JOHNNY JONES

HEAD COACH • 4TH YEAR AT LSU (16TH YEAR AS HEAD COACH)

Consistency and Improvement. The two watchwords of the first three years of Johnny Jones tenure as LSU men's basketball coach.

- 19 wins, 9 SEC wins in 2013
- 20 wins, 9 SEC wins in 2014, NIT bid
- 22 wins, 11 SEC wins in 2015, NCAA Tournament appearance.

Top 3 in the SEC.

In three years, Jones has won 61 games overall and 29 in the Southeastern Conference. That's more than any coach at LSU has won in their first three years on the job in Baton Rouge. Jones is also the first LSU coach to take his team to two post-season events in their first three years as the head coach.

Now as Jones prepares for his fourth season at the helm as head coach of the LSU Tigers, he prepares to bring in a recruiting class that some publications has named No. 1 in the country. There is No. 1 overall high school recruit Ben Simmons, who grew up in Australia and played at Montverde in Florida. No. 14 player Antonio Blakeney also of Florida and Mr. Basketball of Louisiana, Brandon Sampson of Madison Prep in Baton Rouge.

Throw in New Orleans native Craig Victor who has transferred from Arizona, seniors Keith Hornsby and Josh Grey, along with junior Tim Quarterman and several players with a year's experience in the program and the consistency and improvement is set to continue for LSU Basketball.

For Johnny Jones, his head coaching tenure is cementing his legacy at LSU after 21 years involved with the program:

- Four years as a player.
- 13 years a member of Dale Brown's coaching staff.
- In his fourth year as the head coach at LSU.

For Jones, just the fifth LSU alum to hold the top position in the men's basketball program and the third to have played and served as head coach, his beliefs about reaching out to fans and giving them an exciting style of basketball to watch in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center has been a strong selling point to fans and recruits alike.

Jones in his three seasons have put on the floor teams that will play hard from start to finish and play a style of basketball that

makes players want to showcase their talent in a team concept.

In his opening statement after being hired, Jones brought back the "HIT" philosophy of LSU Basketball that Coach Dale Brown used when Jones played and coached. The "HIT" philosophy stands for "Hard, Intelligent and Together."

More than anything, Jones, since his hiring on April 13, 2012, has gone out of his way to embrace all aspects of the community, traveling throughout the state on the LSU Tiger Tour and speaking to civic groups and youth organizations. Included in his points in all his stops was how much he wants people to embrace LSU basketball. It's not only fans he wants to hear that message but high school coaches who are excited again to have LSU coaches visiting with them on a regular basis.

LSU and Coach Jones has a successful booster club that gathers before each game for food and scouting reports in the practice facility prior to each home game, Jones is also hosting public luncheons each month to talk to fans about their basketball program and the luncheons are drawing strong crowds each month during the season.

Besides basketball, there is life outside the arena and academics is an important and successful part of LSU life. Every senior in the LSU program has graduated during Jones tenure and in two of the last three years, the basketball program has posted a perfect 1,000 APR score.

This is Jones' third career head coaching position he has served as the interim head coach at the University of Memphis during the 1999-2000 season and began his run as the head coach at the University of North Texas prior to the 2001-02 season.

When Johnny Jones suited up for his first game as an LSU Tiger against Colgate in the Great Alaskan Shootout on Nov. 28, 1980, it would mark the first of 121 games that he would play for LSU. The player would turn assistant coach and be with Coach Dale Brown for another 407 contests.

As a player at LSU, besides playing on the 1981 NCAA Final Four team, Jones started 54 career games. Jones is the only person in LSU history to both play (1981) and coach (1986, asst.) in an NCAA Final Four.

23 -- No. of games LSU hit at least 9 treys in a game in Coach Jones' tenure (2 this year).

21 -- 21st time LSU won 20 games in season (2015).

5-6 -- Record in overtime games in Jones tenure.

5 -- Number of overtimes in 2014-15, sets school record.

41-16 -- Record in Jones era when outrebounding opponent

18-0 -- Record in Jones era when holding opponents to 36.4 percent or lower field goal percentage

11-0 -- LSU last season when opponents recorded 63 or fewer total points.

12 -- Wins in Jones tenure when down at halftime in 40 games

3 -- Number of wins in Jones tenure when down double digits at halftime (Texas Tech, 2014; at Mississippi State 2013; Seton Hall, 2012).

That will lead into the break that begins on Thursday and will continue until the end of exams on Saturday, Dec. 12. LSU will then play again on Dec. at the University of Houston.

