Top-Ranked LSU Faces Fifth Top 25 Opponent As Auburn Comes To Tiger Stadium

LSU looks to go 8-0 for the first time since 1973 on Saturday when the top-ranked Tigers host Auburn at 2:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised nationally by CBS, the third time this year that LSU has appeared on the network. LSU goes into the game with a 7-0 overall mark and a 4-0 league record following last week's 38-7 win over Tennessee in Knoxville. For the first time in school history, LSU has won its first seven games by double-digits. LSU goes into the game ranked No. 1 in the first BCS Standings which were released on Sunday. LSU is also No. 1 in the Associated Press poll and the Harris Interactive poll and the Tigers are No. 2 in the USA Today Coaches poll. Auburn, ranked No. 19 in the AP poll and No. 23 in the USA Today Coaches poll, brings a 5-2 overall record and a 3-1 conference mark into the game. Auburn is coming off a 17-6 win over Florida on Saturday. Auburn represents the fifth Top 25 team that LSU has faced this season. LSU brings a 14-game Tiger Stadium winning streak and an 8-game overall winning streak into the Auburn contest. LSU is playing its fourth straight game as the nation's No. 1 ranked team - the longest stretch since 1959. LSU is 17-3 all-time in games played as the nation's No. 1 ranked team, which includes a 5-2 mark under Les Miles. LSU brings one of the top defenses in the nation into the Auburn games as the Tigers are ranked in the top 10 nationally in four major categories scoring defense (7th at 11.7), rush defense (6th at 75.1), pass efficiency defense (6th), and total defense (4th at 251.9). Offensively, LSU is third in the SEC in scoring with 38.4 points per game. LSU is averaging 369.1 total yards per game (191.1 rushing, 178.0 passing). QB Jarrett Lee has completed 62.2 percent of his passes (84-of-135) for 1,085 yards, 11TDs and just 1 interception. A trio of sophomores lead the Tigers in rushing – Spencer Ware (512 yards, 6 TDs), Michael Ford (359 yards, 6 TDs) and Alfred Blue (235 yards, 4 TDs). Rueben Randle (28 catches, 532 yards, 5 TDs) and true freshman WR Odell Beckham Jr. (24 catches, 292 yards, 2 TDs) lead the Tigers in receiving. Defensively, LSU has allowed just three TDs in its three SEC games (1 each to Florida, Kentucky, and Tennessee) and the Tigers have held their first four conference opponents to a combined 31 points. S Brandon Taylor leads the Tigers in tackles with 44, while CB Morris Claiborne is tops on the team in interceptions with 3. CB Tyrann Mathieu continues to be LSU's top all-around defender with 42 tackles, 5.0 TFL, 5 PBUs, 4 forced fumbles, 3 fumble recoveries, 2 interceptions and 1.5 sacks. Other defensive standouts include DE Sam Montgomery (21 tackles, 5.5 TFL, 3.0 sacks), S Eric Reid (36 tackles, 1 int.) and DT Bennie Logan (24 tackles, 4.5 TFL, 2.0 sacks).

STORYLINES

- LSU is 7-0 for the second straight year and the Tigers are a victory away from being 8-0 for the first time since 1973 and just the fourth time in school history. LSU won its first 8 games in 1908, '58, and '73.
- In 28 quarters of action, LSU's defense has held its opponent without a TD in 21 quarters.
- LSU has turned the ball over just

three times this year (2 fumbles, 1 interception). LSU's last turnover came in the fourth quarter against Mississippi State. LSU has gone 277 offensive snaps, 48 possessions and 144 minutes and 17 seconds of possession time since its last turnover.

• In 420 minutes of action this year, LSU has trailed for just 6 minutes and 33 seconds. LSU hasn't trailed since

the 2Q of the Oregon game in week 1.

- LSU's given up just 31 points in its first four SEC games, the fewest since 1985 when the Tigers allowed only 27 points in first four league games.
- LSU is ranked in the top 25 for the 40th straight poll - nation's 3rd-longest streak - and for the 101st time in 105 weeks under Les Miles.

Les Miles

HEAD COACH • SEVENTH SEASON

The driving force behind the LSU Tigers' continued dominance at the national level is head coach Les Miles. His steadfast approach expects excellence and dedication from his players, coaching staff and all who contribute to the success of LSU Football.

Since taking over as head coach at LSU in January of 2005, Miles has guided the Tigers to the 2007 BCS National Title and to three Top 5 rankings. Miles' sevenyear record with the Tigers is 69-17, which also includes a Southeastern Conference title, two appearances in the SEC Championship Game and five bowl victories.

LSU's success under Miles hasn't been just on the playing field as the Tigers have also excelled in both the classroom as well as being active participants within the community. With an approach that demands his players strive for excellence and pursue an education while representing the University in first-class fashion, the response by the players has been overwhelming. In addition to averaging over 10 wins for the past six years, the Tigers have also had 104 players earn a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll with another 133 earning their college diploma. LSU has graduated 62 of its 80 seniors since the 2007 season.

The Tigers also played an instrumental role in the recovery efforts in 2005 following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, two of the most devastating natural disasters to hit the Louisiana coast.

On the field, the Tigers have produced 37 NFL Draft picks over the past six years, including a school-record four first-round picks in the 2007 draft. In 2007, senior defensive tackle Glenn Dorsey became the most decorated defender in school history, winning four national awards the Lombardi, Outland, Nagurski and Lott Trophies.

Cornerback Patrick Peterson claimed two national awards in 2010 - the Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back and the Bednarik Award as the country's top defender

The foundation for LSU football is more stable than ever. After 69 wins over the past six years -- including 27 over foes ranked among the nation's top 25 -- and with six straight Top 10 recruiting classes, Miles and the Tigers have solidified LSU's standing as one of college football's premier programs.

One of Les Miles' most impressive qualities is his selfless desire to assist others. Each year, Miles and his wife Kathy host an event that raises nearly \$100,000 for the Children's Miracle Network. In addition, he is active in community service events such as the Mary Bird Perkins Cancer annual fundraiser, the Special Olympics and the Baton Rouge Children's Advocacy Center Celebrity Waiter Event.

Miles spent a week in June of 2006 taking part in the USO Tour, where the Tiger head coach visited American troops serving in Kuwait and Iraq. Miles was joined on the tour, which serves as a morale booster for the troops serving abroad, by former Notre Dame coach Lou Holtz and Tampa Bay Rays owner Vincent Naimoli.

The week-long trip saw Miles visit several U.S. bases in Kuwait before traveling to Iraq, where he met with hundreds of American troops and even flew over the city of Baghdad in a Black Hawk helicopter.

