NEXT UP

► LSU (5-0, 2-0 SEC) takes its undefeated record on the road Saturday when the No. 5/6 Tigers face No. 22 Florida (4-1, 2-1 SEC). Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. CT from Ben Hill Griffin Stadium and the game will be televised by CBS.
► LSU has won its last two games in Gainesville (17-16 in 2017 and 30-27 in 2014).

► LSU and Florida are meeting in Gainesville for the second straight year due to scheduling issues caused by Hurricane Matthew in 2016. The teams played back-to-back games in Baton Rouge in 2015 and 2016.

► LSU is off to its best start since 2015 when the Tigers won their first seven games overall, including four SEC wins, and climbed to No. 2 in the nation in 2015.

► LSU won five games during the month of September for just the second time in school history. The only other time LSU won five games in September came in 2012.

► Overall, LSU has won five games before the calendar turns to October four times (2003, 2007, 2012, and 2018).

► Ed Orgeron, who took over the Tigers four games into the 2016 season, is 20-6 as LSU's head coach (6-2 in 2016; 9-4 in 2017, 5-0 in 2018). Over his last 34 games as a head coach, Orgeron has produced a 26-8 mark – a stretch the also includes a 6-2 record with Southern Cal in 2013.

► In 26 games under Orgeron, LSU's has gone without a turnover 13 times. Dating back to last year, LSU has turned the ball over only four times over the past 28 quarters. LSU has only three turnovers – all fumbles – this year.

► LSU is 14-0 under Orgeron when the Tigers feature a 100-yard rusher (6-0 in 2016, 5-0 in 2017, 3-0 in 2018).

► LSU is one of four teams nationally that hasn't thrown an interception. Others include Kansas, Georgia Southern and Boise State.

► LSU's four FBS opponents are a combined 14-5 overall with LSU being responsible for four of the five losses.

► LSU is 20-of-22 in the redzone this year and in 13 games with Steve Ensminger as offensive coordinator, LSU is 44-of-49 on redzone opportunities (24-27 in 2016; 20-22 in 2018).

► Joe Burrow is 5-0 as LSU's starting quarterback and he's the only LSU QB in school history to have a pair of Top 10 wins during first three starts of career to his credit.

► Burrow is one of only 2 Power 5 QBs with 1,000 passing yards and no interceptions this year.

► Burrow led LSU in both rushing (96) and passing (292) vs. Ole Miss as he accounted for 4 TDs and 388 yards of total offense, the fourth-highest total in school history.

► With Clyde Edwards-Helaire rushing for a career-best 136 yards against Louisiana Tech in week 4, five different LSU running backs have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Coach O. Nick Brossette has done it twice this year.

► LSU PK Cole Tracy ranks first among all active collegiate kickers with 78 career field goals. The graduate transfers kicked 68 at DII Assumption College and now has 10 to his credit at LSU.

► Through 5 games, LSU has started a different combination on the offensive line each week. Overall, eight players have started at least one game on the offensive line for LSU this year.

► In 30 games with Dave Aranda as defensive coordinator, LSU has held opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards 13 times. LSU is 13-0 in those games.

► Going back to 2001 when LSU's football program won its first SEC Championship since the 1980s, LSU has played 208 of its 226 games ranked in the Top 25, which includes 21 of 26 games under Orgeron. LSU is 15-6 as a Top 25 team under Coach O.

BY THE NUMBERS

LSU hasn't allowed a first quarter TD in nine consecutive games dating back to last year. The last team to score a first quarter TD against the Tigers was Alabama in week 9 of 2017.

Ed Orgeron grew up a Tiger fan. He developed a passion for the Tigers at an early age, becoming a fan of some of the all-time LSU greats in the 1970s. Players like Bert Jones, Ronnie Estay, Tommy Casanova and Charles Alexander ignited a purple and gold fire under Orgeron that still burns today.

Now in his second full season as head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron has leveraged his passion and love for LSU into a determination and drive that sees him spend nearly every waking moment focused on LSU football and his vision for the program. Winning championships will always be the goal for the program, but it's what Orgeron and his staff are doing to develop and mentor players off the field, in an atmosphere that fosters inclusion and accountability, that will ultimately set Tigers apart.

His quick impact on the LSU program was evident in 2016 when he was elevated from defensive line coach to interim head coach just four games into the season. The results were immediate and impressive, turning a 2-2 team with little confidence following a loss at Auburn, into a squad that played with swagger and energy. Orgeron earned the title of permanent head coach on November 26, 2016, two days after LSU beat Texas A&M, 54-39, to wrap up the regular season with a 7-4 mark, which included a 5-2 mark under Coach O.

With a "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto and high-energy practices that focus on being crisp and efficient, the players have bought into the Orgeron system, both on and off the field and the results are hard to ignore. Orgeron has guided the Tigers to a 15-6 overall mark in his 21 games as the LSU head coach, which includes a 7-3 record against SEC Western Division opponents and six victories against teams ranked in the Top 25. Of LSU's six losses under Orgeron, three have come by six points or less and two others came against the nation's No. 1 ranked team. Furthermore, of Orgeron's 15 LSU wins, 10 have come against SEC foes and 12 have been by double-digits.

In 2017, Orgeron led the Tigers to a 9-4 overall mark, a second straight appearance in the Citrus Bowl and a No. 18 final national ranking. While LSU came up just short in claiming a 10-win season, Orgeron and the Tigers gave plenty of reasons to show that the program is on the rise. A total of 20 true freshmen – the second-highest figure nationally – saw playing time for the Tigers last year and the group of rookies combined for 44 starts.

The Coach O Way

With the "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto, the Tigers seemingly became a different team overnight under Orgeron and the results that LSU sought soon followed. As the head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron said he was going to "flip the script" and he assigned a theme for the daily practices. The purpose of the descriptive practice themes for each day during the week is one of the ways that Orgeron and his staff hold the players accountable and focused both prior to and during the workout. The daily practice nicknames are as follows: Tell the Truth Monday, Competition Tuesday, Turnover/No Turnover Wednesday, No Repeat Thursday, and Focus Friday.

Orgeron has also opened the doors for former LSU players to come back and be active in the program. Having former players actively involved is a way for the current Tigers to get a better understanding of who helped build the foundation for the program, while also letting them see firsthand what it means to be a LSU Tiger and the responsibility that goes along with it.

Offseason Moves

Coach O bolstered his staff during the offseason with the promotion of Steve Ensminger to offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. It will be Ensminger's second stint as offensive coordinator under Orgeron as he held that spot for eight games during the head coach's transition year in 2016. Under Ensminger, LSU's offense thrived, setting numerous records and proving that he is the right man for the job.

He also added longtime NFL veteran and former LSU assistant Jerry Sullivan to the staff on a fulltime basis as the senior offensive assistant and passing game coordinator. James Cregg, another coach with NFL experience, joined the staff and his impact has already paid off as the offensive line is expected to be one of the strengths for the Tigers this year. Defensively, Bill Busch, who spent three years working alongside Dave Aranda at Wisconsin and Utah State, joined the Tiger staff as safeties coach. Greg McMahon, who won a Super Bowl with the Saints and spent 11 years coaching special teams for the franchise, was elevated from analyst in 2017 to LSU's special teams coordinator in 2018.

Orgeron Coaching History

Orgeron, a native of Larose, Louisiana, is LSU's 33rd head football coach, and the first Louisiana native to serve as head coach of the Tigers since West Monroe native Jerry Stovall held the position for four seasons in the early 1980s.

Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 15-6 at LSU. His career mark as a collegiate head coach is 31-33, however he's 21-8 over his last 29 games. Orgeron went 6-2 as Southern Cal's interim head coach in 2013, taking over a USC team that stumbled to a 3-2 mark over the first five games of the year. Orgeron rallied the Trojans as USC closed out the regular season with wins in six of its final eight games.