LSU will then conclude the pre-Christmas part of the schedule with home games on Dec. 16 (Gardner-Webb), Oral Roberts (Dec. 19) and American (Dec. 22) ... The final home game of the non-conference schedule is at home against Wake Forest on Dec. 29 before the Southeastern Conference schedule begins on Jan. 2 at Vanderbilt.

LAST TIME OUT -- LEGENDS CLASS RECAP -- BROOKLYN, NY

MARQUETTE 81, LSU 80 (NOV. 23); NC STATE 83, LSU 72--OT (NOV. 24)

LSU lost both games in the championship round in Brooklyn after LSU won both regional round games in Baton Rouge to finish 2-2 in the event.

In the Marquette game, LSU fell behind 10-0 and fought most of the night to get back to the front, finally getting it at 80-79 in the final minute. But

Marquette made two free throws and LSU couldn't hit a last-second three to win it. Tigers struggled from the field, shooting just 37 percent (27-73) and 8-of-27 from the arc. The Golden Eagles meanwhile shot 51.7 percent (30-58) and outrebounded LSU, 46-40, despite 22 turnovers.

Ben Simmons had a 21 point-20 rebound-7 assist night, playing the full 40 minutes. Tim Quarterman hit four treys in a 20 point-4 assist game, while Antonio Blakeney posted 14 points and Brandon Sampson 10.

In the consolation game with NC State on Tuesday, the Tigers had chances again, down two at the half and then up five twice in the final seven minutes, 59-54, and 63-58 with 2:19 to play. NC State would score second straight points to take the lead, 65-63, with 49 seconds to play before Simmons tied the game on a layup with 38 seconds left. Simmons was fouled and missed a free throw and both teams missed shots in the final seconds forcing overtime.

The overtime started with LSU missing a trey, two turnovers and then a missed layup while NC State built a 68-65 advantage. LSU got the game back to one, 73-72, on a Brandon Sampson three with 1:49 left, but LSU would not score again as the Wolfpack scored the final 10 points of the game.

The Tigers again struggled from the field overall, hitting just 28-of-77 shots (36.4%) and 11-of-33 three-pointers (33.3%). LSU was 5-of-10 at the free throw line. NC State shot just 39.7 percent (27-68) and made six treys. Quarterman led LSU in scoring with 19 points (3 treys) and nine boards, while Sampson had 18 points (4 treys) and Antonio Blakeney 11 points (3 treys). Simmons had just four points but 14 rebounds and 10 assists with no turnovers to go with 3 blocks and 3 steals.

SIMMONS ALL-LEGENDS CLASSIC

Ben Simmons earned All-Legends Classic honors for his two games in Brooklyn, averaging 12.5 points a game, 17.0 rebounds a game and 8.5 assists per game.

Tim Quarterman led the Tigers in scoring during the two games at the Barclays Center with 19.5 points per game and 7.5 rebounds, making 7-of-14 treys with six assists. Brandon Sampson averaged 14.0 points, making 6 treys, while Antonio Blakeney averaged 12.5 points per game.

SIMMONS KEEPING STAT RESEARCHERS BUSY

The ESPN researchers were tweeting quickly after LSU freshman Ben Simmons had his 23 point-16 rebound contest against South Alabama (11/19).

Simmons became the first Southeastern Conference freshman to have a 20 point-15 rebound game since Julius Randle of Kentucky during the 2013-14 season. Randle is now with the Lakers.

Simmons also became the fifth top 10 recruit to have a 20-15 game in the first three games of their career joining: Michael Beasley, Kansas State, 2007-08; DeMarcus Cousins, Kentucky, 2009-10; Julius Randle, Kentucky, 2013-14; and, one of Simmons' opponents, Henry Ellenson of Marquette, who had 21-16 in the game with Belmont.

Simmons, with his 11 points and 13 rebounds in the opening game against McNeese (11/13) became the third player ranked No. 1 on the ESPN recruiting list since its inception to have a double double in the first game they played.

The others were pretty good as well – Anthony Davis and Kevin Love.

In Brooklyn more notes:

vs. Marquette – 21 points, 20 rebounds, 7 assists – Simmons became the eighth LSU player since 1973-74 to record a 20/20 game, the 13th such game by a Tiger in that time span. Jordan Mickey was LSU's last previous to have a 20/20 game, scoring 25-20 at Mississippi State on Jan. 13, 2015 for the second 20/20 of his career. Mickey and Shaquille O'Neal are the only two players to have multiple 20/20 games at LSU (others were Jaime Lloreda, Geert Hamminck, John Williams, Rudy Macklin, Ed LeBlanc ... According to ESPN Stats and Info, Simmons was just the fifth major conference player to have a 20 point-20 rebound-5 assist game in the last 20 seasons joining Blake Griffin, Michael Sweetney, Eddie Griffin and Tim Duncan.

