LSU Steps Out of Conference Play To Host Top 25 West Virginia

LSU steps out of conference for the second time this year, hosting No. 21/22 West Virginia at 8 p.m. CT in Tiger Stadium. The game, which is sold out, will be televised to a national audience on ESPN2. LSU goes into the game ranked No. 12 in the nation in the USA Today Coaches' Poll and No. 15 in the AP Top 25. The Tigers are 3-0 overall and 2-0 in league play following last week's 29-7 win over Mississippi State. West Virginia, from the Big East Conference, is also 3-0 after beating Maryland, 31-17, last week. It will be the first meeting between LSU and West Virginia in football. It will also the be the first time LSU will face a current member of the Big East since a 23-10 loss to Syracuse in the 1989 Hall of Fame Bowl. LSU is 1-3 all-time against current members of the Big East. LSU goes into the West Virginia game riding the nation's longest regular-season non-conference winning streak at 30 straight. LSU hasn't lost a non-conference regular season game since a 26-8 setback to Virginia Tech to open the 2002 season. In addition, LSU's won 28 straight non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, a stretch that goes back to the 2002 season when the Tigers dropped a 13-10 decision to UAB. In LSU's first three games, the Tigers have played 17 freshmen (9 true, 8 redshirt) and LSU has had 12 players start for the first time in their career (8 vs. North Carolina, 3 vs. Vanderbilt, 1 vs. Mississippi State). LSU goes into the West Virginia game with one of the top defenses in the SEC as the Tigers are No. 2 in the league in scoring defense (11.3 points per game), rushing defense (80.3 yards per game), and sacks (11), and No. 5 in total defense (279.7 yards per game). Offensively, LSU is averaging 28.7 points and 323.0 yards per game (203.0 rushing, 120.0 passing). Individually, RB Stevan Ridley is averaging 106 yards rushing per game, while PK Josh Jasper is first in the SEC in field goals (7), scoring (30 total points) and field goal percentage (87.5 pct.). Junior CB Patrick Peterson leads the SEC in punt returns (23.9 avg.), is second in kickoff returns (31.7 avg.) and tied for second interceptions with two. Senior LB Kelvin Sheppard leads the Tigers with 27 tackles, while DT Drake Nevis has 3.5 sacks to his credit.

STORYLINES

- LSU coach Les Miles is 24-1 in nonconference games at LSU with his only loss coming against Penn State in last year's Capital One Bowl.
- Coach Les Miles is also 25-1 in Saturday Night games in Tiger Stadium with the only loss coming a year ago to No. 1-ranked Florida, 13-3.
- Under Les Miles, LSU is 19-2 when a having a 100-yard rusher and the Tigers are 32-0 when reaching the 100-yard rushing mark as a team and holding the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SIXTH SEASON

LSU goes into the 2010 season coming off the best decade in the history of the program – winning a pair of national titles along with 99 games - and the driving force behind the Tigers' continued dominance at the national level has been head coach Les Miles.

Now in his sixth year with the Tigers, Miles has guided the Tigers to unmatched success – both on and off the field - in his first five years at the school, winning more games than any other coach in LSU history during a 6-year span and claiming both the BCS National Championship and the Southeastern Conference title in 2007.

It's been under Miles' leadership that LSU has established itself as one of the elite college football programs – winning 54 games overall, including four bowl contests, graduating 116 players, having 31 players selected in the NFL Draft, seven of which were first round picks, and producing nine first-team All-Americans.

Under Miles, the Tigers have also posted at least 11 victories in a season three times and they've finished ranked among the top five in the nation three straight years (2005, '06, and'07), a first at LSU.

With an astonishing 54-15 record in his first six years with the Tigers, Miles has climbed to the third-winningest coach in school history, while his four bowl victories rank second among all LSU head coaches.

In addition to his 54 victories, some other notable accomplishments during his first five years with the Tigers include: only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it twice; only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game; nine wins over coaches who have won national titles; and the only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in the class-room as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. Since the 2005 season, LSU has placed 89 players on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 116 earning their college diploma.

Going to back the 2007 season, LSU has graduated 52 of its 65 seniors, including 19 of 24 from the national championship team, 16 of 18 from the 2008 squad, and 17 of 23 from the 2009 team. Ten of the 13 players during that stretch who haven't completed their requirements for graduation are currently playing in the NFL. The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, Tigers have produced 31 NFL Draft picks over the past five years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards.

Now, with the Tigers becoming the first school in the country to have won two BCS National Championships, the foundation for the LSU football program continues to be solid. After 54 wins, including 19 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25, and with five straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of college football's premier programs.

