NOTES ON THE VANDERBILT-LSU SERIES

THE LSU SERIES

This marks just the second time that Vanderbilt has met LSU in its SEC home opener. The first time (Sept. 22, 1990) resulted in 24-21 Commodore win. Vanderbilt is attempting to end a six-game skid in the series dating to the 1990.

When the 'Dores take the field, only seven Vanderbilt starters from the 2009 matchup are expected in the starting rotation. LSU is ranked for the sixth consecutive time the teams have faced off.

KEY GAMES IN SERIES

- ★ 1991 Vanderbilt's opportunity for an upset in Tiger Stadium ended in the closing minute as LSU forced a Commodore turnover at the Tiger 2-yard line.
- ★ 1990 One week after losing badly to SMU in Texas, Vanderbilt topped LSU 24-21 as guarterback Marcus Wilson rushed for 136 yards, earning SEC Offensive Player of the Year honors.
- ★ 1937 LSU came to Nashville as two-time SEC champions and riding a 13-game regular season win streak. Early in the first quarter, Vanderbilt tackle Greer Ricketson, after appearing to fall while blocking, picked up the ball left by teammate Dutch Reinschmidt and rambled 50 yards without LSU defenders taking notice for the deciding touchdown in a 7-6 victory. The "hidden ball" trick play remains one of the most famous plays in Vanderbilt history.
- ★ 1933 In a game that ended 7-7, Vanderbilt misssed a lastsecond field goal attempt in Baton Rouge. It also was the first night game in Commodore history.
- ★ 1902 In one of the most bizarre roadtrips in Vanderbilt football history, the Commodores beat Tulane 23-5 on Saturday, then drove to Baton Rouge and defeated LSU 27-5 on Monday. One of Vanderbilt's top backs was John Tigert, who later became a Rhodes Scholar and eventually U.S. Secretary of Education.


THREE COMMODORES FROM LOUISIANA

Vanderbilt DBs Karl Butler (Fr.), Andre Hal (Fr.) and Trey Wilson (So.) all played their high school ball in Louisiana.

Hal played football right across the Mississippi River from LSU for Port Allen H.S. He helped the Pelicans earn a district title and advance to the first round of the 3A state playoffs. Wilson comes from Evangel Christian, one of the nation's top prep programs. Butler and LSU's Jarred Joseph (WR) were teammates at Brother Martin in New Orleans.

BATON ROUGE, La. - LSU needed Keiland Williams' late touchdown to put away Vanderbilt, 23-9 on a rain-soaked Saturday night, marking the second night this year that the 11th-ranked Tigers allowed an underdog to contend for the victory.

The Commodores (1-1, 0-1 Southeastern Conference) trailed by only one touchdown midway through the fourth quarter as they attempted to win in Tiger Stadium for the first time since 1951.

LSU (2-0, 1-0) made it a two-touchdown

game with 6:01 to go after Williams' second score. He slipped a tackle at the line of scrimmage, cut back, then faked a defender

to the ground before hurdling over him and into the end zone for a 14-yard TD. Williams finished with 72 yards rushing and was the only LSU player to get into the end zone.

Larry Smith scored Vanderbilt's only touchdown on a 6-yard quarterback keeper in the first half that knotted the score 7-7.

VANDERBILT IN 2010: LOTS OF YOUTH

Looking for a quick description for Robbie Caldwell's first Vanderbilt squad. *Youthful* would work.

One week into the season the Commodore depth chart features an array of sophomores, redshirt freshmen and true freshmen.

With only eight seniors expected to contribute against LSU, the Vanderbilt roster is dominated by youth, including 28 sophomores, 14 redshirt freshmen, and 20 true freshmen.

Nearly 30 sophomores and freshmen are featured on the Vanderbilt two-team depth chart.

NINE NEW STARTERS IN OPENER

Nine Commodore players – four on offense, four on defense and a specialist – enjoyed their first career starts in the season opener against Northwestern.

Three offensive linemen and three defensive backs were among the first time starters.

The following Commodores made their first career starts on offense: **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., left guard), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., left tackle), **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., right tackle) and **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., wide receiver).

Defensive players seeing their first starting roles were **Eddie Foster** (So., defensive back), **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety), **Rob Lohr** (R-So., defensive tackle), **Trey Wilson** (So., defensive back).

Richard Kent (R-So. punter) also made his first start, allowing minus-3 return yards on six punts.

TEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

In his first game as a head coach, Robbie Caldwell allowed 10 Commodore true freshmen in see action.