Vs. NC State – 4 points, 14 rebounds, 10 assists, 3 blocks, 3 steals, 0 turnovers – He becomes the first LSU player to have a rebounds-assists double double for LSU ... Simmons, according to ESPN Stats and Info is the only DI player listed 6-10 or taller to have 10 assists and no turnovers in the last 20 seasons ... Also, @ESPNCollegeBall twitter site sent out the notice that Ben Simmons is the only DI player in the last 20 years with at least 80 pts, 70 rebounds and 30 assists in the first five games of the season.

BLAKENEY FIRST SEC FRESHMAN OF WEEK;

THEN ESPN NAMED HIM TOP OF LIST OF PLAYERS NOT BEING TALKED ABOUT ... YET

Freshman Antonio Blakeney's 22 point opening contest against McNeese (11/13) earned him co-SEC Freshman of the Week honors announced on Nov. 16.

Review of previous opening games by freshmen show that Blakeney's 22 points equaled the 22 points that New Orleans native Randy Livingston scored in the opening game of the 1994-95 season. Livingston also had nine assists in the game.

The 22 points was the most by any player in an opening game since Johnny O'Bryant III scored 25 points in the 2013-14 season opener at UMass.

On Nov. 19, Myron Medcalf had Blakeney topping his list "Players you're not talking about ... yet! ... He wrote: "As the projected No. 1 pick in next summer's NBA draft and only the fourth freshman to secure Associated Press preseason All-American first-team honors, Ben Simmons casts a shadow over every player, program and storyline. So it's easy to see how a McDonald's All-American like Blakeney (19.3 PPG, 5.3 RPG, 1.6 APG, 47 percent from the 3-point line), a freshman who leads LSU in scoring through three games and shared SEC freshman of the week honors with Kentucky's Skal Labissiere, can get lost on the national radar. But he's a vital player in Johnny Jones' plans to guide LSU to the top tier of the SEC and the NCAA tournament."

SIMMONS FOLLOWS AS FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Simmons then followed Blakeney for the SEC FOW honor for LSU's play in the home games against Kennesaw State (11/16) and South Alabama (11/19) ... Simmons averaged 22.5 points, 12.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists and three steals in the two wins ... Blakeney and Simmons have helped the total of 19 games in the first 64 that SEC teams have played in that freshman led their teams in scoring.

SIMMONS ON WOODEN AWARD TOP 50

LSU freshman Ben Simmons, two games deep into his first season at LSU, is on the list of the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50, announced Tuesday on ESPN's SportsCenter and on ESPN.com ... The 50 was chosen by a preseason poll of national college basketball experts and the list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who are the early front-runners for college basketball's most prestigious individual honor.

Simmons is one of seven SEC players on the list, representing the No. 19/23 Tigers, who are 2-0 heading into Thursday night's game with South Alabama ... Simmons had 11 points and 13 rebounds in his opener and then 22 points, 9 rebounds, 6 assists, 2 blocks and 4 steals in the win Monday night,

IRONICALLY, SIMMONS NOT ONLY STATE PLAYER TO HAVE GAME LIKE NC STATE

Ben Simmons game against NC State marked the 10th time from 2010-11 to present that a player had 5 or fewer points and recorded a double double. It was the first since Dec. 6, 2014 when Drew Brandon of Eastern Washington at Seattle had 5 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists.

But Simmons is the second player for a D1 school in Louisiana to have a game of such category. William Mosley of Northwestern State in a game at Lamar on Jan. 26, 2011, had 12 rebounds and 10 blocks while scoring 2 points.

SCOUTING COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON

Despite trailing for almost 35 minutes, the College of Charleston was ahead when it counted the most and blocked a shot at the end of the game to get a 57-56 win over Western Carolina Friday afternoon at TD Arena to run its record to 3-2. Jarrell Brantley had 17 points and three blocks of Charleston with Canyon Barry adding 13 and Marquise Pointer adding 12 points. Charleston shot 19-of-57 overall and 4-of-18 from the arc, but forced 24 turnovers and had a 21-11 advantage on points off turnovers and an impressive 24-9 advantage in second chance points, thanks to 21 offensive rebounds.