The Series: First Meeting

Series Notes: LSU and West Virginia meet for the first time in football ... LSU is 1-3 all-time against current members of the Big East with the only win coming against Syracuse by a 13-10 count in the 1965 Sugar Bowl ... LSU is 1-1 vs. Syracuse, 0-1 vs. Rutgers, and 0-1 vs. Cincinnati ... LSU last played a member of the Big East in the 1989 Hall of Fame Bowl, losing to Syracuse 23-10 ... LSU's first game against a current member of the Big East came in 1897 when the Tigers dropped a 26-0 decision to Cincinnati ... LSU returns the trip to West Virginia next year as the Tigers and Mountaineers will square off on Sept. 24 in Morgantown.

LAST TIME OUT: #15/12 LSU 29 MISSISSIPPI STATE 7 (TIGER STADIUM - BATON ROUGE)

LSU's defense intercepted five passes and **Josh Jasper** set a school-record with five field goals as the Tigers remained undefeated with a 29-7 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium. LSU never trailed in the contest, scoring all 12 of its first half points on Jasper field goals. Jasper opener the scoring with a 44-yard field goal on LSU's first possession and then added second quarter field goals of 32, 51, and 37 yards to give the Tigers a 12-0 lead at halftime. Mississippi State pulled to within 12-7 early in the third quarter, however LSU responded with a 7-play, 60-yard drive capped with a 16-yard TD run by **Jordan Jefferson** to extend the lead to 19-7. A **Drake Nevis** interception on MSU's next possession setup another TD by the Tigers as **Stevan Ridley** scored on a 2-yard run to stretch the lead to 26-7. Jasper capped the scoring with 21-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter. Offensively, LSU scored on seven of its nine possessions (5 field goals, 2 TDs) and punted just one time in the game. Ridley led the LSU offense with 78 yards rushing and one TD, while Jefferson completed 10 of 16 passes for 97 yards to go with 40 rushing yards. Defensively, **Patrick Peterson** and **Morris Claiborne** each intercepted two passes as the Tigers limited MSU to 268 total yards. **Ryan Baker** led the Tigers with 10 tackles, while Nevis added nine tackles, 1.5 tackles for losses and an interception.

LSU Looks To Keep Non-Conference Regular-Season Streaks Alive Against West Virginia

LSU goes into the West Virginia game riding the nation's longest regular-season non-conference winning streak at 30 consecutive games. The 30-game non-conference regular-season winning streak dates back to the 2002 when the Tigers dropped a 26-8 decision to Virginia Tech in the season-opener. Since then, LSU has reeled off 30 straight non-conference wins during the regular season. In addition, LSU has won 28 consecutive non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, a streak that dates back to the 2000 season. The last time LSU lost a non-conference home game came on Sept. 23, 2000 when UAB stunned the Tigers, 13-10.

Tigers To Face Second Top 25 Opponent

The West Virginia contest marks LSU's second game against a top 25 opponent this year. LSU opened the season with a 30-24 win over No. 18 North Carolina in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff game in Atlanta. The West Virginia game represents the first time since 1991 that LSU has faced two Top 25 non-conference opponents during the regular-season. In 1991, LSU lost to No. 20 Texas A&M, 45-7, in College Station and then fell to No. 1 Florida State, 27-16, in Tiger Stadium on Oct. 26. To take it another step, LSU hasn't faced two ranked non-conference opponents during the first month of a season since 1988 when LSU opened the year with a 27-0 win over No. 10 Texas A&M in Tiger Stadium and then followed that with a 36-33 loss to No. 18 Ohio State in Columbus, Ohio.

Miles Is 19-11 vs. Top 25 Opponents

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 19-11 in games against ranked opponents following the win over North Carolina. Last year, LSU was 1-2 vs. top 25 teams with the win coming against Georgia in Athens. LSU won a school-record seven games against top 25 teams in 2007, which included a perfect 3-0 mark against top 10 teams. In games against teams ranked in the top 10, Miles is 8-7.

LSU Goes After a Fourth Straight Perfect September – Tigers Have Won School-Record 16 Straight In September

A win over West Virginia on Saturday will give LSU its fourth straight year of being perfect in September. LSU is currently riding a school-record 16-game winning streak during the month of September. LSU is 19-2 in games played in September under Les Miles. LSU hasn't lost a game in September since 2006 when the Tigers dropped a 7-3 decision to Auburn.

Saturday Night Special – Tigers Are 26-1 In Saturday Night Home Games Under Miles

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under **Les Miles**, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 40-4 in night games under Miles compared to a 14-11 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 26-2 in night games in Tiger Stadium under Miles and they are 26-1 in Saturday Night Games during the Miles era. The only two home losses at night for the Tigers under Miles have come in 2005 on a Monday night against Tennessee by a 30-27 count in overtime and then a 13-3 loss to No. 1-ranked Florida last year.