One first-year player, **Jonathan Krause**, showed explosiveness as a receiver, matching the team high with four catches, good for 55 yards.

Other true freshmen seeing action besides Krause were Karl Butler (safety), Steven Clarke (defensive back), Chase Garnham (linebacker), Andre Hal (defensive back), Kenny Ladler (safety), Fitz Lassing (h-back), Jordan Matthews (wide receiver), Andre Simmons (safety), Carey Spear (kicker).

NINETEEN SEE INITIAL COLLEGE ACTION

Nineteen Commodores played their first collegiate snaps against Northwestern.

The first-time contributors were Mylon Brown (R-Fr., OG), Jabo Burrow (R-So., OG), Karl Butler (safety), Steven Clarke (Fr., RB/DB), Jay Fullam (R-Fr., safety), Chase Garnham (Fr., LB), Andre Hal (Fr., DB), Wesley Johnson (R-Fr., OT), Mason Johnston (R-Fr., TE), Richard Kent (R-So., P), Jonathan Krause (Fr., WR), Kenny Ladler (Fr., safety), Fitz Lassing (Fr., TE), Reece Lovell (R-Fr., RB), Jordan Matthews (Fr., WR), Marc Panu (R-Fr., DT), Andre Simmons (Fr., safety), Carey Spear (Fr., PK) and Wesley Tate (R-Fr., RB).

CALDWELL: FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH

Robbie Caldwell, the 26th head coach in Vanderbilt football history, will be one of just 11 first-time head coaches in the NCAA FBS subdivision this season.

Caldwell, a veteran of more than three decades of collegiate coaching, was named to replace Bobby Johnson at Vanderbilt on July 14th following Johnson's unexpected retirement.

Caldwell and Kentucky mentor Joker Phillips are the SEC's only firsttime head coaches this year. A third, Derek Dooley of Tennessee, is in his initial year after having served as Louisiana Tech's head coach.

Besides Caldwell and Phillips, other first-time FCS head coaches are Sonny Dykes (La. Tech), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), John "Doc" Holliday (Marshall), Mike MacIntyre (San Jose State), Larry Porter (Memphis), Jeff Quinn (Buffalo), Charlie Strong (Louisville) and Willie Taggart (Western Kentucky).

Caldwell has the most collegiate coaching experience of the 11 coaches, with Holliday having the second longest tenure.

Vanderbilt is one of 23 schools to feature a new head coach roaming the sidelines in 2010.

HAND NEWEST COMMODORE COACH

Herb Hand, a veteran offensive coach with excellent credentials, is the newest Vanderbilt coach. Hired in early August, Hand serves as offensive line coach and is the first staff hire by Robbie Caldwell.

Hand came to Vanderbilt after three years at the University of Tulsa, a tenure that featured some of the NCAA's most productive offenses. As Tulsa's offensive coordinator, Hand directed 2007 and 2008 Hurricane offenses that topped the nation. Tulsa's 2008 unit averaged 570 yards and 47 points, both tops in the NCAA.

Hand also spent six successful years with the University of West Virginia's productive spread offense before going to Tulsa.

DUTIES CHANGE FOR SIX ASSISTANTS

Six assistant coaches have new responsibilities this season.

- ★ Longtime defensive coordinator **Bruce Fowler** will assist Caldwell as assistant head coach. He will also mentor linebackers.
- ★ Jamie Bryant becomes the sole defensive coordinator and continues as the secondary coach.
- ★ Rick Logo has added recruiting coordinator duties to his primary role as defensive tackles coach.
- \bigstar Running backs coach **Des Kitchings** has added running game coordinator duties.
 - ★ Mike Pelton, hired last spring, will coach defensive ends.
- ★ Ted Cain, former offensive coordinator, will serve as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.

FORMER TIGER MAWAE AT VANDERBILT

Kevin Mawae, a former two-time All-SEC lineman at LSU (1992-93) and a 16-year veteran of three NFL teams, assists the Commodore program as a strength & conditioning intern.

Mawae, one of the top NFL centers of his generation, also serves as president of the NFL Players Association.