The Cougars are led by Canyon in scoring average at 21.0 points per game for the five games with a 4.0 rebound average. Cameron Johnson the other player averaging in double figures at 13.2 points per game. Charleston is averaging 69.0 points per game and giving up 63.4 points.

The series is 1-0 for LSU after a win last year in Baton Rouge ... LSU played at TD Arena a few years ago in the Charleston Classic, going 2-1 in 2011.

UPDATING COACH JONES

Coach Johnny Jones, early in his fourth year at LSU, coached his 100th game as the Tigers head coach against Kennesaw State (11/16), posting 63 wins in those 100 games, more wins than any LSU coach in the SEC era (since the 1933 season) in their first 100 games on the job.

Some of the numbers for other coaches in the SEC era at LSU for 100 games:

Johnny Jones – 63 wins

John Brady – 58 wins

Trent Johnson – 50 wins

Harry Rabenhorst – 50 wins

Dale Brown – 48 wins

Press Maravich – 46 wins

The only coach who won more games than Jones in his first 100 games as head coach was C. C. Stroud, who won 79 of his first 100 games. Stroud coached the Tigers from 1913-1918 and the 1919-20 season.

COACH JONES HAS STRONG FIRST THREE YEARS AT LSU

Entering the season, his 61 wins was 12 more times than any other LSU coach in their first three years in the head coaching chair in Baton Rouge. For that matter of the head coaches presently in the Southeastern Conference who have coached at least three years at their respective league schools, only one (John Callipari at Kentucky), won more than Coach Jones in their first three years.

This is Johnny Jones' 21st year at LSU in some basketball capacity – 4 years as player, 13 years as an assistant coach for Dale Brown and now four years as a head coach ... He played in the 1981 NCAA Final Four and was on the bench as an assistant coach for the 1986 NCAA Final Four.

JONES OFF THE COURT

Coach Jones also has a lot going off the floor and that includes the academic side of LSU where every senior who has been in the LSU program during Coach Jones tenure has walked down the aisle to receive a degree.

During his time as coach the team has received the perfect score of 1,000 in the APR in two of the last three years.

In the community this summer, Jones was able to cut the ribbon on the first "Johnny Jones Courts For Kids" based on golf events held the last couple of years.

The first court in Baton Rouge was located at Expressway Park on South 11th Street. The park features a playground, recreation center, picnic areas, a practice football field, and a trailhead to the Downtown Greenway. The outdoor basketball court was made possible through the generosity of tournament sponsor Walk-On's and Coach Jones' courts program.

The Courts for Kids program's mission is to refurbish courts in local communities around Louisiana. This particular court was formerly a tennis court that has been refurbished and made into one full basketball court and one half basketball court. Other new amenities include new fencing, new basketball goals, bleachers, and a newly painted surface.

THE DUNK-O-METER

It started as something we kept track of in the game notes when Shaquille O'Neal and Stanley Roberts first came to LSU for the 1989-90 season and

something that some years got a lot of use and other years wasn't a per game occurrence.

Against Kennesaw State (11/16), the dunk almost seemed routine as LSU 13 of LSU's 33 baskets were dunks. Ben Simmons had six dunks, Aaron Epps and Brian Bridgewater 2 each and Tim Quarterman, Antonio Blakeney and Brandon Sampson one each.

For the year, Simmons has 10 of LSU's 24 dunks with Blakeney and Sampson 3 each.

ASSISTS ARE GOOD

If there was doubt assists are good, since Ben Simmons had 17 of LSU's 32 assists in the two games in Brooklyn, the pass to a player for a bucket is now a big part of LSU's offense.

LSU had 15 assists for its 27 baskets against Marquette and 17 assists of its 28 baskets in the game against NC State.

For the five games, LSU has 85 assists for 145 baskets ... More importantly, LSU has 85 assists to 55 turnovers, while opponents have 66 assists for 77 turnovers.

Simmons has 31 assists, a 6.2 average, second in the SEC, while Quarterman has 16 assists.

LSU has won 32 straight games when it has 10+ assists MORE than its opponent and is 144-5 since 1975 in this category after a 21-10 advantage in the Kennesaw State game (11/16).

IS THE 5 BY 5 STAT LINE ACTUALLY POSSIBLE?

Olgun Uluc of Fox Sports Australia has raised the question in a column if Ben Simmons can be the first D1 college player to accomplish the improbable stat line of 5 or more points, rebounds, assists, blocks and steals in a game.

Or is it that improbable with what we have seen the first five games?

