2nd Year at LSU • 6th Year as a Head Coach

After laying a new foundation for the future of LSU basketball in Year 1, Will Wade enters his second year as head coach of the Tigers.

The first night Wade led the Tigers onto the floor of the Maravich Center was a night that signaled a new dawn for the storied program.

There had been plenty of excitement prior to the opening game as the first-year coach went all over the state speaking to groups about basketball.

But would people back that up by showing for the opening game?

They did to the tune of 11,856 at the Maravich Center, the largest opening night crowd since the start of Shaquille O'Neal's final season of play at LSU in 1991-92.

It was the first of 18 wins that would lead LSU back to postseason play for the first-time since 2015 and produce the first postseason NIT win in Baton Rouge. Wade became just the second coach in school history to take his first LSU team to postseason play.

The first-year coach delivered on what he promised – a team that would play hard, would represent the University well and players committed to building the program.

Wade and an experienced coaching staff put together a recruiting class that included two five-star players and two four-star players that helped the Tigers finish with the No. 3 recruiting class in the country leading into the 2018-19 season.

That new foundation for the future began on March 20, 2017, when Frank William "Will" Wade was named the 22nd head men's basketball coach at LSU.

He arrived at LSU after a stellar two-year stint as the head coach at Virginia Commonwealth University with four years of very successful experience as a head basketball coach.

Wade was introduced to LSU fans at a special media event held in the

middle of the LSU Student Union. Wade told the media and a large contingent of LSU students:

"I am so excited about the opportunity to lead this program and LSU Basketball back to the top of the SEC and back to regular, consistent NCAA Tournament appearances. We have been to four Final Fours. We have been to 20 NCAA Tournaments. We have 10 SEC Championships, and we are going to add to all three of those categories over our tenure here."

Prior to his appointment at LSU, the native of Nashville, Tenn., directed VCU to a 51-20 record and two NCAA Tournament appearances. The 2016 Rams advanced to the second round of the tournament, defeating Oregon State before losing to Oklahoma. In 2017, VCU lost to St. Mary's in the first round of the 2017 tourney.

Before becoming the head coach at VCU, Wade served as the head coach at Chattanooga for the 2013-14 and 2014-15 seasons.

Wade's coaching start came at Clemson where he served as Director of Basketball Operations (2006-07) and Graduate Assistant (2005-06) after four seasons as a student manager (2002-05). In eight years as an assistant coach at Clemson (2005-07), Harvard (2007-09) and VCU (2009-13), the teams had a record of 177-97 with six postseason appearances (2005-13).

Wade is married to the former Lauren Deason, and the couple has one daughter, Caroline Elizabeth.

TRIBUTE TO WAYDE

There will be a brief tribute ceremony for the late Wayde Sims following the contest against Southeastern on Tuesday night. The junior at LSU passed away on Sept. 28.

The team is wearing patches in honor of Sims and the team put Wayde's jersey in the middle of the front row when it took the team picture last month.

Sims, whose father Wayde played at LSU during the early 1990s for Coach Dale Brown, had played in 63 games over two years. He averaged 5.6 points and 2.9 rebounds last season, playing an average of 17.4 minutes a contest

LSU WIN TOTAL LEAVES LAST YEAR BEHIND

LSU, with the NIT win finished with 18 wins, eight more than a year ago, thanks to wins in the final seven home games and the NIT win. LSU had a winning season and it is a fifth consecutive winning record as a head coach in as many years for head Coach Will Wade.

LSU finished with eight conference wins and that is six games to the plus from the two that LSU won in 2017.

TIGERS ENTER SEASON WITH HOME WIN STREAK OF SEVEN

The Tigers closed the season with six straight SEC wins at home and then an NIT win against UL-Lafayette so the Tigers open with a Maravich Center home win streak of seven, the most to start a season since the Tigers entered the 2006-07 campaign with nine wins ... That streak extended to 11 before being stopped.

In the history of the Maravich Center, the Tigers have had 14 streaks of 11 games or more ... The last long winning streak was when LSU won the final three games of the 2007-08 season and then won the first 14 in 2008-09 for a total of 17 games, the fourth longest in the history of the Maravich Center.

LSU finished 14-4 at home last year in the Maravich Center. LSU has won 549 games in the 47 years of play in the building and 253 in league play. LSU has won at least six conference home games in five of the last seven

seasons. The double figure wins at home marks the 34th time in building history to have double digit wins at home.