In his first game as LSU's permanent head coach, Orgeron guided the Tigers to a 29-9 win over No. 13 Louisville and its Heisman Trophy quarterback Lamar Jackson in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl.

Orgeron originally joined the Tiger staff in 2015 as defensive line coach, before adding the title of recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2016.

Prior to joining the LSU staff, Orgeron's last coaching stop came at Southern Cal where he served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach for the Trojans for four years (2010-13). Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach at USC for the final eight games of the 2013 season, leading the Trojans to a 6-2 mark over that span.

Orgeron served two stints at Southern Cal, the first as the Trojans' defensive line coach from 1998 to 2004. Orgeron coached under Paul Hackett at USC for three years from 1998 to 2000 and was one of just a handful of coaches retained by Pete Carroll when he took over as the Trojans' head coach in 2001.

He added the title of recruiting coordinator for USC in 2001 and helped the Trojans to top five signing classes for three straight years from 2002-04. Rivals.com and Sporting News named him the 2004 National Recruiter of the Year.

Orgeron left USC in 2005 to become the head coach at Ole Miss, where he went 10-25 in three years with Rebels from 2005-07.

Orgeron spent the 2008 season coaching the defensive line for the New Orleans Saints and then joined Tennessee as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009. He returned to Southern Cal following the 2009 season.

Orgeron made a name for himself as a top defensive line coach at the University of Miami from 1988-92, where he coached eight All-Americans, including NFL first rounders Cortez Kennedy, Russell Maryland and Warren Sapp. In 1988, he was a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the defensive line. During his tenure, the Hurricanes won the national championship twice (1989 and 1991), finished second in the AP poll once (1988) and third twice (1990 and 1992) while appearing in five New Year's Day bowls (1989 Orange, 1990 Sugar, 1991 Cotton, 1992 Orange, 1993 Sugar).

Orgeron also was a graduate assistant at Northwestern (La.) State, his alma mater, in 1984 and McNeese State in 1985, working with the defensive line at both schools, then was an assistant strength coach at Arkansas for two years (1986-87).

As a player, Orgeron was a four-year starter on the defensive line for Northwestern State, captaining the Demons as a senior in 1983. He received his bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Northwestern State in 1984. In 2007, Orgeron was named to the Northwestern State Top 100 Players which was part of the school's Centennial Football Celebration.

He starred in football, basketball and track at South Lafourche High in Galliano, La. On the big screen, Orgeron played himself in the 2009 Oscar-nominated movie, "The Blind Side."

Born July 27, 1961, he and his wife, Kelly, have three sons, Tyler, and twins Parker and Cody. Tyler is a member of the LSU football coaching staff, while twins Parker and Cody just completed their second season as part of the McNeese State football team. Parker is a starting wide receiver for the Cowboys, while Cody is competing for snaps at quarterback heading into his redshirt sophomore season in 2018.

LSU To Celebrate 125 Seasons of Football In 2018

- ▶ LSU will celebrate its 125th season of football in 2018.
- ▶ Started in 1893, LSU is one of college football’s most storied programs, winning three national titles (1958, 2003, and 2007) and claiming 11 SEC championships (1935, 1936, 1958, 1961, 1970, 1986, 1988, 2001, 2003, 2007, and 2011).
- ▶ LSU is the 12th-winningest program in NCAA history by victories with 792 and the Tigers are No. 14 all-time in terms of winning percentage (.652). LSU has an all-record of 792-412-47 in 125 seasons.
- ▶ To honor the 125 seasons of LSU Football, players will wear a 125 patch on their jerseys and the logo will also be painted on the field for all home games.

LSU Brings 13-Game October Winning Streak To Gainesville

- ▶ LSU brings a 13-game winning streak in games played during the month of October into Saturday’s contest against Florida.
- ▶ LSU hasn’t lost a game during the month of October since 2014 when No. 5 Auburn posted a 41-7 win over the Tigers in Jordan-Hare Stadium on Oct. 14.
- ▶ Since then, LSU has reeled off 13 consecutive wins during the month of October, which includes 10 victories over SEC opponents.
- ▶ Three of LSU’s 13-straight October wins have come on the road and five have coming against Top 25 opponents.
- ▶ Three wins over Florida are included in LSU’s 13-game October win streak.

Red-Zone Efficiency Significantly Improved

- ▶ LSU has significantly improved its red zone offense in 2018 with a 90.9 percentage in 22 trips.
- ▶ The offense, under coordinator Steve Ensminger, has 12 touchdowns in red zone and eight field goals. The Tigers have punched it in 10 times on the ground and twice in the air.
- ▶ After five weeks a year ago LSU ranked 96th in the country in red zone offense at 50 percent.
- ▶ In 13 games with Ensminger as the Tigers’ coordinator, LSU is 44-of-49 on red zone opportunities (24-27 in 2016, 20-22 in 2018).

Burrow Has Chance To Join Elite LSU QB Company

- ▶ Joe Burrow is currently 5-0 as LSU’s starting quarterback and with a win on Saturday against Florida, he will join Herb Tyler, JaMarcus Russell, and Matt Flynn as the only Tigers dating back to 1957 to win their first six starts at LSU.
- ▶ Herb Tyler holds the mark by winning his first eight games for LSU, while Russell and Flynn both started 6-0.
- ▶ Currently, Burrow and Russell are the only two of the four who’s 5-0 start came in the same season.
- ▶ Tyler went 4-0 to close out 1995 and then won his first four starts in 1996;
- ▶ Russell went 5-0 in 2004 and then went to 6-0 with a win over Arizona State in the 2005 opener. He lost the following week to Tennessee.
- ▶ Flynn went 1-0 in 2005 followed by five wins in 2007 to get to 6-0 before losing to Kentucky.

Offense Continues to Gel in 2018

- ▶ The LSU offense under OC Steve Ensminger and QB Joe Burrow continues to develop and create chemistry in 2018.
- ▶ The Tigers have improved their total offense numbers in every game this season
- ▶ After totaling 296 yards in the season opener win over Miami, LSU has put up 335 yards against Southeastern, 370 at Auburn, 409 against Louisiana Tech and 573 most recently against Ole Miss.
- ▶ Burrow has also continued to get comfortable in Baton Rouge. The graduate transfer quarterback has thrown for 140, 151, 249 191 and 292 yards this season.

Offensive Line Uses Different Starting Lineup in All Five Games

- ▶ Due to injuries, LSU offensive line coach James Cregg has been forced to use a different starting line combination inf every game in 2018.
- ▶ There has been a different starter at left tackle in every game this season.
- ▶ Eight different players have started this season on the offensive line. Lloyd Cushenberry, Damien Lewis, Badara Traore, Austin Deculus and Donavaughn Campbell are all first-time starters.
- ▶ Going back to 1986, this is the first time LSU has opened a season with five different starting lineup combinations on the offensive line.
- ▶ Below is a look at the starters for each game.

White Second in League in tackles

- ▶ Regarded as one of the top linebackers in the country, junior Devin White has continued his top play in 2018.
- ▶ White owns 44 total tackles and averages 8.8 per game this season for second in the Southeastern Conference.
- ▶ In the last two seasons, White has totaled 10 double-digit tackle games. He added his first of 2018 in week two against Southeastern with 11 and finished with 11 against Louisiana Tech.
- ▶ A year ago, White led the Southeastern Conference with 133 tackles. He became the first LSU player to lead the league in tackles since the mid 1980’s when tackles became an NCAA stat.

Two Top-10 Wins Already in 2018

- ▶ With wins over No. 8 Miami and No. 7 Auburn, LSU has the two best victories in the country after four weeks.
- ▶ LSU is the first team since 1976 to defeat two AP top-10 teams in the first four weeks of the season.
- ▶ In 1976, Missouri won at No. 8 USC and at No. 2 Ohio State.