Uluc wrote: "In basketball, the double-double is an impressive, yet somewhat common, statistical feat, where a player accumulates a total of at least 10 in two statistical categories. The triple-double is less common ... The quadruple-double is extremely rare, and the quintuple-double is essentially unheard of.

"The 'five-by-five' ... It would be the ideal achievement for a player like Simmons."

The statistical phenomenon is so rare that no college basketball player has ever achieved it, and only 10 NBA players have ever managed to put together the stat-line (Julius Irving, Hakeem Olajuwon – 6 times, David Robinson, Derrick Coleman, Vlade Divac, Jamaal Tinsley, Andrei Kirilenko, Marcus Camby and Nicolas Batum).

In the preseason game against Southwest Baptist, Simmons was just a steal away from achieving the statistical phenomenon; posting 17 points, nine rebounds, five assists, six blocks & four steals. In that different double double game of Tuesday against NC State, there was reason to think it could have happened as he had 4 points, 14 rebounds, 10 assists, 3 blocks and 3 steals.

THE FRESHMEN SHINE

Well, it wasn't probably hard to imagine that the three LSU freshmen wouldn't shine at some time or maybe start. But all of them were in the lineup and in double figures in the opener versus McNeese (11/13), two with double doubles --

The stat lines on the three top 40 recruits --

Antonio Blakeney – 22 points, 10 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 steal; 7-16 FGs, 2-5 3FGs, 6-10 FT

Brandon Sampson -- 18 points, 3 rebounds, 2 assists, 1 block, 2 steals; 6-12 FG, 4-6 3 FGs, 2-4 FT

Ben Simmons – 11 points, 13 rebounds, 5 assists, 2 blocks; 4-7 FG, 3-4 FT.

The threesome – 51 points, 26 rebounds, 8 assists, 3 blocks, 3 steals; 17-35 FG, 6-11 3 FGs, 11-18 FT

Against Kennesaw State is was Simmons who had the big game with 22 points, 6 assists, no turnovers, while Blakeney had 14 points.

Then versus South Alabama (11/19), Simmons and Blakeney both contributed each in their own way:

Ben Simmons – 23 points, 16 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 steals; 9-14 FGs, 5-6 FT

Antonio Blakeney – 22 points, 3 rebounds; 7-11 FGs, 4-8 3 FG, 4-4 FT

Totals – 45 points, 19 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 steals; 16-25 FGs, 4-8 3 FGs, 9-10 FT

Simmons, Blakeney and Sampson's games in Brooklyn were documented in the tournament review as Sampson averaged 14.0 points, Blakeney 12.5 points and Simmons 12.5 points and 17.0 rebounds in the two games. Blakeney is the only player to have scored in double figures in all five games.

For the season, the freshmen are 1, 2 & 4 in scoring average: Antonio Blakeney 16.6 ppg, 4.6 rpg; Ben Simmons 16.2 ppg, 14.4 rpg; Brandon Sampson 11.8 ppg, 3.0 rpg. In SEC scoring entering play on Friday, the weekend, Blakeney is 10, Simmons is 11. Simmons is 1 in the SEC in rebounds, the only player presently in the league averaging double figure boards and one of four players in the league in double figure boards early; and, ninth in field goal percentage (53.4%, 31-58). Simmons is second in the league in assists at 6.2 assists per game and tied with sophomore teammate Jalyn Patterson at 2.2 steals per game.

TIM QUARTERMAN PLAYING WELL

The junior from Savannah, Georgia, has had some good games for the Tigers again this season and in the two games in Brooklyn was the leading scorer at 39 points, a 19.5 points per game average. Quarterman also averaged 7.5 rebounds in the games against Marquette and NC State with six assists. He shot 13-of-32 overall with 7-of-14 from the 3-point arc. The only negative was probably a 6-of-11 total at the charity stripe.

For the season, Quarterman is third on the team in average at 12.4 points per game with a 4.4 rebounds per game. He also has 16 assists and just six turnovers in the five games. He has made 10 three-pointers on the year.

JOSH GRAY DELAYED START OF SEASON HAS GONE WELL

Josh Gray was unable to play the opener against McNeese State (11/13), but he has made the most of his four appearances off the bench, averaging 22.3 minutes, and a fifth-best on the team scoring average of 9.0 points per game with 3.3 rebounds and 2.2 assists average.

Against Kennesaw State (11/16) he scored 16 points on 6-of-11 shooting with two treys. He also had six rebounds, six assists and three steals. It was his 12th game of five or more assists at LSU. He followed that up against South Alabama (11/19) with 11 points on 5-of-11 shooting with four rebounds.

