 30th career double double, first of the year with 17 points and 13 rebounds, while Darnell Lazare was the only other player in double figures with 11 ... Five player, including two reserves, for Wichita scored 54 of their 57 points.

Game 4 -- LSU 91, McNeese State 57 (November 30, 2006 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

The Tigers got their offense back in gear and was able to go with several different combinations in downing the Cowboys for LSU's 63rd straight win against Louisiana opposition in games played at the Maravich Center ... Five players were in double figures led by Garrett Temple with his second career high of the season, this time 17 points ... Tasmin Mitchell, hitting 7-of-11 field goals, had 16 points, Glen Davis 15, Ben Voogd a career high 12 and Darnell Lazare 11 ... Voogd, whose previous high last year was five, hit all four of his field goal attempts, including two treys and had six assists and no turnovers in 21 minutes ... LSU shot 52.5 percent from the floor (32-of-61) and for the second time this year posted a double figure makes number for the three-point arc (10-of-19).

Game 5 -- LSU 74, Tulane 67 (December 2, 2006 -- New Orleans, La.)

The Tigers were sluggish offensively and allowed an inspired Tulane team to get out to an 11-point advantage with three minutes to go in the first half before coming back to defeat the Wave at the New Orleans Arena ... LSU went on a 15-0 run in the second half taking a six point deficit into a nine-point lead that the Tigers never surrendered ... LSU outrebounded the Wave, 43-29, with a 16-3 advantage on the offensive boards ... Glen Davis had his second double-double of the year with 20 points and 13 rebounds, while Garrett Temple had a career high for the second game in a row, this time with 18 points ... Dameon Mason added 12 and Tasmin Mitchell 11 ... LSU shot just 40.3 percent from the floor (25-of-62), but made 21-of-28 free throws.

Game 6 -- LSU 64, #6 Texas A&M 52 (December 5, 2006 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

The Tigers put together a solid defensive effort to down the Aggies in a game with a tournament-like atmosphere at the Maravich Center ... LSU build a 31-28 halftime advantage and then outscored the Aggies, 33-24 over the second 20 minutes ... Glen Davis had his third double double of the year and his second straight 20 point game of the year, scoring 24 points and grabbing 10 rebounds, while making 9-of-14 field goals ... Tasmin Mitchell had 15 points and just missed doubling with nine boards, while Garrett Temple, in addition to doing a masterful defensive job on Acie Long, added 11 points ... LSU shot 44.4 percent for the game (20-of-45) and made 20-of-25 free throws (including 12-of-13 in the second half) ... LSU out rebounded the Aggies, 35-24.

Game 7 -- Texas 76, LSU 75 (OT) (Dec. 10, 2006 -- Houston, Texas)

The Tigers came up short in overtime after Garrett Temple's three with less than 30 seconds left in regulation tied the game ... LSU had a four-point lead in the overtime and led 72-70 with 2:32 to play before Texas got two three pointers by A. J. Abrams to just one by Tasmin Mitchell of LSU for the difference ... Mitchell had a career high 23 points for LSU and his third career double double adding 10 boards, while Glen Davis was over 20 and double doubled for the third consecutive game with 21 points and 10 rebounds ... Garrett Temple added 14 points ... LSU shot just 35.5 percent for the game (27-of-76), 8-of-27 from the arc and was out rebounded by the Longhorns, 49-46 ... LSU had just 11 turnovers for the game, two in the final 25 minutes, after totaling nine in the first half ... The game was played in Houston's Toyota Center.

Game 8 -- LSU 60, Oregon State 53 (Dec. 17, 2006 -- Corvallis, Oregon)

In a game that featured a first half scoreless streak of eight seconds short of seven minutes and Oregon State shooting 8-of-13 in the second half from the arc and 3-of-16 from inside the arc during the same 20 minute period, the LSU Tigers found a way to get a win in the first half of their Pac-10 road trip ... Glen Davis had his fourth straight double double with 22 points and 13 rebounds and it was his fourth consecutive game scoring over 20 points ... Garrett Temple added 17 and Tasmin Mitchell 11 ... LSU struggled at times from the field, hitting just 40.4 percent for the game (21-of-52), 31.8 percent from the arc (7-of-22) and for the second time this year was below 60 percent from the line (11-of-19, 57.9 percent) ... OSU shot just 32.8 percent for the game, but 52.4 (11-of-21) in three-pointers.

