LSU SWIMMING AND DIVING TO TAKE ON ALABAMA FRIDAY

Before LSU and Alabama meet on the gridiron Saturday, the Tigers and Crimson Tide will face one another in the pool as the men's and women's swimming and diving teams square off at 3 p.m., Friday in the LSU Natatorium. This year's matchup continues a long tradition of the two programs dueling the day before the Tigers and Crimson Tide battle it out on the football field. Last season, the LSU teams swept Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Ala., the day before the Tigers defeated the Tide, 41-34, in Bryant-Denny Stadium. The 17th-ranked LSU men (0-1, 0-1 SEC) earned their first win over the Tide in seven years with last season's 194-106 victory. The LSU women (0-2, 0-2 SEC) enter this year's contest having won three consecutive dual meets in the series. The Lady Tigers hope to rebound after a close defeat at the hands of No. 21 Arkansas last Thursday. The men's squad returns to action after a two week layoff from dual-meet competition.

Men's team ranked No. 17 in the nation

The Tigers held on to the No. 17 position in the latest CSCAA/CollegeSwimming.com men's dual-meet poll after beginning the season ranked in the same spot. The top-25 men's and women's teams in the country are selected by a group of pollsters representing eight conferences and two at-large voters. There will be a total of eight dual-meet polls released throughout the season, and the poll champions (men and women) will be announced on Feb. 26, 2009. The dual-meet rankings are not to be confused with the NCAA standings from the NCAA Championships in March, which will crown the actual national champions.

Co-captains Noland and Farber showing senior leadership

Seniors **Katherine Noland** and **Connor Farber** were two of the four co-captains selected for this year's teams, and both have led by example with their performances in the pool so far this season. Noland swept all three of her events - the 50, 100 and 200 freestyles - versus No. 21 Arkansas and helped the 400-yard freestyle relay squad take first-place against the Razorbacks. Farber tallied 16 points in individual competition against the fourth-ranked Florida Gators in the Tigers' first dual meet of the season and played a vital role on the men's victorious 200 freestyle relay squad with a team-best 50-yard split of 20.29 seconds.

Impact Freshmen

The 2008-09 season is young, but a pair of freshmen have already made their marks in dual-meet competition. **Morgan McGee** came to LSU as arguably the top high school swimmer in the state and has lived up to those lofty expectations thus far. The Shreveport, La., native burst onto the collegiate scene against Florida with the third-fastest 100-yard backstroke time in school history, 55.50 seconds. She followed her 100-back effort with another sensational swim versus the Gators, recording the school's fifth-fastest time in the 200 back, 2:01.12. McGee finished second in both events that day. However, she went on to capture her first career victories in the 100 and 200 backs, respectively, against the Arkansas Razorbacks on Oct. 30. On the men's side, **Ben Decker** enjoyed a fine start to his LSU career. The heralded freshman from Kingwood, Texas took the 100-breaststroke title against the fourth-ranked Gators with a time of 58.63 in his first collegiate swim.

Dalman and Ware among SEC's best

The LSU diving program returned two of the conference's best divers this season, and both have held their own in the early-going. Senior **Niko Dalman**, a 2008 SEC Championships medalist, captured the one-meter title and took runner-up honors in the three-meter versus Florida. His one-meter score of 346.72 against the Gators is the highest mark in the SEC thus far. Junior **Rachel Ware**, the 2008 SEC Women's Diver of the Year, collected a victory in the one-meter springboard (288.23) and finished second in the three-meter (300.45) at Arkansas. Both of her marks against the Razorbacks currently rank in the SEC's top-five in each event, respectively.

Duenas enters program's top five in 200 fly

Vanessa Duenas has enjoyed a fine start to her senior season, etching her name in the school's all-time top 10 for the second time in her career. Duenas, who transferred from Syracuse in 2006, recorded the school's fifth-fastest clocking and a new personal best in the 200 butterfly when she swam the event in 2 minutes, 1.96 seconds against Arkansas last week. The senior also owns the eighth-best 400-IM time in school history, 4:24.22, which she registered at last season's SEC Championships.