Gray, a senior in his second year at LSU, the first time in his college career he has played at the same school in successive years. Last season, Grady averaged 7.1 points per game with 118 assists.

PATTERSON GETS THE START AGAINST NC STATE

Jalyn Patterson, the sophomore who also prepped at Montverde Academy, got his first start of 2015-16 in the NC State game, played 16 minutes with 7 points, an assist and two steals. Patterson had six points, three assists in the Marquette game.

For the five games, Patterson is averaging 4.8 points and 20.2 minutes per game, hitting 5 treys with 8 assists.

ELBERT ROBINSON III

Robinson, the sophomore from Garland, scored more points than last year when he only played in 11 games, in the opener against McNeese (11/13) with eight points. He had his first double figure game of 10 in the South Alabama game (11/19) before spraining his ankle. He started both games in the Legends Classic in Brooklyn but still was bothered it appeared playing a combined total of 36 minutes.

For the season, he is averaging 17 minutes a game and 5.6 points and 3.4 rebounds.

BRIAN BRIDGEWATER

The junior from Baton Rouge has been seeing action in the post and scored five points in a 24-minute stint against NC State. Bridgewater in the five games is averaging 12.0 minutes per game, scoring 3.0 points per game and 2.4 rebounds a contest.

LSU PROBABLY OUT AFTER THREE WEEKS

It won't be official until Monday afternoon, but LSU's two losses will probably knock the Tigers out of the national polls after three weeks and it will have to be seen if LSU is still receiving votes.

LSU was ranked 17th in the USA Today Coaches' Poll this past Monday and 22nd in the AP Media Poll ... LSU's preseason ranking of 21 marked the first time the Tigers were ranked since the final regular season poll of 2009 when LSU was No. 19 in the AP poll.

The third ranking of the year marked the 198th time LSU has been ranked in the AP poll since LSU's first ranking in December 1952. LSU was last ranked in the preseason poll at the start of the 2006-07 season and the 11th time overall.

SIMMONS PRE-SEASON SEC POY; AP ALL-AMERICA SELECTION

When the SEC TipOff took place at the ESPN/SEC Network studios in Charlotte, the league and national media panel selected Australian freshman Ben Simmons as the preseason player of the year. Junior Tim Quarterman was named to the second team.

Simmons was named a preseason selection to the Associated Press All-America team announced on Monday. Simmons joins seniors Kyle Wiltjer of Gonzaga, Georges Niang of Iowa State and Buddy Hield of Oklahoma, along with junior Kris Dunn of Providence.

While this is the third straight year for the pre-season All-America team selected by a panel of 65 media voters to have a freshman, it is only the fourth time a freshman has been named to the five-player team.

The others -- Harrison Barnes of North Carolina (2010-11), Andrew Wiggins of Kansas (2013-14), and Jahliil Okafor of Duke (2014-15) -- all were high picks in the NBA draft after leaving school early.

ARE THE BLOCKS STILL IN PLAY

The Tigers and its fans looked for the block a lot last year to bail LSU out defensively as Jordan Mickey blocked over 100 shots for a second straight season. Mickey and Shaquille O'Neal are the only two players in LSU history to record 100 blocks in a season.

In the exhibition game, LSU blocked 15 shots spread among four LSU front-line players.

Ben Simmons posted six blocks while sophomore Aaron Epps and junior Darcy Malone each posted four rejections. Junior second-year college player Brian Bridgewater posted the one block.

The Tigers blocked three on the first night (11/13, McNeese) with Simmons getting his first two career blocks with Sampson posting one and spread out nine blocks against Kennesaw State (11/16) among seven players – Ben Simmons and Aaron Epps two; and, one each for Elbert Robinson III, Brandon Sampson, Antonio Blakeney, Tim Quarterman and Brian Bridgewater.

As a team, LSU blocked 204 shots, the fifth time the Tigers have blocked 200 shots in a season. The school record is 234 in 2005-06, when a freshman named Tyrus Thomas blocked 99 shots.

In the first five games, LSU has 21 blocks, an average of 4.2 a game.

FAST-PACED TIGERS

LSU has averaged over 70 points each of the three seasons that Johnny Jones has been at LSU, last year averaging 73.4 points per game. That ranked fourth in scoring over the last decade at LSU behind the 75.2 the Tigers averaged in 2005, the 74.8 in 2009 and the 74.7 in 2014 ... Last year marked the first time LSU has averaged over 70 points more than two consecutive seasons for the first time since the 1995-96 campaign when the Tigers averaged over 70 points for the last of 14 consecutive seasons ... LSU is 50-18 in the Johnny Jones era when scoring 70 or more points (20-2 last year). LSU in Jones' era is now 23-4 when the Tigers top 80 points or more (2-1 this year). LSU has failed to score 70 points 33 times in that period with a 14-21 record, 2-9 last year.