When Miles isn't overseeing his LSU football family, he can most likely be found in the bleachers supporting his wife and kids at their sporting events.

LSU and Auburn face each other for the 46th time with LSU holding a 24-20-1 lead in the series ... The teams have met every year since the SEC expansion in 1992 (19 games) with Auburn holding a 10-9 advantage in those contests ... Prior to 1992, the teams played only eight times from 1969 to 1989 ... Home team has won 10 of the last 11 games in the series with the exception coming in 2008 when LSU won at Auburn, 26-21 ... Last year, Auburn won 24-17 at Jordan-Hare Stadium, snapping LSU's 3-game winning streak in the series ... Between 1996-99, the visiting team won each game ... Six of last seven games have been decided by a touchdown or less ... The winner of the LSU-Auburn game has gone on to win the SEC Western Division in seven of the last 11 years (exceptions came in 2002, 2006, 2008, 2009) ... LSU is 14-5-1 all-time against Auburn in Baton Rouge ... LSU coach **Les Miles** is 4-2 vs. Auburn, which includes a 3-0 mark in Tiger Stadium.

LAST TIME OUT: #1/2 LSU 38, TENNESSEE 7 • KNOXVILLE, TENN.

Jarrett Lee tossed three touchdown passes and Spencer Ware rushed for a score and caught a pass for a TD as top-ranked LSU used a dominating second half to post a 38-7 win over Tennessee in Knoxville. The 31-point win marked the largest margin of victory by the Tigers over the Vols. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers accounted for 38 minutes of possession time, including 22 of a possible 30 minutes in the second half. After a scoreless first quarter, LSU took a 7-0 lead on a 5-yard TD pass from Lee to Rueben Randle. Morris Claiborne setup LSU's first score after returning an interception 89-yards to the Tennessee 5-yard line. LSU increased the lead to 14-0 five minutes later when Ware scampered 13 yards on a screen pass for a TD. Tennessee responded with a TD to cut the lead to 14-7, but a Drew Alleman 18-yard field goal just before half gave the Tigers a 17-7 lead at intermission. The second half was all LSU as the Tigers scored TDs on all three of their possessions. LSU had TD scoring drives of 12 plays, 66yards, 7:01; 16 plays, 99 yards, 8:44; and 10 plays, 65 yards, 6:08 in the second half. LSU ran 38 plays in the second half compared to just 19 for the Vols. LSU also outgained Tennessee 222-66 in the second half as the Tigers outscored the Vols 21-0 in the final 30 minutes of the contest. Ware led the Tigers with 80 rushing yards and a score. Lee connected on 13-of-17 passes for 138 yards and a career-high tying three scores. Brandon Taylor led LSU with 10 tackles.

Undefeated LSU holds the top spot in the first BCS rankings of the year, which were released on Sunday night. The BCS formula is consisted of three parts – USA Today Coaches poll, Harris Interactive, and computer polls. LSU stands atop the first standings with a .9522 BCS average. Alabama is second in the BCS standings with a .9519 average, followed by Oklahoma (.9301), Oklahoma State (.8568), and Boise State (.8027). Other SEC teams in the BCS standings include: Arkansas at No. 9, South Carolina at No. 14, and Auburn at No. 20.

LSU's No. 1 In AP Poll For Fourth Straight Week; Longest Streak For Tigers Since 1959

LSU remained No. 1 in the nation for the fourth straight week on Sunday as the Tigers held onto the top spot in the Associated Press poll following their 38-7 win over Tennessee. LSU is also No. 1 in the Harris Interactive Poll, which was released for the first time this year on Sunday, and the Tigers are No. 2 in the USA Today Coaches Poll. LSU will play its fourth straight game as the nation's top-ranked team on Saturday against Auburn. LSU hasn't played four straight games as the nation's No. 1 ranked team since 1959. LSU is ranked No. 1 during the regular season for the first time since 2007. **Les Miles** has guided LSU to No. 1 rankings during the regular season on three different occasions (twice in 2007 and now this year). Miles and Paul Dietzel in 1958 and 1959 are the only two coaches in school history to have teams ranked No. 1 in the nation in two different seasons. LSU first appeared at No. 1 in the AP Poll on Oct. 28, 1958 following a 10-7 win over Florida. LSU remained No. 1 in the AP Poll for the remainder of the year on its way to claiming the national title in 1958.

LSU Is 17-3 In Games Played As No. 1 Ranked Team

LSU goes into the Auburn game with a 17-3 record in games played as the nation's No. 1 ranked team. LSU was 5-0 as the No. 1-ranked team in 1958, followed by a 7-1 record at the top spot in 1959. LSU was 2-2 as the No. 1-ranked team in 2007 and they are 3-0 this year. LSU is 5-2 under **Les Miles** in games as the nation's top-ranked team.

At 7-0, LSU Won First Seven Games In Consecutive Season For First Time Since 1972-73

With a 7-0 overall record, LSU has won its first seven games in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1972-73. LSU won its first seven games last year before falling to Auburn in week 8. In 1973, the Tigers won their first nine games of the season before falling to Alabama on Nov. 22 by a 21-7 count. This year is the sixth time in the SEC era in which the Tigers have won their first seven games. LSU also won its first seven games in 1958, '59, '72, '73 and 2010. Only two teams in modern day school history (SEC era) have won more than seven straight games to open a season – 1958 and 1973. The 1958 team won all 11 of its games on its way to claiming the school's first national title in football. In 1959, LSU won seven straight before falling to Tennessee in week 8; in 1972 LSU opened 7-0 b before dropping a 35-21 decision to No. 2 Alabama in week 8. **Les Miles**, Paul Dietzel and Charles McClendon are the only coaches in LSU history to lead the Tigers to 7-0 starts twice.

LSU's Won First Four SEC Games In Back-to-Back Seasons For First Time Since 1935-36

LSU's won its first four SEC games in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1935-36 when the Tigers went 5-0 and 6-0, respectively. Last year, LSU opened 4-0 before falling to Auburn in its fifth conference game. Prior to last season, the last time LSU started 4-0 in SEC play came in 1987. LSU hasn't gone 5-0 in conference play since 1973 when the Tigers were 5-0 before falling to Alabama in their final SEC game of the season.