LSU Managing Turnovers Early in 2018

- ▶ After five games, LSU owns a +7 turnover margin with three forced fumbles and seven interceptions.
- ▶ The defense's seven interceptions are second in the league.
- ▶ The Tigers' three turnovers are the second fewest in the country. The +7 turnover margin also ranks in the top-10 in the country.
- ▶ A year ago, LSU tied the NCAA mark for fewest turnovers in a season and set the school record with eight.
- ▶ Dating back to November 4, 2017, LSU quarterbacks have thrown 222 consecutive passes without an interception.
- ▶ In its last 13 games, LSU only has six turnovers.

Burrow Puts Up 388 Yards of Total Offense Against Ole Miss

- ▶ LSU quarterback Joe Burrow totaled career-high numbers against Ole Miss and was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for a second time this season.
- ▶ Burrow set career highs for rushing yards (96), passing yards (292) and total offense (388) in the 45-16 win.
- ▶ Burrow connected on 18-of-25 passes and is now 70-of-31 for 1,023 yards and six touchdowns in 2018.
- ▶ He is one of only two Power 5 quarterbacks with 1,000 passing yards and zero touchdowns.
- ▶ The starter's 388 yards of total offense marked the sixth-most in school history.

Brossette Carries the Load as LSU's Running Back

- ▶ RB Nick Brossette opened the season with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games and added 69 yards on the ground against Auburn.
- ▶ Brossette owns 481 yards and six touchdowns in 2018. His total yardage ranks fourth in the league and total touchdowns rank second by a running back.
- ▶ Brossette totaled a career-high 137 yards against Southeastern and 125 yards with a pair of touchdowns against Miami.
- ▶ Brossette became the fifth-straight 100-yard rusher in a season opener for LSU: Guice (2017), Fournette (2015, 16) and Kenny Hilliard (2014).
- ▶ The Baton Rouge native scored two touchdowns in the opener against Miami and then set a career high with three against Louisiana Tech.

Kicker Cole Tracy Has Ice in His Veins

- ▶ PK Cole Tracy is 10-for-12 as the Tigers' kicker and 19-of-19 from PATs.
- ▶ The Assumption College graduate transfer knocked in the game-winning field goal from 42 yards out in the last seconds against Auburn to win on The Plains. It is the first walk-off field goal in regulation in school history.
- ▶ Tracy has already tied the school record for longest field goal with a 54-yard field goal against Miami. The field goal tied Wade Richey vs. Kentucky (1996) and Ron Lewis vs. North Carolina (1985) for the longest in school history.
- ▶ He became the first LSU player to hit two field goals of 50+ yards in the first two games since Colt David in 2008.
- ▶ Tracy leads all active collegiate kickers with 78 career field goals. The graduate transfer kicked 68 field goals at DII Assumption College.
- ▶ Overall, Tracy ranks second in the nation with 10 made field goals and his .833 percentage is in the top-25 in the nation.

Tracy's Game-Winning Field Goal First In School History

- ▶ When Cole Tracy booted the 42-yard field goal at Auburn in week three of the season, it marked the first walk-off field goal in regulation in school history.
- ▶ While there have been field goals in overtime and with less than a minute on the clock, Tracy is the only player to do it with the clock expiring in regulation.
- ▶ Below is a list of LSU's game-winning field goals since 1941. For this purpose, a field goal is classified as a "game winner" if it served as the last points of a game and it came within the final two minutes of the contest or in overtime.

- ▶ Delpit led the team in tackles with 10 against Auburn and had an interception.

Coach O's 12 Wins In First 16 Games Are Third-Most in LSU History Over That Span

- With 12 wins during his first 16 SEC games, Coach Orgeron ranks third in school history in terms of victories over that span.
- Orgeron is currently 12-4 in league games, which is bettered only by Bernie Moore (14-2) and Les Miles (13-3).

20 Is LSU's Magic Number In SEC Games

- LSU has won 18 straight SEC games when scoring at least 20 points, a streak that dates back to a 30-27 victory over Florida in 2014.
- Under Coach O, LSU is 11-0 in league games when hitting the 20-point mark. Overall under Coach O, the Tigers are 19-1 when scoring at least 20 points in a contest with the only defeat coming to Troy by a 24-21 count.
- The last SEC team to beat LSU when the Tigers scored 20 or more points was Mississippi State by a 34-29 count on Sept. 20, 2014.

Double-Digit Wins Under Coach O

- Ed Orgeron has won 20 games as head coach of the Tigers with 16 of those coming by double-digits.
- All six of LSU's wins under Orgeron in 2016 came by double-figures and last year, the Tigers won six of their nine games by at least 10 points.
- This year, four of LSU's five wins have come by double-figures.

Streak of 100-Yard Rushing Games Extended to 22

- ▶ Dating back to November 2016, LSU has rushed as a team for more than 100 yards in 21-straight games.
- ▶ In that stretch of 22 games, 13 players have rushed for more than 100 yards in a game. Darrel Williams and Derrius Guice each ran for more than 100 yards in a game in 2017 against Ole Miss and Texas A&M.
- ▶ A year ago, LSU rushed for more than 100 yards in every regular season game for just the 14th time since 1949.
- ▶ Only 10 times has an LSU team rushed for 100 or more yards in every game in a season including the bowl game.

LSU Is 76-0 When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

- ▶ In the last 158 games, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 128-20 when that happens.
- ▶ Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 77-5.
- ▶ An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 76-0.

LSU Is 73-9 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

- ▶ Dating back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 73-9 against non-SEC foes during that span.
- ▶ Of the nine losses, only three have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field and 2017 vs. Troy).
- ▶ The other six losses came in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame, 2018 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame).

Tracy, Burrow Earn Player of the Week Honors After Win at Auburn

- ▶ PK Cole Tracy and QB Joe Burrow earned Southeastern Conference Player of the Week honors following their performances at Auburn.
- ▶ Tracy was 3-for-4 on the day, including the game-winning field goal from 42 yards out as time expired and capped an 11-point comeback for LSU.
- ▶ In just his third career start, Burrow engineered an 11-point second half comeback for LSU in the 22-21 win over No. 7 Auburn.
- ▶ He threw a 71-yard TD pass to Derrick Dillon with 8:18 left in game to pull LSU to within 21-19.
- ▶ He drove the Tigers 52 yards on 14 plays, which included two third-down conversions and one fourth-down conversion, to set up the game-winning field goal as time expired.
- ▶ Burrow completed 15-of-34 passes for a career-best 249 yards and a touchdown.

Phillips, Tracy Named SEC Players of the Week vs. Miami

- ▶ A pair of first-time LSU starters made a big impact for the Tigers in the season-opening win over No. 8 Miami and as a result, kicker Cole Tracy and linebacker Jacob Phillips were named SEC Players of the Week.
- ▶ Tracy, a graduate transfer playing in his first game as a Tiger, earned SEC Special Teams Player of the Week Honors after going 4-for-4 on field goal attempts in his LSU debut. Tracy's field goals included a school-record tying 54-yarder in the third quarter that extended the Tiger lead to 33-3.
- ▶ For the game, Tracy made field goals of 54, 43, 21 and 21 yards as well as three point-after conversions on his way to scoring 15 points, the fourth-highest single-game point total for a kicker in school history.
- ▶ Tracy's 54-yard field goal tied the previous mark set twice – Wade Richey vs. Kentucky in 1996 and Ron Lewis at North Carolina in 1985. Tracy also became the first kicker in school history to kick four field goals in his LSU debut.
- ▶ Phillips, a sophomore linebacker, earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors after recording seven tackles, an interception and a quarterback hurry. Phillips returned his first career interception 45 yards for a TD in the second quarter to put the Tigers up 27-3.
- ▶ In his first career start, Phillips helped pace a Tiger defensive unit that held the Hurricanes to 83 rushing yards and only 342 total yards. LSU also forced a pair of Miami turnovers and held the Hurricanes without a third-down conversion until midway through the third quarter.