Veteran Experience

The men's and women's teams return a combined 19 seniors this season, and head coach **Adam Schmitt** feels this can be a truly special year for the LSU swimming and diving program. Many of them comprise the first full recruiting class Schmitt assembled here at LSU, and the group has rewarded him with some of the best years the program has seen in recent history. Ten of this year's 19 seniors have All-America honors or school records to their credit.

The German Trio

Seniors **Christoph Lubenau** and **Julius Gloeckner** and sophomore **Hannes Heyl** have combined to earn six All-America honors and shatter five school records in the past two seasons, and the German trio is expected to lead the way for the Tigers again this year. Lubenau, a two-time All-American in 2007-08, has SEC championship potential in his specialty, the 100-yard butterfly and should make a push for first team All-America accolades in that event this season. Gloeckner, who owns more individual records than any other swimmer in school history, is coming off a strong summer of training and will be looking to repeat the kind of success he had in 2007 when he enjoyed one of the finest seasons in recent program annals. However, the one with arguably the highest upside of the three is Heyl, an incredibly versatile athlete who could conceivably become an All-American in three different strokes. The sophomore was a two-time All-American in the 100 butterfly and as a member of the 200 freestyle relay squad last season and finished 12 spots shy of a third honor in the 100 backstroke.

Seniors Noland and Gilmore Lead Lady Tigers into 2008-09

There has not been a more consistent tandem in the Schmitt era than the freestyle combo of **Katherine Noland** and **Katie Gilmore**, and the two return for their senior seasons hoping to cap a pair of sensational collegiate careers. Noland enters her final year as one of the team's captains and will be a force in the freestyle races and a vital member of the relay squads. Gilmore, the program's 50-yard freestyle record-holder, goes into 2008-09 with her final opportunity to record an All-American finish in individual competition.

Ware and Dalman: Two of the SEC's Top Returning Divers

The 2007-08 season was a banner year for the LSU diving program under Doug Shaffer, the SEC Women's Diving Coach of the Year, and this year could yield even better results with the return of junior **Rachel Ware** and senior **Niko Dalman**. Ware, the 2008 SEC Women's Diver of the Year, is the premier diver in the conference after winning the SEC Championship in the 1-meter springboard and registering her third All-America finish in two seasons. Dalman took the third-place medal in the 3-meter springboard and broke the school record in the event at the SECs. Expect both to be two of the best divers in the SEC, if not in the nation, this season.

Introducing the Newcomers

Schmitt and Shaffer welcomed 12 freshmen to the program this season, and quite a few of them will have opportunities to provide an immediate impact. Seven newcomers – five swimmers and two divers – have joined the men's squad. **Martin Jungfleisch**, a product of Bremerhaven, Germany, and **Ben Decker**, a native of Kingwood, Texas, are two of the more decorated swimmers coming in and should contribute in the butterfly and breaststroke events, respectively, right away. Furthermore, both freshman divers – **Brian Gemberling** of Levittown, Pa. and **Matt Vieke** of Indianapolis, Ind. – will see immediate action. On the women's side, five freshmen have come aboard. Both swimmers, **Morgan McGee** of Shreveport, La. and **Samantha Goates** of Visalia, Calif., are expected to boost the team's backstroke efforts. Texas divers, **Chelsea McCorvey** and **Katie Lybbert** and local product Theresa Garcia will be factors in all three diving events.

Former Tigers Represent LSU at the Beijing Olympics

The LSU swimming and diving program was well represented at the 2008 Olympic Games as two former Tiger standouts competed in Beijing. **Miko Malberg**, a 2008 NCAA All-American, swam for his native country of Estonia in record-setting fashion, shattering his country's 50-meter freestyle mark with a time of 22.37 seconds to place 25th out of 98 swimmers. **Heather Brand**, a 2006 All-American, fulfilled her lifelong dream of competing on the world's largest stage as she swam for her home land of Zimbabwe and finished 42nd with a time of 1:01.39 in the 100-meter butterfly.
