

LSU FOOTBALL POSTGAME NOTES

Rice vs. #7/10 LSU

Nov. 17, 2018—Tiger Stadium (Baton Rouge, La.)

Team Notes

1. The LSU Captains were RB **Nick Brossette**, TE **Foster Moreau**, WR **Tiger Scheyd** and S **Ed Paris**.
 - a. Paris wore the No. 21, marking the final time an LSU player will wear the number in Tiger Stadium as Jerry Stovall's No. 21 was retired earlier this season.
2. LSU won the toss and elected to receive. Rice kicked off and defended the south end zone.
3. LSU honored 18 seniors preio to the contest.
4. With the 42-10 win, LSU improves to 9-2, 5-2 SEC.
5. Head Coach Ed Orgeron is now 25-8 at the helm.
 - a. He now has a 40-35 overall record.
 - i. He is 1-0 against Rice all-time.
 - ii. LSU is 19-8 as a Top 25 team under Coach O.
 - iii. LSU is 6-1 at home in 2018, and the Tigers are 14-4 in Tiger Stadium under Orgeron.
 - b. In his last 39 games as a head coach, Orgeron has a 30-10 mark, a stretch that includes a 6-2 record with Southern Cal in 2013.
6. LSU recorded 180 rushing yards and held Rice to 97 yards rushing.
 - a. LSU is 78-0 when rushing for 100 yards and holding opponents to less than 100 yards.
 - b. LSU is now 7-0 this year when out-rushing its opponent.
 - c. Under Coach O, the Tigers are 22-2 when rushing for more yards than its opponent.
 - d. In 36 games with Dave Aranda as defensive coordinator, LSU has held opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards 14 times. LSU is 14-0 in those games.
7. LSU is 74-9 versus non-conference team dating back to 2001.
8. LSU's defense has not allowed 30 points in a game for 21 consecutive contests.
9. LSU's streak of games recording an interception was snapped at 12 as the Tiger defense did not record an interception in the game, dating back to the 2017 season.

Individual

Offense

1. QB **Joe Burrow** is now 9-2 as LSU's starting quarterback. He finished the night 20-of-28 passing for a career-high 307 yards and two touchdowns.
 - a. Burrow connected with WR Stephan Sullivan for a 38-yard touchdown, his eighth of the season with 5:52 left in the first quarter, to give LSU the 14-0 lead.
 - b. He fired a 13-yard strike to Foster Moreau for his second touchdown of the night to put the Tigers up, 28-0.
 - c. His 20 completions were a career-high.
 - i. His previous best was 19 at Florida.
 - d. His previous career high in yards was 292, which he set against Ole Miss.
2. QB **Myles Brennan** finished the night 4-of-6 passing for 65 yards.
 - a. The sophomore entered the game with 6:20 left in the third quarter, marking his first game action of the season.
3. RB **Nick Brossette** rushed for 69 yards on 14 attempts and had two touchdowns.
 - a. With 13:06 left in the first half, Brossette capped a 79-yard drive with a 2-yard rushing touchdown, his 11th this season.
 - b. Brossette rushed for his 12th career touchdown, a 2-yard run with 9:32 left in the third quarter, extending the LSU lead to 35-3.
4. RB **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** recorded 32 yards on 5attempts and had one touchdown.
 - a. The sophomore ran for his seventh touchdown of the season with 11:06 left in the first quarter. It was a 3-yard rush to put the Tigers up 7-0.
5. RB **Lanard Fournette** had a career high seven attempts for a career-best 45 yards and one touchdown.
 - a. His 24-yard run in the fourth quarter was a career long. His previous long was 12 yards.

- b. The junior ran the ball in for a 3-yard touchdown with 11 minutes left in fourth quarter to extend the LSU lead to 42-3.
 - i. It was his first career touchdown.
- 6. TE **Foster Moreau** led the Tiger receivers with 73 yards on five receptions and one touchdown. He had a long reception of 19 yards.
 - a. Moreau's five catches gives him 46 career receptions, which puts him ninth all-time on LSU's career list of receptions by a tight end.
 - b. The senior recorded a senior night touchdown, his first touchdown of the season, a 13-yard reception with 8:01 left in the second quarter.
 - i. It was his fifth career touchdown.
 - c. With his 18-yard catch on the Tigers' opening drive of the second half, No. 18 set career bests for receptions and yards. At the time it was 5 receptions and 73 yards.
- 7. WR **Stephan Sullivan** had four catches for 94 yards.
 - a. His 38-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter was his second of the season and his third career.
 - b. His 94 yards were a career-high. His previous best was 54 versus Southeastern Louisiana.
- 8. WR **Derrick Dillon** recorded a career-best five receptions for 31 yards. His previous high was three, which he had recorded twice.
- 9. WR **Jonathan Giles** recorded a career-high 15 yards one catch.
 - a. His 15-yard grab in the second quarter was a season-long and his career long in Tiger uniform.

Defense

- 1. LB **Devin White** had nine tackles, one sack, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.
 - a. The junior dropped QB Shawn Stankavage for his second sack of the season, a loss of 4 yards, on the opening drive of the second half.
- 2. S **JaCoby Stevens** had a career night with seven tackles and one tackle for loss.
 - a. Stevens' previous career high was two tackles versus Miami.
- 3. LB **Michael Divinity** tied his career high with seven tackles. He also recorded 1.5 tackles for loss.
 - a. He recorded seven tackles versus Georgia.
- 4. LB **Jacob Phillips** had seven tackles and one sack.
 - a. The sophomore recorded his first career sack with 2:56 left in the first quarter, dropping Stankavage for a loss of 6 yards.
- 5. DE **Glen Logan** had two tackles one sack and 1.5 tackles for loss.
 - a. Logan recorded his third sack of the season on Rice's opening drive of the game, dropping QB Parker Towns for a loss of 5 yards.
- 6. NT **Tyler Shelvin** had four tackles and one sack
 - a. With 1:57 left in the first half, Shelvin sacked Stankavage for a loss of 5 yards, marking his first career sack.

Special Teams

- 1. K **Cole Tracy** was 6-for-6 on PATs. He is now 22-of-25 as the Tigers' kicker and 33-of-33 from PATs.
- 2. K **Avery Atkins** kicked the ball of six times. All were touchbacks.
 - a. The freshman has 58 touchbacks on 64 kicks.
- 3. P **Zach Von Rosenberg** punted once for 33 yards, pinning Rice inside of its 20.
- 4. SNP **Blake Ferguson** recorded his 36th consecutive game at long snapper.