LSU-Auburn Winner Usually Wins The West

Since the 2000 season, the winner of the LSU-Auburn game has gone on to represent the SEC Western Division in the league's championship game six times. The only exception came in 2002 (Arkansas), 2006 (Arkansas), 2008 (Alabama) and 2009 (Alabama). The following is a look at the LSU-Auburn series dating back to the 2000 and the impact the win had on the remainder of the season:

Home Team Streak in LSU-Auburn Series Snapped In 2008

Prior to LSU's win at Auburn in 2008, the home team in the LSU-Auburn series had won eight straight games played between the teams. LSU ended that streak in 2008 when the Tigers scored with just over a minute left to claim the road win, 26-21. Prior to the 2008 game, the last time a road team won in the series came in 1999 when Auburn posted a 41-7 victory over LSU in Tiger Stadium. Ironically, that was the fourth straight game in which the road team had won in the series. LSU beat Auburn at Auburn in 1996 and 1998; and Auburn won in Tiger Stadium in 1997 and 1999.

Expect The Unexpected When LSU and Auburn Get Together

Since 1988, the LSU-Auburn series has become one of close calls and one in which the teams and the fans have come to expect the unexpected. The following is a listing of some of the notable happenings in the series since 1988: 1988: LSU's Tommy Hodson hit Eddie Fuller in the back of the endzone on fourth down with 1:41 left to lift the Tigers to a 7-6 win over fourth-ranked Auburn. The noise from the stadium crowd after the play registered on a seismograph across campus prompting the game to be titled "The Earthquake Game."

1994: Auburn intercepted five passes in the fourth quarter, returning three for TDs as the Tigers rally to post a 30-26 win over LSU in a game that become known as "The Interception Game."

1995: LSU donned white jerseys at home for the first time since the early 1980's and promptly went out and upset fifth-ranked Auburn, 12-6. LSU preserved the win with an interception in the endzone on the last play of the game. The contest was dubbed the "Bring Back the Magic" game.

1996: With the old Auburn Sports Arena burning to the ground a couple hundred yards away, LSU beat Auburn, 19-15, in a game titled "The Night the Barn Burned."

1997: Titled "The Comeback", Auburn QB Dameyune Craig engineered a 10-play, 80-yard drive late in the fourth quarter to spark the Tigers to a 31-28 upset of 10th-ranked LSU.

2004: Titled "The Call", Auburn appeared to have missed an extra point with 1:14 left that would have left the game tied at 9-9. However, LSU was called for a penalty on the extra point, thus giving Auburn a second chance at winning the game. The second PAT was good and Auburn held on for a 10-9 win, snapping LSU's 10-game winning streak.

2005: Auburn missed five field goals, including one in overtime, as LSU held on for a 20-17 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The win helped propel LSU to the SEC Western Division title and the game is now known as the "Field Goal Game".

2007: "Can't See Me" Demetrius Byrd caught a 22-yard TD pass from Matt Flynn with just one second left to send LSU to a 30-24 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The play seemed to have caught Auburn off-guard as the Tigers could have attempted a 39-yard field goal for the win. However, LSU took one final shot at the endzone as Flynn connected with Byrd for the score, who then gave the "Can't See Me" gesture to the LSU student section after coming up with the catch.

2008: Freshman quarterback **Jarrett Lee** led LSU on a 7-play, 54-yard capped with an 18-yard TD pass to Brandon LaFell as the LSU Tigers rallied for a 26-21 win over Auburn. It marked the second straight year that LSU scored in the closing moments of the game to beat Auburn.

The LSU-Auburn Connection

Sam Nader, LSU's assistant AD for Football Operations, graduated from Auburn in 1967 after playing quarterback for the Tigers ... LSU TE coach **Steven Ensminger** coached at Auburn from six years from 2003-08 ... Ensminger coached quarterbacks in 2003 and then tight ends from 2004-08.

LSU's Won First Seven Games By Double-Digits – A First In School History

LSU extended its streak of consecutive wins by double-figures to start a season to seven with the 38-7 victory over Tennessee. The 7-game double-digit streak is the longest in school history to open a season. Dating back to last year's 41-24 win over Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl, LSU has won eight striaght games – all by double-figures – which ties the school record set in 1936. Prior to this year, LSU's longest streak to open a season with double-digit victories was five, which has been done three times in the SEC era (1933-presnet): 1958, 1959, and 2007. LSU won the national title in both 1958 and 2007.

Chris Faulk Named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week

LSU sophomore guard **Chris Faulk** earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors on Monday due to his part in the Tigers' 38-7 win over Tennessee. Faulk played all 69 offensive snaps and had a team-high 12.5 knockdowns. He helped pave the way for an LSU offense that racked up 237 rushing yards and accounted for 38 minutes of possession time, including 22 of a possible 30 minutes in the second half. It's the second straight week that an LSU offensive lineman has been honored by the league as senior guard **Will Blackwell** won the award last week.

LSU's Honey Badger – Tyrann Mathieu – Making Plays All Over Field

LSU sophomore CB **Tyrann Mathieu**, dubbed the Honey Badger by the national media, continues to impress with his uncanny ability to come up with big play after big play. Mathieu did it again against Florida, intercepting a pass in the endzone for his third straight game with a takeaway (the streak ended against Tennessee). Against Kentucky, Mathieu recovered a fumble that he forced, and then returned it 23 yards for a touchdown. It's was the second time this year that Mathieu returned a fumble that he forced for a touchdown. Now just 20 games into his career, Mathieu has established the LSU career record for forced fumbles with nine, breaking the previous mark of seven held by Ali Highsmith. Mathieu has been responsible for 10 turnovers (4 interceptions, 6 fumble recoveries) and he's also forced another 9 fumbles. In addition to his turnover creating ability, Mathieu has established himself as an outstanding defender, ranking second on team with 42 tackles this year. In 20 career games, Mathieu has 13.5 tackles for loss, 6.0 sacks and 11 pass breakups.

Tigers Bowl Eligible For Record 12th Straight Year

The win over Florida on Oct. 8 gave the Tigers their sixth win this year, thus making LSU bowl eligible for a school-record 12th straight season. Since the start of the 2000 season, LSU has played in the BCS National Championship twice (2003, 2007), Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (2000, 2005, 2008), Sugar Bowl (2001, 2003, 2006), Cotton Bowl (2002, 2010)) and Capital One Bowl (2004, 2009) in consecutive years.