LSU's Defense Scores In Season-Opener For Second Time In Three Years

- ▶ When Jacob Phillips returned an interception 45 yards for a TD against Miami, it marked the second time in three years the Tigers scored a defensive touchdown in the season-opener.
- ▶ LSU also scored a TD against Wisconsin at Lambeau Field to open the 2016 season when Tre'Davious

52

LSU had 52 players on NFL rosters to start the 2018 season. That number was the most amongst college teams.

White returned an interception 31 yards for a score.

► Dating back to the 1982 season, LSU has had an interception returned for a touchdown 55 times.

► The LSU defense has had at least one interception returned for a touchdown in 27 of the last 37 seasons.

► Only 11 of the 55 interceptions returned for a touchdown have been by a linebacker.

LSU Goes Into 2018 Riding Streak of 18 Consecutive Years With At Least 8 Wins

► LSU goes into the 2018 season having won at least 8 games for 18 consecutive years, which ties with Oklahoma for the longest current streak among Power 5 schools.

► Only Boise State has a longer active streak among FBS teams as the Broncos have won 8 games for 19 consecutive seasons.

► LSU's current streak of seasons with at least 8 wins dates back to 2000 when the Tigers posted an 8-4 overall mark.

► LSU's streak of seasons with at least 8 wins also ranks as the longest of its kind in the history of the SEC, bettering Tennessee 16 (1989-2004); Florida 14 (1990-2003); Georgia 13 (1997-2009); and Alabama 13 (1971-83).

► During the 2018 season, eight Tigers are going to take the field as a college graduate, five of which are LSU graduates.

Louisiana's Foster Moreau Carries on No. 18 Tradition

► Senior tight end Foster Moreau was selected to continue the tradition of the prestigious No. 18 jersey. Moreau was presented with the jersey by coach Ed Orgeron in the first preseason meeting following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s.

► A native of New Orleans, Moreau was the final player to sign in the 2015 recruiting class. He is the second tight end to earn the honor. Richard Dickson wore the number in 2008 and 2009.

► Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007.

Ensminger In Second Stint as LSU's OC

- ▶ Steve Ensminger, a former quarterback at LSU, begins his second stint as the offensive coordinator for the Tigers in 2018.
- ▶ Ensminger served as LSU's offensive coordinator for eight games in 2016, a span that saw the Tigers thrive under his play-calling.
- ▶ Prior to Ensminger taking over play-calling duties in 2016, LSU's offense had scored only nine touchdowns and was averaging 18 points and 339.5 total yards per game. In eight games under Ensminger, LSU improved drastically in every offensive category as the Tigers averaged 32 points and 464.9 total yards per contest during that span. LSU scored 38 or more points five times under Ensminger, including 54 in a win over Texas A&M and 38 against both Arkansas and Ole Miss. The Tigers averaged 7.1 yards per play and converted 46-of-102 third-down opportunities during that eight-game stretch.
- ▶ Also under Ensminger, LSU's offense set school records for yards in a SEC game (634 vs. Missouri), single-game rushing yards by an individual (284 by Leonard Fournette vs. Ole Miss, 285 by Derrius Guice vs. Texas A&M), longest run from scrimmage (96 yards by Derrius Guice vs. Arkansas) and time of possession (42:33 vs. Missouri).

Fulton Reinstated for 2018 Season

- ▶ With just 10 days left before the season opener against Miami, head coach Ed Orgeron announced that cornerback Kristian Fulton was reinstated to the team by the NCAA.
- ▶ Fulton's reinstatement came two weeks after the NCAA denied an appeal by Fulton.
- ▶ On August 17, LSU Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Alleva sent the NCAA a four-page letter request reclassification of Fulton's case.
- ▶ Fulton has played in three games with no starts in his two seasons. He was regarded as the No. 1 overall prospect in Louisiana and No. 3 corner in the nation.

White, Williams Tabbed as Preseason All-Americans

- ▶ Junior LB Devin White and sophomore CB Greedy Williams were named first team Associated Press Preseason All-Americans.
- ▶ White and Williams return as the leaders of an LSU defense that ranked among the best in the nation last year, allowing only 18.9 points and 316.2 total yards per game.
- ▶ Last year, White and Williams became the first set of players from the same team to lead the Southeastern Conference tackles and interceptions in the same year since 1993.
- ▶ White paced the league with 10.2 tackles a contest and ranked No. 2 in the conference in total tackles with 133. Williams, as a redshirt freshman, topped the conference in both interceptions (6) and passes defended (13).
- ▶ White earned second team All-America honors in 2017, in what was his first season as a starter, while Williams was a third team All-America selection.

Von Rosenberg One of Nation's Oldest Players

- ▶ At 28 years old, punter Zach Von Rosenberg is the sixth-oldest player in college football in 2018.
- ▶ Von Rosenberg played minor league baseball for six seasons before joining the team in the fall.
- ▶ James Stefanon of Colorado is the oldest player at 31 years old.

This is #NFLSU

- ▶ The 2018 season marked the fifth-straight year LSU led all of college football with players on opening day NFL rosters at 52.
- ▶ There were a total of 40 players on active rosters, which was second in the Southeastern Conference.
- ▶ Sixty-five LSU players have been selected in the NFL Draft over the past 10 years, which ranks No. 2 nationally. LSU is one of just three schools in college football to have 60 or more drafted players since the 2009 NFL Draft.
- ▶ Over the last decade, LSU has produced nine first round NFL Draft picks. The Tigers have had at least one player selected in the first round 11 of the past 15 years.
- ▶ Overall, 59 former Tigers have appeared on Super Bowl rosters, and LSU has had at least one Super Bowl in 39 of 52 championship games.

We are DBU:

- ▶ Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL draft with 18, including six in the first round.
- ▶ At least one player has appeared in the Super Bowl for 17 consecutive years, which stands as the longest current streak in the SEC.

LSU Scores Historic GSR Rating

- ▶ The University scored an all-time high of 90 percent in the most recent Graduation Success Rate released by the NCAA.
- ▶ The 90 percent rating was up two points from last year's mark and up a staggering 21 point since vice chancellor and director of athletics Joe Alleva took over at LSU.
- ▶ The football team recorded a program-best 78 percent, which is significantly higher than the national average of 44 percent.

LSU Projected to Welcome Largest and Most Diverse Freshman Class Ever

- ▶ The university is projected to welcome its largest and most diverse freshman class ever. Preliminary numbers show that LSU is expected to welcome at least 5,800 new freshmen to campus this year, which would break the previous record of 5,725 new freshmen enrolled in 2012.
- ▶ Among incoming freshmen, the diversity population is up at 30 percent over last year's freshman class. In addition, the class also comes in with a GPA of 3.64, up from last year's mark at this time of a 3.56.

GAME-BY-GAME HIGHLIGHTS- 2018 SEASON

Week One - vs. #8 Miami (Fla.)

- ▶ LSU led Miami 27-3 at halftime. The 24-point lead at the half was the largest against a ranked opponent since Sept. 15, 2015 against Auburn when the Tigers held a 24-0 lead against the SEC West foe. It tied the fourth-largest halftime lead against a Top 25 team in program history.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 11-of-24 for 140 yards in his first game as a Tigers. His start marked the first time since 1959 that an LSU quarterback started his first game with the team. His first play from the line of scrimmage was a pass. It was the first time since 1989 that LSU completed a pass on its first offensive play of the season.
- ▶ Senior **Nick Brossette** earned his first 100-yard game, including touchdown runs of 1 and 50 yards. He finished the night with 125 yards on 22 carries.
- ▶ Kicker **Cole Tracy** and linebacker **Jacob Phillips** were named SEC Players of the week. Tracy played in his first game as a Tiger and went 4-for-4 on field goal attempts along with an LSU record-tying 54-yarder. Phillips recorded seven tackles, an interception and a quarterback hurry. The sophomore returned his first career interception 45 yards for a touchdown.
- ▶ The LSU defense held the Hurricanes to only 83 rushing yards and only 342 total yards.