Tiger Defense Off To Great Start

Through three games, the LSU defense, despite having 10 freshmen (7 redshirt, 3 true) on its 2-deep, has been dominating as the Tigers have recorded 11 sacks and are allowing just 80.3 yards per game rushing – both of which rank No. 2 in the SEC. The 11 sacks is also the third-highest total in college football this year. LSU is allowing just 11.3 points per game, a figure that ranks No. 2 in the SEC and No. 5 in the nation. LB **Kelvin Sheppard** leads the unit with 27 tackles, while DT **Drake Nevis** is second in the league with 3.5 sacks to his credit through the first three games. Here's a look at some of notables by the LSU defense so far this year:

- LSU hasn't allowed a point in the first quarter this year and they've given up just 10 first half points.
- LSU has given up four TDs all year three of which had to go 13 plays to reach the endzone.
- LSU has 11 sacks already this year the Tigers didn't get their 11 sack last year until the 8th game of the year.
- In 38 possessions by the opposition this year, LSU's defense has forced 8 turnovers (3 fumbles, 5 interceptions), 19 punts and one safety. The other 10 possessions have ended by TD (4), field goal (2), and the end of a half (4).
- Seven players have recorded a sack and 14 players have a tackle for a loss.
- The 70 passing yards allowed against Vanderbilt were the fewest in an SEC game against the Tigers since 2006 when Arkansas passed for 62 yards.
- The 8 first downs by Vanderbilt were the fewest against LSU since 2006 when UL-Lafayette had 8 against the Tigers in the season opener. It was also the fewest in an SEC against LSU since 2004 when Alabama managed just 8 first downs in a 26-10 loss to the Tigers.
- LSU had five interceptions against Mississippi State, the most since picking off six passes against the Bulldogs in 2007. **Patrick Peterson** and **Morris Claiborne** had two picks apiece. It is the first time LSU had two players record multiple interceptions in the same game since at least 1976.

Josh Jasper Into the Record Books, Earns SEC Special Teams Player of the Week Honor

In just two years as LSU's primary place kicker, **Josh Jasper** has firmly established himself in the Tiger record books. Jasper, a senior from Memphis, Tenn., is the LSU career leader in field goal percentage having drilled 86.7 percent of his field goals. David Browndyke (1986-89) is second in that category with a 81.3 percent average (61-of-75). Jasper shattered the LSU game record for made field goals with five against Mississippi State and was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts. It broke the previous record of four in one game, set nine different times. Jasper's previous career high was four against Arkansas last season. He hit from 44, 32, 51, 37 and 21. Jasper also set an LSU record for field goals in a half with four in the first stanza. He is now 7-of-8 for the season and 26-of-30 for his career. For his career, he is 5-of-7 from 40 yards or more. Beyond 50-yards, Jasper is 3-of-4. With his five made field goals against the Bulldogs, Jasper moved into a tie for eighth place with Chris Jackson (2003-06) in LSU career field goals made with 26. Jasper is also a perfect 48-of-48 for his career in PATs. The 48 consecutive PATs put him into the LSU top five in consecutive PATs, surpassing John Corbello's 47 PATs (1999-2002).

Drake Nevis, One of the Nation's Top Defensive Lineman

Through three games, one can make a case that defensive tackle **Drake Nevis** has been the top defensive lineman in the nation. For the second straight game, Nevis was named SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week after recording nine tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and his first career interception in the win over Mississippi State. He became the the first LSU defensive lineman to record an interception since defensive end Kirston Pittman had one against Florida on Oct. 6, 2007. He was also the first LSU defensive tackle to pick off a pass since Chad Lavalais did so against Alabama on Nov. 15, 2003. Nevis produced five tackles and 2.5 sacks for a loss of 17 yards a week earlier at Vanderbilt. For the season, Nevis ranks second in the SEC in sacks with 3.5 and he leads the Tigers with five tackles for loss. Nevis has racked up 7.5 sacks and 23.5 tackles for loss for his career.

Ridley Has Career Night Against Vanderbilt

LSU RB **Stevan Ridley** had the game of his career vs. Vanderbilt, rushing for 159 yards and one touchdown in the 27-3 win over Vanderbilt. The 159 yards marked the first 100-yard game of his career and it was highlighted by the longest run of his career – a 65-yard TD in the fourth quarter. Through three games, Ridley has rushed for 318 yards and 2 TDs. He ranks third in the SEC with 106.0 yards rushing per game.