Game 9 -- No. 17 Washington 88, LSU 72 (Dec. 20, 2006 -- Seattle, Wash.)

The Tigers ended up with a 1-1 split on its West Coast road trip as LSU had no answer for Jon Brockman and Spencer Hawes down low as the two combined for 42 points and 26 rebounds against an LSU frontcourt that could muster just 12 points and 18 rebounds ... Sometimes as many as a combined four players would converge on Glen Davis, holding him to his first game under double figures since the fifth to last game of his freshman season, ending a streak of 48 straight games ... Tasmin Mitchell did have a good night for LSU, hitting 20 points with three assists and no turnovers in 34 minutes, while transfer Terry Martin played his first game as a Tigers, hitting for 13 points with three treys in 20 minutes ... LSU was 43.3 percent from the field (29-of-67) as Washington out rebounded LSU, 44-34, with 21 offensive boards.

Game 10 -- LSU 68, Louisiana Tech 52 (Dec. 23, 2006 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

The Tigers used the free throw shooting of Glen Davis, the three-point shooting of Terry Martin and the rebounding of Davis and Tasmin Mitchell that got LSU back on the winning track ... Davis made 15-of-18 free throws and grabbed 14 rebounds in a 23-point performance ... Martin, in his second LSU game and his first home game, hit 5-of-6 treys in a 19-point performance ... Mitchell grabbed 12 rebounds as part of a 45-25 rebounding edge over Tech ... LSU shot 42.3 percent from the field (22-of-52), compared to 21-of-59 for Tech (35.6 percent) ... LSU led 33-22 at the half and after Tech cut the lead a couple of times to seven in the first five minutes of the second half, LSU was able to widen the gap to as much as 21 with four minutes to play.

Game 11 -- LSU 71, Wright State 45 (Hispanic College Funds Classic, Dec. 27, 2006 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

The Tigers' opening night game in the round-robin Hispanic College Funds Classic proved difficult in the opening state as Wright State played a near perfect half, with no turnovers and trailed just 36-28 at the break ... LSU put the defensive clamps on the Raiders in the second half, allowing WSU to hit just 7-of-25 shots, while hitting 13-of-24 on the offensive end to win going away ... Glen Davis equaled his season high with 26 points and 12 rebounds, hitting 10-of-13 field goal attempts that included a career best three three-point field goals ... LSU shot 56 percent for the game (28-of-50) and 9-of-19 from the arc with 19 assists and just eight turnovers ... Terry Martin and Dameon Mason each added 14 points to the LSU total.

Game 12 -- LSU 92, Mississippi Valley State 58 (Hispanic College Funds Classic, Dec. 28, 2006 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

LSU equaled its longest scoring run of the season with a 15-0 run to open the game and went on to a second straight victory in the Classic ... LSU again shot 56 percent for the game (35-of-62) with six treys, out rebounding MVSU, 41-28 ... Five players were in double figures for the Tigers with Glen Davis posting another double double with 19 points and 13 rebounds ... Tasmin Mitchell posted 17 points, Dameon Mason 13 and Darnell Lazare and Terry Martin 10 each ... Garrett Temple had a career high seven assists in 25 minutes of play ... Mississippi Valley shot 39.6 percent for the game (21-53) and 3-of-12 three-point attempts.

Game 13 -- LSU 60, Samford 45 (Hispanic College Funds Classic - Dec. 29, BR, La.)

The Tigers still had the patience and the stamina on the third straight night of competition to withstand a stern test from Samford on the final night of the Hispanic College Funds Classic ... LSU's defense and the ability to shoot 68.4 percent from the field in the second half (13-19) allowed the Tigers to pull away from a four-point halftime lead to expand to the final margin ... LSU had its lowest turnover total in 68 games, turning it over just six times ... For the third straight game in the classic, LSU was right around 56 percent from the field (24-of-43) and made 5-of-8 three pointers ... Glen Davis led LSU with 19 points with Tasmin Mitchell getting 13 and Dameon Mason 11 ... Garrett Temple had seven assists for the second straight night.