NOTES FROM NORTHWESTERN OPENER

- ★ Though played infrequently, the Vanderbilt-Northwestern series appears incredibly close. The Northwestern win evened the series at 1-1-1. The three-game gross score is Vanderbilt 44-Northwestern 43.
- ★ The Vanderbilt offense produced 432 total yards 192 rushing and 240 passing. It matches the Commodores' largest total offense outlet against a BCS-member opponent since Vanderbilt amassed 621 total yards at Kentucky on Nov. 11, 2006.
- ★ Vanderbilt produced more rushing yards (192-144) and passing yards (240-222) than Northwestern. It marked the first time that Vanderbilt has produced more rushing and passing yards in a loss since dropping a 25-19 decision to Florida on Nov. 4, 2006.
- ★ A blocked field goal early in the fourth quarter by **T.J. Greenstone** (R-Jr., DT) was the Commodores' first FG block since another Greg Billinger, stuffed a South Carolina attempt on Sept. 4, 2008.
- ★ Larry Smith (R-Jr., QB), starting his second consecutive season opener, put together one of the finest performances of his career, completing 19 of 33 passes for 240 yards and a TD.

It represents the second highest completion and passing yardage totals in his 11-career starts.

- ★ Brandon Barden (R-Jr., TE) hauled in the longest TD reception of his career, a 36-yarder from Smith late in the third quarter.
- ★ Ryan Fowler (R-So., PK) missed his only extra point attempt and was just 1-of-2 in FG tries, hitting from 30 yards and missing from 46 yards.

Fowler, who enjoyed a consistent preseason camp, entered the season perfect in PATs (20-of-20) from his SEC All-Freshman campaign in 2009. He also converted his final eight FGs last year.

- ★ Jonathan Krause (WR) impressed in his first Commodore game. The true freshmen shared the team high with four receptions and had 55 receiving yards, behind only Barden's 63-yard total.
- ★ The Commodores played a four-tailback rotation: sophomores Warren Norman and Zac Stacy, redshirt senior Kennard Reeves and redshirt freshman Wesley Tate. Stacy topped the team with 69 yards, with Norman and Reeves closely behind with 46 and 27 yards, respectively.
- ★ In his first start, **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety) shared the team high in tackles (12) with **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB).
- ★ Eddie Foster (So., DB) produced career highs in tackles (8) and tackles for loss (3). Sean Richardson (Jr., safety) added eight total tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss.
- ★ **Tim Fugger** (R-So., DE) produced a career-high 1.5 QB sacks. He also forced a fumble and turnover during one of the sacks.
- ★ After punting on its first six possessions, the Vanderbilt offense produced three TDs, a FG and a second FG attempt in its last six drives.
- ★ Vanderbilt hurt its own chances for victory by committing nine penalties, resulting in 91 penalty yards. It was the most penalty yardage by the Commodores since they were flagged for 99 yards in a loss at Army on Oct. 10, 2009.
- ★ The Vanderbilt defense allowed three touchdown passes for the first time since Ole Miss had the same total on Oct. 3, 2009.

VANDERBILT RESULTS IN SEC OPENERS

Vanderbilt looks to return to winning ways in Southeastern Conference openers when it faces LSU on campus Saturday.

Though just 4-21 in their last 25 conference openers, the Commodores are 2-3 since 2005, having defeated South Carolina at home (24-17, 2008) and Arkansas on the road (28-24, 2005).

The Commodores lost at LSU, 23-9, in their 2009 SEC opener.

COMMODORE WINS VS. RANKED FOES

In the last four seasons, the Commodores have notched five wins over nationally ranked opponents. LSU enters the game ranked in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls

Despite those victories, the 'Dores have lost five straight to teams ranked by the Associated Press Top 25.

In 2008, Vanderbilt registered three victories over ranked foes, accomplishing the feat for the first time in team history. The 'Dores beat No. 24 Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, No. 13 Auburn before an ESPN *College GameDay* crowd and No. 24 South Carolina before an Thursday night sellout.

VANDERBILT: SOLID IN SEPTEMBER

The Commodores look to continue their recent trend of solid early-season play when LSU visits Nashville.

Since the 2005 opener, the Commodores are 15-7 in games played before October 1. They lost their first September game this year, 23-21, to Northwestern.

In 2005 and 2008, the Commodores went 4-0 in September.

From 2000-04, Vanderbilt struggled in September, going 4-16.

SMOTHERMAN START STREAK ENDS

Adam Smotherman's consecutive start streak of 23 games ended against Northwestern when he did not dress due to an injury. It was the team's second longest active streak, trailing LB **Chris Marve** (26).

Smotherman, a redshirt senior defensive tackle, is not expected to play until early October from an ACL injury suffered last spring.