LSU Continues Its Overall and Tiger Stadium Winning Streaks

LSU ran its Tiger Stadium winning streak to 14 straight with the win over Florida. The Tigers also extended their overall winning streak to eight straight, dating back to the victory over Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl, with the with over Tennessee. The 14-game Tiger Stadium winning streak ranks as the fourth-longest active streak in college football, while LSU's eight consecutive overall wins ties with Alabama and Boise State as the third-longest streak in the nation. LSU Defense Has Held Opponents Without TDs In 21-Of-28 Quarters; LSU Has Scored TDs in 22-of-28 Qtrs

LSU goes into the Auburn game having held its opponents without a touchdown in 21 of 28 quarters this year. LSU hasn't allowed a first quarter TD all year as the Tigers have limited their opponent to just three first quarter field goals through seven games. LSU went nine straight quarters without allowing a touchdown in wins over Northwestern State, Mississippi State and West Virginia. The Mountaineers snapped the streak with a second quarter TD in week 4. On the flip side, the Tigers have scored TDs in 22 of 28 quarters this year on their way to averaging 38.5 points per game. LSU saw its streak of consecutive quarters with a TD snapped at 11 against Florida when the Tigers only had a field goal in the third quarter. The Tigers had scored in 31 consecutive quarters before going scoreless in the first quarter against Tennessee.

LSU Leads SEC, Ranked No. 4 In Nation In Turnover Margin; LSU's 3 Turnovers Ties For Fewest In Nation

One reason for LSU's success through the first seven games of the season has been its ability to take care of the football as the Tigers have turned the ball over just three times (2 fumbles, 1 interception) all year. LSU leads the SEC and ranks No. 4 in the nation in turnover margin at plus-1.86 per game. Overall, LSU is plus-13 in the turnover margin category as the Tigers have forced 16 turnovers (6 fumbles, 10 interceptions), while giving the ball up only three times. LSU's three turnovers ties with Wisconsin as the fewest in the nation. LSU has now gone 16 straight quarters without a turnover. LSU's last turnover came in the fourth quarter of the win over Mississippi State.

LSU's Gone 42 Possessions Without A Turnover

LSU goes into the Auburn game riding a streak of 48 offensive possessions without a turnover. LSU hasn't turned the ball over since the 10:08 mark in the fourth quarter of the Mississippi state game. Since then LSU's had 48 possessions, 277 offensive snaps and 144 minutes and 17 seconds of possession time without a turnover. LSU is currently tied with Wisconsin for the national lead in fewest turnovers (3) and the Tigers are second behind Utah State (0) in interceptions thrown.

In 420 Minutes, LSU's Trailed For Just 6 Minutes And 33 Seconds This Year

In 420 minutes of football this year, LSU has trailed for just 6 minutes and 33 seconds. The only time LSU has trailed in a game this year came in the season opener when Oregon led 6-3 in the first quarter and 13-9 in the second quarter. The Tigers trailed 6-3 for 59 seconds (from 0:42 in the first quarter to 14:43 in the second quarter) and then again 13-9 from the 5:16 mark in the second quarter until there were 44 seconds left in the half. LSU regained the lead for good at the 0:44 mark in 20 when **Rueben Randle** caught a 10-yard TD pass from **Jarrett Lee**. LSU hasn't trailed since.

LSU Scores 10th Defensive Touchdown In Miles Era Against Kentucky

For the 10th time since 2005, LSU scored a defensive touchdown when CB **Tyrann Mathieu** recovered a fumble that he forced and raced 23 yards for a TD in the 35-7 win over Kentucky. It's the first defensive touchdown – and third on a non-offensive play - for the Tigers this year. LSU is 8-1 in games under **Les Miles** when scoring a defensive touchdown. Here's a look at the defensive scores for the Tigers since 2005:

It marked the second time this year that the Tigers have scored on special teams as CB **Tyrann Mathieu** stripped Oregon punt returner Kenyon Barner of the ball and then scooped it up and ran 3-yards for the score in the season opener. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all seven seasons under Miles. LSU is 13-1 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. Tigers Take Advantage Of Turnovers As 10 Of 16 Have Resulted In Points

LSU taken advantage of the turnovers created by its defense as the Tigers have capitalized on 10 of the 16 takeaways this year. Against West Virginia, the Tigers scored three touchdowns following takeaways. LSU's 16 takeaways have resulted in a total of 64 points through seven games. Note: LSU has allowed just 82 points all year. On the otherhand, LSU has allowed just a field goal following its three turnovers this year. LSU Only Team In Nation With Four Top 25 Wins

Seven weeks into the season, LSU is the only team in the nation with four wins over Top 25 teams. Even more impressive, three of the four wins have come away from Tiger Stadium. LSU is also the only team in the SEC to play two non-conference BCS opponents away from home this season. It marked the fourth time in school history and the first since 1988 that LSU played three Top 25 opponents through the first four weeks of the season. However, it's the first time in school history all three of those contests have come away from home.

LSU Leads SEC And Ranks No. 4 In Nation In Redzone Offense

LSU leads the SEC and ranks No. 4 in the nation in redzone offense as the Tigers have converted on 34-of-35 trips (28 TDs, 6 FGs) inside the redzone this year. LSU is tied with Oklahoma State for the most redzone TDs this year with 28 each. LSU ran its streak of successful redzone attempts to 43 before missing a field goal from the 13-yard line against West Virginia. Prior to the unsuccessful redzone trip against West Virginia, the last time LSU didn't score when reaching the opponents 20-yard line came last year in the second quarter against McNeese State on Oct. 10 when the Tigers missed a field goal.

LSU's 32-4 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 32-4 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle, which includes a 6-0 record this year. LSU has won the turnover battle in every game this year with the exception of the Northwestern State contest in week 2. This year, LSU is plus-13 in the turnover margin category, which leads the SEC. Since the start of the 2005 season, LSU is plus-35 in the turnover margin category. The Tigers have also won 16 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 14-2 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent.

LSU Sweeps SEC East For Second Straight Year; Tigers Have Won 6 In A Row Vs. SEC East

LSU's win over Tennessee gave the Tigers their second straight sweep over the SEC Eastern Division, the first time in school history that's been accomplished. LSU is currently riding a school-record tying 6-game winning streak against teams from the SEC Eastern Division. Since going to the divisional format in 1992, this is the first time that LSU's gone

3-0 against the SEC East in back-to-back seasons. Last year, LSU had wins over Florida (24-21), Tennessee (16-14) and Vanderbilt (27-3). LSU's last loss against a team from the SEC East came in 2009 against Florida (13-3) in Tiger Stadium. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 16-7 against teams from the SEC Eastern Division. Since the start of the divisional format in the SEC in 1992, LSU is 34-29 overall against the Eastern Division, which includes a 3-1 mark in the SEC Championship Game. LSU's longest winning streak against teams from the SEC East came from 2001—03 when the Tigers won six straight (def. Kentucky (29-25) and Tennessee (31-20) in 2001; def. Florida (36-7), So. Carolina (38-14) and Kentucky (33-30) in 2002; def. Georgia (17-10) in 2003. Florida snapped LSU's 6-game winning streak wtih a 19-7 win in 2003.