LSU is 19-2 Under Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU ran its record to 19-2 under **Les Miles** when a Tiger reaches 100 rushing yards following the win over Vanderbilt. LSU RB **Stevan Ridley** rushed for a career-best 159 yards and 1 TD in the victory over the Commodores The only two games under Miles that the Tigers didn't win despite having a 100-yard rusher came in 2008 vs. Georgia (Charles Scott, 144 yards), and 2007 vs. Arkansas (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

Ground Game

LSU pounded out 280 rushing yards against Vanderbilt in week 2, the most by the Tigers since rushing for 321 yards against Louisiana Tech on Nov. 10, 2007. It was also the most by an LSU team in a conference game since Sept. 22, 2007 when the Tigers had 290 rushing yards against South Carolina.

LSU's lefferson Second-Winningest Active QB in SEC With 12-5 Record

LSU junior **Jordan Jefferson** goes into the West Virginia game with a 12-5 overall record as the Tigers' starting quarterback. The 12 victories makes Jefferson the second-winningest active quarterback in the conference, trailing only Greg McElroy of Alabama, who is 17-0 as a starter. LSU backup **Jarrett Lee** has a 5-4 record as a starter, which ranks him sixth among all active quarterbacks in the SEC in terms of victories. Jefferson was 1-1 in 2008, 8-4 in 2009 and 3-0 this year, while Lee was 4-4 in 2008 and 1-0 last year. Jefferson is 6-1 as a starter in Tiger Stadium and he's 6-4 on the road.

LSU In the Top 25 For 20th Straight Week

The win over Mississippi State stretched LSU's streak to consecutive weeks in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll to 20 straight. LSU is No. 12 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll this week and No. 15 in the AP Top 25. LSU has been ranked in both polls every week since the start of last year. Since Miles took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll in 80 of the 84 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 105 of 107 games ranked in the top 25, including 67 of 69 games under **Les Miles**. LSU has a 54-13 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles.

Miles Has Victories Over Every SEC Team

With last year's win over Georgia, LSU coach **Les Miles** has recorded at least one victory over every team in the SEC. Miles is 29-13 in SEC regular season games and 30-14 in all league games (including SEC Championship Game). In addition, Miles has faced 48 different teams during his head coaching career and he's beaten all but two of them – Texas and Penn State.

Russell Shepard On The Ground And Through The Air

WR **Russell Sheppard** made the full-time move to wide receiver this offseason and his 2010 debut has been a success. Shepard accounted for 67 yards rushing, including a 50-yard touchdown run with 8:06 left in the second quarter versus North Carolina. He scored the season's first touchdown on a 6-yard pass from Jordan Jefferson with 8:57 left in the first quarter. In the win over UNC, Shepard became the first LSU player to record a receiving touchdown and a rushing touchdown in the same game since Early Doucet vs. Tulane on Sept. 23, 2006 (2 receiving, 1 rushing). In three games, Shepard leads the Tigers in touchdowns with three (2 rushing, 1 receiving).

Who's In and Who's Out for the Tigers

LSU lost starting right guard **Will Blackwell** on its first offensive play of the year against North Carolina. Blackwell suffered a broken ankle and will be out for what appears to be the remainder of the regular season. LSU also continues to be without WR **Chris Tolliver** (head). Tolliver returned to action briefly against Vanderbilt, but missed the Mississippi State game. LSU could get TE **Deangelo Peterson** (foot) back for this week's game against West Virginia. Peterson has missed all three games this year after suffering a foot injury during practice the week of the season-opener.

The ESPN Family of Networks Streak at 24 Straight Wins

LSU goes into the West Virginia game riding a 24-game winning streak on games played on the ESPN family of networks (excluding ABC). The last time LSU lost a game played on one of the ESPN networks came in 2005 when the Tigers dropped a 30-27 overtime decision to Tennessee on a Monday night (due to Hurricane Rita) on ESPN2. Since then, it's been 24 consecutive victories for the Tigers on the ESPN family. Here's a breakdown of the streak:

LSU Rebounds Following Loss Under Miles

For the first time during the **Les Miles** era, LSU went into a new season coming off a loss as the Tigers dropped a 19-17 decision to Penn State in the Capital One Bowl in January. LSU responded by beating North Carolina, 30-24, to run its record under Les Miles to 14-1 in games following a loss. LSU has only loss back-to-back games once under Miles, that coming in 2008 when the Tigers dropped consecutive games to Ole Miss and Arkansas in late November.

Miles is 31-6 Overall In Tiger Stadium

LSU goes into the West Virginia game with a 31-6 overall mark under **Les Miles** in games played in Tiger Stadium. Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama in 2008. LSU also has a loss to No. 1 ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium.