Week Two - vs. Southeastern Louisiana

- ▶ The LSU defense pitched a shutout Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, 31-0, as the 11th-ranked Tigers forced three turnovers and held Southeastern Louisiana to 65 rushing yards.
- ▶ Kicker **Cole Tracy** continued his perfect start in 2018, making his only field goal from 50 yards. He became the first LSU kicker since 2008 to record 50-yard kicks in consecutive contests. He has made all five of his field goals and all seven PATs. The field goal was also the first 50-plus yard field goal by LSU in Tiger Stadium since Nov. 13, 2010.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 10-for-20 with 151 yards passing and two touchdowns. With the clock at 0:00 in the second quarter, Burrow threw a desperation pass into the endzone when a leaping **Stephen Sullivan** brought down the 40-yard pass to give LSU the 24-0 lead at the half. It was the first passing touchdown on the final play of a half since the Bluegrass Miracle in 2002 and the first in Tiger Stadium since 1989.
- ▶ The shutout was preserved with a **Greedy Williams** interception with 11:54 left in the first quarter. It was the seventh interception of Williams' career and the first of the season. It remained in tact again when Southeastern had a bad snap, and **JaCoby Stevens** recovered the ball at the SLU 18-yard line and ran it back 64 yards, which resulted in a touchdown four plays later by **Clyde Edwards-Helaire**, the first rushing touchdown of his career. The shutout was the first by LSU in Tiger Stadium since Sept. 13, 2014, when LSU blanked UL-Monroe 31-0.
- ▶ Linebacker **Devin White** led the LSU defense for the second consecutive game, recording 11 tackles, one tackle for loss and one forced fumble. His forced fumble was with 8:45 left in the first quarter, and it was recovered by **Andre Anthony**. Following the fumble recovery, the Burrow connected with **Ja'Marr Chase** to culminate the 34-yard drive and gave the Tigers the early 7-0 lead. The touchdown was the first touchdown for both the quarterback and the wide receiver.

Week Three - at #7 Auburn

- ▶ With the clock at 0:00, kicker **Cole Tracy** continued his excellent start in his LSU career, connected on a 42-yard field goal to seal the 22-21 win on The Plains. The 42-yarder was one of his three made field goals in the game. The graduate transfer also booted an extra point.
- ▶ The walk-off score was the first one since Drew Alleman kicked the game-winning field goal on Nov. 5, 2011 at Alabama in the "Game of the Century" and was the first one in regulation since Oct. 2, 2010, when Stevan Ridley ran for one yard on the final play of the game against Tennessee.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 15-of-34 passing for 249 yards, including a 71-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **Derrick Dillon** that pulled LSU within two points with 8:18 to play. The touchdown was the first of Dillon's career and was the longest catch of his career. On the final drive of the game, Burrow led the Tigers on a 14-play, 52-yard drive that used the final 5:38 of the clock and ended with a 42-yard field goal that split the uprights with the clock at 0:00.
- ▶ Safety **Grant Delpit** led LSU with 10 tackles, while linebackers **Devin White** and **Jacob Phillips** each had eight. Both Delpit and **Greedy Williams** had interceptions. Williams' interception was his second in as many games and was the eighth pick of his career.
- ▶ LSU out-gained Auburn, 370-328, converted 8-of-20 third downs and overcame a season-high nine penalties for 91 yards. Auburn also had nine penalties for 111 yards, including a key pass interference penalty that setup LSU's winning field goal. Save 21-straight points by Auburn in a 10-minute segment of the game spanning the second and third quarters, LSU's defense controlled the majority of the game. Auburn was held scoreless in the first 24:54 and the final 25:38 of the game.

Week Four - vs. Louisiana Tech

- ▶ Running backs **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** and **Nick Brossette** combined for five touchdowns to lift the No. 6 Tigers to 4-0 on the season with a 38-21 victory against Louisiana Tech. Edwards-Helaire rushed for 136 yards, making 2018 the 10th-consecutive season that LSU has featured multiple 100-yard game rushers. LSU's streak of 100-yard rushing games was extended to 21-straight as the Tigers ran for 218 yards.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** is now 4-0 as the Tigers' starting quarterback and finished the night 16-of-28 passing for 191 yards. With 0:35 left in the second quarter, Burrow was sacked and fumbled the ball. It was recovered by Louisiana Tech's Keonatyne Garner, marking the Tigers' first turnover of the season. Prior to the turnover, LSU was the only team in FBS that did not have a turnover this season. The Tigers had gone 20 consecutive quarters without a turnover.
- ▶ Linebacker **Jacob Phillips** paced the Tiger defense with a career-high 13 tackles, marking his first double-digit tackle game. Linebacker **Devin White** recorded his 10th double-digit tackle game of his career, posting 11 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, one sack, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.
- ▶ Safety **Ed Paris** intercepted a pass broken up by White, shortly after **Cole Tracy**'s ninth field goal of the season, a 24-yarder. The Interception was the first of Paris' career and set up an Edwards-Helaire touchdown one play later.

Week Five - vs. Ole Miss

- ▶ LSU honored the 1958 National Championship Team by wearing numerals on the side of its helmets and romped to a 45-16 win against the Rebels. The game officially ended at 11:50 p.m. CST. It is the latest end time since start times and game durations have been kept consistently (1979). LSU had 33 first downs in the contest, marking the most first downs in a game since 1978.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** is now 5-0 as the Tigers' starting quarterback. He finished the night 18-of-25 passing for a career-high 292 yards and a career-best three touchdowns. Burrow also led the team in rushing with 96 yards on nine attempts and one touchdown. Burrow connected with nine different receivers including wide receiver Justin Jefferson who had a team-high five catches for 99 yards with touchdowns of 65 and 5 yards. Stephen Sullivan added five catches for 50 yards while Racey McMath had his first two career catches for 42 yards.
- ▶ Along with Burrow's 96 net yards rushing, running back Nick Brossette had 72 net yards with a 4-yard touchdown run late in the first quarter that put the Tiger ahead, 14-3. Clyde Edwards-Helaire added 67 net yards on 11 carries with a 3-yard touchdown run midway through the second quarter.
- ▶ S **Grant Delpit** finished the night with five tackles, one sack, a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss, one interception, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.

On This Day - October 6

September 29, 1984 • LSU def. #15 Southern Cal, 23-3, at Los Angeles Coliseum

LSU has played on October 6 14 times in school history. Of the 14 times, the last six have been against Florida. LSU has a 3-3 record against Florida on that date. Of the six games, LSU has played four in Tiger Stadium and has an 0-2 record in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. Below are recaps of the three wins.