SEASON OPENERS

The Tigers are 1-0 on opening night in the Will Wade era with last year's opening night win over Alcorn State ... LSU all-time is 89-20 in opening night games and LSU is presently on a streak of four years. LSU last lost an opener at the start for the 2013-14 season when the Tigers fell at Massachusetts, 92-90. LSU has won the last 27 season openers that have taken place in the Maravich Center. LSU's last home lost on an opening night was at the start of the 1986-87 season against TCU.

SKYLAR MAYS GOOD OFF COURT

Sophomore guard Skylar Mays was named second team Academic All-American as selected by CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) at the end of last season.

Mays was originally one of five players named to the District 6 Academic All-District Team selected by CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America). The Academic All-District Men's Basketball Team recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the court and in the classroom. District 6 covers Arkansas, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota, Missouri, Mississippi, North Dakota, South Dakota and Wisconsin.

Mays was then selected second team Academic A-A based on a vote of the CoSIDA Academic All-America committee.

Mays has a 4.01 GPA and is majoring in pre-med/kinesiology ... In addition to the CoSIDA honor, he was honored by the LSU Black Faculty and Staff Cuacus at their annual awards presentation in Spring 2018 as one of the recipients of the Jesse Owens Student Award for the highest GPA by undergraduate student-athletes.

AND MAYS IS VERY GOOD ON COURT

In his sophomore year, Mays upped his scoring average three full points at LSU, from 8.3 to 11.3 points per game ... He played in all 33 games starting 30 and in two years has made 55 starts in 64 career games ... The Baton Rouge native averaged 4.0 rebounds a game, 3.0 assists a game and 1.6 steals per contest ... Mays was the second part of Coach Will Wade's two-point guard system at LSU a year ago and on Feb. 24 against Georgia he became the 33rd player in LSU history to have 200 career assists (210 now)

Mays posted an assist-to-turnover number of 97 assists to 56 turnovers He was No. 15 in the league in minutes played per game at 31.1 with 22 games in double figures, including eight-of-the-last-10. He has 35 double figure games over two years with 14 career games with five assists or more.

TREMONT WATERS -- POINTING THE WAY

As the primary point guard last season for Coach Will Wade, Tremont Waters showed his ability in several different categories -- passing, three-point shooting, steals and some spectacular plays that three times earned him spots on ESPN's Top 10 Plays of the Day. Now after an All-SEC Freshman team season and having been named first-team Preseason All-SEC by the media, Waters will be expected to add leadership to those abilities as he will be one of four players with returning court time for the Tigers.

Waters started 32-of-33 games, playing the last three games in the post-season (SECT, NIT) with a mask after breaking his nose i practice. He averaged 15.9 points, 3.4 rebounds, 6.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game ... He finished the season with 198 assists, topping the school record for freshman of 158 set in 2016 by Ben Simmons and the 198 is also the second most assists in a single season by an LSU player ... Waters had 21 games scoring in double figures (10 games of 20 or more points) with five double doubles (four points-assists; one points-rebounds).

Waters, according to TeamReference.com, was the first LSU freshman since the 1992-93 season (the last season site database can reference) to average 15 points and five assists in a season The last SEC freshman to do it was John Wall of Kentucky during the 2009-10 season ... He finished the season No. 8 in the SEC in scoring, No. 2 in assists, No. 1 in steals, No. 8 in free throw percentage (117-146, 80.1%), seventh in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.1) and sixth in the league in minutes played.

Water was named by collegebasketballNBCsports.com fifth on its list of top 20 lead guards for 2018-19. Scott Phillips wrote: "There might not be a guard who is more fun to watch than this 5-foot-11 sophomore. Breaking LSU's freshman school assists record while pumping in tons of tough shots, Waters averaged 15.9 points, 6.0 assists and 3.4 rebounds per game last season. With flashy handles and deep perimeter shooting ability, Waters was made to make highlights as he can single-handedly ignite an offense."

IS THE TWO-POINT GUARD SYSTEM NOW THE THREE POINT-GUARD SYSTEM

Okay, the two-point guard system of Waters and Mays certainly worked last year for LSU and Coach Wade is a proponent of having two point guards on the floor to help run the offense smoothly.

But when you look at an option like freshman Ja'vonte Smart of Baton Rouge, LSU at times may have three-point guards on the floor. All three players have certainly shown the ability to pass and score the ball so look for that to be an option as this 2018-19 campaign gets under way.

Will Wade joined Trent Johnson as the only two LSU coaches to take their first team to post-season play. In 2009, Johnson took the Tigers to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. For Wade, this was his first trip to the NIT, but continues a trend of going to post-season in each of his three jobs over the five seasons as a head coach.