TWO COMMODORES IN POSTGRAD STUDIES

Two members of the Commodore football team, quarterback **Jared Funk** and receiver **Turner Wimberly**, are enrolled in graduate courses at Vanderbilt's Peabody College. Both Funk and Wimberly are working toward postgraduate degrees in Leadership and

Public Policy.

A third Commodore player, linebacker **John Stokes**, has received early admission into Vanderbilt's Medical School, but will not start those classes before September 2011. Stokes is a two-time District IV Academic All-America recipient.

VANDERBILT'S TOUGH SLATE

College football insiders say the Commodores' 2010 schedule ranks among the nation's most difficult.

Ten of Vanderbilt's 12 opponents this season made postseason appearances during the 2009-10 season. Six of the 10 played in bowls on or after January 1. An 11th foe, Wake Forest, went 5-7 last year after making three straight bowl appearances.

Vanderbilt's 12 opponents won at a 58.4 percent clip in 2009, going a combined 90-66. Remove Eastern Michigan's winless campaign, and the remaining 11 teams went 90-54 one year ago.

Phil Steele's College Football Preview listed the Vanderbilt schedule No.12 toughest among 120 NCAA FBS teams.

The Commodores are slated to play four teams ranked in Associated Press preseason Top 25 (Florida, 4th; Arkansas, 17th; LSU, 21st; and Georgia, 23rd). Three other 2010 foes received AP Top 25 mention: South Carolina, Connecticut and Ole Miss.

The Commodores are also the only Southeastern Conference school this year that will face at least three opponents from BCS-member conferences: Northwestern, Big Ten; UConn, Big East; and Wake Forest, ACC.

THIRTEEN PLAYERS ON COUNCIL

Thirteen players participate in the Leadership Council, serving as an entity that addresses team and student-athlete issues while acting as their teammates' voice in communicating with Vanderbilt coaches.

Co-captains Joey Bailey, T.J. Greenstone, Chris Marve and Adam Smotherman are members of the Leadership Council.

Others voted by teammates to represent various position groups include Larry Smith, QBs; Kennard Reeves, RBs; Brandon Barden, TEs/HBs; John Cole, WRS; Tim Fugger, DL; John Stokes, LBs; Sean Richardson, safeties; Casey Hayward, DBs; and David Giller, specialists.

MARVE WEARS DOSTER "KD1" PATCH

Linebacker **Chris Marve** (R-Jr.) became the fourth Vanderbilt player to wear the "KD1" jersey patch when the Commodores faced Northwestern.

The recognition is one of the most significant awarded by fellow Commodore players.

The patch honors the memory of Kwane Doster, the only Commodore ever to receive the SEC Freshman of the Year Award. Doster was shot and killed in his hometown of Tampa, Fla., on Dec. 26, 2004. RUNNING BACK BY COMMITTEE IN OPENER

Due to preseason injuries and health uncertainties at the position, the Commodores used a four-back rotation at tailback against Northwestern in the opener.

The rotation – sophomores **Warren Norman** and **Zac Stacy**, redshirt senior **Kennard Reeves** and redshirt freshman **Wesley Tate** – proved beneficial for the Vanderbilt offensive attack. The four backs combined for 144 rushing yards and 38 receiving yards, playing a big part in Vanderbilt's 432 yards of total offense.

Just days before the Northwestern game, the status of Vanderbilt's backfield was in serious doubt. Norman, the reigning SEC Freshman of the Year and arguably the team's most explosive player, was questionable after undergoing a knee scope less than two weeks earlier. Stacy was coming off a knee sprain suffered in camp and Tate had missed two weeks with a tender foot.

Stacy topped the Commodores with 69 rushing yards against Northwestern, including a late 33-yard TD carry. Norman produced 133 all-purpose yards, including 46 via the ground. Reeves also ran hard, gaining 27 yards on four carries. Tate's lone rush was a 2-yard gain that produced a Commodore first down inside the Northwestern 5-yard line.

VANDERBILT VS. NON-SEC FOES

Vanderbilt is 9-6 in its last 15 games against non-Southeastern Conference opponents. The Commodores suffered a narrow loss to Northwestern in the opener, and will face UCONN, Eastern Michigan and Wake Forest later this season.

In the last decade, the 'Dores are 24-11 in games against non-SEC teams.

MARVE, NORMAN PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Standouts **Chris Marve** and **Warren Norman** were named to the Preseason All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers. Marve, a junior LB from Memphis, and Norman, a sophmore RB/RS from Stone Mountain, Ga., were both named first team all-conference.