Patrick Peterson – Special All The Way Around

He's been labeled the best cornerback in college football. After his debut as LSU's primary return specialist, **Patrick Peterson** may add best return man in college football to his resume. Peterson set an LSU record for return yards against North Carolina with 257 yards - 157 on punt returns, 100 on kickoff returns. The 257 return yards were just 10 shy of breaking the SEC mark of 266 held by Nick Turner of Mississippi State. The 157 punt return yards ranked as the second-most in LSU history, only behind Norman Jefferson's 169 return yards versus Ole Miss in 1983. Peterson returned a punt 87 yards for a second quarter touchdown, which tied for the sixth-longest punt return in school history. He also set up another LSU touchdown with a 47-yard return to midfield midway through the second quarter. Peterson ranks No. 2 in the nation in punt returns (39.2), No. 3 in all-purpose yards (257.0) and No. 11 in kickoff returns (33.3). And, oh by the way, Peterson added five tackles, including one tackle for a loss, from the cornerback position. Peterson has scored touchdowns three different ways during his career at LSU - interception return (37 yards vs. Miss. State, '09), blocked field goal return (53 yards vs. Ole Miss, '09), and punt return (87 yards vs. North Carolina, '10). Peterson is one kickoff return for a TD away from becoming the first LSU player to score a touchdown four different ways since Kevin Faulk in the late 1990s.

Youth Movement

LSU played a total of 18 first-time players, including nine true freshmen, in the season-opening win over North Carolina. The nine true freshmen were the most to play in a season-opener under **Les Miles** and it's the most to see action in a single-season since 2006 when 10 true freshmen played for the Tigers. The breakdown of first-time players for the Tigers against North Carolina was: 9 true freshmen, 8 redshirt freshmen and one junior college transfer. Of the 18 first-timers, 11 were used on defense. Rush Defense Has Big Night Against North Carolina

LSU's rushing defense came up big in the season-opener against North Carolina as the Tigers allowed just 24 yards on the ground. The 24 rushing yards were the fewest by an opponent since Alabama had 20 yards rushing on Nov. 3, 2007. It was also the third-lowest total in a season-opener dating back to 1970 when the Tigers set a school-record by holding Texas A&M to minus-42 yards on the ground in a 20-18 loss. The other season-opener low total came in 2007 when the Tigers surrendered just 10 rushing yards in the 45-0 win over Mississippi State. Other defensive highlights from the North Carolina game include: four sacks from four different players and 15 total tackles for losses (-62 yards).

A New Face At Left Tackle

For the first time in 53 games, LSU started a new player at left tackle as senior **Joseph Barksdale** has taken over the spot this year. Barksdale, who has started a team-high 29 straight games (26 at right tackle, 3 at left tackle), replaced Ciron Black, who started a school-record 53 games at left tackle over the past four years. As a matter of fact, since the start of the 2002 season, only two players have started at left tackle for the Tigers - Andrew Whitworth and Black. Whitworth, now a starter for the Cincinnati Bengals, started 52 straight games at left tackle from 2002-05 with Black starting every game at the position from 2006-09.

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 216-60-4 (.778) at night under the lights compared to a 21-25-3 (.459) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 61-11 overall at home, which includes a 50-5 (.909) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and an 11-6 (.647) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. LSU Is 32-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman. In 68 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 49-5 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 33-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 32-0. Murphy To Wear Jersey No. 18

Jersey No. 18 – one of the new traditions in LSU history – has been passed down to senior running back **Richard Murphy** this year. The Jersey No. 18 tradition was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to its first national championship since 1958. His number (No. 18) became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed Jersey No. 18 down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped the Tigers to another national title in 2007. Richard Dickson wore Jersey No. 18 in 2008 and 2009. LSU coach **Les Miles**, along with input from the three other players who have worn Jersey No. 18, determined the Richard Murphy would wear the jersey in 2010.

Peterson Named SEC Special Teams and Lott IMPACT Player of the Week vs. North Carolina

LSU cornerback/return specialist **Patrick Peterson** picked up a pair of awards last week - earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors as well as being named the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week. Peterson, a 6-1, 211-pound junior from Pompano Beach, Fla., set an LSU record with 257 return yards in the Tigers' 30-24 win over North Carolina in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic. The return yards finished nine shy of tying the Southeastern Conference single-game record held by Nick Turner of Mississippi State. Peterson had an 87-yard punt return for a touchdown, a total of 157 yards in punt returns and 100 more in kickoff returns. He also contributed five tackles. Peterson is on watch lists for every postseason defensive award, including the Lott Trophy, Bronko Nagurski Award, Jim Thorpe Award and Chuck Bednarik Award. LSU will receive \$1,000 from the Lott Foundation for its general scholarship fund in recognition of Peterson's achievement.