The 91 points Kennesaw State scored marked the sixth time LSU has topped 90 in the Coach Jones era with a record of 5-1.

POSSESSIONS

Things are supposed to be better in this new rules era, but possessions has never been a problem. LSU had 80 possessions in the Southwest Baptist game, scoring on 45 of them averaging 1.225 points per possession.

The Tigers in the opener had 73 possessions, scoring 38 times and a points per possession ratio of 1.11.0 and similar against Kennesaw State with a 1.182 points per possession ratio of 42 scores in 77 possessions. Against South Alabama, LSU failed to score at a 50 percent clip or better in its 72 possessions but had a points per possession average of 1.083.

Last season LSU averaged 72.3 possessions a game, ninth in the country, and 72.7 possessions in the 2013-14 season. LSU had over 80 possessions in each of the games in Brooklyn.

FIRST HALF/SECOND HALF

While it really didn't play out in the Marquette game, when the Golden Eagles jumped out 10-0, but LSU's better scoring half has been the first 20 minutes, outscoring opponents, 190-145. In the second 20 minutes and one overtime five minutes, LSU has been outscored by opponents, 224-212.

REBOUNDS

The one glaring thing that has been emphasized in practice for the last couple of weeks has been the ability of LSU to get opponents off the glass. LSU is down in overall rebounds, 201-218, and 141-154 on the offensive glass.

In Brooklyn, Marquette out rebounded LSU, 46-40, and NC State had a 54-41 advantage. LSU is averaging 40.2 rebounds a game and opponents 43.6. LSU is seventh in the league in rebounds pulled down and 13th in rebounds allowed.

50 PERCENT SHOOTING WINS

Here's the interesting thing about the Arkansas win to close last year's regular season ... When Keith Hornsby's buzzer-beater three-pointer went in, it gave LSU a game shooting total of 33-of-66 or 50.0% ... That made LSU 9-0 last year when shooting 50 percent or more from the field and 21-1 in the Johnny Jones era at LSU ... The last three of those in 2015 came on the road.

Now LSU has two 50 percent shooting nights and victory this year to run LSU's streak presently to 16 straight wins when shooting 50 percent or better ... LSU shot 50.8 percent against Kennesaw State (11/16) and then 50.9 percent against South Alabama (11/19).

For the season, LSU is 145-333 of 43.5% from the field (after shooting 36.7 percent in the two Brooklyn games), while opponents are shooting 41.3 percent (131-317).

FROM THREE-POINT RANGE

LSU has made 40 three-pointers in the first 8 games, including 11 versus NC State ... LSU is 40-of-115 (34.8%), which puts the Tigers eighth in the league in 3 point shooting percentage and T4 in number of three-pointers made.

CAN LSU GET IT DONE IN REGULATION?

LSU had five games go into overtime last season and that set a school mark for the most overtime games in one year at LSU ... The Tigers were 3-2 in overtime games this season ... LSU in four previous seasons had played four overtime contests – 2011-12, 2004-05, 1983-84 and 1968-69.

Four of the overtime games came against SEC schools.

Against Missouri and Georgia, the first two games in SEC play in January, marked the first time LSU played back-to-back overtime games since Dec. 2010 when LSU lost to Coastal Carolina, on Dec. 13, 2010 and LSU defeating McNeese on Dec. 16, 2010.

The last time LSU played back-to-back overtime games in the SEC came during the 1984 season when LSU defeated Georgia (69-68) on Feb. 4, 1984 and then Tennessee, 61-59, on Feb. 6 of that year.

After losing to NC State in overtime on Tuesday, LSU is 5-6 in the Johnny Jones era in overtime games.

Overall, LSU all-time is 39-54 in overtime games.

finished the season 6-3 in the league and 8-3 overall on the road ... The non-conference wins were at No. 16 West Virginia and UAB in December with the SEC wins at Ole Miss, Florida, Vandy, Tennessee, Auburn and No. 18 Arkansas.

Coach Jones is 16-20 in road games and 11-16 in SEC road games as LSU's coach ... One has to go back to the 2008-09 season when LSU won six straight SEC road games en route to the league title to find the last time LSU won six in the league on an opponent's home court ... The eight road wins was the most since the record season of 1985-86 when LSU won 10 road games (including four at schools on the islands of Hawaii) and certainly the most against Division I teams in a season.