October 6, 1973 • #10 LSU def. Florida, 24-3, in Tiger Stadium

LSU methodically trampled the highly-ranked Florida Gators as the Tigers scored for the first time in the 1973 season in the opening period and were never in danger. LSU blew a golden opportunity on the second play of the game when Gary Champagne recovered a Gator fumble at the Florida 25, but three plays failed to net a first down and Juan Roca missed a 39-yard field goal try. On the next series, LSU forced Florida into a punting situation, Steve Elekacs blocked it and sophomore David Lee picked up the loose ball at the 3-yard line and carried it across the stripe for a 7-0 LSU lead. UF drove right back and hit on a 32-yard field goal. However, on the play preceding the three pointer Bink Miciotto zapped quarterback David Bowden for an 11-yard loss and removed him from action the rest of the night. Miciotto's defensive efforts against the Gators earned him Southeastern Lineman-of-the-Week honors. The Tigers took the ensuing kickoff and went 74 yards on 13 plays with Mike Miley rolling into the end zone for the tally with three seconds left in the initial period. There was no more scoring until early in the second half when Roca popped a 50-yard fielder, third longest in LSU history, to cap a drive, which had started at the Tiger 25. After holding Florida, the Tigers embarked on a 72-yard, 13 play drive with Terry Robiskie contributing some crucial runs and Miley tallying the score. LSU played ball control, maintaining possession 23:08 of the second half to win its fourth-straight game of the season.

October 6, 1979 • #17 LSU def. Florida, 20-3, in Tiger Stadium

LSU trailed by a scary 3-0 at halftime as a result of Brian Clark's 48-yard field goal in the second period. Meanwhile, the Tigers were netting but 21 yards of offense in a flat opening quarter and posing but one serious scoring threat before intermission against a surprisingly stern Florida defense. In fact, it wasn't until late in the third stanza that the Tigers got anything going. Starting from his own 14, Steve Ensminger ate up most of the intervening yards with tosses to LeRoid Jones, Lionel Wallis, Carson, Myles and Porter until it was first down on the Gator 16, from where Myles took a pitchout to the left and raced across in the southeast corner. Early in the fourth quarter, a short punt set up LSU on the Florid 36, and Ensminger steered 'em across in four plays with the aid of an interference penalty. Myles going in from the five. Ensminger and Myles starred in a 68-yard clincher in the fading minutes, but it was LeRoid Jones who checked in on a 6-yard sweep left. Barthel's second PAT of the evening accounted for the final score. With Gajan sidelined by injuries sustained against Southern Cal, Myles and Jones took up the rushing slack with 79 and 73 yards, respectively. But Ensminger's 10-for-13, good for 125 yards, was the decisive factor. Lyman White, still the soul of consistency, racked up 11 tackles and Chris Williams added another interception to his school record total.

October 6, 2007- # 1 LSU def. #9 Florida, 28-24, in Tiger Stadium

In what was called an epic battle of two college football heavyweights, LSU willed itself, behind the play of Jacob Hester and the gutsy play calling of Les Miles, to a 28-24 win over Florida. Trailing 24-14 entering fourth quarter, the Tiger offense dominated the final 15 minutes of the game, possessing the ball for 12 minutes and scoring 14 points. LSU took its first and only lead of the contest on its last possession of the game, going 60 yards on 15 plays, capped with a 2-yard Hester TD run that put the Tigers up 28-24 with just over a minute left. LSU's defense turned away Florida on its final possession to seal the victory in front of a school-record 92,910 fans. Florida wasted little time in jumping on the Tigers, taking a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. The Tigers pulled to within three on a 1-yard run by Ryan Perrilloux, but the Gators answered right back to a take a 17-7 lead at halftime. The second half was all LSU as the Tigers held the powerful Gators to only seven points and 142 yards of offense. LSU used a Kirston Pittman interception early in the fourth quarter to pull within 24-21 following a 4-yard pass from Matt Flynn to Demetrius Byrd. The Tigers held the Gators to a three-and-out on their next possession, setting up the game-winning drive.

VICTORY IN THE SWAMP! Defense Keys Huge Win, 17-16

The LSU Football team showed resilience as the Tigers held on for a 17-16 victory against No. 21 Florida on Saturday afternoon in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. LSU (4-2, 1-1 SEC) built a two-touchdown lead early in the second half, took advantage of a missed PAT and held the nationally-ranked Gators scoreless in the fourth quarter for the key SEC win. Devin White batted down a fourth-down pass in Florida territory late in the fourth quarter to secure the victory. White led the Tigers with 13 tackles, including a sack. It was his fourth consecutive game with double-digit tackles. The Tigers sacked Felipe Franks five times, as the Florida freshman quarterback finished the game with 108 yards on 10-of-16 passing. LSU out-gained the Gators in total offense 341-302 and won the time of possession battle at 33:50. Danny Etling was 9-of-16 passing for 125 yards and ran the ball nine times for 26 yards. Russell Gage scored LSU's first touchdown and led the Tigers with 52 of the team's 216 rushing yards. Derrick Dillon was ejected at the 5:43 mark for targeting and missed the remainder of the game. Prior to his departure, he had one carry for a 30-yard gain that moved the Tigers into Florida territory for the first time in the game. Gage carried the ball for 30 yards to put the first points of the game on the board with 1:22 left in the first quarter. Connor Culp kicked the successful PAT to put the Tigers up, 7-0. The score capped an 11-play, 86-yard drive. Florida threatened in the second quarter, but was only able to get three points out of an 11-play, 70-yard drive at the 4:01 mark. Eddy Pineiro connected on the 25-yard field goal, 7-3. LSU responded on the next drive as Culp split the uprights for a 38-yard field goal with 25 seconds left in the half. LSU took the opening drive of the second half 75 yards on nine plays to jump out to a 14-point lead. Tory Carter caught a two-yard touchdown pass from Etling with 10:56 to go in the third quarter, followed by a successful PAT by Culp. The score was Carter's first career touchdown on just his third career reception. Carter is also the first true freshman to score a touchdown this season. Florida scored on the next drive with a 2-yard run by Lamical Perine with 7:39 left in the third. Pineiro's extra point was good, 17-10. The Gators cut the LSU lead to one with 1:45 left in the third. Perine scored from one yard out and Pineiro's kick failed to keep Florida from tying the score, 17-16. The teams traded punts until late in the fourth quarter. LSU stopped the final Florida drive on 4th and 3 at the Gator 25 with a huge pass break up by White with 1:39 left in the game. The defensive stop preserved the win for the Tigers.

The teams last played in 2017 when the Tigers posted a 17-16 win over the Gators in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. LSU returns to Gainesville for a second-straight year in 2018. In 2016, the LSU-Florida game was originally scheduled to be played in Gainesville on October 8, however, Hurricane Matthew postponed the game. Instead, both teams canceled non-conference games (LSU-South Alabama; Florida-Presbyterian) scheduled for November 19 and met in Tiger Stadium where the Gators posted a 16-10 victory ... Due to the movement of the game from Gainesville to Baton Rouge last year, LSU played at Florida in 2017 and again in 2018. Overall, LSU has won four of the last five and six of the last eight meetings with the Gators ... In its last to Gainesville in 2014, Colby Delahoussaye kicked a 50-yard field with three seconds left to lift LSU to a 30-27 victory ... Prior to Florida's 2016 win over LSU, the Gators' last win over the Tigers came in 2012 in a 14-6 win in Gainesville ... Florida serves as LSU's permanent opponent from the eastern side of the SEC ... Since 1992 when the SEC was split into two divisions, Florida has a 15-11 record against LSU ... The teams have met every year since 1971 ... Dating back to 2000, LSU holds a 10-8 advantage in the series ... LSU leads 5-4 in the last nine games played in Gainesville ... LSU coach Ed Orgeron is 1-2 vs. Florida, with losses coming to the Gators 30-24, in 2007 as the Ole Miss head coach and 16-10 in 2016 year as head coach of the Tigers.