LSU Capped Decade of Dominance In 2009

LSU put an end to the most successful decade in school history in 2009 by posting a 9-4 overall record and advancing to a major New Year's Day Bowl. LSU's 99 wins during from 2000-09 ranked second to only Florida (100) in the SEC. The decade saw LSU claim a pair of national championships in 2003 and 2007 and three SEC titles (2001, 2003, and 2007). LSU played in a bowl game each year, winning seven, four of which were BCS games. Five national award winners, 18 first-team All-Americans, six Academic All-Americans, 53 NFL Draft picks and 180 college graduates highlight a decade that has seen LSU establish itself as one of the premier football programs – on the field, in the classroom and in the community – in college athletics. Some other highlights for LSU during the decade include:

- Tied for first in the SEC in bowl appearances (10), SEC Championships (3) and Top 25 final rankings (9).
- Won more home games (59) than any other team in the SEC.
- Had the best regular-season non-conference record in the SEC with a 34-2 mark.
- Led the SEC in shutouts with 10
- With 99 wins from 2000-09, only three teams in the history of the SEC have won more games in a decade than LSU Alabama (103) in the 70's, and Florida, who won 102 games in the 90's and 100 games from 2000-09.
- The Tigers played 111 of its 130 games from 2000-09 ranked in the top 25.

LSU's Won At Least 8 Games For 10 Straight Years

By going 9-4 in 2009, LSU ran its streak of consecutive season with at least eight wins to 10 straight. LSU won at least eight games every year from 2000-09, and its current streak ranks as the fifth-longest in the nation. You can now refer to LSU as D-line U as the Tigers have made it a habit of producing All-Americans and NFL Draft picks from its defensive line. Since the 2003 season, LSU has had five defensive linemen earn a total of six First-Team All-America honors and 10 members of its defensive line selected in the NFL Draft. In 2007, DT Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defensive player in school history - winning four national awards - on his way to becoming the fifth overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft. In the spring of 2009, Defensive end Tyson Jackson became the highest LSU defender ever picked in the NFL Draft, going No. 3 overall to Kansas City. Said his favorite comic book growing up was The Green Lantern.

#72 Alex Hurst • OT

#9 Jordan Jefferson • QB

His father, John, was offered a basketball scholarship to play point guard at Nebraska ... John played two seasons for the Cornhuskers before transferring to Louisiana-Monroe to be with Jordan and his mother Elaine after he was born ... The second youngest quarterback to start a game for LSU, only behind Y.A. Tittle ... Was 21-0 as a starter at Destrehan High School, but had to sit out nearly all of his junior year in 2006 after breaking his wrist on current LSU defensive tackle Drake Nevis' helmet in a game ... He says the two have talked about the incident and Nevis claims "he didn't mean to do it" ... Models his game after Washington Redskins quarterback Donovan McNabb.

#12 Jarrett Lee • QB

Father, Stephen, was his coach at Brenham High School in Texas ... Father played college football at Angelo State ... Hails from Brenham, Texas -- home of Bluebell Ice Cream ... His favorite sports hero is John Elway.

#64 P.J. Lonergan • C

His dad, Patrick Lonergan, was an offensive lineman for LSU in 1978 ... Wears the same number as his dad, No. 64 ... Played goalie on his soccer team as a child, but found it "too boring" ... Played on the same high school team as current LSU safety Daniel Graff ... Models his game after Jeff Saturday of the Indianapolis Colts.

#18 Richard Murphy • RB

Both of his parents died of cancer ... Father died when he was 10 and his mother passed just before Christmas in 2005 ... His mother's illness (stomach cancer) was kept from Murphy until two weeks before her death ... His pregame ritual is talking to his four-year old son, Jamal ... "I just have to say something to him and tell him I love him." ... Jamal lives with Richard's oldest sister, Virginia Bates, in Rayville ... The morning after LSU when the BCS National Championship game in New Orleans in 2008, Murphy showed up at Rayville High and presented his game jersey to Principal Georgia Ineichen ... Inherited the No. 18 as selected by Coach Miles and the previous No. 18s following the 2009 season ... It's a tradition the Tigers established since Matt Mauck (2003) wore the number.

#2 Rueben Randle • WR

Nickname is "Big Reubeno" (pronounced "Roo-bean-oh") ... Played shortstop on his high school baseball team, and was scouted by several MLB teams ... Models his game after Chad Ochocinco, Terrell Owens and Randy Moss ... Wants to be a coach when his football career is over.