Game 14 -- LSU 66, #18 Connecticut 49 (Jan. 6 -- Baton Rouge)

The Tigers overcame a start that saw sloppy play and an inability to keep Connecticut off the offensive boards in the first half to end up winning going away before a national television audience and a paid crowd of over 13,000 Saturday night ... UConn led three times by seven and finally by nine, 15-6 at the 11:50 mark of the first half before LSU tried to claw its way back into the fray ... LSU actually ended up with a two-point halftime lead, 30-28, on a scrambling 35-footer by Tack Minor at the halftime buzzer ... In the second half, LSU's defense kicked in, especially in the final 10 minutes, as UConn shot just 29.2 percent (7-of-24), while LSU was making 12-of-26 field goal attempts ... For the night, Connecticut out rebounded LSU, 42-40, with 19 offensive rebounds ... Glen Davis and Tasmin Mitchell each had 16 points, while Tasmin Mitchell doubled up with 10 boards ... Garrett Temple had 14 points as well for the Tigers.

Game 15 -- #14 Alabama 71, LSU 61 (January 9 -- Tuscaloosa, Ala.)

Glen Davis had a tremendous game that hid his sore ribs from a recent auto accident by scoring 24 points and 11 rebounds with three blocks in trying to lead LSU to victory in the conference opener ... Tasmin Mitchell added 19 points in 36 minutes ... The Tigers were able to get only 18 points from the other six players that played in the game ... LSU hit just 28.6 percent in the first half of play, missing 30 shots (12-of-42) as Alabama built a 35-26 halftime advantage ... LSU played the Tide almost even in the second half, hitting 13-of-28 shots (46.4 percent), while Alabama shot a consistent 24-of-52 (46.2 percent, 12-of-26 in each half) ... LSU had 18 offensive rebounds in out rebounding the Tide, 43-36.

Game 16 -- LSU 65, Auburn 63 (Jan. 13 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

The LSU Tigers had to rely on second half defense and a strong performance by Terry Martin to get the job done and even its conference record at 1-1 against the Auburn Tigers ... LSU missed 22 first-half shots and trailed 32-28 and trailed only by four thanks to three treys by three different players in the final two minutes of the first half ... In the second half, Terry Martin took charge, hitting five treys and getting 23 points to lead LSU ... Tasmin Mitchell had 12 points with Glen Davis getting 11 points and 11 rebounds ... Garrett Temple had seven assists and four blocks in 39 minutes ... The Tigers shot 41 percent for the game after shooting 54.2 percent in the second half (13-of-24), while out rebounding the Auburn Tigers, 43-32, with 19 offensive rebounds.

Game 17 -- LSU 62, Ole Miss 55 (Jan. 17 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

LSU's defense again proved to be plenty as LSU was able to beat Ole Miss for its 19th consecutive Southeastern Conference home victory ... The Tigers for the first time in three games did improve its first half shooting, hitting 11-of-24 shots for 45.8 percent ... LSU was consistent throughout the game, hitting 45.5 percent in the second half to finish 21-of-46 or 45.7 percent ... Glen Davis was held in check for the second straight game with 11 points, while Tasmin Mitchell doubled up with 19 points and 10 rebounds ... Terry Martin his four treys in a 15-point effort and Garrett Temple was again showing his prowess at point guard, getting seven assists for the second consecutive game ... LSU out rebounded Ole Miss, 35-32.

Game 18 -- Arkansas 72, LSU 52 (Jan. 20 -- Fayetteville, Ark.)

LSU's offensive struggles continued as LSU missed 22 first half shots and shot just 35 percent for the game (21-of-60) ... Arkansas shot 50 percent for the game (26-of-52) taking control of the game in the first 10 minutes, building a 39-26 halftime advantage ... Glen Davis led LSU with 16 points and eight rebounds, while Terry Martin had 10 points ... Arkansas out rebounded LSU, 37-31 ... Tigers hit 5-of-19 treys (26.3 percent).