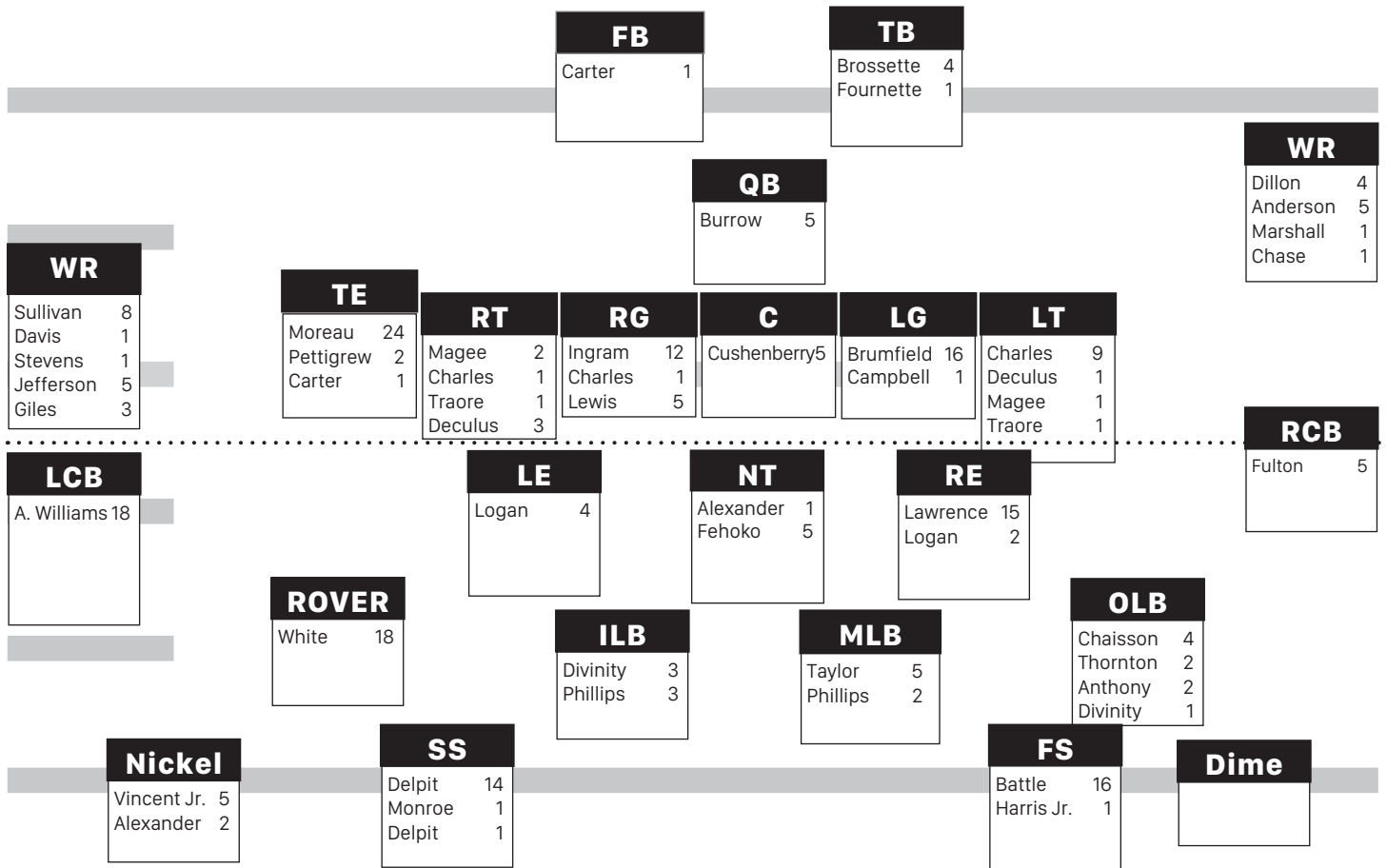

LSU Dominates Early, Storms Past No. 8 Miami, 33-17

No. 25-ranked LSU took a commanding 27-3 halftime lead and cruised to its second Top-10 victory under head coach **Ed Orgeron**, 33-17 over No. 8 Miami on Sunday night in AT&T Stadium. LSU (1-0), playing with 11 first-time starters, held the Hurricanes to 97 yards in the opening 30 minutes and led 33-3 entering the fourth quarter. Just before halftime, LSU sophomore linebacker **Jacob Philips** returned an interception 45 yards for a touchdown that put the Tigers in firm command of the contest. The Tigers, who committed a nation-best eight turnovers in 2017, continued to protect the football - and kept Miami's "Turnover Chain" in its case. Senior running back **Nick Brossette** earned his first 100-yard game including touchdown runs of 1 and 50 yards. The Baton Rouge native had 125 yards on 22 carries. Graduate transfer quarterback **Joe Burrow** led the Tigers to six scoring drives without committing a turnover. Burrow finished 11-of-24 passing for 140 yards, while rushing four times for 14 yards. Sophomore **Justin Jefferson** set career-bests with 81 yards on five catches. Another graduate transfer, senior **Cole Tracy**, made all four of his field goal attempts and tied a school record with a 54-yarder that skidded over the crossbar in the third quarter. Tracy also had makes from 43, 21 and 21 yards in his Division I debut. Miami outgained LSU, 342-296. LSU scored 10 points off two Miami interceptions and held the Canes to 83 net rushing yards on 34 attempts. The Tigers recorded four sacks of Miami quarterback **Malik Rosier**. Rosier led the Hurricanes with 259 passing yards but was pressured throughout the contest by the aggressive LSU defense.

No. 11 LSU Posts Shutout in Home Opener, 31-0

The LSU defense pitched a shutout Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, 31-0, as the 11th-ranked Tigers forced three turnovers and held Southeastern Louisiana to 65 rushing yards. LSU was led by running back **Nick Brossette**, who had 137 of LSU's 184 net rushing yards on 19 carries. Quarterback **Joe Burrow** completed 10-of-20 passes for 151 yards with two touchdowns. Burrow also ran for a touchdown, as did running back **Clyde Edwards-Helaire**. LSU placekicker **Cole Tracy** continued his perfect start in 2018, as the senior transfer made his only attempt from 50 yards. Linebacker **Devin White** recorded his ninth double-digit tackles game with a team-high 11, while true freshman **Micah Baskerville** made his debut and added six tackles in relief of **Jacob Phillips**. Phillips was ejected for targeting late in the first half. Nose tackle **Breiden Fehoko** was dominant up front, collecting six tackles including 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage. **Neil Farrell Jr.** came off the edge to make six tackles including 1.5 sacks. LSU had 10 tackles for loss in the game. **Greedy Williams** picked up his first interception of the season and added three tackles. LSU grabbed a 7-0 lead with 7:15 remaining in the first quarter when quarterback Joe Burrow connected with freshman wide receiver **Ja'Marr Chase** on a nine-yard touchdown pass. The aerial was the first TD throw of Burrow's LSU career and the first scoring reception of Chase's collegiate career. After a three-and-out by the Southeastern offense, LSU drove 46 yards in seven plays with the march ending on Burrow's one-yard TD run, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead at the 3:20 mark of the first quarter. LSU increased its advantage to 17-0 with 11:21 remaining in the first half when placekicker Cole Tracy nailed a 50-yard field goal, his second 50+ yard three-pointer of the season. Tracy became the first LSU kicker since Colt David in 2008 to make 50+ yard field goals in consecutive games. Burrow hit wide receiver **Stephen Sullivan** on a 40-yard Hail Mary touchdown pass on the final play of the first half to give LSU a 24-0 lead at intermission. The play culminated a 96-yard, seven-play march and marked the second career TD reception for Sullivan. SLU mounted a scoring threat early in the fourth quarter, advancing to the LSU 21-yard line, but cornerback Greedy Williams picked off a Chason Virgil pass at the Tigers' 6-yard line to stymie the drive. Taking over at their 49, the Lions took advantage of the short field and marched to the LSU 3-yard line. However, a bad pass from center on third-and-goal was recovered by LSU's **JaCoby Stevens** at the SLU 18 and returned to the LSU 18. The last of four-consecutive rushes by Edwards-Helaire resulted in a 7-yard touchdown and gave LSU a 31-0 lead with 2:03 to play.