#34 Stevan Ridley • RB

He is the first running back to wear No. 34 since Cecil Collins ... Growing up his favorite player was Emmitt Smith, models his game after him. Wore No. 22 in high school to honor him ... Does community service back home in Natchez, Miss., at a children's home ... Also helps build houses back home for the poor ... Gets his motivation from his family being in the stands and wants to put the small town of Natchez on the map ... After football he wants to go into the Drug Enforcement Agency and be in Criminal Justice.

Wears the No. 10 because of Vince Young ... Ran and was elected to the LSU Student Government University Court in the spring of 2009 ... Says his motive was to have something else to

do besides football and it was a way to give back to the University ... He had to resign in the summer due to football taking up too much of his time.

#80 Terrence Toliver • WR

High school state champion in the long jump and double figure scorer on the basketball team ... Speaks at his former high school about the value of leadership in the community and responsible decision making ... Nickname is "Snug", which his mother gave him.

#17 Morris Claiborne • CB

Nickname is "Mo" or "M.C." ... Models his game after Denver Broncos cornerback Champ Bailey and teammate Patrick Peterson ... Does community service in his hometown of Shreveport, La., including installing smoke detectors and fans in nursing homes.

#4 Jai Eugene • S

Very mature for his age and has one of the largest families on the team ... Has one son, Jai, Jr. ... Has three sisters, Jami, Ja'lisi, Shaysa and two brothers, Samja and Syri ... Grew up a huge Chicago Cubs fan and watches WGN religiously ... Is superstitious and elected to wear No. 4 because he says he has worn a single-digit number his whole football career ... His pregame routine includes reading the Bible ... His all-time favorite LSU player is former running back Rondell Mealey ... Says nobody believes that he is an avid swimmer.

#43 Daniel Graff • S

Nickname is "Little Steltz" after former LSU All-American safety Craig Steltz ... Former scholarship track athlete at the University of Louisiana-Lafayette in 2005, but was forced to move home after Hurricane Katrina destroyed his house in Metairie, La. ... Attended the University of New Orleans as a student in 2006 before walking on at LSU in 2007 ... Awarded a scholarship prior to the 2009 season.

#38 Derek Helton • P

Picked up a ball his junior year in high school (Kansas), starting kicking it around and his teammates realized he had a gift ... Personal hero: Mom; went back to school, got master's degree with 2 kids; big struggle for her and "that motivates me".

#95 Lazarius Levingston • DT

Nickname is "Pep" ... Motivated by his mother ... A single parent, she motivated him to go to school and get an education ... His little sister, Marquesha, got shot in the head and was "an inch away from dying" ... Before he came to LSU, the one thing she told him "Pep, if you don't do anything else, make the people at LSU love you" ... This meant a lot to him.

#99 Sam Montgomery • DE

Nickname is "Sonic" because he loves Sonic the hedgehog ... Didn't start playing football until his junior year of high school ... Played on a club basketball team with former Kentucky guard John Wall in high school ... Chose football because his high school coach told him he would have a better future in it ... Nearly went to play basketball and football at North Carolina ... His brother died while Montgomery was in high school, and he says that he learned not to take things for granted.

#7 Patrick Peterson • CB

Legally changed his name from Johnson to Peterson after his 18th birthday ... His father, Patrick Peterson and his mother, formerly Shandra Johnson, were not married until Patrick Jr. was 12 years old ... Patrick Jr. kept his mother's name until he could legally change it on his own ... Relative of Washington Redskins wide receiver Santana Moss and New York Giants wide receiver Sinorice Moss ... Every offseason, he visits the little league football team he played for as a kid and spends a few days helping coach both offense and defense and leaves the team with a signed football from him ... He's done that since he was a junior in high school ... His favorite thing to do is spend time with his three younger sisters and mentor his only brother, who transferred back to Pompano Beach and lives with grandparents ... His father started teaching him the game of football at the age of 2 ... His father put a football in his hands at the hospital just after he was born ... Did not play football his sophomore year of high school because he "goofed off academically" ... Said that was an eye-opening experience because his father would not allow him to play and told him he had to watch the game from the stands and he broke down ... Wears the No. 7 because it was his father's number.

Notables

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 86th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 79th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 30 of its last 35 games at home. Head coach **Les Miles** is 25-1 in Saturday Night games in Death Valley.
- More than 85,000 fans have attended each of LSU's last 70 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 60 times, including a school-record 93,129 for the Oct. 10, 2009 game that pitted No. 4 LSU against No. 1 Florida.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 46 of the past 53 seasons.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 216-60-4 (.778) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 21-25-3 (.459) at home during the day in that span.