Both earned All-SEC recognition from league coaches last year after putting together excellent seasons: Marve ranking as the SEC's No. 2 tackler; Norman walking away with SEC Freshman of the Year honors as the conference's all-purpose yardage leader.

Marve, one of four captains, has been named to watchlists for the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award. He enters his third season as a starter trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn accomplished the feat in 1998-2000.

Marve, who posted 121 tackles in 2009, opened this season with a 12-tackle performance against Northwestern.

Norman played well against Northwestern despite undergone an arthroscopic procedure less than two weeks ago. The sophomore rushed for 46 yards, caught two passes for 32 yards, returned two kickoffs for 58 yards in limited action.

In 2009, Norman producted produced one of the most productive freshman campaigns in SEC history one year ago. He topped the SEC with 1,951 all-purpose yards, breaking Herschel Walker's freshman SEC record in the process, and matched another league mark with three kickoff returns for touchdowns. Norman also ranked seventh in the SEC with 783 rushing yards.

OTHER TOP RETURNEES

BRANDON BARDEN (R-Jr., TE) Finished 2009 with 29 receptions, good for 357 yards and a TD. Former prep QB ranks as Vanderbilt's active career leader with 57 receptions and 565 receiving yards.

Barden had four catches for 63 yards and a TD in the opener

RYAN FOWLER (R-So., PK) Untested entering '09, Folwer connected on 11 of his last 12 attempts, including final eight. Fowler's 16 FGs tied a school record, earning Freshman All-America and SEC honors.

Fowler missed a PAT and was 1-2 on FGs vs. Northwestern

T.J. GREENSTONE (R-Jr., DT) Extremely productive on the field, 2010 co-captain posted 38 total tackles and two QB sacks last year.

Greenstone blocked a FG and recovered fumble in opener

CASEY HAYWARD (Jr., DB) Displayed excellent cover skills, picking off two passes and defending seven others. He also added 58 total tackles, including 8.5 for loss.

Hayward posted four solo tackles vs. Northwestern

SEAN RICHARDSON (Jr., Safety) Regarded as one of the SEC's top safeties, Richardson blossomed as a starter at strong safety in 2009, earning 84 total tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.

Richardson had eight tackles, including 2.5 for loss, vs. Northwestern

ZAC STACY (So., RB) Playing much of his freshman season at less than full speed, Stacy rushed for 478 yards.

Stacy had 69 rushing yards, including a 30-yard score, in the opener

REMEMBERING RAJAAN BENNETT

The Commodores are without one student-athlete who was expected to be a key member of the 2010 signing class, **Rajaan Bennett**.

Bennett, a highly sought-after running back from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga., died tragically on Feb. 18, 2010. Bennett was the victim of a residential shooting that shocked the McEachern and Vanderbilt communities. Last Friday, the school honored Bennett by retiring his No. 5 jersey and erecting a monument at its football stadium.

At a memorial service days after the death, his literature teacher read an essay entitled "Strength" written by Bennett within a week of his death.

The essay closed with the following lines:

"There will never be a time that I will give up. I work hard at whatever I do for that man upstairs to smile down on me with the rays of the sun.

"My drive cannot be stopped or even slowed down, because every obstacle has a way around it.

"Every day I become stronger from the weights physically, the books mentally and life emotionally. There is no limit to my strength and at the end of the day, I want to be known as the strongest."

Bennett rushed for 1,857 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior captain, helping McEachern to an undefeated regular season. A Rivals' 4-star recruit and one of Georgia's most decorated seniors, Bennett earned the state's AAAAA Offensive Player of the Year Award. At McEachern, Bennett was a campus leader and honors student.

The son of Narjaketha Bennett and the late Charles Bennett, Rajaan is survived by a younger brother and sister.

SEYMOUR, HERNDON HELD OUT OF OPENER

Two Commodore offensive players, OT **Ryan Seymour** and WR **Tray Herndon,** missed the opener against Northwestern for violating university rules. Both can dress this Saturday against LSU. Seymour was an SEC All-Freshman selection last year.

MONAHAN TO MISS SEASON WITH ACL INJURY

Austin Monahan (R-Jr., TE) will miss the 2010 season after suffering an ACL tear in an early August practice. It marks the third consecutive year that the unfortunate Monahan has sustained a season-ending injury. Last year, he tore an ACL at midseason. In 2008, Monahan suffered a shoulder fracture after making a catch at Ole Miss.