LSU Pulls A Rarity Under Miles Against Mississippi State

With a 200-yard passer and a 100-yard rusher against Mississippi State, LSU did something for the first time since the 2008 season in the win over the Bulldogs. Against Mississippi State, **Jarrett Lee** tossed for 213 yards and **Spencer Ware** rushed for 107 yards in the LSU victory. It marked the first time since the Georgia game in 2008 (Jarrett Lee 287 passing yards, Charles Scott 144 rushing yards) that the Tigers had a 200-yard passers and a 100-yard rusher in the same game. LSU's done it 11 time under **Les Miles** and the Tigers are 9-2 in those games. Here's a look at the 200-yard passer and 100-yard rusher games since 2005 for LSU:

LSU Runs Top 25 Streak To 40 Straight

With its No. 1 national ranking in the Associated Press poll and No. 2 in the USA Today Coaches poll, LSU ran its streak to consecutive weeks in the national rankings to 40 straight. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 100 of the 104 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 121 of 125 games ranked in the top 25, including 84 of 86 games under Miles. LSU has a 68-16 record in games played as a top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU hasn't played as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 vs. Arkansas and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. LSU was ranked in the preseason Top 25 for the 11th straight year heading into 2011. The following is a look at the longest current streaks for teams in the AP Top 25:

LSU is 24-2 Under Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 24-2 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. The Tigers, who are 5-0 in road games when having a 100-yard rusher, have won 10 straight dating back to the Tulane game in 2008 when a running back reached the 100-yard mark. **Spencer Ware**, with 109 yards against Florida, became the latest Tiger to reach the 100-yard mark for the Tigers.

Miles Has 69 Wins at LSU; He's Averaging Over 10 Wins A Year as Head Coach of the Tigers

LSU coach **Les Miles** recorded his 69th victory at the school in the 38-7 win over Tennessee. Now in his seventh year at LSU, Miles is 69-17 in his 86 games with the Tigers. Only two coaches in LSU history have won more games than Miles – Charles McClendon (137) and Bernie Moore (83). In terms of active SEC coaches, only Steve Spurrier (72) needed fewer games than Miles to get to 60 victories. Miles is also averaging 10.3 wins a year at LSU, making him the only coach in school history to average double-figure wins in five or more years.

Miles is 40-6 Overall In Tiger Stadium; Tigers Have Won 14 Straight At Home

LSU is 40-6 in seven seasons under **Les Miles**. LSU was a perfect 7-0 at home in 2010 and the Tigers are currently riding a 14-game home winning streak. Of LSU's six home losses under Miles, three have come in overtime - 30-27 loss to Tennessee on a Monday night in 2005; a 50-48 triple-overtime loss to Arkansas on a Friday afternoon in November of 2007; and a 27-21 overtime loss to No. 1 Alabama in 2008. LSU also has a loss to No. 1 ranked Florida in Tiger Stadium.

LSU's Closed Out Another Perfect September; Tigers September Win Streak at 21

LSU closed out the month of September without a loss for the fifth straight year as the Tigers have now won 21 consecutive games during the month. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 24-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count.

Saturday Night Special – Tigers Are 48-4 In Night Games Under Miles

LSU football loves a night game and with the results that the Tigers have had under **Les Miles**, it's hard to argue. The Tigers are 48-4 in night games under Miles compared to a 20-13 mark in games played during the day. LSU is 11-1 in away night games under Miles with the only loss coming at Florida in 2008 by a 51-21 count. LSU is 30-2 in night games in Tiger Stadium under Miles and they are 31-1 in Saturday Night Games during the Miles era. The only two home losses at night for the Tigers under Miles have come in 2005 on a Monday night against Tennessee by a 30-27 count in overtime and a 13-3 loss to No. 1-ranked Florida in 2009. LSU Runs Nation's Longest Non-Conference Regular-Season Winning Streak To 36 Straight

LSU ran the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak to 36 in a row after the 47-21 win over West Virginia. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular-season game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va. Wisconsin is second on the list with 31 straight non-conference regular-season wins. **Les Miles** has accounted for 26 of the 36 wins during the streak. The 36-game non-conference regular season win streak ties Miami from 1985-88 for the second-longest such winning streak in the FBS era (since 1978) and is just three wins shy of tying Kansas State from 1993-2003 for the longest streak (39). The West Virginia win marked the sixth ranked team LSU has defeated during the streak. Kansas State defeated just one ranked team during its run, and Miami defeated 12 teams ranked in the AP poll during its streak.

More On Les Miles' List of Achievements

Now in his seventh season with the Tigers, head coach **Les Miles** has put together quite a list of achievements during his 86 games. The following is a look at some of Miles' highlights during his seven seasons with the Tigers:

- Fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), and 60 wins (76 games) in school history.
- Led LSU to 10-1 start for the third time in six years (2005, '07, '10)
- Led LSU to back-to-back 7-0 starts in 2010 and 2011 for first time since 1972-73
- Only coach in SEC history to beat Urban Meyer and Nick Saban in the same year twice (2007, 2010)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season and he's done it twice (2005, '07)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year, doing it twice (2010, '11)).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 11 wins over coaches who have won national titles
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons a first at the school
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings

Jarrett Lee's Streak Of Passes Without An Interception Ends at 131; New Streak at 75 Straight

Senior QB **Jarrett Lee** ran his streak of consecutive passes without an interception to 131 before throwing his first interception of the season last against Mississippi State. The 131 passes without an interception ranks as the second-longest streak in school history, trailing Alan Risher's mark of 137 in 1982. For the year, Lee has connected on 56-of-87 passes for 624 yards, 6 TDs and 1 interception. Since throwing his only interception of the season against Mississippi State, Lee has now gone 75 attempts without an interception.

Jarrett Lee Runs Record To 12-4 As Starting QB

Senior **Jarrett Lee** ran his record to 12-4 as LSU's starting quarterback with the win over Tennessee. Lee went 4-4 as a redshirt freshman in 2008, 1-0 in 2009 and now he's 7-0 this year. Prior to the Oregon game, Lee's last start came in November of 2009 as he guided the Tigers to a 24-16 win over Louisiana Tech. During his career, Lee has help rally the Tigers to four fourth-quarter comebacks, including a dramatic game-winning drive last year against Florida. For his career, Lee has thrown for 3,5906 yards, 26 touchdowns and he's completed 284-of-516 passes for a 55.0 completion percentage.