Tigers Survive North Carolina Rally To Win Season-Opener, 30-24

LSU held off a furious North Carolina rally as the Tigers opened their sixth season under Les Miles with a 30-24 victory over the 18th-ranked Tar Heels in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta. Leading 30-10 early in the fourth quarter and with North Carolina backed up on its own 3-yard line, the Tigers spotted the Tar Heels a 97-yard TD pass to close the gap to 30-17 with 10:34 to play. That TD changed the momentum of the game as the Tiger offense couldn't get anything going. LSU went 3-and-out on its next possession before the Tar Heels marched 67 yards on 13 plays to pull with 30-24 with 2:31 to play. After UNC recovered its onside kick, the Tiger defense stepped up, forcing what appeared to be a game-ending turnover on fourth down. With the ball on the UNC 39-yard line and with just over a minute left, LSU tried to run out the clock but a fumble by Stevan Ridley gave the ball back to UNC with 1:08 left in the contest. With no timeouts, the Tar Heels marched all the way to the LSU 6-yard line before the Tiger defense batted away passes in the endzone on consecutive downs to seal the victory. LSU jumped out to a 30-10 halftime lead thanks to a series of big plays in the second quarter, including an 87-yard punt return for a TD by **Patrick Peterson**, a 50-yard TD run by Russell Shepard and a 51-yard TD pass from Jordan Jefferson to Rueben Randle. Peterson finished with a school-record 257 return yards, just nine yards shy of tying the SEC record. LSU's defense limited UNC to just 24 yards rushing, while the Tigers racked up 162 yards on the ground, 81 coming from Ridley and 67 from Shepard.

Ridley Rushes Tigers Past Vanderbilt in SEC Opener, 27-3

Stevan Ridley rushed for a career-best 159 yards and one touchdown and the LSU defense dismantled Vanderbilt as the Tigers broke open a tight game with 17 fourth quarter points in the 27-3 win over the Commodores in Nashville. LSU rolled up 392 yards of total offense, including 280 on the ground, as the Tigers overpowered the Commodores on the both sides of the ball in the victory. After a scoreless first quarter, Russell Shepard got the Tigers on the board with a 30-yard run just 40 seconds into the second quarter. Josh Jasper tacked on a 36-yard field goal as LSU led 10-0 at halftime. Vanderbilt pulled to within 10-3 early in the third quarter on a field goal. From there, it was all LSU as the Tigers scored 17 fourth quarter points highlighted by a 65-yard TD run by Ridley. Alfred Blue scored his first career TD on a 6-yard run and Jasper kicked a 23-yard field goal to round out the scoring for the Tigers. For the game, LSU's defense forced punts on 10 of Vanderbilt's 12 possessions – including all seven first half possessions - as the Tigers limited the Commodores to only 135 total yards – 65 rushing, 70 passing. Vanderbilt crossed into LSU territory just twice in the contest and they got inside the Tiger redzone just one time. Drake Nevis led the Tigers with five tackles and 2.5 sacks, while Kelvin Sheppard added nine stops for an LSU defense that recorded six sacks and held Vanderbilt to only eight first downs.

Jasper Shatters LSU Field Goal Record As LSU Downs Mississippi State, 29-7

LSU's defense intercepted five passes and **Josh Jasper** set a school-record with five field goals as the Tigers remained undefeated with a 29-7 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium. LSU never trailed in the contest, scoring all 12 of its first half points on Jasper field goals. Jasper opener the scoring with a 44-yard field goal on LSU's first possession and then added second quarter field goals of 32, 51, and 37 yards to give the Tigers a 12-0 lead at halftime. Mississippi State pulled to within 12-7 early in the third quarter, however LSU responded with a 7-play, 60-yard drive capped with a 16-yard TD run by **Jordan Jefferson** to extend the lead to 19-7. A **Drake Nevis** interception on MSU's next possession setup another TD by the Tigers as **Stevan Ridley** scored on a 2-yard run to stretch the lead to 26-7. Jasper capped the scoring with 21-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter. Offensively, LSU scored on seven of its nine possessions (5 field goals, 2 TDs) and punted just one time in the game. Ridley led the LSU offense with 78 yards rushing and one TD, while Jefferson completed 10 of 16 passes for 97 yards to go with 40 rushing yards. Defensively, **Patrick Peterson** and **Morris Claiborne** each intercepted two passes as the Tigers limited MSU to 268 total yards. **Ryan Baker** led the Tigers with 10 tackles, while Nevis added nine tackles, 1.5 tackles for losses and an interception.