Game 19 -- Vanderbilt 64, LSU 53 (Jan. 24 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

Again, despite Vandy making 10 three-pointers, LSU is able to hold the Commodores in check enough to have a chance, but a slow starting first half in which LSU against missed over 20 shots (24), resulted in a 10-of-34 shooting half (29.4 percent) and a 34-24 deficit ... LSU let the lead get out to as much as 18 in the second half, before whittling it down to six twice, the last at the 2:16 mark ... Vanderbilt was able to answer back and control the game the rest of the way ... Tasmin Mitchell led LSU with 16 points while Glen Davis and Garrett Temple each had 12 ... LSU shot 32.3 percent for the game, compared to Vanderbilt's 41.8 percent ... The Commodores out rebounded the Tigers, 42-36, as Vanderbilt ended LSU's 19-game conference home winning streak that dated back to March 2004.

Game 20 -- Georgia 57, LSU 54 (Jan. 28 -- Athens, Ga.)

Georgia's Levi Stukes hit a three-pointer with 0.6 seconds to play to give the Bulldogs a 57-54 win ... LSU had played a much better game against Georgia, especially in the first half, hitting 11-of-28 shots (39.3 percent), with Glen Davis having a career high six assists as LSU scored the first eight points and led, 32-29, at the intermission ... Georgia would tie the game, but LSU twice came on for a four point (39-35, 15:24) and six-point (49-43, 8:38) advantage before falling in the end ... LSU got its final points and a 54-52 lead with 4:59 to play on a Darnell Lazare bucket, but only had two shot attempts around three turnovers the rest of the way ... Davis led LSU with 18 points and 14 rebounds, hitting 6-of-11 field goals and his only trey attempt ... Terry Martin had 16 points with four treys ... LSU hit 6-of-15 three-pointers, but just 8-of-14 free throws ... LSU held Georgia to just 34.5 percent from the floor, but Georgia hit 11-of-26 three-pointers.

Game 21 -- #19 Alabama 73, LSU 70 (Jan. 31 -- Baton Rouge, La.)

Alabama rallied from five-points down in the final 4:30 of the contest to beat LSU and hand the Tigers their second consecutive home and fourth straight overall loss ... The Tigers began to break out of their offensive slump, hitting 51.8 percent of their field goal attempts (29-of-56), but LSU hit just 3-of-12 from the arc ... For the first time since 1994, LSU was perfect at the line in a game, going 9-of-9 on free throws ... LSU scored 20 points off Alabama's 14 turnovers, but Alabama had 22 second chance points to LSU's 10 ... The Tigers led 38-34 at the half and had a five-point lead, 68-63, with 4:34 left ... But LSU had three turnovers, missed five-of-six shots while Alabama was making two baskets and six free throws to swing the game ... Glen Davis led LSU with 15 points and for the second straight game, six assists, while Tasmin Mitchell had 14 and Chris Johnson, making his first collegiate start, hit 4-of-8 field goals in a 13 point, three block effort.

Game 22 -- Mississippi State 85, LSU 78 (February 3 -- Starkville, Miss.)

The Tigers offensively got off to a strong start, shooting 60 percent for the second straight first half from the field and shot over 50 percent for the second straight game, but this time defensively LSU had no answer to Mississippi State's 13 three-point field goals as the Bulldogs outscored LSU by 13 in the second half after getting a 39-39 tie at intermission ... Glen Davis was one off his career high at LSU with 27 points, including three three pointers and his league leading 12th double double of the year with 10 rebounds ... Garrett Temple had one of his best SEC games with 16 points and five assists, while Terry Martin added 14 and Tasmin Mitchell 11 ... LSU shot 53.4 percent (31-of-58) and out rebounded Mississippi State, 36-26.

Game 23 -- Tennessee 70, LSU 67 (February 6 -- Knoxville, Tenn.)

The Tigers again did some good things offensively, but 20 turnovers and 19 points off the turnovers by Tennessee hurt LSU's chances to stop what is now a six-game losing streak ... LSU hit 44.9 percent from the floor (22-of-49) and 7-of-14 from the arc to just 38.6 percent from the floor for Tennessee with the Vols just 5-of-21 at the arc ... LSU out rebounded Tennessee, 39-30 ... But the Vols limited Glen Davis to his lowest scoring total since his freshman year with five points on 2-of-10 shooting ... Tasmin Mitchell picked up the slack with 23 points, tying his career high, while Terry Martin had 15 ... Garrett Temple had seven assists and Ben Voogd five assists.
