

LSU FOOTBALL POSTGAME NOTES

LSU vs Ole Miss

Oct. 22, 2016 – Tiger Stadium (Baton Rouge, La.)

- LSU's game captains were #83 Travin Dural, #40 Duke Riley, #92 Lewis Neal, #81 Colin Jeter
- LSU won the toss and elected to receive. Ole Miss kicked off and defended the south endzone.
- RB Leonard Fournette was back in uniform tonight after missing the last two games with an ankle injury. He also missed the Jacksonville State game earlier this season.
- With Leonard Fournette rushing for 171 yards just in the first half, LSU has had a 100-yard rusher in the last 10 consecutive games. LSU is 8-2 with a back over 100 yards in the last 10 contests.
- The Tigers lost two fumbles in the first half, marking the first time since the 2014 game against Ole Miss that LSU has lost multiple fumbles in a game.
- With his 284 yards tonight, Leonard Fournette set a school record for rushing yards in a game. The previous record was 250 yards set by Alley Broussard against Ole Miss in 2004. Broussard recorded his 250 yards on 26 carries. Fournette surpassed the previous school record on his eighth carry tonight. He finished the game with 16 carries and three touchdowns.
- The Tigers have won 10 consecutive games played during the month of October. LSU has also won 19-straight October games played in Tiger Stadium dating back to 2009.
- With the win over Ole Miss, LSU is now 60-41-4 all-time over the Rebels.
- LSU has outscored its opponent, 73-7, in the second half in its three games under Head Coach Ed Orgeron.

Individual Notes:

- Leonard Fournette busted off a 59-yard touchdown run with 3:26 left in the first quarter for his third rushing touchdown of the season; the 35th of his career. He increased that total to four for the season and 36 for his career with his 76-yard touchdown run with 6:11 left in the second quarter that put LSU ahead 21-13. He scored for the third time tonight on a 78-yard run on the first play of the drive with 13:38 left in the third quarter. He now has five rushing TDs for the season and 37 for his career.
- Leonard Fournette has scored seven touchdowns from runs of 50 yards or more in his career, including three tonight. Twelve of Fournette's 37 touchdown runs have been from 25 yards or more. The 78-yard run was a season high for the junior.
- Leonard Fournette has registered two or more rushing touchdowns in 11 career games. Fournette has scored from the run in 20 of his 29 career games.
- With his school record-setting 284 yards tonight, Fournette has posted five career games of 200 or more yards rushing. The five 200-yard games set a school record as the previous record holder, Kevin Faulk, had four career 200-yard rushing games from 1995-98. He had a 200-yard game in each of those four seasons. Fournette had four 200-yard games in 2015.
- Leonard Fournette rushed for 284 yards on 16 carries for an average of 17.75 yards per carry, which is a school record for a back with at least 15 carries. Fournette previously held the record with 12.0 yards per carry against Auburn last season. He had 228 yards on 19 carries in that game.
- QB Danny Etling completed his first seven-straight pass attempts tonight. His first incomplete pass was late in the first quarter on a deep ball to Travin Dural. Etling finished the game with 204 yards and a touchdown on 19-of-28 passing. He tossed one interception tonight.
- Donte Jackson picked off Chad Kelly in the second quarter for his second interception of the season; the third of his career. Jackson's pick was on the first play following Ole Miss' fumble recovery. Jackson had his first interception of the season against Jacksonville State.
- D.J. Chark scored on a 40-yard reception from Danny Etling with 11:13 remaining in the second quarter to give LSU its first lead of the game, 14-10. It was Chark's third TD reception of the season. Chark has caught a pass in each of the last six games and has scored receiving TDs in the last two games.
- Travin Dural has caught at least one pass in every game this season. He has logged four or more receptions in five of the seven games this year.
- On his sixth carry tonight, a 76-yard touchdown run, Leonard Fournette eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the 19th time in his career. Fournette has rushed for more than 100 yards in all four games he has played

in this season, and in his last six-straight games dating back to last season. He has posted 100 yards in 12 SEC contests.

- With the 40-yard touchdown pass to D.J. Chark in the second quarter, Danny Etling has thrown a TD pass in five of the last six games. Etling totals seven touchdown passes this season; and 23 for his career (includes 16 at Purdue).
- Arden Key sacked Chad Kelly for a loss of four yards in the third quarter for his 8th sack of the season. Key has logged a sack in all but the Southern Miss game this season. With his eighth sack, Key moves into the Top 10 in single-season sacks. Key needs just four more sacks to tie the school record of 12 set by Oliver Lawrence in 1989.
- Two plays after Arden Key's sack, Davon Godchaux sacked Chad Kelly for a loss of a yard for his fourth sack of the season. Godchaux has posted a sack in four of the last five games.
- Colby Delahoussaye booted a 44-yard field goal to put LSU up, 31-21, with 8:27 left in the third quarter. The 44 yarder was a season-high make for the senior. Delahoussaye is 5-of-7 this season and is now 1-of-2 from 40-49 yards out.
- Senior LB Duke Riley picked off Chad Kelly on 2nd-and-10 from the Ole Miss 18 late in the third quarter for his first career interception. Riley made a three-yard return on the play.
- Derrius Guice scored on a six-yard run to put LSU ahead, 38-21, with 7:26 left in the game. Guice has scored from the run in the last three straight games. He has seven rushing TDs this season and 10 for his career.
- Duke Riley logged a career-high 14 tackles in tonight's contest. He had five solo stops as well as 1.5 TFL and an interception. His previous high was 13 tackles earlier this season against Auburn. Riley has posted double-digit tackles in three games this season.