Jefferson Moving Up LSU Rushing Charts For A QB

Senior QB **Jordan Jefferson** has moved up to third in school history in career rushing yards by a quarterback with 864 following his 73-yard effort against Tennessee. Jefferson needs just 75 yards to move past Lee Hedges (938 yards from 1949-51) for the top spot. In addition, Jefferson now has 11 rushing TDs during his career, fifth best in school history. Herb Tyler (23 from 1995-98) holds the school record for rushing TDs.

True Freshman Playing Prominent Roles For Tigers

Now five games into the season, several true freshmen are playing prominent roles on offense for the Tigers. **Odell Beckham, Jr.** and **Jarvis Landry** are both in the rotation at wide receiver, while **Kenny Hilliard** has seen time at fullback and **La'el Collins** at left guard. Beckham ranks second on the team with 24 catches for 292 yards and 2 TDs, while Landry has three catches for 23 yards. On defense, **Anthony Johnson** is the rotation on the line and he's got 5 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack in 7 games. Through 7 games, LSU has played eight true freshmen: Beckham, Hilliard, Landry, Collins, Johnson, DE **Jermauria Rasco**, PK **James Hairston**, and most recently RB **Terrence Magee**, who saw his first action against Kentucky.

Miles Is 27-13 vs. Top 25 Opponents

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 27-13 in games against ranked opponents during his seven years with the Tigers. LSU was 5-2 against Top 25 teams in 2010. LSU won a school-record seven games against top 25 teams in 2007, which included a perfect 3-0 mark against top 10 teams. In games against teams ranked in the top 10, Miles is 10-9.

LSU's Been Good As A Top 10 Team

LSU's top 10 rankings haven't come by accident in recent years as the Tigers have backed up their placement in the polls by winning 63 of the 78 games they've played as an AP Top 10 team since the 2000 season. Since returning to the top 10 on a consistent basis during the early 2000s, LSU has recorded a 63-15 record in games in which they have been ranked in the AP Top 10. That record goes back to the 2002 season when LSU cracked the AP Top 10 the week they faced Auburn. LSU was 6-3 in 2009 as a top 10 team, 4-2 in 2010 and they are 7-0 this year.

The Chief Back To Run LSU Defense

John "Chief" Chavis returns for a third season as LSU's defensive coordinator in 2011. Last year, Chavis led the Tiger defense to top 12 national ranking in three defensive categories. LSU led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in pass defense (169.8 ypg); the Tigers were second in the SEC and No. 11 in the nation in scoring defense (18.2 ppg); and LSU was third in the league and No. 12 in the country in total defense (307.2 ypg). In his first year at LSU in 2009, the Tigers were 11th in the nation in scoring defense as they allowed just six rushing TDs all year. The Tigers opened 2011 by limiting Oregon's high-powered offense to 335 yards and just 95 rushing yards, well below their average of a year ago. In week 2, LSU held Northwestern State to minus-4 yards rushing, the first since 1982 for an opponent to be held to negative rushing yards (Ole Miss, minus-50). The Tiger defense held Mississippi State to nearly 400 yards below their season average. Mississippi State entered the game leading the SEC in both total offense and rushing offense and the Tigers held the Bulldog to season lows of 193 total yards and 52 rushing yards.

LSU Is 39-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 86 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 65-7 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 40-3. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 39-0, including a 5-0 record in 2011. Brandon Taylor To Wear Jersey No. 18

Jersey No. 18 – one of the new traditions in LSU history – has been passed down to senior safety **Brandon Taylor** this year. The Jersey No. 18 tradition was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to its first national championship since 1958. His number (No. 18) became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed Jersey No. 18 down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped the Tigers to another national title in 2007. Richard Dickson wore Jersey No. 18 in 2008 and 2009. RB Richard Murphy, now with the Jacksonville Jaguars, owned the number in 2010. LSU coach **Les Miles**, along with input from the three other players who have worn Jersey No. 18, determined that Brandon Taylor would wear the jersey in 2011. Taylor is a Lott Trophy candidate.

LSU's Won At Least 8 Games For 11 Straight Years

LSU ran its streak of seasons with at least eight wins to 11 straight in 2010 as the Tigers posted an 11-2 mark a year ago. LSU has won at least eight games in a season every year since 2000. LSU's streak of years with at least eight wins ranks as the longest such streak in the SEC and is third nationally. This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 220-60-4 (.780) at night under the lights compared to a 26-25-3 (.509) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 70-11 overall at home, which includes a 54-5 (.915) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 16-6 (.727) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. Inherited the No. 30 jersey from friend and former teammate Josh Jasper, who shattered the LSU record books in 2010 ... Has kicked a 57-yarder in practice before.

#33 Odell Beckham, Jr. • WR

Mother, Heather Van Norman, was an All-American sprinter for LSU women's track team from 1991-93 ... Led the Lady Tigers to five national championships and she was also a former track coach at Tulane ... His father, Odell Beckham, Sr., was a running back with the Tigers from 1989-92 ... Father was roommates with Shaquille O'Neal during college.

#60 Will Blackwell • OG

Grandfather was a guard at Louisiana Tech ... Wears No. 60 because that was his grandfather's number ... His dad and uncle both played football at Northwestern State, and his sister currently plays softball at Northwestern State ... Models his game after former Tigers Alan Faneca and Eric Andolsek ... Also played baseball and did the shot put for the track team in high school ... Played on the same high school team as current LSU defensive end Barkevious Mingo ... Arrived at LSU as a defensive end.

Was also an all-state basketball star in high school and even played tennis ... Began his career as a wide receiver now heads into his junior year as a Thorpe candidate ... Said Patrick Peterson took him under his wing and helped him become the player he is.

#89 Lavar Edwards • DE

Attended Desire St. Academy with teammate DeAngelo Peterson when Hurricane Katrina hit ... Both left their families to play with their high school football team in Niceville, Fla., then to LSU.

#37 Karnell Hatcher • LB

Started playing football at age eight ... Listens to Lil Wayne before every game to get focused ... Volunteers at Pompey Park in his hometown of Delray Beach, Fla ... His duties have ranged from helping pick up trash to setting up tables for receptions or other events being hosted ... Aspires to own his own business after college ... His parents are his role models because he respects the way they've worked so hard to help him achieve his dreams ... Says that he's shy around people he doesn't know, which is often mistaken for being a quiet person, but he breaks out of his shell when he's around people he's comfortable with and enjoys talking and cracking jokes.