Tracy's Walk-Off Caps Comeback Win at No. 7 Auburn

Cole Tracy made a 42-yard field goal as time expired, as the No. 12-ranked LSU football team defeated No. 7 Auburn, 22-21, on Saturday on The Plains. LSU (3-0, 1-0 SEC) knocked off its second top-10 opponent - No. 8 Miami and No. 7 Auburn - in the first three weeks of the 2018 season, each away from Tiger Stadium. The last team to beat two AP top-10 teams in the first three weeks of a season was Missouri in 1976. LSU quarterback **Joe Burrow**, a transfer from Ohio State, earned his first SEC victory in one of the most hostile environments, as the visiting Tigers won at Auburn for the first time since 2012. Burrow was 15-of-34 passing for 249 yards including a 71-yard touchdown pass to **Derrick Dillon** that pulled LSU within two, 21-19, with 8:18 to play. On the final drive of the game, he led the Tigers on a 14-play, 52-yard drive that used the final 5:38 of the clock and ended with Tracy's 42-yard field goal that split the uprights with the clock at 0:00. The walk-off field goal was LSU's first in regulation since at least 1941. Running back **Nick Brossette** led LSU with 69 rushing yards on 19 carries, while Burrow had 22 net yards on 10 carries including a sack. Wide receiver **Justin Jefferson** had a team-best 97 yards on five catches, while Dee Anderson added 41 yards on three grabs including a key first-down catch-and-stretch to keep LSU's final drive alive. Tracy, made 3-of-4 field goals with makes from 33, 27 and the game-winner of 42 yards. The miss - his only in nine attempts in 2018 - was from 53 yards in the first quarter. Save 21-straight points by Auburn in a 10-minute segment of the game spanning the second and third quarters, LSU's defense controlled the game. Auburn was held scoreless in the first 24:54 and the final 25:38 of the game. Safety **Grant Delpit** led LSU with 10 tackles, while linebackers **Devin White** and **Jacob Phillips** each had eight. Both Delpit and **Greedy Williams** had interceptions. LSU outgained Auburn, 370-328, held the ball for 10 minutes longer than Auburn, converted 8-of-20 third downs and overcame a season-high nine penalties for 91 yards. Auburn also had nine penalties for 111 yards, including a key pass interference penalty that setup LSU's winning field goal. Quarterback Jarrett Stidham led the Auburn offense, completing 16-of-28 passes for 198 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. Redshirt freshman Jalarvious Whitlow had 104 rushing yards on 22 carries with a 7-yard touchdown run, while back Shaun Shivers had 25 yards and a 7-yard score. Darius Slayton caught a 4-yard touchdown pass on third-and-goal to give Auburn a 21-10 lead with 10:38 left in the third quarter. A 20-yard catch by Anderson turned into a 35-yard gain when a face-mask penalty was called. Following a 7-yard run for a first down by Brossette, wide receiver **Jonathan Giles** drew a pass interference penalty that gave LSU first-and-goal at the 8. When three plays netted one yard, LSU settled for a 27-yard Tracy field goal and trailed 21-13 with 3:58 to play in the third quarter. On the first play of the drive, Burrow got perfect protection and found Dillon streaking across the middle of the field. Burrow's lofted a pass just over the linebacker and into Dillon's hands in stride. Dillon sprinted untouched to the Auburn 10 before dodging a tackle and completing a 71-yard catch-and-run for a touchdown. LSU trailed 21-19 when its two-point pass attempt to Jefferson fell incomplete in the back of the endzone. With less than five minutes on the clock, the Tigers were able to get the ball to Auburn's 24-yard line. The final snap was a 42-yard field goal from Tracy, which ended the game 22-21.

Backs Combine for Five TDs in Victory Over Tech

LSU running backs **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** and **Nick Brossette** combined for 214 yards and five touchdowns, as the No. 6-ranked Tigers improved to 4-0 with a 38-21 victory over Louisiana Tech. After LSU jumped out to a 24-0 lead midway through the second quarter, Louisiana Tech (2-1) gave LSU all it could handle. The Bulldogs scored 21-unanswered points including a 42-yard touchdown pass from J'Mar Smith to Adrian Hardy with 12:57 to play. However, LSU responded with two touchdowns in a six-minute span, which sandwiched a defensive stop and turnover on downs in Bulldogs territory. Sophomore Edwards-Helaire had career-bests of 20 carries, 136 yards and two touchdowns, while Brossette tallied 78 yards on 20 carries and scored on runs of 1, 1 and 2 yards. LSU quarterback **Joe Burrow** completed 16-of-28 passes for 191 yards, as the Tigers amassed 409 yards of total offense. Burrow's 21-yard pass to freshman wide receiver **Ja'Marr Chase** setup Brossette's first touchdowns. Cornerback **Kristian Fulton** forced a fumble and linebacker **Devin White** returned it to the Louisiana Tech 3, leading to Brossette's second score on the first play of the second quarter. Following a **Cole Tracy** 24-yard field goal, LSU defensive back **Ed Paris** intercepted a pass broken up by White at the Bulldogs 28. On the next play, Edwards-Helaire scored to give LSU a 24-0 lead. Linebacker **Jacob Phillips** had a team-high 13 tackles, while White added 11 including 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage and three pass breakups. Safety **Todd Harris Jr.**, who started in place of **John Battle**, had nine tackles. Louisiana Tech quarterback J'Mar Smith finished 27-of-50 passing for 330 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. His top target was Adrian Hardy, who had 10 catches for 181 yards with touchdowns of 20 and 42 yards.

No. 5 Football Balanced in Ole Miss Blow-out, 45-16

Fifth-ranked LSU rolled up 573 yards of total offense - 292 through the air and 281 on the ground - in a 45-16 victory over Ole Miss on a rainy Saturday night in Tiger Stadium. LSU (5-0, 2-0 SEC) was led by quarterback **Joe Burrow**, who was 18-of-25 passing with three touchdowns while running for a team-best 96 yards and a touchdown. Burrow connected with nine different receivers including wide receiver **Justin Jefferson** who had a team-high five catches for 99 yards with touchdowns of 65 and 5 yards. **Stephen Sullivan** added five catches for 50 yards while **Racey McMath** had his first two career catches for 42 yards. Along with Burrow's 96 net yards rushing, running back **Nick Brossette** had 72 net yards with a 4-yard touchdown run late in the first quarter that put the Tiger ahead, 14-3. **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** added 67 net yards on 11 carries with a 3-yard touchdown run midway through the second quarter. LSU ran 50 times for 281 yards, converted 7-of-12 third downs and overcame two turnovers. The Tigers had 33 first downs - LSU's most since 1978 - and held the ball for 35:17. Though the Tigers' offensive line got a boot with the return of tackle **Adrian Magee**, LSU started its fifth different combination in as many games. Sophomore **Donavon Campbell** earned his first start at left guard in place of an injured **Garrett Brumfield**. Defensively, LSU held the Rebels in check throughout the contest, beginning with a diving interception by safety **Grant Delpit** on Ole Miss' second play from scrimmage. Cornerback **Greedy Williams** led the Tigers with 10 tackles, while Delpit had five including 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage. Linebackers **Devin White** and **Jacob Phillips** collected six tackles each. Saturday's 8:15 p.m. CT kickoff led to the latest ending time for an LSU home game officially recorded (since 1979). Ole Miss (3-2, 0-2 SEC) committed 17 penalties for 167 yards, the highest by an LSU opponent on record (since 1937). Rebels quarterback Jordan Ta'amu was 19-of-38 passing for 178 yards. Ole Miss running back Scottie Phillips ran 16 times for 96 net yards with a 1-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter.