LSU's 84-61 win over Auburn on 2/24, was LSU's 16th road win of 18 or more points since 1975.

It also is the first time since 1945-46 season that LSU had won three road league games in the same season by at least 18 points:

BREAKING DOWN A LITTLE MORE IN THE SEC ROAD WINS

In the six LSU road wins in the league a year ago, LSU averaged 78.5 points per game, compared to 66.8 points for opponents. The Tigers made 178-of-353 field goal attempts (50.4 percent), compared to 37.9 percent for opponents. LSU also shot over 40 percent in those six games from the arc (45-of-109) while opponents shot just 24.6 percent from three-point range.

Charleston will be LSU's first game on a road court this season.

AT THE MARAVICH CENTER

The Tigers concluded the home season 13-4 for the year at the Maravich Center, 5-4 in the league ... With the win Thursday, Coach Johnny Jones is 43-10 in his years as Tiger head coach ... LSU has posted 16 years of at least 13 wins in the Maravich Center's 44 years of play ... LSU was 8-0 in non-conference play last season and is 277-39 in non-conference games in the building.

TIGERS GOING FOR FIFTH CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASON

With 22 wins last year, the Tigers easily earned their fourth consecutive winning season (18 in 2012, 19 in 2013, 20 in 2014 and 22 in 2015). That tied for the fourth longest run of consecutive winning seasons in program history:

11 -- 1982-1993; 6 -- 2002-2007; 5 -- 1977-1981; 4 -- 2012-present; 4 -- 1932-35

LSU's 22 wins tied for 10th most wins in a single season with the 1992-93, 1969-70 and 1952-53 seasons ... A total of 13 teams at LSU have won at least 22 games in a season topped by the 1980-81 team which won 31 games.

WILL IT BE ANOTHER 23 YEARS

When Tim Quarterman posted a triple-double of 18 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists versus Ole Miss in the Maravich Center on Feb. 28, 2015, it marked the first triple double in just under 23 years. On March 19, 1992, in the NCAA Tournament first round game against BYU, Shaquille O'Neal of LSU posted the points-rebounds-blocks triple of 26-19-11 ... It was the sixth and final one of his career and he currently has the record along with Michael Anderson of Drexel (1985-88) for most triples in a career. There is also one recorded triple-double for Pete Maravich from 1969.

With Ben Simmons and his ability to pass, score and rebound, certainly the triple double is a part of the lexicon that may not have to wait another 23 years to take place.

AUSTRALIAN TOUR A SUCCESS

The Tigers were able to use their once-every-four-years foreign tour opportunity to bring Ben Simmons and Darcy Malone home to Australian where LSU played five games against teams from the National Basketball League and area all-star squads. LSU was 3-2 on the trip playing before packed gyms and arenas and gaining lots of new fans and media attention in Australia.

Simmons averaged 20 points and 9.0 rebounds in the five games with 27 assists, 11 blocks and 18 steals, while Tim Quarterman averaged 16.4 points and 5.2 rebounds. Also averaging in double figures was Antonio Blakeney with a 13.8 points average (6.2 rpg), Keith Hornsby 12.3 points per game and Brandon Sampson at 11.8 points per game.

In a four-quarter game with a 24-second shot clock that reset to 14 seconds after an offensive rebound, LSU averaged 87.2 points per game, shooting 43.8 percent from the floor. LSU was out rebounded in the five games and average of 42.6 to 39.0.

JOHNNY JONES RADIO, TV SHOW TO BEGIN THIS WEEK

The Johnny Jones Radio Show presented by Capital One Bank will begin its 2015-16 season of broadcasts on Tuesday night. The show will have a regular air night of Mondays on the LSU Sports Radio Network, but situations like Monday's game will move the show to Tuesday and in this case it will follow Coach Nikki Fargas' show that airs normally on Tuesdays at 7 p.m. So Coach Jones will follow at 8 p.m. This will be the only 8 p.m. show. All others are 7 p.m.

Show dates are as follows: Dec. 1, 8 p.m.; Dec. 7, 14, 21, 28; Jan. 4, 11, 20 (Wednesday), 25; Feb. 3 (Wednesday), 8, 15, 24 (Wednesday), 29.

"Inside LSU Basketball presented by Academy Sports and Outdoors" will begin airing on Sunday, Dec. 6 on the LSU Sports Television Network. The show will debut locally on WBRZ at 10:35 p.m. on Sundays.