#56 Anthony Johnson • DT

Nickname is "Freak" because he was 315 pounds and ran a 4.8 in the 40 in high school ... Molds his game after Warren Sapp, John Randle and calls his idol "Jevon Kearse" ... Can kick with both his left and right foot ... Played Australian Rules football for 15 years ... Hails from Melbourne, a population of 4 million ... Dad played one season in the NFL and was a star in the Australian Rules Football league.

Notables

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 87th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 80th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- LSU has won 39 of its last 44 games at home and 14 straight. Head coach Les Miles is 29-1 in Saturday Night home games.
- More than 85,000 fans have attended each of LSU's last 79 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 69 times, including a school-record 93,129 for the Oct. 10, 2009 game that pitted No. 4 LSU against No. 1 Florida.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 47 of the past 54 seasons.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 220-60-4 (.782) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 26-25-3 (.509) at home during the day in that span.
- LSU has won 29 consecutive home games over non-conference opponents. Les Miles is 20-0 in non-conference home games.

Auburn Runs Past LSU, 24-17, In Battle Of Top 10 Teams

Auburn's Onterio McCalebb raced 70 yards for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter to break a 17-17 tie as the fourth-ranked Tigers went on to a 24-17 victory over sixth-ranked LSU in a battle of the final two unbeaten teams in the SEC. McCalebb's run highlighted a day that saw Auburn rush for 440 yards against LSU, the most ever surrendered by a Tiger team. Despite being outgained 526-243, LSU still had chances to win the game as outstanding punting by Derek Helton and Josh Jasper kept Auburn bottled up inside its 10-yard line for most of the day. Auburn started five of its 12 drives inside its 10-yard line, including two at the 1-yard line. LSU scored on two of its four possessions on the first half as the teams were tied at 10-10 at halftime. LSU's first half scoring came on a 48-yard field goal by Jasper and on a 2-yard run by Jordan Jefferson that tied the game at 10-10 with 15 seconds left in the first half. Auburn extended its lead to 17-10 on a 49-yard run by Cam Newton on its first possession of the second half. The score remained that way until early in the fourth quarter when LSU used a trick play - a halfback pass from Spencer Ware to Rueben Randle that covered 39 yards - to tie the game at 17-17 with 12:16 to play. After forcing Auburn to punt on its next possession, the LSU got the ball at its own 40-yard line with 7:51 to go in the game. LSU went three-and-out and Auburn scored on a 70-yard run three plays later for the winning points. LSU turned the ball over on downs on its final possession of the contest. Jefferson led LSU with 74 yards rushing and 1 TD. He also completed 7-of-14 passes for 46 yards and a score. Randle led all receivers with six catches for 73 yards and a score. Ryan Baker had 12 tackles for LSU.



No. 4 LSU Shuts Down No. 3 Oregon in Cowboys Classic, 40-27

LSU's defense contained one of the most potent offensive attacks in college football limiting Oregon to just 335 total yards as the fourth-ranked Tigers opened 2011 with an impressive 40-27 victory over the third-ranked Ducks in Cowboys Stadium. While the defense was doing its job, the LSU offense was methodical in its approach, wearing down the Ducks with a steady pounding of sophomore running backs **Spencer Ware** (99 yards, 1 TD) and **Michael Ford** (96 yards, 2 TDs). The duo combined for 195 yards and 3 TDs as the Tigers broke open a tight game at halftime with 17 unanswered points during a 7-minute stretch in the second half. Trailing 6-3 early in the second quarter, LSU DB **Tyrann Mathieu** stripped Oregon's punt returner Kenyon Barner of the ball and then scooped up the fumble and raced three-yards for the score, giving the Tigers a 9-6 advantage. LSU QB **Jarrett Lee** hit **Rueben Randle** with a 10-yard TD pass just before halftime to give the Tigers the lead for good at 16-13. Touchdown runs by Ford and Ware in the third quarter stretched the lead to 30-13 at the 3:03 mark. Oregon pulled to within 33-20 early in the fourth quarter, but a 16-yard TD run by Ford put the game out of reach at 40-20 with just over two minutes left in the contest. LSU held Oregon All-America RB LaMichael James to just 54 yards on 18 carries. Lee finished 10-of-22 for 98 yards and 1 TD.

Tiger Defense Stifles Northwestern State in 49-3 Rout

LSU put together another outstanding defensive outing - limiting Northwestern State to just 95 total yards – and the Tiger offense scored touchdowns on seven of 12 possessions in a 49-3 win over the Demons in Tiger Stadium. The win was the 35th straight non-conference regular-season victory for the Tigers. LSU never trailed in the contest, scoring on its first possession when Jarrett Lee connected with Deangelo Peterson on a 9-yard TD pass. The Demons cut the margin to 7-3 early in the second quarter, but the Tigers responded with TDs on three of their next four possessions to take a 28-3 lead at halftime. Zach Mettenberger started the second half for LSU and completed 8-of-11 passes for 92 yards and 1 TD in his first action as a Tiger. Michael Ford led the Tigers in rushing with 72 yards and a pair of scores, while Alfred Blue added 53 yards and 1 TD as the Tigers grounded out 175 rushing yards. Mettenberger and Lee combined to complete 17 of 21 passes for 225 yards and a pair of TDs as LSU's offense accounted for 400 total yards. Defensively, the Tigers held the Demons to minus-4 rushing yards on 27 attempts. It's the first time since 1982 that an LSU defense held an opponent to negative rushing yards (Ole Miss, minus-50 yards, 1982). Morris Claiborne led the LSU defense with 6 tackles as the Tigers had 12 players account for a tackle for loss in the game.

Tigers Score 13 Unanswered To Put Away No. 25 Mississippi State on Thursday

LSU's defense held Mississippi State to nearly 400 yards below its season average as the third-ranked Tigers used a methodical offensive effort to post a 19-6 Thursday night win over the Bulldogs in Starkville. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 3-0 lead midway through the first quarter on a 21-yard **Drew Alleman** field goal. Mississippi State tied the game at 3-3 on its next possession before another Alleman field goal just before halftime gave the Tigers a 6-3 lead at the break. The Bulldogs tied the game at 6-6 late in the third quarter, before the Tigers closed the game with 13 unanswered points for the victory. First, Alleman broke the tie with a 41-yard field goal with 1:46 left in the third quarter and then **Jarrett Lee** connected with **Rueben Randle** on a 19-yard TD pass at the 11:56 mark in the fourth quarter to put the Tigers up by 10 at 16-6. Alleman closed the scoring with another field goal at the 2:53 mark. For the game, LSU's defense recorded 15 tackles for losses and five sacks in holding the Bulldogs to just 52 rushing yards and 193 total yards. On 11 possessions, LSU's defense forced a 3-and-out or a turnover seven times. Offensively, Lee completed 21-of-27 passes for 213 yards and one score, while **Spencer Ware** rushed for 107 yards to lead the Tigers rushing attack. LSU finished with 361 yards of total offense (148 rushing, 213 passing) as the Tigers had nearly 38 minutes of possession time.

Jarrett Lee Throws For Three Touchdowns As LSU Rolls Over West Virginia

Jarrett Lee threw for three TD passes as the Tigers rode a balanced offensive attack to post their third win over a top 25 team with a 47-21 victory over 16th-ranked West Virginia in Morgantown. LSU won despite a record-setting passing night by the Mountaineers as they set school records for completions (38) and passing yards (463). LSU wasted little time in jumping on the Mountaineers, scoring on an 11-yard TD pass from Lee to **Rueben Randle** on its first possession. LSU stretched the lead to 13-0 following a 22-yard TD run by Michael Ford. WVU countered with a score, but the Tigers closed the half with 14 straight points to take a 27-7 lead at halftime. Odell Beckham Jr. caught a 52-yard TD pass from Lee for a 20-7 lead and then a defensive highlight reel play from **Tyrann Mathieu** – on a corner blitz he intercepted a pass that he batted backwards into the air – putting the Tigers at the 1-yard line with less than a minute to go before halftime. LSU scored two plays later for a 27-7 advantage. The Tigers appeared to be on their way to putting the game away on their first possession of the second half, however, a dropped TD pass and then a missed field goal gave WVU new life. The Mountaineers responded with two quick TDs to cut the deficit to 27-21 late in the third quarter. LSU regained the moment on the ensuing kickoff as Morris Claiborne raced 99 yards for a TD giving the Tigers a 33-21 cushion. From there it was all LSU as the Tigers tacked on two fourth quarter TDs for the 47-21 victory. The Tigers forced four turnovers, converting TDs on three of those. Spencer Ware led the Tigers with 92 yards on a23 carries, while Ford added 82 yards and 2 TDs on 12 attempts. Lee connected on 16-of-28 passes for 180 yards and a season-best three scores.

No. 1 LSU Rolls By Kentucky In SEC Home Opener, 35-7

Behind another strong defensive outing and a balanced offensive attack, LSU remained undefeated with a 35-7 victory over Kentucky in Tiger Stadium. LSU limited Kentucky to just 155 total yards, 45 in the first half, as the Tigers led from start to finish. LSU finished the game with 348 total yards (179 rushing, 169 passing). LSU punted on six of its eight first half possessions, but the Tigers did manage to take a 14-0 lead at halftime. **Jordan Jefferson**, in his first action this year, scored on a 1-yard run at the 7:06 mark in the first quarter to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead. LSU extended the lead to 14-0 on a 51-yard TD pass from **Jarrett Lee** to **Odell Beckham Jr.** After holding Kentucky to a 3-and-out to start the second half, LSU went 68 yards on 10 plays, capped by a 1-yard run by **Alfred Blue** to stretch the lead to 21-0. The Tigers increased the lead to 28-0 when **Tyrann Mathieu** recovered a fumble that he forced and raced 23-yards for a TD. **Terrence Magee** capped the scoring for the Tigers with his first career TD early in the fourth quarter. The Wildcats scored their only points of the game with less than five minutes to go. Blue led the Tigers with 72 yards and one TD on 16 carries, while Lee connected on 8-of-21 passes for 169 yards and a score. LSU held Kentucky to 89 rushing yards and just 66 passing yards.

Ware Leads LSU Rushing Attack Past No. 17 Florida, 41-11

Spencer Ware rushed for a career-high 109 yards and 2 TDs and the Tiger defense limited Florida to just 213 yards as LSU rolled to 41-11 win over the 17th-ranked Gators in Tiger Stadium. LSU scored on four of its first five possessions – including a 46-yard TD pass from Jarrett Lee to Rueben Randle on the Tigers' second offensive play of the game. LSU quickly built a 14-0 lead on a 2-yard run by Ware at the 6:40 mark in the first quarter. Drew Alleman added a 35-yard field goal and Ware an 8-yard TD run as the Tigers built a 24-0 first half lead. Florida kicked a field goal just before halftime as the Tigers led 24-3 at intermission. Florida scored its only TD of the game late in the third quarter to cut the deficit to 27-11, but the Tigers responded with a TD on its next possession to put the game out of reach at 34-11. Alfred Blue closed out the scoring with a 2-yard run with just over a minute left in the game. LSU's defense held Florida to nine first downs as the Gators completed just 9 passes for a total of 113 yards passing. LSU had its best offensive showing of the season, totaling 453 total yards (238 rushing, 253 passing). Lee connected on 7-of-10 passes for 154 yards and one score, while Jordan Jefferson connected on 3-of-4 attempts for 61 yards and a score. Blue added 70 rushing yards and 1 TD for the Tigers. Defensively, Tyrann Mathieu had 6 tackles, including one for a 7-yard loss, and an interception.

Dominant Second Half Lifts No. 1 LSU Past Tennessee, 38-7

Jarrett Lee tossed three touchdown passes and Spencer Ware rushed for a score and caught a pass for a TD as top-ranked LSU used a dominating second half to post a 38-7 win over Tennessee in Knoxville. The 31-point win marked the largest margin of victory by the Tigers over the Vols. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers accounted for 38 minutes of possession time, including 22 of a possible 30 minutes in the second half. After a scoreless first quarter, LSU took a 7-0 lead on a 5-yard TD pass from Lee to Rueben Randle. Morris Claiborne setup LSU's first score after returning an interception 89-yards to the Tennessee 5-yard line. LSU increased the lead to 14-0 five minutes later when Ware scampered 13 yards on a screen pass for a TD. Tennessee responded with a TD to cut the lead to 14-7, but a **Drew Alleman** 18-yard field goal just before half gave the Tigers a 17-7 lead at intermission. The second half was all LSU as the Tigers scored TDs on all three of their possessions. LSU had TD scoring drives of 12 plays, 66yards, 7:01; 16 plays, 99 yards, 8:44; and 10 plays, 65 yards, 6:08 in the second half. LSU ran 38 plays in the second half compared to just 19 for the Vols. LSU also outgained Tennessee 222-66 in the second half as the Tigers outscored the Vols 21-0 in the final 30 minutes of the contest. Ware led the Tigers with 80 rushing yards and a score. Lee connected on 13-of-17 passes for 138 yards and a career-high tying three scores. **Brandon Taylor** led LSU with 10
